

EDITOR'S NOTE


Fall is an adventure ...

A dog named Pickles was the inspiration for the name of what is currently the fastest growing sport in the United States. The year was 1965, and the place was Joel Pritchard's home on Bainbridge Island, Washington. Joel and his friends, Bill Bell and Barney McCallum, wanted to create a sport the whole family, young and old, could play. Taking an old badminton court, wiffle balls and table tennis rackets and using mostly tennis rules and net, the three men accomplished their goal. As family members and friends played, it was Pickles who laid in wait in the bushes to chase out-of-bounds balls. As the legend goes, "Pickles' balls" became pickleball.

Max and Debbie Taylor caught the pickleball "bug" during an out-of-state visit with longtime friends, Jack and Cindy Dierkes, who introduced them to the game three years ago. "I haven't picked up a tennis racquet since," Max said. The couple built a barn for their RV but converted that space to an indoor, climate-controlled pickleball court. Then they converted their clay tennis court into four lit pickleball courts. "Right now, pickleball courts are somewhat hard to locate, but the paddles and balls can be found at Wal-Mart or any sporting goods store and aren't that expensive," Max said. "We poured concrete over the clay tennis court, and several pickleball friends helped me paint the courts and the lines. Figuring out how to line off the courts became a lesson in geometry, but fellow pickleball player, Terry Moore, came up with an easy solution for us!"

The lights often burn brightly on Debbie and Max's courts, with three to four evenings of pickleball played on a weekly basis. Players book their courts in advance through an online app created specifically for pickleball around the U.S. (Yes, there's an app for everything.) Occasionally, the Taylors host a "mixer" on a weekend for players of all skill levels. Max added, "It's a game that has multiple strategies. You can be what's called a "dinker" by hitting the ball just over the net, similar to a drop down in tennis, or you can be what's called a "banger" who likes to play at a fast pace and hit the ball hard. Currently, we have about 20 or more players who come to play on a weekly basis. We're all simply addicted to this game!"

Tennis, racquetball and table tennis players will see similarities in the court, paddle, ball, net and rules used in pickleball. "This is an easy-to-learn sport," Debbie explained. "All ages and abilities can play pickleball, even old people like me. It's a good workout, and it's the fasting growing sport around the world."

Max agreed, "It's easy to pick up. It's amazing to see how quickly players increase their skill level after just one or two times playing this game. Like anything else, the more you practice, the better you get." Also, with more experience comes mastering different shots. For some players, they can hit an underspin to make the ball curve in the air, while others become adept at lobbing over their opponents or dropping the ball just over the net. Players do have to get used to staying out of the kitchen (the red part of the court by the net) and having both the server and partner outside the back line when serving."

Max and Debbie are members of Northside Baptist Church and see their pickleball playing as a church outreach. Debbie said, "We encourage our pickleball friends to rotate partners often and invite others to come play. Pickleball is such a great way to meet different people in the community."

Max added, "Our pastor, Daniel Harper, encourages us to get out of our comfort zones to meet our neighbors. What better way to "break the ice" than over a friendly game of pickleball with a stranger?"

Typically, players play six to 10 games in an evening. Most of the time players will rotate partners every two to three games. Some games take about 10 minutes while others take 30 minutes. "Only the serving team can score a point, so games sometimes run longer if the receiving team keeps winning most of the points," Max explained.

As in all sports, there's a governing body, the United States Pickleball Association, which makes the rules, and there are other groups, such as the





American Pickleball Association, state/ local associations and gyms, through which players become members and play and/or watch tournaments. "It's amazing how many pickleball tournaments are being scheduled all over the Metroplex," Max stated.

Max, a Palestine, Texas, native, and Debbie, a Waco, Texas, native, met while students at Stephen F. Austin State University. "We came to Corsicana as teachers and stayed," Debbie said. "We wouldn't trade life here for anywhere else. Our daughter, Jill, and her family live next door, and daughter, Amy, and her family, live in Spring, Texas. We now have five perfect grandchildren."

Max and Debbie own a child nutrition business, and Debbie has taught swimming lessons for the past 50 years. They are active at their church, and Max is a member of the local Gideons International camp. Debbie serves as a Sunday school teacher and is on the Navarro County Child Protective Services board.

