#### **EDITOR'S NOTE**


This season screams with ghosts and goblins!



In 1894, the "original Brice" was born on the land in Navarro County that Brice Bonner IV still farms and ranches. It's a generational thing, and Brice Bonner V, age 11, is following in his dad's footsteps in his love of the land and water when on their ranch, hunting or fishing. A fifth-grader at Kerens ISD, Brice V shared proudly, "I got my first deer three years ago."

"We enjoy anything outdoors," Brice IV added. Fishing is currently their primary shared passion when not working or in school. Brice IV, a former Mildred High School fishing club adult volunteer, can now be found most Wednesday nights fishing for three hours each time with Brice V as part of the Wednesday Nighter Richland Chamber group. "We have a Facebook page and different jackpots," Brice IV explained.

In preparation, father and son enjoy hand tying and molding lead to make their own customized jigs. "I've caught a 5-pounder on one of our homemade jigs," Brice V said. He's also won the Media Bass youth division. His favorite memory? "I caught my biggest bass ever from the dock. I hooked it, but Dad thought it was a limb. He looked up at a plane, and the line took off." One of Brice V's goals now is to qualify for the Bassmaster Open trials.

"My dad, Brice III, got me into fishing and hunting," Brice IV stated. "Everyone around here knew him from his Aggie General days. He bought my first johnboat when I was in high school, so I had my driver's license. I was king of the lake and got into bass fishing." Brice IV has broken his own Richland Chambers record and has repeatedly made great fishing memories. "During one of the Wednesday Nighters, I hooked an 8-pounder, it jumped, the hook came out and the line broke. It was the one that got away," he recalled.

Outdoor sports are a shared passion throughout the Bonner family. "All of my people are big outdoorsmen," Brice IV stated. "My wife, Whitney, is a crappie fisherman, and our daughter, Jessie, age 5, a pre-K student in Kerens, is coming along."




When not out on the lake, the two Brices can often be found on the land hunting dove or deer. "Last year, I won the youth draw hunts at the WMAs two times in a row," Brice V, shared. Huck, their black Lab, however, hasn't yet become much of a bird dog. "Huck is a squirrel dog. He brings back squirrels after a while," Brice V added. His challenges include the sun, winter cold and having to be patient.

Farming and ranching take up much of Brice IV's time, but he also shares some necessary skills in that area with his son. He runs a cow/calf operation, raising Black Angus and Charolais. A graduate of Mildred High School, he attended Navarro College, Tarleton State University and Texas State Technical College. Brice IV holds a diesel agricultural certification. "I enjoy living and working in Navarro County because I know somebody almost everywhere I go," he stated.

"Back in the day, I used to team rope at jackpot ropings and rodeos," Brice IV said. Now, he's teaching Brice V to rope, starting with roping their commercial goats.

"This is my third year to show goats at the Navarro County Youth Expo," Brice V said. "I like showing







goats because I get out of school." He participates in the woodworking, arts and crafts and cooking events during the 4-H and FFA annual show as well.

The family is also involved in a sport that Brice V enjoys. "I like to play baseball," he said. In school, his favorite subject is science.

The family's travels mostly revolve around fishing and baseball tournaments and hunting outings. "We like trips into East Texas and Davy Crockett National Forest and hunt around Hamilton, Texas," Brice IV. remarked.



For those who want to learn about fishing and hunting, Brice IV recommended getting with some experienced fishermen or hunters. "We taught kids at Mildred High School who didn't know anything about fishing to fish and be on the team," he said. There are also programs sponsored through the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and private guide services.

Brice IV sees commercial, industrial and residential development as the biggest threat to the outdoor way of life. "I like the country the way it is," he said. "We're losing a lot of farm and ranch acreage to development and higher

taxes. I hope my son likes the outdoor way of life as much as I like to live it and will keep his interest in it while gaining skills."

"We need more kids to join us," Brice V agreed.

"I see my niece, nephew and friends' kids enjoying outdoor sports," Brice IV concluded. "Hunting and fishing teach patience and what can happen with the weather and wind. Nature is always in control. Just when we think we have everything under control, the weather or something changes." These are valuable life lessons still being taught and learned since time began. NOW

Anytime is a great time to visit family-owned Green Tree Pecan Co., but with the holiday season just around the corner, it's almost a must. Owners Dennis and Kim Bancroft greet and help customers find just the right treats and eats. "We love getting to meet and know so many people through the years," Dennis said. "Some people come by just to see our two dogs that come to work with us every day and hang out in the office."

