

“The biggest thing with the ministry is giving a helping hand up and not a handout.”

Another month has come and gone and the struggle to put food on the table continues. Sometimes, you just need a little assistance for your family. Angel Food Ministries can help, because all the food you receive is food you pay for at a mercifully reduced rate. The concept of the ministry is simple — to allow people to purchase a box of groceries and only pay about half the total net value.

Danny and Amy Hayes are the hosts for Midlothian's Angel Food Ministries where they distribute the food boxes once a month at Midlothian Bible Church. Amy explained the history of the organization, "The ministry was founded by Pastors Joe and Linda Wingo in 1994 on their back porch. A place to serve meals had closed in their city. There were families doing without, so they felt God laid it on their hearts to help them. It has grown to 35 states and feeds over 500,000 families a month."

The menu or contents of the food box provided by Angel Food Ministries changes every month. In any given month, one might find rib eye steaks, chicken leg quarters, smoked sausage, frozen vegetables, eggs, rice or sliced peaches. In addition to the main box, specialty boxes are offered at

reduced prices. The specials may be a steak and meat combo, such as bacon-wrapped beef or pork filet. Another possible special box may contain fresh fruits and vegetables. If the

quality of the food is not good, it is replaced or money is refunded. Amy added, "The organization is adamant about quality. In the two years we have been here, only one person wasn't satisfied with one of the food products. We replaced it and they still order with us to this day."

There is enough food in the box estimated to feed a family of four for one week or a senior citizen for a month. This is a box with an estimated value of \$65.00 that sells for just \$30.00. Amy said, "We take orders for this area [Midlothian and surrounding areas]. We have three to four weeks of collecting orders and money, do the administrative side of it, answer questions about the ministry, pick up from the main drop site, transfer back to the church and disperse it into individual boxes."

For Danny and Amy, it is a labor of love. The Angel Food Ministries is a nonprofit organization and Danny and Amy do not receive any money for their efforts. In addition to both working full-time jobs, they still put in the volunteer hours to help others. "This is a ministry for us. It's a lot of

work, but it is worth it," Amy said. "The organization sends us a dollar for every box and special we sell. We use that to turn around and buy extra boxes for families who couldn't afford to purchase boxes. We purchase at least two boxes a month with it, and sometimes we will donate boxes."

ourselves. That is our goal, to get as many boxes for the needy that we can."

In these times of economic turmoil and uncertainty, everyone is looking for a way to save money. Anyone can use this program, from families who are looking to use their money more wisely to those who are homeless.

According to Amy, "Every month we have about 30 families struggling to make ends meet. Our numbers are down this year because of the economy." One theory is, because of the economy, some families are suffering so much that they can't allocate \$30.00 for a future box of food; the ministry only hands out boxes once a month.

Another reason is that the citizens just do not know about the program. Amy



stated, "I am really trying to get this out there because it is such a big benefit to families. It helps so much on the grocery bill."

Amy understands personally the strain of trying to provide for a growing family and having limited funds. She said, "I used to be a single mom before I met Danny, and I know how tough it is to make ends meet. Anything I can do to help somebody who needs help on a monthly basis, or just one time, makes my heart grow so much bigger. I know where they are because I have been there, and I know how much it hurts to ask for assistance. The biggest thing with the ministry is giving a helping hand up and not a handout."

This ministry is labor intensive when there are only a few hands to do the work. When Danny and Amy first began to volunteer for Angel Food Ministries, they had the help of their children. However, children do grow up and move away, and Danny needs help with the distribution of the boxes, in picking up the food and sorting it. Amy explained another reason for increasing the number of volunteers. "We need volunteers because we want people to get involved, because the more they get involved, the more they understand the program, and that turns into outreach by word of mouth.







stone all the way up the fireplace and along the kick-wall of the bar in the kitchen. All this gave the family room the lodge feel they both desired, and linked the two rooms together. 

Strumming Along

“All I wanted to do was play guitar. I just seemed to always like it.”

With an athletic father who loved sports and music, slightly less, Tony Pierce had an opportunity to follow his dad in one or both. He said, “My dad was very athletic and into football, baseball and all kinds of different sports. You would think I would gravitate toward the sports, but I couldn’t care less about sports. All I wanted to do was play guitar. I just seemed to always like it.”

Horse Happiness

Almost every little girl has asked her parents for a pony, but very few have asked for a pony with which to compete. That was 11-year-old Marissa Brown's request, and once she got her hands on one, she was hooked. As a student at Longbranch Elementary, Marissa was recently recognized with the 2007 High Score Award for the South Central Region by the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of America, Inc.

