





After a 34-year career in the U.S. Navy, one would think retirement would include a lot of fishing or golf. For retired Captain Joe D. Hill, however, the first 34 years serving his country and fellow man were just the beginning.

Joe received his ensign gold bars at the Navy Officer Candidate School in Newport, Rhode Island. "Upon graduation, I reported to my first ship as an officer and served two tours in Vietnam," he recalled. Including enlisted service, Joe served over the years on several destroyers, an attack cargo transport and an ammunition ship. His last shipboard duty was on the nuclear aircraft carrier, USS *Enterprise*. "I enjoyed assignments at the Pentagon and serving on the staff of several admirals," Joe added. "My final assignment during Operation Desert Storm was the naval air station in Sigonella, Sicily. It's the largest naval base in the Mediterranean Sea area and was the logistics hub of that war.


"We were living in Detroit, Michigan, when I retired, and my wife, Janis, who had done all of the following during my career, started sending out résumés. She landed a job working in a hospital in Lake Charles, Louisiana, and we stayed there until she retired about three years ago."

Time spent in Louisiana was not really about retirement for Joe. "I felt like, being a Navy man, I should have a boat, which I did, and after Hurricane Rita blew through, we lived on the boat for a while because our house was hit by five



"For five years I worked for FEMA as an intergovernmental affairs officer. My responsibilities included rebuilding schools, libraries and other civic buildings. We saw hurricanes Katrina, Rita, Gustav and Ike blow through. One project was rebuilding the hospital in Cameron Parish that had been hit by a 20-foot wall of water. I remember meeting President George Bush (41) and George Clooney. They each pledged \$1 million from their foundations to help rebuild the hospital."

Another five years in South Louisiana was spent working for U.S. District 3 Representative Charles Boustany Jr., MD. During that time, Joe was sent to lead a delegation to China.

It's almost hard to believe that during all of this very active life, Joe also had time to serve in local Rotary clubs. In his well-appointed home office, he displays mementos from around the world, including two Rotary past-president gavels and a past district governor plaque.

"We came to Corsicana three years ago with plans to throttle back and for this to be our 'go-to-Glory-town," Joe continued. "Our children live in the Metroplex, so this was a way to live close to them." It was not long at all before loe was involved in the local community, especially in honoring military veterans.

In a brief conversation with Dr. David Campbell about Joe, Dr. Campbell remarked, "My goodness, what a marvelous asset Joe has been since he moved to Corsicana. He had a history of community involvement from Lake Charles, and he has jumped in here with



both feet. Besides the veterans' parade, he was a member right away with the Coyote Squadron of the Commemorative Air Force. He served on the library board, and he likes to help without being one to toot his own horn."

Joe explained that the Texas Veterans Parade is typically held on Armed Forces Day in May. The parade website states its mission, "To honor Texas Veterans of all wars and conflicts. To teach our school children about the sacrifices of Texas veterans, freedom and liberty." The parade also recognizes Medal of Honor recipients, most recently CWO4 Hershel "Woody" Williams, USMC, and Don Ballard. "Last fall, Woody Williams was present to flip the coin at the Corsicana High School vs. Ennis High School football game, and we presented the first traveling trophy to the winner of the game that honors Medal of Honor recipients "Spider" Garcia from Corsicana and lack Lummus from Ennis.

Mayor Don Denbow was also quick to mention what an asset loe has been to the community in the relatively brief time he has been in Corsicana. "Joe is a great resource for us regarding all things related to the military and veterans, and he also provides a fresh, objective view of other things we do here."

Though his résumé of community service and professional achievement reads like it should belong to more than one person, loe continues to serve his fellow man. "I'm just glad to be in Corsicana and making new friends. There is a great future here, lots of great things coming down the pike, and I plan to stay involved." NOW





Recipes with simple, quick preparations and Southern comfort foods using her garden veggies are Faye Frasier's favorites. A Garrison, Texas, native, Faye learned to cook from her mom and by reading cookbooks. "I use recipes, but I also cook the way my mom did — 'a dash of this, a spoonful of that."

Daughter Lynn's Salsa

Salsa will keep about 2 weeks when refrigerated.

I large onion

1 14-oz. can diced tomatoes

3 chilies

1/2 tsp. cumin

1/2 tsp. salt

Juice of 1/2 lime 1 garlic clove 3 Tbsp. ketchup 1/2 bell pepper Cilantro, to taste

1. In a blender, blend all ingredients well. Pour the salsa into containers; refrigerate.

Daughter Causby's Chocolate Peanut Butter Treats

This recipe can be made for any number of people and as chocolatey as desired.

Smooth peanut butter, to taste
Ritz Crackers, to taste
Milk chocolate chips or milk chocolate
almond bark, to taste
White chocolate almond bark, to taste
Rainbow-colored candy sprinkles, to taste

- **1.** Spread peanut butter on Ritz Crackers; press the crackers together to form sandwiches.
- **2.** Melt the milk chocolate chips or milk chocolate almond bark; dip the sandwiches into the melted chocolate to coat the sandwiches on all sides. Place the sandwiches on waxed paper to cool.
- **3.** Melt the white chocolate almond bark; use a spoonful of the white chocolate to drizzle lines over the chocolate sandwiches.
- **4.** While the white chocolate is still warm, shake candy sprinkles over the sandwiches to make a colorful treat.

