












He likes karate because it requires a discipline that he also applies to his everyday life, as proven by his reflection on that championship day. "It was on a Friday, and I had a math test that day," Diego said. 'I passed it and won the championship, so it was a good day."


Not that Diego was really worried about the math test. Anything he does, he does well. He's been competing in karate two years and takes pride in winning a title in one of the oldest karate organizations around. "Chuck Norris actually competed in some of their early competitions," his mother, Angelica Salinas, said.

Diego used to play soccer, but gave it up when he discovered karate, plus it was difficult to do a lot of running with his asthma. "I thought indoor soccer would be easier, but you run even more," he said with a smile.

Hockey is his second favorite sport because of the action. He thought about playing football, but said, "I found karate, and I thought it was cooler."

Diego is a young man who does not allow dust to gather. He also likes bicycling, though he's outgrown the bike of his youth. One of his favorite moments, however, didn't involve him riding, but rather helping other riders in the 2017 Head for the Hills Bike Rally in Cedar Hill. He volunteered, handing out snacks and drinks to the riders, along with doing things such as delivering ice to each check-in station along the route. "In the end, I got some Red Robin burgers. That was my reward," he said. "I think I played a big part, along with the other volunteers. It was a lot of fun."

Diego is also excited about his future career plans. He wants to dig up dinosaur bones for a living. With his goal of being a paleontologist in front of him, by the time he graduates in five years, he will not only have a high school diploma, but he will be about halfway through college, as well. "I started becoming interested in dinosaurs when I was little. When I saw Jurassic Park the first time, I asked my mom if that was real," Diego said. "You just can't bring back the wonder and terror of that first movie."

Angelica recalled a family trip to Colorado when Diego was young. "We made the trip about his interests. He still has some fossils and artifacts from that trip."

Diego, in fact, already knows where he will be going to college. He plans to attend Louisiana State University in honor of his father, Danny, a big fan of the school. He plans to major in science. "My dad really adores LSU. I want to be the first male in the family to go to college," Diego confided.



Danny spent much of his youth in Baton Rouge, since his father worked as a concession manager for the school. His dad previously spent nine seasons in the same position at Texas Stadium, former home of the Dallas Cowboys. "We loved it there. My brother and I would pass out programs. We even met Shaquille O'Neal," Danny said of the NBA player who played college ball at LSU.

Diego and Danny have a special relationship. Danny was diagnosed with muscular dystrophy in 2005 and began spending his days at home with young Diego. "I had to stop working, and I had him there with me all the time. My favorite things rubbed off on him," Danny said.

To which Angelica added, "It's a nice bond, and it's great to still see it now that Diego's a teenager. The little things Diego has seen him do while growing up have had a great effect."

Danny's muscular dystrophy is slow progressing. In fact, he's been dealing









with some effects of it since high school, though he wasn't quite sure what it was. He played soccer and softball when he was younger. "He's someone I can look up to every day, every hour," Diego said. "He's pretty strong to do what he does."

Danny never gives up and has worked to instill that attitude in Diego. "I enjoy life. I love being with my family, and I still do things with them," he said. "Diego and I love doing things together. For example, we love going to Comic-Con."

Diego isn't the only success story among the Salinas children. His 7-year-old sister, Bella, plays softball and performs ballet. Her 6-Under softball team out of Cedar Hill won an area championship in 2016, defeating nearby teams from Duncanville, DeSoto and Red Oak.

Diego is looking forward to the travel involved in his career choice. "I want to travel around and find bones, maybe even a new dinosaur. I'm excited about finding new species." And, just like life, Diego said, "We still don't know what all was out there."

Wherever life takes him, Diego is counting on his lessons from karate and martial arts to help guide him. The self-discipline that helps him achieve success on the mat will also be there for him in other facets of life. "It helps in real life," he said. "The discipline helps sort through things." NOW

AT HOME WITH TIFFANY BURTON







Tiffany Burton is living life on so many planes, but there is nothing plain about where she lives it! Tiffany is a single mother of three, finishing a doctorate in public health, who finds the love and energy to be a foster parent, as well, while welcoming another three children into her heart and home.

On entering Tiffany's home, the first thing that strikes you is the bold use of color — and the occasional fleur-de-lis celebrating her Louisiana heritage. Just off the entry is Tiffany's private salon room with red walls and mirrors and a professional salon chair behind a woven screen bedecked with grapes. The living area combines mustard walls with red leather furniture. The second thing that hits you is Lola, the Great Dane, who makes sure all visitors are properly greeted and welcomed to the Burton abode.

From the living room, the view of the kitchen is unobstructed, and breakfasts and other informal meals tend to happen in both rooms, with everyone finding a seat at whichever table is available, when all six human members of the Burton household descend at once. With such a large household and only one parent, structure and order are a necessity.





