

The Burleson Police Department prides itself on constantly exploring new ways to better serve the community. One such way is to ensure the future with its Explorers Program. The program, officially named Burleson Police Explorers Post 4911, falls under the umbrella of Scouting and is for youths (male and female) ages 14-21. The Burleson chapter is led by Sergeant Shelly Henken, who has been with the force 10 years and is in her second year as lead advisor of the local program. "These kids have a good grasp on what they want to do," Sgt. Henken said. "They want to do something to make a difference."

Though the Burleson group is small, with only seven members, it's an elite group. "We like to have like-minded individuals," Sgt. Henken said. "A lot of the kids are in criminal justice classes at their schools, and they want to make an impact in the law enforcement community someday."

Colby Smith recently wrapped up his first year on the Burleson Police Force and was named the department's Rookie of the Year. He was in the local Explorers from 2012 to 2017, when he aged out at age 21. He is also the first student from Burleson Centennial High to come out of the program. "Being a part of the Explorer Program gave me a purpose in life by making me realize that my career in law enforcement was a calling," Officer Smith said. "Being an Explorer helped me prepare for my career by allowing me to learn the basic fundamentals of law enforcement and the inner workings of the Burleson Police Department.

"The best part of the Explorer Program was being able to do ride-alongs," he said. "They helped me apply the things I learned in the program to real life law enforcement, and they were a lot of fun on top of that."

Burleson Police Chief Billy Cordell said, "The sky's the limit for Officer Smith. He could be sitting in my chair someday. Officer Smith is at the top of every category, and I can't help but say this program had a lot to do with that. He's the poster boy for the Explorers."

Another former member is Cody Marzahn, age 20, who has worked in the Johnson County Jail. "He's very involved," Sgt. Henken said.

Along with ride-alongs, Explorers learn and practice a variety of police techniques, such as building searches, arrests, search and seizure, traffic stops and accident investigations. Of course, they don't actually do these things, but rather learn about them in a controlled environment. "We try to make it fun," Sgt. Henken said. "I like to actually put them through practice scenarios. I'll use my patrol car as a suspect vehicle in the back parking lot."

Chief Cordell admits that the Explorers Program is a great recruitment tool. "It allows you to get in and work with officers, and to ask yourself, 'Is this the career I want to go into?" he said. "It also allows officers to get to serve as role models for youth.

"You can equate the program to sports, band — any extracurricular activity," Chief Cordell continued. "It's another opportunity to help young people find a niche in life."

Burleson High School senior Micaleh Tomlinson has been in the program for two years. "I like crime scene investigating. It's interesting — all the science involved. I want to go more to the detective side," she said.

Those who go through the program don't always enter law enforcement, but it does help them in other ways of serving their community and even their country. Some go into the military, others go on to law school. For example, former Explorers, such as Tanner Bates, Treg Davidson and Brad Dye are in the Marines, Navy and Air Force, respectively.

Joining the Explorers isn't easy. Among the things participants need in order to join are references, a good job history (if they've been employed), organizational skills, an explanation of hobbies and activities and a






short written essay on why they are interested. "It's a long list," Sgt. Henken said with a grin.

Benefits include team building, working with others, respect for others and moral and ethical standards. "These are special young people," Sgt. Henken said. Ranks within the Explorers include corporal, sergeant, lieutenant and captain. "It kind of mirrors the stairsteps of police officers going up in rank," she explained.

The Burleson Explorers also compete against other Explorers teams, traveling to events throughout North Texas. The highlight is a three-day competition at The University of Texas at Arlington each year that features programs from all over the state. The locals have represented themselves and the department well throughout the years. "We've done pretty good at competition, I'm proud to say. They love getting dressed in uniform and competing," Sgt. Henken said.

The competition uniform consists of blue pants, a gray button-up shirt with a badge, duty belts, handcuffs, a diecast red imitation gun and boots. The everyday uniform for meetings is a little more laid-back with a gray T-shirt with the Explorers logo, black pants and boots. To help pay for equipment and competitions, the group holds fundraisers, such as a spaghetti dinner. They are also under the umbrella of the nonprofit Burleson Police Foundation. Of course, individuals can always choose to help, also.

Explorers can be found helping out at events around town. These include city events and the annual Burleson Police Department Open House. "It's building rapport among the community," Chief Cordell said. "They're building that relationship and a mentorship. These are just fine young people whom I can't wait to see have a great impact on the world."