Marissa has been competing in equestrian events for the last three years, but her mother said she has always loved riding. "Since she was knee high, she has loved to ride horses," Joni Brown said. "She would get on little pony rides, and I could never get her off."

As Marissa grew older, so did her passion for riding. At the age of 7, she got the urge to move from pony rides to



something a little more challenging. "One summer, she wanted to go to horse camp. I had found a place to put her and that was a mistake," Joni said jokingly. "Within about a week, she was taking lessons." And from those lessons, she has become even more enthusiastic. She now needed a horse of her own. "A friend of mine in Arkansas gave us a pony and Marissa started showing that pony," Joni said. From there she went to a Welsh Cob — a cross between a Welsh pony and a draft horse."

Joni soon realized that this was not just a hobby or fad; Marissa was serious about equestrian sports. The pair moved from Arlington to Midlothian a couple of years ago, so Joni could begin training under Mariam Copeland and boarding horses on the JoMar Farm. Marissa competes on a Section C Welsh Cob, which is about 13.2 hands or 53 inches tall, in equitation and hunter, flat and jumping. "In equitation, judging is based on how the rider rides and their position and stance, while hunter focuses on the horse and its style," Joni explained. "Flat is the basic walk, trot and canter — a controlled, three-beat gait. Show jumping deals with courses



and going over fences."

With victory on the mind, the mother/daughter duo has since spent show seasons traveling to equestrian competitions across the central United States. "Usually, location is the determining factor," Joni said. "We mostly stay within a 12-hour distance. Marissa shows probably one to two shows a month, with competitions beginning in March and running pretty heavy through October, and there are a few winter shows."

Because Joni has ridden and shown horses all of her life, this intricate sport, which she said takes a lot of skill and precision, is in Marissa's blood. "So much goes into equestrian," Joni said. "You have to hold your hands properly. Legs are important because you have to grip with your legs. Leg placement, body positioning, everything from head to toe is judged. You've got to know where you're looking at all times, with your toes pointed to the sky and your heels to the ground." But that is not all. In equestrian sports, the horse is considered as much an athlete as the rider. "Along with Marissa's training, we have to bathe and clip the horses. Then there's horse makeup, baby oil and baby powder, hoof polish. There's just as much prepping for the horse as there is for her."

This may sound like a lot to remember, but this horse lover has been able to master it with ease. "I have a wall filled with ribbons, certificates and trophies," Marissa said. "Equitation jumping is my favorite, and that's what I win the most in."

So what makes an 11-year-old want to put so much time and energy into such a demanding sport? Marissa said it is fun. "I love everything about equestrian — especially the winning. Lessons are twice a week, but I will ride for hours sometimes just for fun." And winning is what she does best, according to her mother. With several



If clothing isn't something they want, then maybe it's accessories or jewelry or a purse or flip-flops.



Hundreds of children sat quietly in rapt attention. They were not watching television or playing video games. They were reading and loving it. The vision is a dream come true for every librarian and teacher, and it happened two consecutive years at the Midlothian ISD Multipurpose Stadium for the Field of Readers event. This month marks the third Field of Readers for MISD. Instructional Technology Director Nancy Bergvall smiled when she recalled the sight,

"The first year, we were just thrilled to have 500 students participate. There were 900 in 2007 and our goal this year is for 1,000 students." The planners hope to include the same popular events this year with some fun additions.

The first event, held in 2006, was to help showcase the new Meadows Library and encourage the community to take advantage of its many resources. The Meadows Library at Midlothian High School operates in a dual role as the library for the school and as a public library. The new football stadium also opened in 2006 as a multipurpose facility and provided the perfect location for the event. Nancy stated, "We saw the opening of the new stadium as an opportunity to bring parents and kids together to read. The stadium had the room for it, and we wanted to use it for something more than athletics. We thought everyone would want the opportunity to go on that field. We made sure all of the guidelines were followed so the field would not be damaged in any way."

In addition to advertising the Meadows Library, the library media specialists in town, along with Nancy, also wanted to encourage the joy of reading, and so the idea for the Field of



Readers was born. She said, "The library media specialists are great visionaries about the possibilities of what they can do to promote technology and reading. They will do anything. Every year they will brainstorm a list of what we can do. They are just a phenomenal group of people to work with." During the Field of Readers event, a representative from the Meadows Library will be present to issue library cards.

This year, the event will take place November 13, from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Students from around the district are encouraged to participate in this experience. Each child will bring a book and a blanket to spread on the field to make the reading time more comfortable.

