




PARKING LOT PARKING

Burgers sizzle on the grill. Hot dogs are next to them, both waiting for hungry folks to decide which to munch on — perhaps both — as they wait for the game to start. Footballs fly through the air, along with Frisbees. A friendly game of bag toss is taking place, and a television features a pregame show or a game that started earlier. This will be the scene in parking lots across America as another football season begins.

But for Luke Lorick, this season has something extra. He has September 3 circled on his calendar. It is the first National Tailgating Day, created by Luke himself. "I saw there is a National Flip-Flop Day (June 17) and a National Cookie Day (July 9)," Luke said. "I thought there's got to be a National Tailgating Day, but there wasn't."

So, Luke went to work creating one. He completed the necessary forms, jumped through the appropriate hoops, and in a few weeks, learned that his request had been approved by the registrar at the National Day Calendar. The day will fall on the first Saturday in September each year. This is also typically

of the premier conferences in college football. But, as Luke is quick to note, it doesn't take a powerhouse team to have a powerhouse tailgate experience. All it takes is a willingness to have fun with friends. However, it is enhanced if your team is having a good day. "I love having friends together. That's the best part of tailgating," he said. "It is a great experience and makes for a perfect day — especially if my team is winning!"

Tailgating to Luke is more than just this one special day, however. The day, in fact, is an offshoot of his company, Tailgating Challenge. "I was literally lying in bed one night and it came over me: Do something I like, and have fun with it," Luke said. "It began as a fun project that has ballooned."

Luke said Tailgating Challenge is more than a way to make some money. In fact, he still commutes daily from Waxahachie to his job at an insurance company in Richardson, and Meredith is a marketing professor at Baylor University in Waco. Tailgating Challenge showcases cutting-edge products and offers people an opportunity to learn

And if anyone would know how to get the most out of a tailgate, it is Luke. He's been enjoying such events ever since he was a young boy going to the



University of South Carolina football games with his family. "The first game I remember attending as a child, I must



have been 9 or 10, opened my eyes to tailgating," he said. "People were tossing footballs around. There was food everywhere. And after all that, we got to go into the stadium and watch our favorite team. I said, 'This is something I want to keep doing.""

lot and be in the atmosphere of the game, all while saving a few bucks. When that happens, it means you are throwing a good tailgate."

Food is one of the biggest essentials to a good tailgate outing. Next to people, of course. "Without friends and fun folks, it doesn't matter what you have," Luke said. "But as for food, the No. 1 rule is you can't run out. Some people will stay and others will briefly pop by, and you must have enough for everybody. A good tailgate is also going to have plenty of beverages, adult and others."

Grilling is always the top form of cooking at a tailgate, highlighted by hamburgers and hot dogs. But people are getting more creative with their menus, as Luke noted when he remembered a photo sent to him from a game. "They were lobster-gating. I bet they dropped


quite a few more bucks than they would have for a couple of hot dogs," he said with a laugh.

George Peters, co-founder of Kettle Pizza Ovens, is a big fan of Luke. He complimented him on his forward thinking to designate National Tailgating Day. "Tailgating with family and friends will continue to grow because people love to share food and have some fun in a safe and friendly environment. You never see too many unhappy people at tailgating events," he said.

Luke envisioned his ultimate tailgate. This is what he would do if money were no object. "I'd have a customized trailer with a full bar, numerous TVs, a rooftop area on the trailer for people to go up and dance or sit and relax," he said. "There would be all kinds of cool toys, such as motorized coolers." He chuckled as he stated he'd also have to have lobster and fillets.

"We'd have a live band taking requests. It would be a day people would never forget. Oh, and it would be at a Clemson versus South Carolina game, with South Carolina winning," he added.

And while tailgating is typically associated with football, from high schools to the pros (no alcohol at high schools, though), Luke sees no reason it can't expand. Lots of folks already tailgate at concerts, he noted, but there could be some missed opportunities, like, say, a wedding? "I could make it happen," Luke said with a grin. "And everybody would have a great time."

Just on the edge of downtown sits a little white house that has been transformed into a dreamy cottage for two. Rhonda's career has taken her to downtown Dallas for 25 years working as a secretary for a chief executive. Before he retired, Gary spent 44 years in education. He is now a Realtor who loves to remodel homes.

