

ARING WITH TRUTH

Marty Hill is a pastor who has been to seminary, is ordained and has led local churches. But calling him a pastor only scratches the surface. In addition to his work at Grand Prairie Family Church, Marty has two big passions — outreach ministry helping women in need and shredding his electric guitar as one part of the hard rock band, Roaring Truth. Marty sees both projects as part of a greater calling.

Marty grew up in Duncanville, and his experience serving people in the South Dallas area greatly impacted his life over the last two decades. "I was a preacher's kid, and my dad's greatest legacy was founding the Austin Street Shelter in Dallas. Growing up, whenever he would take me to doctors' appointments or anything like that, I would go and help him at The Stewpot or at Austin Street," he detailed.

Though he did not go straight into ministry, once Marty felt the call, he was pulled specifically to outreach for at-risk and homeless populations. First, he studied psychology and criminal justice at the University of North Texas, which led to a career in forensic case management for Dallas County Mental Health and Mental Retardation Center.

Probably the most important part of his time at UNT, though, was meeting his wife, Jennifer. "I met her before I was thinking about marriage or anything, but I remember thinking when I first saw her that I could marry someone like that," he said.

Marty and Jennifer have two kids. Zach is a freshman at Oklahoma State University, and Alyssa graduates from Midlothian High School in May. The family moved to Midlothian in 2005, staying here through the iterations of Marty's pastoring career.

After many years with MHMR, Marty started seminary at the same time they were moving to Midlothian. Shortly after being ordained, he was convinced by a friend to help open a women's outreach center in Kaufman — work that was near to his heart. "It's amazing seeing how it came together. As my income was going further down, Jennifer was working hard to move up from being a nurse to earning a job as an executive with a hospital in Dallas," he explained. "I could not have done all I've done without all of her sacrifice and hard work."

Though Marty loved the work in Kaufman, he felt there was something different he needed to be doing. "I heard the call to come back to the streets I was from," he said, "so I bought a house in South Oak Cliff and opened a Women's Recovery, Discipleship and Sober Living Facility called Soul Flight Ministry."

Along with all he has done helping the homeless and people fighting addiction, music has been a constant in his life. "I started playing guitar when





I was 14, and really the guitar just feels like a third arm to me," he described.

Though Marty had been playing for a long time, it was during seminary that he felt a new part of the call on his life. "I would play when I was taking study breaks, and I was writing a lot. I just knew that I had these songs, that if I got a chance to share them, they could help people," he explained.

Marty had played in garage bands in high school, so he knew he wanted to find a group to help flesh out his song ideas. "The guy that introduced Jennifer and me helped me record some scratch tracks, but I needed a band. I started posting on Craigslist eight years ago, and eventually I found the right guys," he recounted.





It took four years for Marty to find his first bandmate, mainly because he was being selective. "I connected with guitarist Dillon Moses, and we added our singer, James Jones, a few months later. Then about a year ago, we met our drummer, James McLester, who I remembered watching with Dallas rock bands years ago."

With a mostly formed band, Roaring Truth left the garage and played a few shows last year and recorded some of their own songs. "There is a hard rock deejay with Dallas radio station, KNON, and he was trolling the Internet one night," Marty recalled. "He came across our first single, "Homesick," and decided to start playing it. We ended up being one of the station's Top 10 Metal Bands in DFW after we'd only played two shows. Then, Internet rock radio KDKT, featured us in January, and we got more requests than any band had in eight years."

The group rounded out the band this summer with Jordan Greer, another answer to a Craigslist ad. In the last year, they have opened for bands like Dokken and Winger, and recently signed a distribution deal to help get their music to a wider audience.

What makes their success more incredible is the contrast of Marty's songs to what many bands in the genre produce. "We don't market ourselves as a Christian band, and we like to think we are on a covert mission," he smiled. "Jesus taught in parables, and I think our lyrics are parabolic. Just like we do with Soul Flight, the band is meeting people where they are, trying to present light in a dark place and casting seeds."

Thad and Christina Miller could have lived anywhere in the U.S. After canvassing the country, however, they decided Midlothian best met their criteria. "We were wanting to leave Illinois, mostly for better career opportunities, better cost of living and quality of life, better schools and to escape frigid and gloomy winters," Christina explained. "When we narrowed down our scope to the DFW area, we then looked for a place between Dallas and Fort Worth, with great schools. That's how we found Midlothian!"