However, before the designated reading time on the field, there is much fun to be had. Last year, one of the more popular events involved high school students reading to the elementary children. Nancy explained, "There is a class at the high school called Ready, Set, Teach. This class is to prepare high school students who may want to enter into education. Some of them came and read with the students on the field. It is a cool thing for little kids to be read to by a high schooler."

A more active event occurred at the book walk. Nancy said, "We had a vendor donate some books, so we had a book walk. It is similar to the cakewalk. When the music stops, if they are on the line, they receive a free book." These activities

will also be available this year. One of the booths that parents and grandparents will appreciate is the book fair. All of the books from Scholastic Book Fair will be half price. The school will not make any money from this. It is strictly to benefit the children.

Another popular event at last year's Field of Readers involved students telling jokes on the JumboTron screen. The audience had the chance to hear rib ticklers such as:

"Knock, knock!"

"Who's there?"

"Cardigan."

"Cardigan who?"

"I forgot my library card again!"

And

Question: What did the detective do to the librarian when he didn't believe her story? Answer: He booked her!

It is all a part of making the evening fun for the students.

Associating laughter and fun times with reading is a good thing.

After everyone present has had time to enjoy the different events on the field, an announcement to "Drop Everything and Read" will be made. Nancy remarked, "This is the time for quiet as they sit down with their families and read. We have them gathered on their blankets for about 15 - 20 minutes." With a knowing smile she stated, "The younger ones don't want to sit longer than that."

The success of this occasion can be measured not only by the satisfaction of the parents and students, but acknowledgement from a professional organization. The Midlothian ISD Media Library and Technology Services captured the Highsmith Award from the Texas Library Association. This award is presented to an outstanding Texas library that creatively promotes library services. It may seem unconventional to have a reading event on a football field, but in this case, the readers win, and the act of reading scores big. **NOW**

IN THE KITCHEN WITH BILL DAVIDSON

BUTCH'S DRESSING

1 6-oz. box or bag of stuffing mix
(I use Stove Top Turkey.)
1/4 cup margarine
1 cup smoked turkey broth
1/3 cup water
1 cup smoked turkey meat, shredded
(I use the leg meat.)
1/3 cup turkey gravy
2 jalapeños, finely diced (I use 1/4 cup.)

Mix stuffing seasoning packet, margarine, turkey broth and water in a medium saucepan; bring to a boil then reduce heat to low. Stir in breadcrumbs, turkey, turkey gravy and jalapeños. Cover and cook for 5 minutes. Remove from heat and let stand 5 minutes. Fluff with a fork.

DEEP FRIED TURKEY

1 large turkey
1/4 cup jalapeños, pureed
1 jar Cajun Injector Creole Butter and Garlic
2 Tbsp. black pepper
2 Tbsp. crushed red pepper
3-5 gal. Canola oil
(amount depends on size of pot and turkey)

Thaw turkey. Wash turkey inside and out. Drain turkey and let come to room temperature. Mix pureed jalapeños

and Cajun Injector in a small bowl. Inject turkey with mixture. Lightly rub outside with black pepper and crushed red pepper. Fill fryer pot to fill line with Canola oil. Preheat oil to 350 F. Lower the turkey into oil; turkey must be completely covered with oil. Be sure to maintain oil temperature between 325 and 350 F. Fry 3 1/2 minutes per pound.

SPINACH SALAD WITH HOT BACON DRESSING

SALAD:

1 lb. fresh spinach, washed and torn into pieces
3 boiled eggs, sliced
8 oz. fresh mushrooms, sliced
1/2 cup red onion, sliced
HOT BACON DRESSING:
8 slices bacon
3 tsp. cornstarch
1 1/4 cup sugar
1/2 tsp. salt (optional)
1/4 cup warm water
1/2 cup white vinegar

Combine all salad ingredients in a large bowl; set aside. Cook bacon until crisp; cool and crumble. In a small bowl, mix cornstarch, sugar and salt. In a medium saucepan, combine water and vinegar; cook over medium heat. Bring to a slow simmer (do not boil). Slowly add dry ingredients, stirring constantly until

well mixed. Add crumbled bacon and continue to cook until thick. Serve warm over spinach salad.

ITALIAN BEEF

4 lbs. chuck roast
black pepper to taste
garlic salt to taste
2 beef bouillon cubes
1 tsp. oregano
1 tsp. fennel seed
1 tsp. sesame seed
1/2 tsp. anise seed
1 cup water
2 large green peppers, diced or sliced
Italian hoagie rolls

Heavily cover chuck roast with pepper and garlic salt. Put all ingredients, except for green pepper and rolls, in a Crock-Pot or roasting pan; cook for 5 - 6 hours, if cooking in the oven; roast at 250 F. When meat is tender, use a fork to pull apart into pieces. Add green pepper and cook 2 - 3 more hours. Serve on hoagie rolls with peperoncinis.

