EDITOR'S NOTE

Pink is everywhere ...

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, so you're likely to see a lot of pink this month. You'll see everything from license plate frames to firefighters in pink T-shirts. There are many ways to give to groups like Breast Cancer Research Foundation, National Breast Cancer Coalition Fund (both of which focus on finding a cure), Breast Cancer Prevention Partners (which focuses on preventing new cases), The National Breast Cancer Foundation and Dr. Susan Love Research Foundation (which both look for ways to improve the lives of people with breast cancer). You will likely have the opportunity to participate in a 5K or other fundraising events. Take the opportunity. Breast cancer affects so many lives. It is still the second leading cause of death in women.

But don't forget that a much smaller number of men also get breast cancer each year. About I in 100 white people who develop breast cancer is a man. The number is about I in 70 for black people. While there are fewer than 3,000 cases of male breast cancer each year, the death rate among men is much higher, because men don't even realize they can have it. The father of a co-worker recently died from it. We don't have "breasts," but we have some of all the tissues involved. As with women, the most common sign is a lump. Early detection is key, and the word is getting out. Methodist Charlton Medical Center recently held a breast cancer event that included a special session for men, hosted by male survivors.

Female or male, it's important to be aware of your body. Seek treatment early.

Our current location is next door to GDMP. We've added a salon, where ladies can come to have their hair and scalp serviced, in a private setting. AT HOME WITH SEAN AND TERI O'CONNOR

Reaching the Goal

When arriving at the home of Sean and Teri O'Connor, three stones in the courtyard let you know who you're about to meet, even before the dogs greet you. They declare Laugh, Live, Love, and that's what this family does.

Longtime Duncanville residents, they bought their current house in 2003, moved away for a few years and came back to the same house. "We're only the second owners of this house," Sean said. "The previous owner was a chef and did catering here. But we bought it because of the pool."

Teri agreed, "We missed the pool we had before we moved to the Dallas area. It was something we wanted for our girls." Sean smiled. "Yeah, we told the agent we wanted a great pool, a nice backyard and a good house," he said. "When we walked in, the house was OK. It was nice. But when we saw the backyard, we said, 'OK. We're here."

Their youngest daughter, Danielle, was only in kindergarten then. Now she's the only one still at home. "All the rooms are mine now," Danielle explained. "I'm moving into my oldest sister, Jackie's, room. My room will become the new guest room."

Sean and Teri met at a church summer camp. Teri was there on staff to lead worship. Sean was just there to hang out with his friends. But they were about the same age, and Teri caught Sean's eye, right off. "I asked her out, and she said, 'No."

Teri laughed. "He asked me out more than once, and I kept telling him no. I finally told him, 'Me counselor. You camper. No.' It was against the rules. Then he asked me if that was the only reason. I was thrown off by that, and said, 'Well, yeah, I guess so.' Then Sean replied, 'Great! I just became a counselor two hours ago!"

"I was determined to knock down every barrier!" Sean laughed. "When I asked if I could be made a counselor, they laughed and said they'd been waiting for me to ask." They married in 1990 and had three daughters, Jackie who just finished a master's degree and is starting a career, Miranda who just married and Danielle who is enjoying all the extra space at home.



Sean trained as a pastor but spent years coaching high school sports at private schools in and near Duncanville. "I was at the Evangelical Methodist Church's pastor's school, just down the street, and I was looking out the doors between sessions. The church ran a school, and it was track season. The students were outside practicing without a coach. The pastor came up and asked me, 'Didn't you used to do that?' I said, 'Yeah.' In college, my goal had been to go to the Olympics for javelin. 'They alright?' he asked. I told him, 'They're gonna get hurt!' He said, 'Tell you what. You go help them, and I'll give you credit for the rest of the pastor's school. I worked with them for a few hours. The next month, several of the boys I had helped medaled at their track and field meet. The head of the school's board called and asked me to be their athletic director. I said, 'Yes.' So, we moved from Copperas Cove to Duncanville." That began a long stretch of coaching high school and college sports.

"Sean didn't just coach," Teri explained. "He ministered to the kids. A lot of single moms needed help with the turmoil of adolescence. They'd call here, and Sean would get on the phone."