The couple, who met in 2002, while attending the same college, moved to Texas three years ago. "We flew down to house hunt in May 2015 with our youngest son, who was about 6 weeks old at the time. We saw 14 houses in two days and put an offer on the one we liked best and had the most potential," Thad recalled.

Their selection was a five-bedroom, nearly 4,000-square-foot home built in 2007. "Upon walk-through, we thought the decor and paint were very neutral, which was a great relief. But when we moved our belongings into the house, we realized that the paint seemed neutral with *their* decor but clashed with our things," Christina said.

As a result, the family hired an interior decorator to pick replacement colors, only to decide the choices were too dark and not suited to their own style. "So, we ended up picking most of the paint colors on our own. We looked at samples and lots of pictures and recommendations online. We painted sample squares over many of the walls — it looked pretty crazy in here for a while!" Christina remembered. "The colors tended to not look at all like the samples once they were all over the walls. Plus, we're very particular, so there's been a lot of repainting!"

Having packed and moved from out of state, the family became more aware of their quantity of belongings. "It turned us more into minimalists. It's still something we're working on, but we are a lot more careful about our purchases than we have been in the past," Thad admitted.


we like it, but it finally has the right feel," Christina said.

As part of the functional decor, the Millers have wine bottles stored aesthetically on one wall and have placed an ornate mirror to add depth to the dining room. They also used preserved wreaths to add a pop of color and fresh smell here, and a piece of art from one of their favorite artists completes the design.

More from the artist is displayed in the home's front room. "A couple of the pieces are etches of Chicago scenes. We purchased them at art shows from the artist himself when we still lived in the area, knowing we would one day move from there, and they would be a special way to remember," Thad noted.

Along with a spacious master suite, the house has a formal dining room with butler's pantry, a large kitchen featuring granite-like counters and roomy breakfast nook where a favorite collection is displayed. "We collect 'You Are Here' mugs from Starbucks. They are displayed on a mug rack from Magnolia Market in Waco, Texas, on the wall in our dinette," Christina said. Fun and functionality have been part of every design choice, as the Millers continue to make the house their own. "We've been remodeling the house with functionality in mind, mostly. We installed lighted outlets in the darker hallways, for example," Thad explained.

Christina added, "We used a cutting machine to add our address onto our front door, which is very functional, since our address plaque is covered by a giant palm tree! We also had fun customizing the glass on our office doors, which adds fun detail."



Located on a busy corner lot, the Miller home is part of an enthusiastic community. "We love our neighborhood because of the great people! There are so many of our son's classmates and friends nearby. Our neighbors look out for each other. Our Facebook group page is super helpful, and it has a pool," Christina enthused.

Cheyenne Osborn looks like your typical all-American teenager, and in many ways, she is. A middle school athlete with an eye toward college, the 13-year-old is a blend of confident and cautious — character traits that stem from overcoming difficulties you would never know of unless she decided to reveal them. Cheyenne suffers from complex regional pain syndrome but has learned to conquer it at every turn. "We've never let her use it as a crutch. It's something she has, but something she can't feel sorry for herself about. She knows every day is a blessing," Mom Nada Osborn relayed.

CRPS is a nerve disorder usually occurring after some sort of traumatic injury, surgery or immobilization. Cheyenne believes hers stemmed from a simple decision to wear the wrong shoes for one day. "It was the third day of third grade, and I had a new dress with matching shoes. The shoes were too big, but I insisted on wearing them, even though my mom said not to," Cheyenne recalled. "I walked on the sides of my feet all day and was in terrible pain."

True to determined form, Cheyenne refused to skip cheer and soccer practice that evening and played through the pain. The next day, her foot was twice its natural size. Initially diagnosed as a severe sprain, it would be several ER trips before the injury was accurately labeled. "Ultimately, we were directed to Cook Children's Medical Center," Nada recalled.

On the eighth day after Cheyenne's injury, a chance encounter led to the proper diagnosis. "We were waiting at Cook's to see an orthopedic specialist when an intern passed by. He glanced at Chey's leg and said, 'Oh, does she have RSD?"