MEAT FILLING:

1 16-oz. can spinach
1 lb. ground chuck
garlic powder to taste
salt to taste
pepper to taste
1/4 green pepper
2 stalks celery
1/2 yellow onion
1 egg
1/4 cup bread crumbs
Parmesan cheese
DOUGH:
1 1/2 cups flour
3 eggs
pinch of salt

Fill a large soup pot with 1 gallon of water. Add all broth ingredients to soup pot; simmer for 3 hours. Drain spinach and set aside in a bowl. Season ground beef with garlic powder, salt and pepper; cook and drain grease. While meat is cooking, dice green pepper, celery and onion; add to bowl with spinach. Mix meat with egg and breadcrumbs; combine with spinach, green pepper, celery and onion. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese; set aside. Mix all dough ingredients well with a fork; roll into a ball using a rolling pin on a heavily floured board or table. Cut into 2 x 2-inch squares. Place 1/2 tsp. meat filling in the middle of each dough square; fold square diagonally. Pinch edges closed with fork. Let dry on wax paper 1-2 hours. Cook in broth for approximately 1 hour until dough is tender. Serve sprinkled with Parmesan cheese. Goes well with a salad and Italian bread.

PECAN BALLS

2 sticks margarine
4 Tbsp. sugar
2 cups flour
2 cups pecans or walnuts, chopped
2 tsp. vanilla
1/2 cup powdered sugar

Cream butter; add sugar, flour, nuts and vanilla; roll into small round balls and bake 45 minutes at 250 F. While still warm, roll in powdered sugar.

APPLE SQUARES

CRUST:
5 cups flour
2 cups Crisco
1 cup milk
1 tsp. salt
FILLING:
9 large Granny Smith apples, sliced
5 Tbsp. tapioca
1 1/2 cup sugar
1/2 tsp. cinnamon
FROSTING:
3 cups powdered sugar
6 oz. cream cheese
1 tsp. vanilla
3 Tbsp. milk

Mix together crust ingredients; roll 1/2 into a rectangle the size of a cookie sheet. Save the other 1/2 for the top crust. Mix together filling ingredients; place on top of bottom crust. Roll out top crust and cover apple mixture. Bake at 350 F for about 1 hour or until golden brown and apples are soft and bubbling. Mix together frosting ingredients; spread on top of crust while still slightly warm. Cut in squares.




Diabetes Type 1

Puncturing your skin with a needle every day hardly seems a reason to celebrate. However, if the substance in the syringe is insulin, then every day is a reason to celebrate because without it, the consequences are dire. The delicate balance between health and catastrophe on the weighing scales of life plays out very clearly in the life of someone with type 1 diabetes. In type 1 diabetes, the body is not able to produce insulin, or it produces it in insufficient quantities. Type 1 diabetes, known as juvenile-onset diabetes because the diagnosis is usually made in childhood, can also be diagnosed in older individuals who have lost the function of their pancreas because of disease or injury. The main goal of treatment involves proper management of blood glucose levels. All individuals with this type of diabetes must undergo daily insulin injections.

Insulin injections are necessary because the body needs the glucose, or sugar, in the circulatory system converted into energy for the body. Insulin facilitates this conversion. Without insulin, the glucose stays in the blood vessels and can cause many serious complications. The requirement of regular monitoring of the blood glucose level keeps the management



of this disease in check, and gives the doctor a simple tool for treatment. Abnormal levels of this substance in the blood long term can lead to significant damage in the eyes leading to blindness. It can disrupt kidney function so significantly that it can lead to failure of that organ. Improper management can also lead to amputations of the lower-extremities and also heart disease.

In diagnosis, two of the most common symptoms are frequent urination and increased thirst. Other symptoms are unexplained weight loss despite increased hunger, nausea, fatigue, vision changes and when wounds, particularly on the lower extremities, are slow to heal. The onset of symptoms of type 1 diabetes can sometimes be severe enough to require hospitalization until you become stable.

After the diagnosis of type 1 diabetes, usually consultation with a nutritionist is in order. Your diet makes a huge impact on your blood sugar levels and dictates how much insulin you receive. Other factors that influence your blood levels are the amount of exercise you have every day and any future illnesses.

Sometimes, the diabetic must walk a thin and fragile line. However, it is completely within the bounds of expectations that one can live a full and normal life with careful planning while indulging in whatever activity suits them. **NOW**
