





Different but the same. That's perhaps a good way to describe the artwork of Blair Peak and her late father, George Peak. "I picked up his paint brushes after he passed away. It made me feel a little closer to him, as if a little bit of his DNA was still on them," Blair explained.

Blair's father passed away from cancer in 2013. She had been a photographer, with her shots sometimes inspiring his work, and vice versa. "Neither one of us ever had art lessons," she said. "He built houses. I decorate them."

Though George's profession was as a house builder, art was his passion. His work can be seen throughout the Fort Worth area, including on traffic light boxes in the area of Lancaster and Beach, along with numerous offices. A portrait photographer and an interior decorator, 35-year-old Blair just started painting as a hobby. After only a few years, she has already found her niche. Among her favorite original works, all abstract, are one of Bonnie and Clyde, a Sergeant Pepper's collage featuring people from her life, Val Kilmer as Doc Holliday from the movie, *Tombstone*, and a *Pulp Fiction* dance scene featuring Princess Leia and Han Solo from *Star Wars*. One of her favorite works is of her sons, 12-year-old Maesen, and 10-year-old Jaxen, with a living room from *The Simpsons* as the backdrop.

Some of her paintings have political or social commentary themes. She worked on some of these paintings before the subject matters even became hot button topics — for example, transgender bathrooms and Donald Trump before he became president. One painting of which she's especially proud is of a North Korean girl with duct tape where her mouth should be. It portrays a message of someone longing to speak, but unable to, leaving the viewer to determine if the girl is

frustrated or has accepted her role in that society. "You can say so much with the eyes, and everyone's are different," Blair said. "I call it big-eye art. The eyes are the most important things to paint. They tell what is being felt. If they don't seem to go with the face, I'll change the entire painting."

Blair learned much by simply watching her parents create. Her mother is also an artist and a retired school teacher. "I'd watch mom and dad paint together, and it was inspiring," she said.

"I took mom and dad in when the cancer hit the point of no return," she continued. "But even in that short time, he'd wake up in the middle of the night and work until he got it done. He was so devoted to his art, right up until the end."

In fact, her father left some unfinished paintings when he died. It took some time, but she completed some of them. "My mom encouraged me, but I couldn't. It wasn't until I saw mom painting a small fairytale piece for my baby niece, Ava Rose, that I tried to finish one, and it turned out so great," Blair said. She kept going until finally she was ready to finish a train painting of her father's, as well as a self-portrait of him. "Mom has the coveted selfportrait. It was hard. I was trying to pull too much personal feeling, but it turned out good, and she's so proud of it."

Blair went to school with a focus on film, and with many friends and family living in Los Angeles, she visits Hollywood annually. She has met a few celebrities and has a couple of friends in the industry. She has even painted





some of them. However, she paints for her generation scenes from childhood movies, legendary or iconic characters or musicians, etc. Her list includes the late Kurt Cobain, lead singer of Nirvana, and Michelle Pfeiffer in *Scarface*.

Blair indicated that her children, particularly Maesen, are also showing artistic tendencies. "Maesen's actually done a couple of paintings with me," she said. "He's good. They're both musicians, and my dad was a musician, also."

Though it is certainly on her radar, Blair has not featured her work in a show yet. "It's definitely evolved enough for a stronger commentary on it," she said. "Dad was so good at knowing how to price his art." At this point, she has mostly only shown her work to people she knows. It can also be seen on Facebook and Instagram.

Among Blair's favorite things to do is travel. She uses her travels for inspiration, as do many artists. "You learn from your travels," she said. "I like to live as the locals do, so when I'm in New York City, I take the subway."

First and foremost, Blair prides herself on being a mom. She lives every day to its fullest, and has a simple motto: "Make sure I'm happy and my kids are happy at bedtime."

She aims for that motto to guide her through the rest of her life, as will always honoring her father with her talent. "There's so much to enjoy in life. I create my own choices, and I want to live by those choices," she said. "I want to create art, happy art, not just for myself, but for others, inspiring them to enjoy everybody and everything they have."