Reflex sympathetic dystrophy, or RSD, is another name given to CRPS, which was first labeled 150 years ago as pain considered disproportionate to the event causing it, such as a sprain or fracture, and it is rare in children.

Multiple tests confirmed the intern's suggestion, and Cheyenne was prescribed a list of medicines and physical therapy. Despite those efforts, her condition worsened, and Nada took matters into her own hands. She began her own research, started an online support group and decided to ween Cheyenne off her prescriptions. "We researched and decided on natural medicines, vitamins, upped her physical therapy — we even massaged her hands and feet while she was asleep — and really managed her diet," Nada reflected.

While the measures resulted in small breakthroughs for Cheyenne, doctors suggested that a nerve block procedure might be the ultimate solution to ease her pain. "We set an appointment for

the nerve block and were discussing it on the way to physical therapy. That very day, Cheyenne walked without her boot, crutches or any help," Nada remembered. "When we got home, the neighborhood came out to watch Chey walk!"

Cheyenne continued to push herself to do more, and after about a month, she reached a remission stage. Two weeks later, she wanted to try out for competitive cheerleading and play soccer again. "She was homebound for two years of school as we worked through all of this, but ultimately, she came out the other side like the miracle child that she is," Nada said, noting that doctors had told Nada and her husband they would never be able to have children.

Hobbies that Cheyenne began as a child helped motivate her then and now. "My mom said I was making up dances and cheers when I was 2, so when I was old enough, she started me in peewee cheer. Then two years later, I started competitive cheer and have loved it ever since," Cheyenne recalled. "I love the dancing and performing of cheer."

As much as she enjoyed cheer, soccer would prove her favorite. "My dad wanted me to try it, so I started on a YMCA team when I was 4 or 5. They say I was just a natural at it," Cheyenne said. "The director of Storm FC, Antony Penna, saw me playing and recruited me to come over to Storm the next season. I have always loved it and do not know my life without it!"

The Osborns firmly believe Cheyenne has a mission to fulfill with her life. "We believe she's here for a reason," Nada said. "Maybe it's to show others who are in pain that you can get through it."

Cheyenne said she tries to use the experience to encourage others, especially her peers. "I try to be the person others can come to if they are feeling beat down. I tell them, 'You have to be positive. You have to stand up for yourself.'''

While Cheyenne participates in cheerleading, choir and track at Walnut Grove Middle School this year, her focus is soccer. "Soccer is constant moving, and the rush when you win as a team helps me to forget about where my CRPS has put me before," Cheyenne admitted.

Cheyenne's goal is to play in college, possibly at the University of North Texas, Texas A&M, Texas Tech or Alabama universities. "Because of her skill level on the field, she felt it really was the best choice for her future," Nada said.

Although Cheyenne still has periods of breakthrough pain, she said CRPS has given her more compassion, understanding and determination. "I don't overdo it because I want to keep getting better. If I miss a practice, I just work extra hard the next time to make up for it," Cheyenne admitted. "But I've learned exactly how strong I am, and I'd like to become a nurse to help other people someday. If I can also coach soccer, cheer, or both, that would be the ultimate!"



With those goals in mind, Cheyenne said she will "stay focused, work hard and also help others to work hard." "I need to show others that it doesn't matter what happens to you in life. If you stay determined and always get up when you get knocked down, you can achieve anything," she said. "Even if it's not perfect, just do the best you can every time. That's what matters most."

Nada has no doubt her determined daughter will do whatever she sets her mind to. "It was difficult, and she fought hard to stay on track in school and physically," she said. "Ultimately, she learned when people are counting on you, you have to follow through. And that's the kind of person she is. Cheyenne always pushes through."



On a Roll

Heather Lowry spent much of her life caring for her family and building a career. Three years ago, however, an online message caught this Midlothian resident's eye, and a fire to do something solely for herself was sparked. "I'd thought about 'what ifs' all my life but was always too busy working, taking care of other people, volunteering, etc.," Heather reflected. "I reached a point where I felt like if I didn't do something for myself it might be too late."