Not long ago, Allison Hollier had no idea what it meant to be a "ham." She only knew she wanted to be prepared to help in case of an emergency. The term "ham" is a moniker that amateur radio operators apply to themselves and other amateur radio operators. However, there is nothing amateur about what Allison does.

"I wanted to get my license, so I could help with disaster events. I'm a weather nerd and fell into this by accident. It's turned out to be so much fun, though," she said.

Allison, a Burleson resident, became a ham in 2014 after passing an FCC exam. Today, Allison "KG5BHY" is a member and vice president of the Mansfield Johnson Amateur Radio Service, or MJARS.

MJARS is a nonprofit organization of approximately 100 hams. They assist the community with communication support during times of disaster, civil emergency and other occasions that serve the public interest. MJARS volunteers work together to provide critical services to the community at no cost to the government or taxpayers.

Allison is also working to bring more women into the hobby. Four years ago, she started a weekly on-air meeting for women radio operators to speak with other women in a welcoming environment. The boundaries are endless for the on-air

meetings, or "nets," which are held every Monday night. "The first night we did it, we had someone call from Tennessee," Allison remembered. "Our net encourages women to get involved, participate and get past the mic fright that can sometimes plague newbies."

She has also helped MJARS triple its female membership. "And it's not just us. You're starting to hear more women on the air everywhere," she said. When local single women — or married women whose husbands aren't hams — need help with their stations, Allison organizes the MJARS Tech Team to help install or upgrade equipment.


"Allison is a shining star guiding women into what was once primarily a male-dominated hobby," her "Elmer," Jim Erickson "KBODBJ," said.

An Elmer is a mentor to those new or learning the craft. Allison has done her own share of Elmering. "I don't know where the name comes from. It's just part of the jargon, and that's just part of all the fun," she said.

As part of MJARS, Allison is active in many community events. Among the largest is the Burleson Honey Tour bike ride, along with at least four other large area rides, one of which works with Harvest House and Johnson County Food Bank. Other outreach projects include teaching Scouts about amateur radio during the annual Jamboree on the Air event.

Each June, Allison and her fellow hams participate in the Amateur Radio Relay League Field Day. Hams all over the world set up stations and operate nonstop for 24 hours. "We pride ourselves on the number of visitors we attract to the event and how many nonhams we can convince to sit in front of the mic at our Get on the Air station," she said. "No matter your abilities or your disabilities, there is a way for everyone to participate in our events," she said.

Allison has spoken with operators from distant places, such as Puerto Rico, Guam and Canada. And she has used her amateur radio skills in the way she originally planned. She and MJARS assess and monitor changing weather conditions for the National Weather Service and partner with the cities of Burleson and Mansfield to man their Emergency Operations Centers in times of inclement weather.



"When the tornado hit Mansfield, I was running a storm spotting net. People were in their bathrooms talking to me on their portable radios. These were my friends," she said. "I was here in Burleson monitoring the weather and having to keep it together."

Amateur radio is also making an impact with young people. "For all the tech talk, ham radio is about people," she said. "But I can entice them with cutting-edge technology, such as the MJARS high-speed wireless mesh network that covers much of Johnson and Tarrant counties. You can send text messages and emails with radio, too. You can talk to astronauts, even, with ham radios.

"There are just so many things you can do with a ham radio. But to me, it still comes down to, 'Can I talk to the person a few doors down in a storm?"

The days of kids crying when getting a haircut are over. Thanks to Cookie Cutters Haircuts For Kids, youngsters may never want to leave the barber shop.

The owners, Aubrey Musoma and his wife, Katrina Willie-Musoma, have opened the first hair cutting salon of its kind in Burleson, catering to youth as young as 8 months old. Since their first customer came in on October 29, 2018, the response has been strong for the local installment of the nationwide chain based out of Salt Lake City, Utah.



"A lot of people are glad we're here because now they don't have to go into Fort Worth," Aubrey said. "So far, the response has been great."

Oh, to be 5 years old and need a haircut! Youngsters can frolic in the large play area while waiting their turn, then give mom and dad some exercise as they try to corral them for their turn in the stylist's chair.

"The kids love the slide," Aubrey said. "We've had a mom sit for about 10 minutes after the haircut because the kid wanted to keep playing on the slide."