"We have a schedule for everything. I try to schedule everyone's appointments, so we keep all the chaos in that one day. Everyone has chores. I identify their strengths, and everyone helps out. They all get a \$10 allowance on the weekends, and we go to Dollar Tree on Wednesdays, so they can spend it on whatever they want. We go grocery shopping once a month. We all eat meals at the same time." But Friday nights are different.

"For Friday dinner, every child gets an individual meal. They get to pick whatever they want, and I cook it. Crab legs, meat pies, whatever."

In addition to the couch and love seat, the living room features wooden accent tables with Japanese-inspired floral arrangements. Geometric art goes with the circular pattern on the curtains. Behind the love seat near the door to the backyard, is Lola's bed and some chew toys. "That's Lola's

backyard. The kids play out there, but Lola is responsible for all the holes!"

Upstairs, the first room you come to is the TV room, with couches and chairs for relaxing, if you don't prefer sitting on the colorful puzzle mat. "During the school year, we don't watch TV or play video games during the week," Tiffany explained. "We draw, read or play board games. But Friday night, the TV comes on."

The girls' bedroom features lots of
















pink — even the wicker furniture is pink. Next to that is the blue and green room and one of the bathrooms. The boys' room has beige walls, with stenciled reminders on the walls. The bunk beds sport striped bedspreads, while a fur rug keeps things cozy.

The master bedroom is a celebration of purple. A lavender fur rug snuggles up to a

chair by the big four-poster bed with its purple satin and velvet bedclothes, complemented with some big, furry pillows. All of this reflects in the big, horizontal mirror on the wall.

"When I graduated high school, I had a list of what I wanted in my life," Tiffany said. "I wanted a two-story house, a big truck and a huge dog. But when I got pregnant, everything got put on hold." Tiffany's life may have been on hold, but not for long. Nothing holds her back for long. At only 26, an age when many young people are still living at home trying to figure out what direction they want to try to go, Tiffany was already buying her house. "Believe it or not, I already had enough furniture in my twobedroom place I was living in to fill this house up when I bought it!" The truck and the dog came soon after.

"Lola loves attention. She loves to see people's faces when they first meet her. She greets me every day when I come home. She stands up and puts her paws on my shoulders! Once, when I was eight months pregnant, I had to board her for three days when I went out of town. I told them to be sure they had control of her when I came to pick her up. Lola got loose, ran to me and knocked me down. My wig flew off! The vet thought they were going to have to call an ambulance for the pregnant lady. Lola was just so happy to see me!"

Tiffany's venture into fostering is a rather new part of her life. "I was a manager for a multi-site corporation, working full time. But I wasn't very happy with my job. I'm finishing my Ph.D., so I'm 'overqualified' for everything." Tiffany had also suffered a recent tragedy. The father of her youngest child had recently died traumatically. It was during this dark time that her family expanded. "They asked me if I'd like to be a foster parent. They said it wasn't a problem that I'm a single parent. I've been doing this for six months now. It's a very humbling experience. I never thought having a house full of kids would be so rewarding in so many ways. Just when you think you're the teacher, these kids will end up teaching you things, too. But you see how they respond to structure. Their parents are thankful when their kids go back to them. Fostering got me out of the house. There was no more time for pity partying."

Tiffany also has an interest in mental health, knowing how important it is for people to have the tools they need to deal with stress and depression. "They need to be equipped to prioritize problems and deal with them one day at a time, one problem at a time and to seek help if it's necessary."

Tiffany keeps on painting bold new strokes of a vibrant life. Who can tell what color the next wall of accomplishment will be? **NOW**

Creative Spark

Glitter, rhinestones, sparkling beads — Cerena Jones uses these items and more to custom decorate license plate covers, lampshades, jewelry, pen holders, business and office signs, flip-flops, karaoke mics and bottles of all shapes and sizes. "I pretty much upcycle almost anything," Cerena said. "I'm an only child, so I'm creative."

She started making scented candles by recycling baby food jars and wine and liquor bottles that she decorated. "I wanted to touch every sense," she explained. Cerena's home-based business is appropriately named Vivid Sense. She sells her creations on Etsy and at area arts and craft shows. "I find my art a very addictive and relaxing experience," Cerena added. "My mind is always going. I can start a piece in one direction, and then it moves in another. I'm not a planner. The art must

flow, and I must feel like doing it or it won't work well. Sensory things — wine, music and movies — help me while I create. I don't know if I'm that simple or complicated. I don't do any of this for the money."