"I'd answer and they'd say, 'You know, Coach, if he can't follow instructions at home, I think he needs to sit this week out," Sean remembered. "I'd say, 'Put him on. ... Why haven't you done what your mother asked you? I will. No, go do it now. I'll wait.' They'd come back. 'Now go apologize to your mother. I will. No, now. I'll wait.' We did life with them."

Teri nodded. "I always said we had three daughters and 85 sons. They'd ask me, 'Mrs. Coach, can we come over and swim?' In six-man football there's a





mercy rule. If you're ahead by 45 points at halftime, the game's over. I'd say, 'Only if you're done by halftime!' Still today, it's hard to go to Tom Thumb without meeting somebody we know from his time as a coach or mine as a teacher."

A few years ago, Sean transitioned back to pastoring a church in Carrollton, and Teri started a doctorate in leadership. While finishing her coursework, she's commuting to Kentucky and Minnesota to help Christian schools as a certified fundraising executive (CFRE). "I design multi-million dollar projects for noble causes," she explained. "These schools are just one of the things I do."

A couple of years ago, the family experienced a crisis of their own. "Sean had a cough, so he went to CareNow. They thought he had pneumonia. After 10 days of treating him for that, they sent him to the hospital in Denton. What he had was heart failure. They did a triple bypass."

"They had to go back in 24 hours later. It's taken two years to recover from that," Sean added.

Teri grimaced. "He didn't do well in that second operation. They told me to prepare for the worst. They were planning to stop his heart and restart it, but they weren't sure they could get it to restart. I went home and called the kids together. I called friends and asked them to pray. Then, a friend at the hospital called to say Sean's numbers had just corrected themselves. I asked when it happened. He told me 10:13 p.m., and I couldn't stop laughing. Romans 10:13 is Sean's favorite Bible verse. It's all over his office!"

Sean and Teri are still involved with young people. They co-lead the young adult ministry at the church Sean pastors. They believe working with the 20- to 30-year-olds keeps them young. "Pastoring is a lot like coaching," Sean said. "They're both 24/7 jobs, and it's all about learning to love people. The more you do with them, the more you love them." NOW







and encouraging them, so that they will be successful, and they will do good things," John shared. "The people at my church say thank-you and encourage me. One of my dad's friends said it encouraged him to finish his book."

Doing good things is something John knows about firsthand. He and his father volunteer at their church once a week, doing everything from setting up chairs for services to arranging for PowerPoint presentations for classes, to cleaning. John's mom said he also likes to help around the house as well as in the community. He and his father often walk their neighborhood picking up litter. "He's a hero in our church, in our community and in our home," she said.

John's other future plans are to earn his MBA degree and to become a preacher or maybe the president. 




Founded in the 1840s on Big Cypress Bayou, Jefferson was once the largest inland river port in Texas. Steamships plied this river to New Orleans by way of the Red and Mississippi Rivers and brought a level of prosperity not seen by other cities in this region. If it's a historic hotel you prefer, the Excelsior House Hotel is located downtown and has been in continuous operation since the 1850s.





While the pace is slower here, you'll quickly find an attraction to interest almost everyone and a memory waiting to be made. There are museums, galleries and an original restored Carnegie Library. For model railroad enthusiasts of all ages, the R.D. Moses Model Railroad is located in the Depot directly behind the Jefferson Historical Museum. Train rides, soda fountains, a petting zoo with exotic animals, shops and boutiques, informative horse-drawn carriage rides and coach tours on brick streets await your exploration and are in operation year-round. To fuel all that activity, you'll find Jefferson has everything from unique sandwiches, award-winning barbecue, burgers and fudge to bistros, wine, coffee bars and fine dining establishments. If you still have the energy, you will find ghost tours available on weekends with fascinating stories of hauntings, past and present.

Festivals abound all year with a candlelight Christmas season, an oldfashioned Fourth of July celebration and a pilgrimage of homes. Add to that Mardi Gras, motorcycle rallies and car shows, Bigfoot sightings, history symposiums and Girlfriend Weekend book festivals, and you might have to stop to catch your breath. But, if you're just looking to get away from the crowds for a weekend, Jefferson offers that, too. And that feeling of relaxation and contentment you'll carry home with you comes free of charge. NOW