Chestnuts might roast in that popular Christmas melody, but at Green Tree Pecan, the fruit of the Texas Official State Tree holds center court. Customers can enjoy the downhome atmosphere in person or shop online or by phone. The store offers pecans, almonds, Brazil nuts, cashews and peanuts in raw, roasted or mixed packaging. Candies, dried fruits, home decor items, garden and flowering plants in season and nut and fruit trees are also available. Green Tree Pecan Company is also the place to go for commercial pecan shelling and individual custom cracking. Their deli serves

breakfast and lunch items including cold sandwiches, hot dogs and burgers. They also serve plate lunches on designated days throughout each week. "We provide a great product and service at a reasonable price," Dennis explained.

The business now employs 10 people. "We started harvesting pecans and incorporated in 1984," Dennis recalled. From 1992-2014, the family sold pecans out of a booth at Canton First Mondays, and in 2000, Dennis purchased his dad's interest in the pecan shelling business. "Since 2000, we've been able to grow our business exponentially," Dennis added. "This year will make 47 years that we have been in the pecan business."

A Navarro County native, Dennis was raised in Powell. "My family all live in Navarro County and are part of our business," he stated. "Our daughter, Rebecca, handles all of our retail shipping and office duties. Our son, John, handles the pecan shelling plant and product packaging. We put Bible verses in our advertisements because, in that way, we have found the true value of life and hope that others will find it, too."

As the business grew, Dennis still found time to give back to his community. He served 19 years as the mayor of Powell, as the Powell VFD's fire chief and on the Navarro County Planning & Zoning Commission. He has been a Navarro Regional Hospital trustee and a Navarro County Emergency Services District commissioner.

When the family isn't at work, Dennis and Kim enjoy traveling and RVing across Texas and visiting the San Juan Mountains in Colorado. At home, during breaks from the store, they enjoy their small farm and watching wildlife pass through the acreage.





#### **Seafood Dressing**

- 3 boxes honey sweet corn bread mix Eggs (2 more than the corn bread mix requires)
- 1 stick butter
- 4 cups onions, diced
- 3 cups celery, diced
- 1 lb. 70 count shrimp
- 1 lb. crab meat
- 1 tsp. sage

- Salt, to taste Pepper, to taste 8 cups chicken broth
- **I.** In a bowl, prepare the corn bread mix according to package directions; add two additional eggs to the batter. Set aside.
- **2.** In a skillet, melt the butter. Sauté the onions and celery. Add the shrimp and crab meat.
- **3.** Combine the shrimp mixture with the

corn bread mixture. Add the sage, salt and pepper; mix well.

**4.** Mix in the chicken broth; pour the completed batter into a baking dish. Cover the dish with foil; bake for 1 hour at 350 F. Remove the foil; bake for an additional 30 minutes or until the top starts browning.

#### **Shrimp Cocktail**

1 lb. 70 count shrimp
1 30-oz. can Ro-Tel
Juice of 2 limes
1/2 8-oz. bottle prepared chili sauce
3-4 oz. orange juice
Salt, to taste
Pepper, to taste
Avocado, sliced
Tortilla chips

- **1.** In a large pan, boil the shrimp. Drain; set aside.
- **2.** For the sauce: In a bowl, combine the Ro-Tel, lime juice, chili sauce, orange juice, salt and pepper; mix well. Pour the sauce into a bowl; garnish with the avocado slices. Serve with the shrimp and tortilla chips.

#### Cheryl's Smoked Pickled Jalapeños

This recipe can be halved.

60 jalapeño chilies
5 1/2 cups distilled white vinegar
1/2 cup kosher salt
1 1/2 cups sugar
3/4 cup garlic, chopped
1 Tbsp. cumin seeds

- **1.** Sterilize 4 pint-size canning jars according to canning directions.
- **2.** Using gloves to protect one's hands, clean the jalapeños; snip the stems to approximately 1/2-inch in length. Using a paring knife tip, score approximately 1/2-inch-deep across in the tapered end of each jalapeño.
- **3.** In a large stockpot, combine all ingredients; bring to a boil over high heat.
- **4.** Remove the pot from the heat. Using tongs, place 15 jalapeños into each sterilized jar. Ladle enough hot pickling liquid from the stockpot to fill each jar to the bottom rim of the jar's mouth. Seal according to canning directions.

#### Shrimp and Grits

I lb. shrimp, peeled and deveined I lb. smoked sausage I onion, chopped I/2 cup celery, chopped Salt, to taste Pepper, to taste I cup grits 4 cups chicken broth I cup cheese, shredded

- **1.** In a skillet, cook the shrimp, sausage, onions and celery; season with salt and pepper. Remove; set aside.
- **2.** In a saucepan, cook the grits according to the package instructions, except use the chicken broth instead of water. Add the cheese; mix well until the cheese is melted and blended.
- **3.** Plate the grits; spoon on the shrimp and sausage mixture.