Craft and hobby stores, online or brick-and-mortar, are Cerena's favorite places to shop. While most of the items she decorates are free upcycles, Cerena's art is "blinged out" with treasures she purchases. "UPS packages are delivered to me almost daily," she admitted. "I started painting on canvas and found that to be too expensive, so now I find wood pieces and recycled mirrors with character to paint." One mirror piece that hangs in her entryway is of a moon eclipse. "I was inspired by an actual eclipse, started on it and finished it a month later. It kept evolving," she revealed.

A self-proclaimed hands-on learner, Cerena works at achieving the right color shades and effects. "I've learned from and talked to other artists. I didn't go to art school, but I've watched other artists on YouTube and have learned their techniques," Cerena explained.

"I experiment with different shades of color on cardboard first. At my first art show, a watercolorist was so encouraging. She surprised me by saying I was an inspiration to her. I hadn't expected any compliments."

Finding self-confidence in her creations has been a challenge. "I look at a piece and wonder if there's something more I can add to it, change or if I've just wasted my time and energy. I have to tell myself, 'No, I had a great time creating it."

Learning from having experienced doubt, Cerena's ready to encourage others in their passions. "I'm ready to motivate others and tell them not to get frustrated. Keep trying," she said. "There may be something missing in their lives, but by becoming creative, they can find that missing joy."

Cerena's already applied that concept successfully toward a friend who was going through a tough time. "I gave him an easel, paint and a glass of wine and told him to paint whatever without conversation. It's therapy," Cerena explained.

A Dallas native, Cerena served in the Air Force as a computer operator, traveling to Japan, Kuwait and in the U.S. "I missed home, but those were some of the best years of my life," she recalled. "The military taught me patience."

Holding an associate degree from Everest College, Cerena's in her ninth year working at the Mine Safety and Health Administration. She and her children, Czarien (13) and Tatiyana (7), enjoy their Duncanville home of one year. "It's a small town, but accessible to everything," Cerena said. "There's a great sense of community."

Both Czarien and Tatiyana enjoy creating with their mom. The formal dining room is their creative space. "I may move more into abstract painting," Cerena revealed. "It's like a puzzle or problem solving. I'm like a kite in the wind."







As a child, Mayté Magdaleno enjoyed staying close to her mother and watching her cook. Little did she know, she herself would enjoy the art of cooking one day. Carne Molida con Papas

1 lb. 80/20 ground beef Salt and pepper, to taste

1 tsp. cumin powder

1/2 tsp. onion powder

1/2 tsp. garlic powder

1/8 tsp. crushed red pepper flakes

1/4 to 1/2 medium white onion, diced

I tsp. garlic, minced

4 small russet potatoes, peeled and diced

4 oz. tomato sauce

1/2 pkt. Sazón Goya con Azafran seasoning (optional)

1 4-oz. can diced green chilies

2 cups low-sodium chicken broth

I whole jalapeño (optional)

- **3.** While the ground beef is cooking, dice potatoes. Add the potatoes, tomato sauce, Sazón Goya con Azafran seasoning, green chilies and chicken broth; stir well to combine. If using, top with jalapeño; cook for about 20 minutes, until most of the liquid has reduced.
- **4.** Mix in lime juice; serve with warm tortillas.

Champurrado

1 1/2 cups hot water

1/4 cup masa flour

3 cups low-fat milk

1 to 1 1/2 tablets Nestlé Abuelita Chocolate

1 Tbsp. Nestlé Abuelita Syrup

1/2 tsp. cinnamon

1/2 tsp. nutmeg

I. Pour hot water and masa flour in a large saucepan; mix until smooth.

- **2.** Add milk and chocolates; warm over medium heat, stirring constantly, until mixture begins to boil.
- **3.** Add cinnamon and nutmeg. Reduce heat to low; cook for 3 to 5 more minutes. Serve immediately. *Note:* This drink can be strained through a sieve before serving if a smoother consistency is desired. Also, more cinnamon may be sprinkled on top.

1 tsp. dry parsley



- **3.** Add shrimp; sauté until pink, about 3 to 4 minutes. Stir in lemon juice and parsley; serve warm with bread or over pasta.

- I cup white sugar
- I cup brown sugar
- 1 cup PET Evaporated Milk
- 2 large eggs, beaten
- I stick butter, melted
- I tsp. vanilla extract
- 1 tsp. lemon juice
- 1/2 tsp. allspice
- 1/4 tsp. nutmeg
- 1/4 tsp. cinnamon
- 2 9-inch pie shells, regular or graham cracker crust
- **I.** Preheat the oven to 350 F In a bowl, blend all ingredients together, except pie shells. Pour mixture into pie shells.
- **2.** Bake for an hour, or until knife inserted into middle comes out clean.