Faye's Chicken Salad

- 2 12.5-oz. cans chicken breast, well-drained
- 1-2 cups almonds, chopped
- 1 1/2 cups sweet pickle relish
- I cup mayonnaise (add more if using to make sandwiches)
- 1 Tbsp. garlic powder
- 1 Tbsp. ground black pepper

Mandarin orange slices, chilled, to taste (optional as a garnish)

Chunk pineapple, sliced, to taste (optional as a garnish)

Strawberries, to taste (optional as a garnish)

- **I.** Using a pastry knife, shred the chicken well; mix all ingredients, excluding garnishes.
- **2.** Refrigerate at least 2 hours or overnight before serving. This can be sandwich filling or served by scoopfuls on salad greens.
- **3.** Garnish chicken salad scoops with chilled Mandarin orange slices, chunk pineapple or sliced strawberries.

Daughter Berri's Spinach Dip

- I 10-oz. pkg. frozen chopped spinach, cooked according to package directions, drained and cooled
- 1 2-oz. pkg. Carl Budding ham lunch meat, chopped
- 1 2-oz. pkg. Lipton Vegetable Dry Soup Mix
- 3 green onions, thinly chopped
- 1 16-oz. tub sour cream

Wheat Thins, to taste

- **1.** In a bowl, mix the first 4 ingredients into the sour cream.

- **I.** Cut the tortillas into strips. In a 9x13-inch baking dish, alternate layering the tortilla strips, beans, kernel corn, chili, onion and cheese. Top with a layer of cheese.

- 1/4 cup coconut, shredded



Frosting:

- 1/2 cup butter
- 6 Tbsp. milk
- 3 1/2 cups powdered sugar
- I tsp. coconut extract
- Shredded coconut, to taste
- **1.** For cake: In a bowl, mix the flour and sugar; set aside.
- **2.** In a saucepan, mix the water and shortening. Bring the mixture to a boil; add it to the flour mixture.
- **3.** Add the buttermilk, baking soda, eggs, vanilla, coconut extract and coconut, in that order, mixing well between additions.
- **4.** Pour the batter into a greased 18x13x1-inch cookie sheet; bake at 400 F for 20 minutes.
- **5.** For frosting: Combine the butter and milk; bring to a boil. Stir in the powdered sugar and coconut extract.
- **6.** Poke holes in the baked cake with a fork; pour the frosting over the cake. Sprinkle the cake's top with lots of shredded coconut.

Painted Churches and More

In German, *Schulenburg* means "school town," an appropriate name for the home of the ISD Shorthorns, a Catholic elementary and a Blinn College campus. While education remains a top priority, heritage and history live daily in this small community. German and Czech influences remain strong, which proves a delight to intentional visitors and those who stop on the way to other places. Situated on I-10, Schulenburg offers a perfect stop for weary travelers. But stopping might mean staying a while.

Best known for the painted churches in the area, the Greater Schulenburg Chamber schedules and hosts guided tours. Although you can choose the self-guided option, having a knowledgeable volunteer to share local tidbits makes the trip better.

The aged, but well-preserved churches appear ordinary from the outside, but stepping inside transports you to a

different world. Most of the churches are Catholic, but one is a Methodist church. Though more than a century old, many operate today, holding weekly services and events.

When built in the 1800s and 1900s, they emulated churches left behind in Europe. With hand-painted statues, filigree, angels and more, a hush falls across the room, regardless of a group's size. Each church boasts a memorable history. Some have paintings hanging on the walls, while others incorporate ceilings and walls painted as beautifully as any church in Europe. Several also feature massive pipe organs, some with a maintenance entrance accessible only through narrow staircases. The adventure in these churches comes from imagining the sheer amount of work artists put into the paintings.

While you don't want to miss the painted churches, other museums in Schulenburg may capture your interest, as well.

Visit the Texas Polka Music Museum, which offers a collection of vintage records and instruments, costumes and more. They also make it a point to honor any disc jockey who helped promote polka through the ages. Texas polka bands honor the legacy of Czech, German and Polish ancestry.

The Stanzel Model Aircraft Museum, dedicated to the past, present and future of model and toy airplanes, contains three areas. The Main Museum houses the original shop where Victor and Joe Stanzel pioneered manufacturing miniature aviation in the 1930s. The Factory Wing and Historic Stanzel Home encompass the other two areas.

History buffs may want to take a tour of the Historic Museum and homes, including an authentic log cabin, or catch the historic restaurant and dance hall at Momma's at Sengelmann. Then, stop to experience the Piano Bridge. Erected in 1885, the bridge spans the Navidad River connecting High Hill and Dubina, the first Texas Czech community. Although the bridge no longer twangs when crossed, it remains a memorable place surrounded by beauty.

At various times during the year, Schulenburg hosts festivals. One of the most famous, Sausagefest, normally occurs in April, with the Schulenburg Festival in August. And in November and December, the town transforms into a wonderful place for unique gifts, food and shopping. The Holiday Wine Walk, held the first weekend in November, coincides with Holiday in the Country. Or visit one of two local wineries to relax in picturesque South Texas evenings.

Any time you visit, be sure to allow time for unique shopping experiences and the tastes of authentic German, Czech and Polish foods. With hotels, ranches and RV spots in Schulenburg, you might want to spend a few nights to experience everything.