Beyond pickleball, Max enjoys playing golf, and Debbie is always doing something with the grandkids. The couple enjoys taking trips, especially in their RV. "We have a bucket list of trips we want to make," Max said. "Otherwise, we have a lot of the things we would do on a vacation right in our backyard."

The Taylors encourage everyone to come watch and, hopefully, try their hand at pickleball, whether on their courts or at the Corsicana YMCA's converted pickleball court. "Don't be afraid to get out there and play," Max encouraged. "You'll pick it up quickly and probably become just as addicted to this sport as the rest of us have!" NOW

The year was 1871. President Ulysses S. Grant, in his first term, was leading the United States through a period of recovery after the Civil War and Lincoln's assassination. The Chicago Fire, which killed 300 people and left 100,000-plus homeless, was headline news. And Father Peter Chady, newly ordained that year, was assigned the job of founding a church and parish, Immaculate Conception Church, in Corsicana, Texas, a fledgling city that had been founded in 1848. "This is the oldest, continuously active church in the Catholic Diocese of Dallas," a lifetime member, Joe Francis Borsellino, stated. "The people make it special."

Dee Schriefer, a member since 1970 and longtime church secretary, agreed. "It's interesting to look back and see how the parish has grown. We've done a good job carrying on

what was started so long ago. She and her husband, Alfred, settled in Corsicana because of James L. Collins Catholic School. "The parish and the school are diverse. We welcome and celebrate our many cultures. Our church members volunteer throughout Corsicana, including at Hope Center, Food for Fitness and the food pantry."

"People get something out of this parish that creates inspiration with God's given grace," Lewis Palos, a native of Corsicana, retired police officer and a church deacon for nearly 30 years, shared. "The Eucharist has been continued for 2,000 years. The Eucharist is a comfort to people in turmoil, distress and darkness. Our faith is special in that way." Lewis added, "We've had an increase in parishioners. Young people are making the move to the faith."

Early locations of the parish church and school, which was later closed, were where Sam Houston Elementary, and the original church was at 15th and West Collin Street. The church and school's current location on Highway 22 were secured after James L. Collins, a Corsicana oilman, and his friend Fr. Vitus Graffeo dreamed of being able to provide a Catholic education in Corsicana. James L. Collins left a large part of his estate to Immaculate Conception for that purpose. Groundbreaking at the beautifully landscaped campus was in 1955. "We owe a lot to James L. Collins," Dee said. "We've grown to 1,130 families registered at this church."

Lewis agreed, "We're so lucky to have this campus."

The 150th birthday celebration, which began on July 4, 2021, will consist of monthly events throughout the birthday year, such as a movie at the Palace Theatre and a dinner at the Cook Center. This month, the bishop will lead a mass followed by a festival on the grounds. In November, veterans will be recognized on Veterans Day, and they will be recognized again in May 2022 on Memorial Day. The parish is currently led by Fr. Juan Carlos Marin. "We will also be remembering generations of families who have been a part of this parish," Dee explained.

"I was greatly influenced by older people in the parish," Lewis added. "I was raised here, and this is home."

Dick and Pearl Skewes have been parish members since 1970. Dick, a past president of the local Rotary Club and community volunteer, has helped the church with jail ministry outreach. "When we travel, we attend Mass. We are at home anywhere because it's the same Mass worldwide," Pearl said.

Joe Francis "butchered for 30 years" before retiring. He and his wife raised their children in this church. "The members are loving and caring," he remarked. He recalled that, in his youthful days as an altar boy, Fr. Graffeo 'always got on my case" for swinging on the church's bell pull so hard that the bell would flip over, causing a problem. "We had the nativity scene inside the church. It was pretty," he added.

Not only has Dee been employed by the church, but she has volunteered in outreach ministries and has served as the altar society president, often setting up for Mass. "I love the parish and Corsicana as a community," she remarked. "I see people I know everywhere I go."

