


Happy Thanksgiving!



Bill, like many children, had a Lionel train set when he was young, but his true love for the model train hobby did not begin until he was much older. "Sometime during the '80s, I bought a model train and began expanding it," he explained. "Before I knew it, I had several trains and really began working to create the natural environment for the trains. The hobby began to grow, and pretty soon, my wife told me to move the trains out of the house."

Today, Bill has a building beside his house measuring 24x36 feet, which contains his trains and workshop. "Everything has pretty much been built by hand by me and Gene Dickerson," he stated. "We source sand, rocks, moss and other natural elements from Colorado, Hawaii, the Grand Canyon and other various places across the country."





The result is truly life-like scenes, giving credit to what Bill is trying to accomplish. "We focus primarily on scenery and want it too look as real as possible." Even many of the trees have been fashioned from natural weeds and plants, rather than being store bought.

It is not just the natural landscape Bill and Gene are attempting to recreate. Bill's miniature world contains towns, construction zones, camping grounds, shopping areas and even a casino. Within each scene are small details, which are easy to overlook unless one takes the time to really study the area. "We have people from nursing homes and assisted living facilities come view the trains," Bill explained, "and they love trying to find the birds, frogs, various people and even witches, which are all small details within the scenery."

If people look carefully, they can discover a robbery taking place at a casino, paramedics trying to save a life at an accident and people shopping for a new bike at the Harley Davidson store. The backdrops even contain images of buildings found in Waxahachie. Bill smiled, "The real fun is in the details."

As amazing as the environment is, still, the focal point is the trains. Watching them chug up the inclines Bill created and pass over bridges and through tunnels is mesmerizing. Over the years, the model train industry has come a long way. Bill laughed, "You know, in the 1950s you could buy a decent train for \$50. Today, just the locomotive is \$1,000, and each car sells for around \$50." He shook his head and then added, "This really can be an expensive hobby." Getting away to the tropics this Fall? 

Bill runs four trains at one time on his intricate track layout. Each locomotive pulls various cars in assorted colors and shapes. To make all this run smoothly and to prevent accidents, all of Bill's trains are computer operated. "I can control everything that happens with a controller, which is programmed on a computer," Bill shared. "Even GPS is incorporated to keep things running smoothly."

The model train hobby keeps Bill busy and introduces him to other model train enthusiasts. Bill is a member of the Classic Train Collectors Association. He hosts a meeting for this group once a year, where members can observe the changes he has made. "It's fun to have people come see what you have done, and I get to see what other people in the model train community are doing with their sets and layouts."

With continuous inspiration, Bill is always in the process of changing or tweaking something with his display. Bill offered, "My train set and design has been rated one of the best home displays, but I am always looking to make it better."

Over the years, the model train bug has continued to grow, and Bill is just as passionate now as he was all those years ago when he first started building. Anyone can call Bill and make an appointment to view his model trains, as he is always happy to give a tour. He smiled and explained, "There is nothing like a model train display to bring a smile to one's face, no matter the age."

my second job. We've been constantly working on it since we moved into it in 1995."




and cooking. "I love this time of the year," she said, when family and friends gather indoors and out-of-doors even more often than usual at their home.

VETERANS – By Shannon Adams REMEMBERED

Earn it. Two words etched into granite are also etched into Perry Giles' heart. He first heard them in 1998, in a Steven Spielberg movie at the historic Texas theater. In the first 30 minutes of Saving Private Ryan, Perry knew this movie "got it right," and when he walked out of the theater and faced the courthouse, his thought was, I've got to get this monument built.

That day, Perry made a commitment to see the Waxahachie Veterans Memorial completed as soon as possible. The monument was a dream that he and longtime friend David Hudgins had been nurturing for 10 years. "That stuck me like an arrow," Perry said. "You need to do your part to be a good citizen."

Although Perry himself has never served in the military, veterans' causes are close to his heart. "I grew up in the '60s," he said, "and my heroes were World War II veterans. I had uncles and grandfathers in the military."