A true reflection of this couple who wants their home to be a place to get away from it all, every inch of their home whispers, "Rest, relax, come away." It is difficult to imagine that a home so close to the Waxahachie square could be a relaxing retreat, but that is where the skill of this talented duo becomes evident. They were married in the Bahamas 20 years ago while on a cruise. "We left my makeup bag and wedding ring in the car back at the dock," Rhonda laughed. They went directly from the airport to the marriage license bureau. While they were taking care of business, they noticed their cab driver taking a nap. 

War time period and other interesting pieces Gary has collected are found there. A well-done graphite pencil drawing of a buffalo hangs over his desk, which was drawn because of the gratitude of a family he had helped while serving as principal in Palmer, Texas. Opposite that wall, under Robert E. Lee's picture, stands an 1897 ice box. In excellent condition, made of solid oak and sporting brass hinges, it is no surprise to peek inside and see that the porcelain panels, used for keeping the food cold, are also still intact. On the wall by the door is an antique pendulum clock, which houses treasures in its casing. One of those treasures is a Santa Fe special pocket watch that has been handed down through the Autrey family. Only railroad engineers were given these special edition watches.

Leaving the office and rounding the corner leads to the kitchen, where beautiful white cabinets, stone tile floor and countertops, a granite-top island and a work/conversation place created in an otherwise unused nook can be found.



Through the French doors at the end of the L-shaped kitchen awaits a Key West-style oasis that invites the weary soul to just breathe and rest. Three large windows to the left invite refreshing light into the sitting room, while to the right, an open, sheer draped, archway leads to the bedroom. A four-poster bed with more white, sheer draping continues the island feel, with more light coming in from the large crafted windows on the right bedroom wall.

Just steps away from the bedroom is a master bath with a large open shower of multiple tones of brown and taupe. Two cherry vanities provide his and her space for dressing. However, the most unique feature of the home is a staircase that rises from the bathroom to the second floor, which is completely dedicated to Rhonda's closet and dressing room. 


The history of Ellis County is lined with strong, independent residents, all driving toward the same goal — to make this community the best in Texas. Amidst that history are a number of strong, powerful women who worked tirelessly to ensure the education and amenities available for the children of the community were head and shoulders above the rest. Numbered among those were members of the Waxahachie Mothers Club, led by women who brought their bountiful skills and illuminating talents together to not only provide opportunities for the children of the community but for their parents, as well.

The Waxahachie Mothers Club began in 1947, before the days of PTA and PTO, becoming a part of the City Federation of Women's Clubs, all designed to build a better community. "There were a number of mothers with an interest in improving the lives of our children, and they took it upon themselves to form the club to meet

those needs," explained immediate pastpresident, Frances Farley. Approaching their 70-year anniversary, Frances added, "So many wonderful women have come before us. We owed it to them to keep working for the children and families of Waxahachie."

According to their mission statement, the Mother's Club is "centered around the welfare of children and mothers," allowing members the opportunity to "share their knowledge, time, money and expertise wherever and whenever needed in the community." Incoming president, Grace Tamminga, said, "Our goal is to be communal, and it helps that we are all interested in the welfare of children and are all very good friends."

Although the club's numbers have diminished over the years, the impact that the organization continues to make includes scholarships, donations, volunteer hours and activities. "It's all about the children and families," Frances said. "We want to help children in any way we can to become responsible adults who then will serve our community with their gifts and talents."

The club supports two scholarships each year. "Our graduates in Waxahachie are so bright," Frances said. "They are amazing." The Frances McGregor Scholarship is based on excelling in academics and continuing their education, while the Jennette Loftis Scholarship is based on grades and volunteer activities. Both women were former club members. "It's really important to us to continue our children's' education," Frances added. But that's not all they do with Waxahachie ISD. Various members of the club have participated in volunteer



reading sessions at DEAR Day, while others have volunteered with the special needs students. "It's all been such a joy to do," Frances said with a smile.

Over the years, the club has made its mark in myriad ways. The Mothers Club members have volunteered their time at First United Methodist Church, where they made food packages to go all over the world; donated money and supplies to Daniel's Den, while helping homeless members of the community; helped establish and stock the library at Texas Baptist Home with books for children and tapes for education; donated to CARE; and volunteered for the annual Gingerbread Trail, which benefits the Ellis County Museum. "We try to touch as many lives as we can," Grace shared.