Lewis reflected on the secret to the parish's long success in Corsicana. "We have a history of dedicated people. The older generations set the foundation stones, raised the money and were involved in the community and education. We're continuing to build the kingdom of God." NOW



Mini Pumpkin Cheesecake Balls

- 1 16-oz. pkg. cream cheese, room temperature
- 1/2 cup pumpkin purée
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar or stevia
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- 1/2 tsp. sea salt
- 1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
- I cup gluten-free graham cracker crumbs
- 1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice

1. In a large or stand mixer bowl, blend the

- first 6 ingredients with a mixer until creamy. The mixture should be fairly stiff; if not, add more sugar.
- **2.** Put the next 3 items into a small bowl; mix thoroughly.
- **3.** Dust hands with powdered sugar; form the dough into $1 \frac{1}{2}$ -inch balls.
- **4.** Roll the balls in the cracker mixture; insert the pretzel sticks and parsley leaves.
- **5.** Place the balls on a tray. Cover with plastic wrap; refrigerate overnight.

1 16- to 20-oz. box brownie mix PAM cooking spray

I cup dark chocolate chips 1/2 cup chunky peanut butter Green, black and gray icing

- **1.** Preheat the oven to the brownie mix's package recommendation.
- **2.** Line a sheet pan with parchment paper; spray with PAM.
- **3.** Prepare the brownie mix per the package directions.
- **4.** Add the dark chocolate chips and chunky peanut butter; mix until incorporated.
- **5.** Spread the batter into the prepared pan, making sure the center is slightly lower than the edges. Bake as directed.
- **6.** Cool the brownies slightly. Cut into tombstone shapes; let them cool to set.
- **7.** Decorate with green, gray and black icing to look like headstones; let the icing dry.

Smoked Salmon Cream Cheese Pumpkin Ball

- 1 lb. smoked salmon
- 1 8-oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened
- 1 1/2 tsp. horseradish
- I cup sharp cheddar, finely shredded Zest from I lemon

1 tsp. Worcestershire or 1/2 tsp. liquid smoke Cooking oil Turmeric or curry powder, to taste 3 yards string or yarn Celery stick and celery leaves Peppers and veggies (optional) Black and orange tortilla chips

- **1.** Flake the salmon from the skin; mix with the cream cheese, horseradish, cheddar cheese, lemon zest and either sauce.
- 2. Cover your hands with oil; form the mixture into a ball. On a sheet of plastic wrap large enough to cover the entire ball, sprinkle turmeric or curry powder.
- **3.** Roll the ball in the spices; wrap in the plastic.
- **4.** Cut the string into 18-inch pieces. Lay all the pieces together; knot in the center to form 6 legs.
- **5.** Set the ball centered at the knot. Bring the ends together tightly to form indentations resembling a pumpkin. Chill for at least 2 hours.
- 6. Unwrap; insert the celery stick as the stem; add the celery leaves. Decorate as a jack-o'-lantern if desired, using peppers or other veggies.
- **7.** Surround with chips or veggies.

Witch Fingers

- 1 14-oz. pkg. Lit'l Smokies I bottle sauce of choice, to taste (barbecue sauce, salsa verde, honey mustard or garlic Parmesan) Sliced almonds, to taste
- 1. Cut a cuticle shape out of one end of each sausage.
- 2. Make a couple shallow cuts in each sausage to look like a knuckle.
- **3.** In a Crock-Pot or fondue pot, cover the "fingers" in the chosen sauce. Add the sliced almonds; warm the sausages thoroughly.


- **3.** Place the cracked boiled eggs in the bag. Remove as much air as possible; refrigerate overnight.
- **4.** Peel the eggs; halve. Place the yolks into a bowl or zipper bag.
- 5. Place the white halves on a tray.
- **6.** Finely mash the yolks; add the sour cream, hot sauce or mustard and lemon juice or pickle juice.
- **7.** Mash everything together until well blended.
- **8.** Cut the corner off a zipper bag; fill it with the egg halves mixture.
- 9. Halve 12 jumbo olives.

- **10.** Place an olive half on each egg to form spider bodies.
- **11.** Slice one olive per egg into 4 rings; place the closed end of each olive next to the olive "body" to form the spider's head.
- **12.** Halve the rings to form the spider legs.
- **13.** Add pimento to the spiders' backs to make black widows.