Browsing the Internet, Heather saw an ad asking, "Have you ever thought about roller derby?" Unexpectedly, the sport had crossed Heather's mind. "I hadn't been on skates in three decades, but I decided to check out a practice. The day after that, I was buying my own skates," she said. Three years later, Heather says being part of roller derby is a welcome escape from the daily grind. "It's nothing like what people think of from what was on TV in the '70s. Our rule set is very strict — there's no elbowing or fighting. In fact, we're not trying to knock each other down. We're trying to build each other up," Heather explained.

A contact sport played by two five-member teams at a time, roller derby involves skating counter-clockwise around a track. Each team designates a jammer, identified by a starred helmet, who scores by lapping the opposing team. Skaters try to keep the opposing jammer from progressing, while helping their own advance.

As members of the Blackheart Betties in the Arlington Derby Avengers League, Heather and her teammates rotate between jammer, blocker and pivot positions in the rink. While anyone is welcome, participants must pass a minimum skills assessment. "You're required to skate 27 laps in five minutes — about 11 seconds per lap," Heather noted. "But we've had ladies who don't let go of the walls for months. It's OK. Some people's journey takes a little longer. The point is to keep coming back."

It is that mentality that encourages women to return, Heather said. "We have a motto that it's not how you fall, but how you get back up. It's not about competing against others but about not defeating yourself."

In twice weekly practices at Cedar Hill Roller Rink, skaters range from age 14 and under in junior league or 15 and older in adult league. "You don't have to have any skills to join. We'll teach you what you need to know," Heather said. "There's a real emphasis on safety, and although it's very competitive, we keep it fun."

Founded by a mother and daughter in January 2015 to promote health and fitness, Arlington Avengers has done more than that for Heather. "Our league is small, but growing, and has become like a family. There is such encouragement," she said. "Sometimes, it's hard to get to practice, but I always leave feeling better for having gone."

With mash-up bouts in off-season, the three Avenger teams compete in six official matches per season starting in June and culminating in a championship match, which Heather's team won last year. "In matches each team encourages the other while waiting on the line," Heather said. "While you're skating in bouts, you're laughing and cutting up, but always encouraging your team and your opponents."

Spectators can cheer on Heather, also known as Hell Kat 00, should her team make the championship December 8 in Cedar Hill. "I'm not the best skater, but I'm very enthusiastic," she joked. "And I'm pretty confident about making it to the championship."

Heather, who runs her own home cleaning service by day, said roller derby serves an important purpose in her life. "Roller derby may not be for everyone, but for me, it's a reminder that there's more to life than paying bills," she said. "I encourage everyone to find something like it, because we're all worthy of spending some time on ourselves."

- 1 cup pecans, chopped
- I cup brown sugar

I. Preheat the oven to 350 F Put the potatoes in a pot on the stove, filling with water just over the potatoes. Cook on high for about 10 minutes, until soft; drain.

2. Mash the potatoes until smooth; pour into a mixing bowl.

 Add sugar, flour, butter, eggs, milk and vanilla. Mix together; pour into a 13x9-inch pan.
 In a small bowl, mix the pecans and brown sugar; sprinkle on top of the potato mixture. Bake for 30-35 minutes.

Goat Cheese "Truffles"

- 4 oz. cranberry cinnamon goat cheese
- 4 oz. plain goat cheese
- 6 oz. cream cheese
- 2 tsp. cinnamon
- 3 Tbsp. honey, plus extra to drizzle atop truffles
- I cup dried cranberries, cherry infused
- I cup pecans, chopped
- 1/2 cup fresh parsley, minced

I. Put the goat cheeses on a microwave-safe plate; heat for 30 seconds.

2. In a large bowl, mix the goat cheeses and cream cheese until combined. Add cinnamon and honey; set in refrigerator while you complete the next steps.

Roughly chop the dried cranberries. Mix the cranberries, pecans and parsley in a bowl.
 Spread parchment paper or waxed paper on the counter; pour the pecan/cranberry mixture on the paper. Remove cheese mixture from the refrigerator; use a 1-inch scooper to make balls out of the cheese mixture.
 Roll each ball in the pecan/cranberry

mixture; return the balls to the refrigerator until ready to serve.6. When ready to serve, drizzle more honey over the tops. Serve chilled.