The group is also very generous, using their own funds to donate monthly to different groups such as First Look, designed to provide prenatal care for



area women. Club members donate diapers and other supplies for new moms who might be struggling in the early days. "We've donated toys to the fire department toy drive, volunteered and given funds to the Gingerbread House and Hope Clinic. We don't host fundraisers, but we are careful with our funds and want to give to the community," Grace explained.

When asked why community service is so important, Frances was quick with the answer. "The community always needs volunteers. There are so many things to be done. If everybody just did one thing, what a difference it would make."

The club is also a great place for new residents, which is exactly what happened to Grace, who had recently arrived from Holland in 1984. "I wanted to be with other women and make friends," she recalled, "and it was a great way to do it."

When Frances moved to Waxahachie, she received an invitation from Jeanette Loftis and Virginia Curry. Frances noted, "They were very involved in the Texas Federation of Women's Clubs in Austin, a community of women who played













an important role in shaping Texas and the nation. Women are intelligent and powerful. We need to use that power for the betterment of our world."

The Waxahachie Mothers Club has a special place of honor, as the members learned. Grace was asked to do a cross-stitch of the Texas Federation of Women's Club's personal prayer from 1904, which is hanging in the state headquarters in Austin.

Of course, the club has its social aspect, also. The members take trips across the region to area attractions including art museums, the Dallas Arboretum and Bluebonnet Trails. Guest speakers share stories and community information at meetings. "It's not required to be a mother to be a member," Grace explained. "It all focuses around children and families, and we want to help build solid families, whether one parent or two."

"We would welcome anybody. We're very open," Frances added. "It's all about having a strong instinct to protect children and take care of them. All a child needs is one person to support him or her. So, it doesn't matter if you're a mother, as long as you're interested in serving your community."

· Get Your Papers in Order

Before you do anything else, make sure your licenses are up to date. You may purchase licenses at most sporting goods outfitters or large superstores. You can also now purchase licenses online through the Texas Parks and Wildlife website.

• Know the Calendar

Texas has outlined specific seasons for different animals. This area, called the North Zone, has start dates as early as September 1 for doves. The most anticipated season — white-tail deer — starts November 5, and there are dates for various game and fowl

starting everywhere in between. There are several animals with multiple or split seasons, so be sure you are hunting your prey legally, as the penalties include loss of license, hefty fines and can even involve jail time. If you want to try your hand at bowhunting, your season will start about a month before rifle hunters.

· Pick Your Spot

There are several options when choosing a hunting spot. You may try to find a friend who has a hunting lease, allowing them to hunt on someone else's property. Or, you can opt for one of the many public hunting lands nearby. There are plenty of options within an hour or so, but if you are willing to travel a little farther, the Texas Hill Country is known to have the largest number of white-tail deer.



GET READY

· Before You Lock and Load

You'll want to have your guns and ammunition ready before your trip. Cleaning your shotgun or rifle takes a little time, so you do not want to wait until the. big weekend to take your gun out of the safe. Be sure to bring enough ammunition. If you have a great hunt, you may only need a few shots to reach your limit, but you should plan on a few misses just to be safe. If you have never hunted, you will want to spend some time practicing your shot, which means you should plan a weekend to go shoot targets or clays. This will also help you get familiar with your weapon. It is also very important to know your surroundings. You especially need to know if other hunters are nearby.

• Blend In and Stand Out

The right camouflage can be paramount in keeping your game from spotting you



before you pull the trigger. Make sure your gear is right for the natural environment that will surround you. On the other hand, there are clear laws requiring hunters on public lands to wear at least 400 square inches of hunter orange, in addition to orange headgear. So, when you are packing your camouflage, do not forget your orange vest and hat.

· Bring Your Vittles

You will probably be in the field for a while, so be sure to pack some food and drinks. Avoid odorous things like garlic, as

well as fibrous foods like beans or broccoli that may lead to discomfort while you are trying to hunt. The best options are foods that have carbs, protein and a little fat. A peanut butter sandwich is easy and will keep your body ready when that deer or bird comes into view.



· Staying the Night

If you are planning on making an entire weekend of your hunting trip, you will have to add another level of preparation. Research what camp grounds are available. If you are planning to go on the season's opening weekend, you will want to reserve a spot ahead of time. If you are pulling your tent from a pile of things you rarely use, set it up and check it for leaks before your trip. Bring a flashlight and extra batteries, and be sure to bring a warm enough sleeping bag for potentially cold temperatures. Lastly, be mindful of local wildlife. If bears or other animals are a potential threat, take precautions to keep food and trash sealed and out of reach from such critters.

