

You may not know they're there, but the Southwest Regional Communications Center may have already saved your life, or the life of someone you love. When you call 9-1-1, in DeSoto, Duncanville or Cedar Hill, these are the people who answer the phone and send the police, firefighters and ambulance speeding your way. In a life and death emergency, they stay on the line and fight on the side of life.

Michelle Shepperd, Kennetra Dixon and Jacob Walker are the Public Education and Engagement Team, who work to get the word out about who they are and what they do. "We go out in the communities to educate citizens on what 9-1-1 actually does," Kennetra explained. "People think it's like on TV or in the movies, but it's not. We're not in the police station, with a cop standing over our shoulder, listening to the call. We're not in the squad car. And we can't unplug, like Halle Berry in *The Call*, to go save the kid ourselves. We spend a lot of time trying to clear up myths about what we do."

"We do programs at a lot of schools," Michelle explained. "The K through second grade students, their brains are still growing. We try to teach them that it's important to memorize their mom and dad's phone numbers, know the name of the store they're in, know what street they're on, stay calm while we ask them questions. The middle school and high school students have some idea of what we do, so we talk to them on career days, about career opportunities, and tell them what it's like to work in a 9-1-1 communication center. We got to meet a lot of teens and their parents at the Everything Teen Expo in DeSoto."

The SWRCC handles 9-1-1 dispatch for the cities of Cedar Hill, DeSoto and Duncanville as well as Cedar Hill State Park and the south campus of UNT. But they also handle the after-hours calls for the water departments and streets departments of all three cities and Tri-City Animal Shelter. "You'd be surprised how many vicious animal calls we get," Jacob reported. "Sometimes, it's a person trapped in their vehicle by a threatening dog. If you have a water main break, after hours, the call comes to us, and we let the emergency crews know where the problem is."

All three dispatchers work 12-hour shifts, answering emergency calls and sending the appropriate aid your way. But they also work hard to engage with our three communities. "I'm a people person," Kennetra declared. "I like to go out and meet people. I always volunteer. When they sent an email asking for people to join the P.E.E.T. team, I jumped on board. I've been a dispatcher for two years. I'm still new to the team, but I'm learning a lot."



"I'm the same way," Michelle agreed. "I've been a dispatcher for 29 years. I enjoy making contact with the public. I give tours to all the citizens police academy and fire academy classes. There's always something new to teach the public about, like text to 9-1-1. That started a few years ago, but a lot of people don't know about it."

"I had 20 years in hospitality and auctions before I started this career. I traveled all over the country to events, but I wanted to stay closer to home and have more impact on my community. My father was a firefighter. He did a short stint in dispatch. I thought that sounded intriguing! I was working on a nursing degree when I got the offer to work dispatch. I've been at it six years now. Like my previous careers, it fits with my ADD. I think they asked me to do public relations because of my voice," Jacob explained. "They sent me to a public educators conference for training. Then COVID hit and all that was out the window. As first responders, there was a four-week







period when we had no days off. We worked around-the-clock."

The P.E.E.T. team also shows up at community events to reach both kids and their parents and grandparents with lifesaving information. "We have attended Country Day on the Hill. We go to National Night Out in all three cities. We do angel trees for the Salvation Army, the Bridges Safehouse diaper drive, food boxes for the needy and appreciation buckets for Police Week. Last year, we hosted our first Trunk or Treat at Halloween. We decorated our cars, had bounce houses and games," they listed in rapidfire succession. "It was a lot of fun," Michelle declared. "We look forward to doing that again."


"It's important to let people know that we're trained professionals. We're not secretaries. We have to be able to talk people through a crisis. We get calls from suicidal people with knives in their hands. There's a lot of emotion on the other end of the line. We have to be calm and professional. What we say, and how we say it, is



important," Kennetra explained. "It's not a call center job. It requires a lot of commitment, but I stay at it because I'm passionate about saving lives."

We want people to be aware of our physical existence," Jacob added. "But also to think about this as a career. We always need new people. This is an admirable expenditure of time and energy. There's a lot of change coming to how this job works in the next 10 years. There will be new technology and changing skills to do the job. But we do this job because of a sense of purpose." NOW

It has become more and more common to personalize wedding details with a doit-yourself flair. Jujy's Molasses Cookies

These disappear so fast, that I usually make a double batch!

- 3/4 cup Crisco All-Vegetable Shortening
- I cup Imperial Dark Brown Sugar (Be generous on the brown sugar.)
- 1/4 cup Grandma's Molasses
- l egg
- 2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour (Skimp a little on the flour.)

2 tsp. baking soda

1/4 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. cloves, plus a little extra1 tsp. cinnamon, plus a little extra1 tsp. ginger, plus a little extraGranulated sugar, enough to coat the cookie dough balls

I. With a mixer, mix together the shortening, brown sugar, molasses and egg; set aside.

2. In another bowl, blend the flour, baking

soda, salt, cloves, cinnamon and ginger with a whisk.

3. Gradually add the dry mix to the wet ingredients, in the mixer; mix until all is well blended.

4. Place the cookie dough in the refrigerator until chilled, about 35 minutes.

5. Heat the oven to 375 F.

6. Form the dough into 1-inch balls; roll the balls in the granulated sugar. Place them 2-3 inches apart on a greased cookie sheet.7. With your fingers, sprinkle each ball with two to three drops of water.

8. Bake 10-12 minutes until set, but not hard. Do not overbake. The cookies should remain soft even after cooling.