The world can be a scary place for someone who doesn't speak the language of the land in which they live. Likewise, for someone who's in need of more education. That is where Barbara Yoder comes in. She has a passion for helping people develop skills to succeed in the world through English as a Second Language and High School Equivalency classes in Johnson, Hood, Somerville and Erath counties. "I've had interest in this a long time," said Barbara, who administrates the programs in those counties. The classes are for ages 17 and up. Those under age 19 must have parental permission.



In all, Barbara said there are about 750 students enrolled in the four counties. The largest contingent is in Johnson County. "Not that there's any more need — it's just a larger county," she said.

Barbara started English as a Second Language (ESL) and High School Equivalency (GED) classes at Joshua United Methodist Church this past April. Other classes are at the Burleson Public Library, First United Methodist Church in Granbury, Stephenville High School, Glen Rose Tech Center, Alvarado ISD Administration Building, Venus High School and at the old Fulton School in Cleburne. "The language of the land is English. There are all kinds of barriers if you can't speak it," she said.

Barbara knows this firsthand. She spent nearly three decades in the manufacturing industry, working with many Hispanics and second language learners. She retired from that industry 14 years ago, but she hardly stopped working. Only now she is doing the work she loves the most, and with her help, lives are being changed. "I learned that there is a large Hispanic population that needed to assimilate," she said. "Wouldn't it be great if they could speak and not rely on their children to communicate?"

Barbara began administering the program through Cleburne ISD in 2004. Now, the Adult Education and Family Literacy federal grant under which the program operates (with 20-percent matching from the state) is administered under the Texas Workforce Commission, with Denton ISD as fiscal agent.

As for folks not finishing high school and in need of a GED, Barbara said, "The most common reasons that students quit school are to go to work or family needs." And though sometimes a student is only in class because their

mom, dad or even a judge ordered them to go, according to Barbara, they almost always learn to appreciate the education on their own. "We talk about their goals," she said.

In all, the GED program featured 58 graduates over the four counties last year. Often, these students go on to attend college. "A young man wants to go to dental school and started at Texas Academy of Dental Assisting. Another lady is going to electrician's school at Texas State Technical College. We've had a lot go on to vocational school and a lot go into the military," Barbara said. "We have a wide range of ages. One lady is 62, and another is in her 50s."

Elizabeth Washington is a former student who went through both ESL and GED classes 10 years ago. She is now an aide in the Granbury ESL program and said she owes a great debt of gratitude to Barbara. "It's made such a difference in my life. When you cannot express yourself, it's very hard," she said. "I was able to get my GED and go to Hill College to get my associate degree. I'm so happy. My life has changed so



much. Barbara was the first person I met when I came to the ESL classes. Sometimes, I didn't think I could do it anymore, but she kept pushing me and told me I could. I'm so grateful for her."

Jennifer Cranford teaches ESL in Burleson. She said that Barbara's passion shows in every aspect of her work. She also finds time to volunteer with Court Appointed Special Advocates, Johnson County Family Crisis Center, Zonta and the Christian Women's Job Corps. "Barbara has a huge heart. She's willing to do whatever it takes, whenever it takes, to get the job done," Jennifer said. "She is always glad to spend time with students. Even if she has other things to do, she always makes time for students."

Barbara's desire to help doesn't stop with adults. For example, she reads books to children at Christmas with the Advisory Committee for Adult Ed. "This promotes lifelong learning, and each child receives a book to read at home," she explained. And while she isn't a designated teacher, she often fills in to teach when the opportunity presents itself.

"I get great joy in their happiness, hearing about their families, even their grandkids," Barbara said of her students. "I see them at the store, different places. They want to tell me what they're doing, and I love listening. They've had a great impact on my life, too. Everybody has 24 hours in a day. What you do with it is up to you."

5. Bake for 30 minutes; top with cilantro.