Ogre Eyes

12-15 medium baby bella mushroom caps

- 1/2 lb. Italian sausage
- 1/2 tsp. minced garlic
- I Tbsp. minced flat leaf parsley Italian seasoning, to taste
- 1/2 tsp. onion powder
- 1/2 cup Italian blend shredded cheese
- 1/2 cup Parmesan, finely grated
- 1 5- to 6-oz. jar green olives stuffed with pimento
- **1.** Preheat the oven to 400 F; line a sheet pan with parchment paper.
- **2.** Remove and chop the mushroom stems; set aside.
- **3.** Arrange the caps on the prepared pan.
- **4.** Sauté the sausage, garlic, half of the mushroom stems, parsley, Italian seasoning and onion powder; cook until the sausage is just pink.
- **5.** Remove from the heat; add the cheese blend.
- **6.** Using a melon ball or small ice cream scoop, stuff the caps with the sausage mixture. Top with Parmesan.
- **7.** Slice the stuffed green olives into the rings; place in the center of each cap to form eyes' irises. Bake for 15-20 minutes.
- **8.** The eyes are best served warm, but they can be reheated in the microwave for 1-2 minutes.

Looking for the perfect day trip or perhaps a nearby overnight getaway? North of Fort Worth, a world of nature waits to provide relaxation and a fantastic opportunity to spend time outdoors. The Fort Worth Nature Center & Refuge includes forests, prairies and wetlands. When the city created Lake Worth in 1914, they purchased land around the West Fork of the Trinity River, protecting drinking water quality for the community. Local citizens and the Fort Worth Audubon Society convinced the Park Board to designate land in 1964, providing a wildlife sanctuary and nature preserve. FWNC&R became a reality, and in 1980, the U.S. Department of the Interior designated it a national landmark.

The center holds various events such as field experiences, holiday and summer programs, canoe trips, hikes, walks and more. Start at the Hardwicke Interpretive Center. There, learn about the area and view aquariums that house a few snakes, turtles and a demonstrative alligator. Examine displays of tracks and other items to identify them later while hiking one of many trails.

Behind the Hardwicke, look for animals undergoing rehabilitation, like a young owl who peers at visitors, seemingly

bored by the intrusion. A 220-yard loop contains displays about the area. A simple walk, the loop is suitable for wheelchairs and strollers.

Although a few trails have steep steps, most have smooth surfaces, easy for guests to enjoy the trail. The prairies, marshes and forests each invite exploration. On the hottest days, trees shade the trails. Coupled with gentle breezes, it makes a fascinating place to break free from life's bustle.

For the less adventurous visitor, the boardwalk includes a



covered pavilion, perfect for a picnic. With sidewalks and literal boards, anyone can venture close to the wetlands. Fish from a covered area where water lilies provide beauty in the gentle movement of the water. In the distance, cranes pose for those who can see them without threating their safety. Ample opportunities to view wildlife abound. Relax, watch and wait for turtles, frogs, fish, birds and others to welcome you to their home, or simply enjoy the cool breeze coming across the water.

While bison and prairie dogs shy away from visitors and heat, both make FWNC&R their home and appear at times. When hiking through the forest, expect to hear multiple sounds, and try to identify various inhabitants. With a dozen different trails, let adventure entice you to visit more than once, and try them all.

During your visit, don't forget to venture over to Greer Island. An easy walkway crosses the water, leading to two trails where you might spot an infamous creature. In the summer of 1969, numerous Fort Worth residents reported seeing a giant, hairy half-man, half-goat at Lake Worth. First sighted on Greer Island, rumors say he still calls the area home.

With bed-and-breakfasts, hotels and campgrounds in the area, visitors can easily turn a wondrous day trip into a multiple-day adventure. Also in the area, the legendary Hip Pocket Theatre offers another unique experience. The outdoor theater boasts its 45th season of actors portraying distinctive characters in original plays. While visiting FWNC&R, consider staying overnight, and take in a live play surrounded by the beauty and peace of nature. NOW