SAFETY FIRST

· Fire When Ready

Guns can be dangerous if not handled correctly. The state of Texas requires a hunter's education course for every hunter, which is good for life, after completion. You can get a one-time deferral good for a year, but it is highly recommended that you go through safety courses before operating a gun.

· Beware of Snakes

Most likely, your hunting site will be home to slithery critters, as well as the prey you are there to hunt. Only about 10 percent of Texas' snakes are dangerous for humans, so the first step to safety is identification. Bring a field guide, and be on the lookout for copperheads, cottonmouths and rattlesnakes. If you or a companion are bitten, the best solution is to get to a nearby hospital. Do not try to cut around the puncture or try to suck out the venom. Instead, clean around the wound with disinfectant soap, take off jewelry or items that may restrict the area, and try to limit movement of the extremity until you can get to a doctor.

Whether you are hoping to bag meat for the winter, or you want a 16-point buck over the mantel, a great trip starts with the right equipment and preparation. Staying safe while you are out will ensure a successful hunt is not overshadowed by injury or tragedy. With these tips, you are ready to aim and fire. **NOW**

What Is a Mutual Fund?

Investments may take many forms. Some people buy and sell stocks and bonds, while others purchase real estate. Another common investment tool is a mutual fund.

Mutual Funds

By investing in a mutual fund, you're essentially pooling your money with other investors to access a broader range of stocks or bonds than most people could own by themselves. According to the Investment Company Institute®, there are more than 8,900 mutual fund choices in the United States today controlling close to \$15 trillion in assets¹. The investment company uses the assets in the fund to buy and sell securities, such as stocks or bonds, in pursuit of a specific objective as outlined by the company charter.

Mutual Fund Objectives

One objective a mutual fund may attempt to achieve is long-term growth of capital. This may be done by purchasing the stock of large companies that have consistently made a profit, or buying the inexpensive stock of smaller companies in hopes that the value increases. Some funds may be invested primarily in foreign companies, while others invest in specific market sectors, such as technology or health care.

Some funds are developed to generate income for the investors. Dividends from bonds or preferred stocks held by these funds are accumulated and distributed to investors on a regular basis. If the fund's assets are invested in municipal bonds, the dividends may be exempt from federal taxes, which would provide the investor with income taxed solely at the state or local level.

How a Fund Is Managed

Many funds are actively managed, meaning an



experienced investment advisor will take an active role in determining the portfolio, or holdings, of the fund. The securities held in a fund may change based on how well a security performs and meets the objective of the fund.

Other funds are called index funds and attempt to mirror the performance of a given index, such as the S&P 500® or the Russell 2000® Indexes. The fund portfolio will generally contain stocks of as many companies in the index as is possible in amounts reflecting the weighting assigned by the index. NOW



Don't Get Sidelined

An injury commonly associated with famous athletes can bedevil nonathletic people also. The anterior cruciate ligament tear, or better known as a torn ACL, is actually a common problem. The ACL is one of the ligaments that connects the thigh bone (femur) to the tibia, which is one of the leg bones. Considering the way the knee is structured and its function, it is not surprising that it is prone to this and many other injuries. Some of the ACL's functions are to assist in changing position, bending, twisting and general stability and mobility of the knee. An injury occurs when the ligament is overstretched or tears.

These injuries occur when there is an abrupt movement, such as pivoting, having the foot planted when changing position and awkward landings with the knee fully extended and player-to-player contact. It has been found that women are more prone to this injury than men due to a combination of female knee anatomy, the effect of estrogen on ligaments, physical conditioning and muscle strength. When the ACL is torn, most people report feeling a pop in the knee. Severe pain follows immediately. Because of the swelling within the knee, straightening or even fully extending it will be challenging with a noticeable lack of stability in the knee.

Treatment after the injury will depend upon several factors, but primary to the

decision is what your level of activity was before the injury and what level of activity you wish to return to. Not every torn ACL needs to be repaired surgically. If your activity level was more sedentary and you are not inclined toward sports, you might opt for physical therapy and an exercise program to build strength and reduce further loss of function in the knee. Those who are more athletic will no doubt choose the surgical remedy to repair the structure, so they can return to their previous level of function. Recovery with the surgical option takes anywhere from four to six months before athletes can expect to return fully to normal.