Sausage-stuffed Mushrooms

2 lbs. larger baby bella mushrooms
1/4 cup Worcestershire sauce
Salt and pepper, to taste
I lb. Italian sausage
8 oz. cream cheese

 Preheat oven to 350 F. Pull the caps off the mushrooms; place the caps in a bowl. (The rest of the mushrooms won't be used.)
 Add Worcestershire sauce to the caps; season with salt and pepper.
 Brown sausage in a skillet on medium heat; make sure to break the sausage up into little pieces as it cooks. Drain the fat.
 Turn the heat to low; add the cream cheese. Mix until all is combined.

Combined, the words "Athens" and "Greece" conjure visions of ancient ruins and wall-to-wall tourists — all of them frantically trying to take selfie pictures in front of temples of the gods. Scores more scour the Plaka, a neighborhood that sits in the shadow of the Acropolis, looking for bargains and trinkets for friends and relatives at home. A relaxed vacation it is not.

If you really want to soak up true Greek sun, sand and life, then look no further than Voula, Greece. Voula is a southern suburb only 10 miles from Athens' center city, but a million miles away from the frantic pace. The Greek people are very gregarious and friendly. It is common for a Greek to see a child and call out " $\delta\mu\rho\rho\rho$ $\pi\alpha\iota\deltai$ " — beautiful child. The older Greeks love to ask if they can kiss your child on the head and hold their hands. The staff in their small grocery store will stop what they are doing and rush over to see the children who enter. They are quick to give them a banana or some other fruit to eat. The children love this attention so much.

Voula resides on the coast and looks out over the Saronic Gulf. The views of the water are relaxing and refreshing as





you stroll along the seawall. Any day, you can catch Greeks sunning themselves or enjoying the cool water at the many secluded beaches dotting the shoreline.

Kavouri Beach is a top location for family members due to the safe water and the open space of the beach. There are plenty of parking spaces around the coast, but it can get overcrowded on the weekends. Kavouri Beach is easily accessible via public buses, a car or a nice, moderate walk. The beach is an excellent choice for swimming, sunbathing or playing beach games, such as volleyball. It has nice facilities and plenty of cafés located right by the sea.

In the evening, locals and tourists alike head for Notos Café, an elegant, airy seaside restaurant serving modern and classic entrees. Enjoy cocktails from the bar as you sit and gaze out over the open water and reminisce on your fabulous Greek holiday.







HealthNOW Fix Feet for Weight-loss Success

Many of the estimated 70 million obese Americans are trapped in a life-threatening vicious cycle. Obesity aggravates foot problems, like heel pain and flat feet. Sore feet make it hard to exercise and lose weight, and without exercise, obesity worsens and exacerbates progression of diabetes, heart disease and other serious health threats.

It's unfortunate obese adults get caught up in the vicious cycle of avoiding physical activity due to foot or ankle pain, thereby permitting cardiovascular disease and other lifethreatening conditions to worsen. For example, in many cases, chronic heel pain occurs from carrying too much weight. Left untreated, it becomes an impediment to physical activity and meaningful weight loss.

There is no reason foot or ankle pain should stop obese patients from exercising. The first step toward breaking that vicious cycle is an evaluation by a foot and ankle surgeon.

Many causes of foot pain can be relieved without surgery through stretching exercises, orthotics and athletic shoes with good shock absorption and support. If a bunion, heel pain or other condition requires surgery, patients can participate during their recovery in non-weight-bearing activities, such as riding a stationary bike, swimming or weight training.

For those moderately to severely overweight, a thorough physical examination is mandatory before beginning an exercise program. Once cleared by your physician to begin exercising, don't try to do too much too soon. Follow a gradual routine until your body adjusts to the stress of regular physical activity. For example, overweight patients should avoid working out on treadmills or elliptical machines to minimize pounding and stress on their joints.

Shedding excess pounds helps diabetic patients control their disease, but many who experience foot ulcerations and vascular problems caused by diabetes might think they shouldn't exercise. Every diabetes patient needs regular foot exams to check for possible sore spots and assess nerve sensation. And with proper diabetic foot care and the right footwear, most patients can follow an exercise regimen that is safe and appropriate for them.