Katrina said, "We have a rambunctious 4-year-old son and he loves it here. We also have lots of nieces and nephews."

And when it's time for the haircut itself, children don't sit in just any chair. They can choose to sit in an airplane, a hot rod, even a pink Cadillac. The shampoo station is a fire truck.

And all the while, they can watch their favorite show on TV. "Each child gets to pick what they want to watch while they're getting a haircut," Aubrey said. "And every child leaves with a lollipop and a balloon." Neither Aubrey nor Katrina do the hair cutting themselves. They have a team of professionals, which includes experience working with children in addition to their styling skills. "The stylists make it fun for the kids," Aubrey said.

"Our stylists are very patient," Katrina added.

Aubrey spent the past five years working in risk management for a local merchant services provider. His father is a hotelier back home in Zambia.


Katrina is a pediatrician in Mansfield. "So, kids were a natural fit," she said. "I remember hating going to the hair salon as a kid, but working with moms as a pediatrician, I know their struggles. One of the things that also makes us attractive is our stylists are trained to work with children with special needs."

They feature local specials, which can be found on their website. Also, Tuesday is family day, on which after paying full price (\$1795) for the first haircut, each additional child's cut is \$12. There are also prepaid package specials that can be purchased, and the loyalty program allows customers to build points to use for future services or retail products.

"We see Burleson as a growing city," Aubrey said. "We see a lot of families leaving Fort Worth and coming here. This is perfect for them.


"Our motto is haircuts should be fun, stress-free for parents and fun for kids. Families are trying to navigate everything from haircuts to soccer practice."







Reserve time to visit the Petrified National Forest and the Painted Desert during your journey. Stop on the way at historic diners for old-fashioned food and a signature pie or milk shake.

Near the Grand Canyon, Williams, Ariz., is an unexpected treasure of its own. Shops and galleries line the streets in the small town, offering canyon memorabilia or arts and crafts from local artisans. Here, the Grand Canyon Railway departs daily for Grand Canyon National Park.

Built in 1908 by the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railroad, the depot served as an oasis for travelers. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Williams Depot and original Fray Marcos Hotel (a Harvey House Hotel) represent the oldest concrete structures in Arizona.

While passengers wait to board the train, costumed entertainers treat the crowd to a Wild West show, setting the mood for a journey back in time. Since its initial trip on September 17, 1901, the millions of enchanted Grand Canyon Railway guests have included presidents, celebrities and ordinary individuals.

In the late 1800s, only the most adventurous explorers experienced the Arizona canyon. As railroads tied the nation together, the main line connected Chicago to Los Angeles passing through Williams, Ariz. Though originally intended to transport ore from the Anita Mines, investors soon realized the potential for tourism.

Because ore and mining proved unsustainable, the railroad relied on tourism to recoup its investment.





The \$3.95 train ride replaced the \$15 eight-hour stagecoach ride from Flagstaff, allowing visitors to experience the Grand Canyon. The adventure is definitely worth the 2019 ticket price.

Train hosts educate passengers about the history and topography of the area. As the train nears the station, hosts offer information about the layout of Grand Canyon Village and the many food options inside the park. The El Tovar Dining Room, a five-star restaurant, provides an elegant atmosphere for a delicious gourmet lunch.

Over the years, the Santa Fe built structures to accommodate an increasing number of tourists. In 1905, El Tovar became one of the finest hotels in the Southwest. In a progressive move, the railroad hired a woman, Mary Elizabeth Jane Colter, to design buildings that became the signature of the Grand Canyon National Park. Landmarks include the Hopi House, Lookout Studio, Bright Angle Lodge, Desert View Watchtower and Hermit's Rest.

These structures are evidence of Colter's distinctive imprint, a natural style of Pueblo Indian architecture. Garden spots, the American flag and architecture of the buildings in the village enhance the canyon experience. Plants and wildlife naturally add color.

Time passes quickly in Grand Canyon Village. Some visitors hike deep into the canyon, while others linger in shops or museums. Many stand in awe at the rim and soak in the magnificence, attempting to commit every detail to memory, experiencing, as Roosevelt said, "the wonderful grandeur, the sublimity, the great loneliness and beauty of the canyon."

No words describe the breathtaking beauty. Pictures fail to capture its magnificence. Only personal experience explains why Roosevelt loved Grand Canyon.