Prevention of ACL injuries can be as simple as proper stretching and strengthening of the legs and also developing core and hip strength. Athletes should be taught the proper mechanics of exercises involving squatting, lunging and jumping to avoid ankle and knee collapse. Non-athletes and those who play sports should take extra care to watch their knee position when turning or twisting. It isn't possible to avoid all conflict with your knees, but being aware and having proper skill training will go a long way toward avoiding injuries. NOW

In the Kitchen With Marilyn Adlof

Marilyn Adlof is a self-taught cook who enjoys baking and down-home cooking. "I was motivated by the fact that I come from a long line of good cooks," she confessed, "so I had to continue the tradition." Her family heritage has definitely had an influence on her cooking journey. "I grew up at a time when everything centered around family, church and school," she said. "There were always large group gatherings with plenty of homemade breads, mouthwatering pastries and sweets of all kinds."

Although small in comparison to the memories she has from childhood, Marilyn's gatherings today allow her to set a pretty table using her china, crystal and silver. "My favorite flavoring is Adams Best vanilla," she shared, "and there's something therapeutic about handling a rolling pin!" NOW

Never Fail Pastry

1/2 cup shortening 1 cup flour with a dash of salt 1/4 cup ice water

- **1.** Cut shortening into flour with two knives until slightly crumbly. Continue mixing with pastry blender, twisting and turning until mixture becomes the size of small peas.
- **2.** Add water all at one time, stirring with a spoon until ball forms. With floured hands, form ball into a flattened ball and roll out on floured surface. (I use a wooden rolling pin and wooden cutting board, both of which have also been floured.)
- **3.** Hold an inverted pie plate over rolled pastry to check for size. Roll about half the pastry onto the rolling pin and roll into pie plate. Prick the bottom and sides lightly with a fork prior to baking at 350 F until lightly browned.

Banana Cream Pie

2 eggs
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 tsp. salt
2 Tbsp. cornstarch
2 cups rich milk
1 tsp. Adams Best vanilla flavoring
2 tsp. butter
3-4 bananas
Pie shell
Cool Whip topping, to taste

- **1.** Divide egg yolks from whites. Slightly beat egg yolks; set aside.
- **2.** Mix sugar, salt and cornstarch in a saucepan. Slowly stir in milk. Boil 1-2 minutes over medium heat, stirring constantly until mixture begins to thicken. Remove from heat.
- **3.** Stir half of the mixture into the egg yolks, and then blend back into the remaining hot

mixture. Cook until thick, stirring constantly. Remove from heat.

- **4.** Add vanilla and butter; let cool. If preferred, to chill, pour into a bowl and cover with plastic wrap, making sure the wrap touches the pudding in the center.
- **5.** Slice 1 to 1 1/2 bananas into the bottom of a baked pie shell. Slice another 2 bananas into the pudding mixture. Pour pudding mixture into pie shell. Garnish with dollops of Cool Whip topping, if desired.

Asparagus Pea Casserole

1 14.5-oz. can English peas, drained

1 14.5-oz. can cut asparagus, drained

1 8-oz. can water chestnuts, drained and chopped

1/2 lb. New York cheese (or cheese of your choice), grated

Salt, to taste

1 10-oz. can mushroom soup

- **1.** Place a layer of peas, asparagus, water chestnuts and cheese in a greased casserole dish. Repeat layers. Season to taste.
- **2.** Pour soup over casserole and top with a final layer of cheese. Bake at 350 F for 30 minutes or until cheese is melted and casserole is heated thoroughly.

Brownies

2 oz. bitter chocolate 1/2 cup salad oil

3/4 cup sifted flour

1 cup sugar

1/2 tsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. salt

2 eggs

1 tsp. Adams Best vanilla flavoring

1 cup nuts (optional)

- **I.** Melt chocolate in salad oil. In a separate mixing bowl, cream flour, sugar, baking powder, salt and eggs together. Add vanilla, chocolate mixture and nuts, if desired.
- **2.** Pour into a buttered, waxed-paper lined pan. Bake at 315-320 F for 20 minutes.
- **3.** The recipe can easily be doubled to make larger quantities. For a single recipe, use a smaller baking pan. For a doubled recipe, use a larger baking pan.