Coming of age at the close of the Vietnam era, Perry watched as tired soldiers, including some cousins, came home from war. He was appalled at how the servicemen were treated — how they were told to change their uniforms in airport restrooms, so they wouldn't be ridiculed as they walked through the airport. "I take that as a lesson of how we should *not* act," Perry said. For a moment, he stared at the back wall of his office, then shook his head. "It was their war, but they didn't start it," he continued. "They were asked to go, and they went. Vietnam veterans want to make sure that no veteran ever gets treated that way again. We need to do our part to correct it."


This passion led to a project more than a decade in design. What began as a single monument honoring Waxahachie natives killed during their military service, gradually grew into a collection of benches and tributes dedicated to deceased servicemen from across Ellis County.

The listed names are of those who served in World War I, World War II, Vietnam and Korea. "I think the first donation I got was from one of our former governors, Bill Clements," Perry said. "I told him I was building a veterans' monument in a couple years, and I told him, 'When I get it built, I'd like for you to come to the dedication.' Three or four months later, he sent me a letter and a check fell out on the floor. It was \$2,500."

For the next three years, donations kept coming in. As fundraising goals were met and surpassed, Perry redesigned the monument multiple times. The result can now be seen in a small memorial park in front of the Waxahachie Civic Center.

With the completion date of the project near, Perry and David realized an official ceremony would be a fitting way to unveil what is now the Ellis County Veterans Memorial. In the fall of 2000, just in time for Veterans Day, the task was complete. "The original plan was just to build this monument," Perry said. "But when we got to the finish line, [David and I] were sitting here in two





chairs, and we said, 'Well, I guess we should have some kind of a ceremony to dedicate it."

Regardless of the dollar amount, Perry and David sent an invitation to everyone who had donated toward the memorial. The dedication ceremony took place November 11, 2000. It was cold, and it was miserable — "bone-chilling weather," Perry recalled. Despite the weather, between 800 and 1,000 people showed up. Once again, Perry thought the story was over. Once again, he was mistaken.

The commander of the VFW was present at that first ceremony. Perry explained, "I was sitting next to him before it started, and we were just amazed at the number of people that were coming. And he told me, "I've never seen so many people come to something like this."

A Vietnam veteran, the commander was receiving a vastly different reception than what he had experienced decades before. "When he got up and spoke, he said that he hoped we came back and did this again next year, and when he said that, it's like a little lightbulb went off," Perry said.

Just as the monument morphed from a Waxahachie tribute to an Ellis County tribute, so the ceremony itself has evolved. On average, attendance each year is about 1,000 people, and the ceremony is free of charge and open to the public. "The only qualification to get inside is that you have to be patriotic," Perry said, "And we encourage young people to come. Our average age is probably about retirement age."





Perry's not quite sure how it happens, but the ceremony draws visitors from out of town, and even busloads of people visiting from out of state. He and his committee of 10 people work yearround to make the ceremony happen every November.

According to Perry, these volunteers are not afraid of work, spending two full days setting up and tearing down. The Civic Center is arranged to accommodate a crowd. Refreshments are available, and live music plays while everyone waits. It's not hard to see the stage because of the three large screens where everything is projected.

The ceremony itself lasts around 90 minutes, and it never gets dull. Veterans are acknowledged as their branch's song is played, live bands perform tributes, and in the background, a slideshow plays through hundreds of pictures. The photos focus on people, rather than places or things. They are mainly of servicemen, servicewomen and their families, and usually show their faces and their eyes. "That's where the connection is," Perry said. The ceremony ends with a flyover of vintage planes ranging from World War II to the Vietnam era.

Perry had no idea 20 years ago that two words uttered by a movie character would make such a difference in his life. When people ask him how this whole thing got started, he likes to joke that Steven Spielberg made him do it. The ceremony, the monument, the time and effort that he gives are his way of making sure that no veteran he encounters ever feels alone. It's his way of walking the walk. "And that's really the whole story wrapped up in two words," he said. "Earn it." **NOW**

TravelNOW Fabulous Greek Holiday

Combined, the words "Athens" and "Greece" conjure visions of ancient ruins and wall-to-wall tourists — all of them frantically trying to take selfie pictures in front of temples of the gods. Scores more scour the Plaka, a neighborhood that sits in the shadow of the Acropolis, looking for bargains and trinkets for friends and relatives at home. A relaxed vacation it is not.

If you really want to soak up true Greek sun, sand and life, then look no further than Voula, Greece. Voula is a southern suburb only 10 miles from Athens' center city, but a million miles away from the frantic pace. You can reach Voula easily by hailing a taxi (Uber and Lyft are not available in Greece) or using the Beats App from Athens International Airport. The 20- to 30-minute ride is enjoyable.

The picturesque town's charm will engulf you soon after arriving. Voula is separated by Parko Ethnikis Antistaseos, a green space that has a playground for children to run and plenty of shady trees to help fight the rays of the sun. The park runs southwest from Iridos Street all the way until it hits the Saronic Gulf. Close to the park is the town center, a place where Greek gentlemen and women sit in the early morning, drinking coffee, enjoying a smoke and having fun conversation with their friends. Small children run around, playing hide-and-seek, riding skateboards or playfully kicking a soccer ball around.

The town center has many wonderful restaurants to visit. They all serve authentic Greek food, such as gyros, moussaka, and kebab. Away from the trappings of Athens, the cost of the meal is very reasonable.

The Greek people are very gregarious and friendly. It is common for a Greek to see a child and call out " $\delta\mu\rho\rho\rho$ $\pi\alpha\iota\deltai$ " — beautiful child. The older Greeks love to ask if they can kiss your child on the head and hold their hands. The staff in their small grocery store will stop what they are doing and rush over to see the children who enter. They are quick to give them a banana or some other fruit to eat. The children love this attention so much.

Voula resides on the coast and looks out over the Saronic Gulf. The views of the water are relaxing and refreshing as





you stroll along the seawall. Any day, you can catch Greeks sunning themselves or enjoying the cool water at the many secluded beaches dotting the shoreline.

Kavouri Beach is a top location for family members due to the safe water and the open space of the beach. There are plenty of parking spaces around the coast, but it can get overcrowded on the weekends. Kavouri Beach is easily accessible via public buses, a car or a nice, moderate walk. The beach is an excellent choice for swimming, sunbathing or playing beach games, such as volleyball. It has nice facilities and plenty of cafés located right by the sea.

In the evening, locals and tourists alike head for Notos Café, an elegant, airy seaside restaurant serving modern and classic entrees. Enjoy cocktails from the bar as you sit and gaze out over the open water and reminisce on your fabulous Greek holiday.







HealthNOW Fix Feet for Weight-loss Success

Many of the estimated 70 million obese Americans are trapped in a life-threatening vicious cycle. Obesity aggravates foot problems, like heel pain and flat feet. Sore feet make it hard to exercise and lose weight, and without exercise, obesity worsens and exacerbates progression of diabetes, heart disease and other serious health threats.

It's unfortunate obese adults get caught up in the vicious cycle of avoiding physical activity due to foot or ankle pain, thereby permitting cardiovascular disease and other lifethreatening conditions to worsen. For example, in many cases, chronic heel pain occurs from carrying too much weight. Left untreated, it becomes an impediment to physical activity and meaningful weight loss.

There is no reason foot or ankle pain should stop obese patients from exercising. The first step toward breaking that vicious cycle is an evaluation by a foot and ankle surgeon.

Many causes of foot pain can be relieved without surgery through stretching exercises, orthotics and athletic shoes with good shock absorption and support. If a bunion, heel pain or other condition requires surgery, patients can participate during their recovery in non-weight-bearing activities, such as riding a stationary bike, swimming or weight training.

For those moderately to severely overweight, a thorough physical examination is mandatory before beginning an exercise program. Once cleared by your physician to begin exercising, don't try to do too much too soon. Follow a gradual routine until your body adjusts to the stress of regular physical activity. For example, overweight patients should avoid working out on treadmills or elliptical machines to minimize pounding and stress on their joints.

Shedding excess pounds helps diabetic patients control their disease, but many who experience foot ulcerations and vascular problems caused by diabetes might think they shouldn't exercise. Every diabetes patient needs regular foot exams to check for possible sore spots and assess nerve sensation. And with proper diabetic foot care and the right footwear, most patients can follow an exercise regimen that is safe and appropriate for them.
