

#### HAVE A HAPPY THANKSGIVING













The year was 1933, during the Great Depression, when on March 11, nine area women educators met with one of Delta Kappa Gamma Society International's founders, Mamie Sue Bastian, to organize a local DKG chapter, Alpha Rho. By the first meeting, the group had grown to 13 members with seven prospective members. A 90th birthday celebration was held in 2023 to honor the chapter's founders and longtime members. Many of the traditions established long ago are still followed by the current 27 chapter members. "We are educators and caregivers, and as such, we are part of this community and give back to it in many ways," Marcia Anderson, current president and a retired teacher and administrator, stated.

The DKG Texas' theme for this biennium fits the local chapter's purpose and is explained in the acrostic use of the letters in "Soar" with the "A" standing for "Act to serve and share." "Every year, we make a connection with every school in the county," Jo Beth Ellis, a past president, stated. Some of the chapter's projects include Welcome Back to School gift baskets and donations to the Corsicana Animal Shelter, the House of Refuge and to teachers for student field trips. The chapter members also donate school supplies to Head Start, books as memorials and backpacks. "We pass the hat. We don't use chapter money for these contributions," Jo Beth added.

A Christmas season fundraiser has become a tradition and a friendly, but competitive, event between attendees at Kinsloe House. Jo Beth recalled, "Kinsloe House is beautifully decorated for the season. There's usually a fight over the homemade bread and hand crocheted

necklaces, but we make it work. I give the necklaces to people I love." A Santa that wiggles was donated one year and has continued to return every year since, prompting a bidding war between members. Monies raised fund the chapter's scholarships to students wishing to become educators.

The "S" in the acrostic stands for "Seek new members and opportunities." Monthly meetings are held at Kinsloe House during the traditional school year months. Committees are responsible for every-other-month speakers. On the other months, a business meeting is held. "Our speakers are people from our community and school groups such as choirs and the Amazing Shake team," Marcia said.

Prospective members must have taught a minimum of three years and receive an invitation from a current member. "Teaching" is broadly defined to include such positions as park rangers, college professors or anyone who trains or instructs others on a regular basis. Su Morris, the longest serving active member, who was initiated in 1973, stated, "Originally, the new member initiation required long, formal gowns and the traditional red roses, but now it's less formal." New initiates become members during a ceremony held at the September meeting each year.

Lindsay Olsen, scholarship chairperson and the newest member, shared how she became involved. "I was invited to a meeting by my son's first grade teacher," she said. "I respected her. She always had a servant's heart, and I was impressed by the wealth of information shared by members. There's a camaraderie that transfers across generations of educators. Our recent scholarships have gone to Abigail Estrada and Margarita Garcia. We work with Navarro College, Texas A&M University-Commerce and the Navarro College Foundation to select qualified candidates."

Chapter members enjoy attending area workshops and conventions sponsored by DKG Texas and the DKG Society International, headquartered in Austin, Texas. The state and international annual events are an opportunity to gain knowledge, travel, learn from educators across the







globe and make lifetime friendships and professional connections.

Marcia transferred from a Waco chapter after moving to Corsicana. "I've had the best time at conventions and being a member helps keep my brain active," she said. "Members are very supportive." She retired after serving as a teacher, administrator and at the regional service center for 48 years. "I enjoy life in Corsicana," she said. "I can call on people when I need anything, and I've easily acclimated here after only three years." Marcia is a member at Corsicana First Methodist Church and is serving as a volunteer with several area organizations. She enjoys reading, British TV shows, travel and cruising.

"I was honored to receive a membership invitation in a sealed envelope, and I've enjoyed sharing info and the sad and happy moments with other members," Jo Beth recalled. She began teaching in 1979 in Corsicana ISD, and though retired, she's still substitute teaching, is a church nursery teacher and enjoys reading to her grandson's class. A member of Corsicana First Baptist Church, Jo Beth said, "Corsicana's a great place to live. We're small enough to get to know people, but close enough to the big city for everything we need." She enjoys RVing, cruising and her grandchildren.

Su enjoys seeing teachers from other schools at meetings and the support she receives from members. She served 43 years as a teacher. A volunteer giving people rides to doctor appointments, Su also volunteers through her church. She enjoys cruises.


Lindsay is in her 22nd year as an educator and serves as a Region XII Service Center dyslexia





#### **Chicken With Mushrooms**

This entree pairs well with an avocado salad.

1 6-oz. chicken breast, sliced
Salt, to taste
Variety of preferred spices, to taste
1/2 oz. margarine
3 oz. mushrooms, sliced
1.5 oz. yellow onions, sliced

I.5 oz. poblano peppers, slicedI tsp. fresh garlic, choppedMonterrey Jack cheese, to tasteRice, cooked according to package instructions (optional)

- **I.** Season the chicken with salt and your personally preferred spices; set aside.
- **2.** In a skillet, melt the margarine; sauté the

mushrooms, onions, poblano peppers and garlic.

**3.** Add the chicken breast; cook all the way through, turning and searing on both sides. Add the cheese; cook until the cheese melts. Serve over rice, if using.

#### **Green Rice**

2.5 oz. fresh spinach
2 bunches cilantro
4 poblano peppers
3 oz. white onion
6 garlic cloves
2 Tbsp. salt
2 Tbsp. chicken base
1/2 tsp. white pepper
Salad oil, for toasting
32 oz. rice

- **1.** In a blender, mix the spinach, cilantro, poblano peppers, onions and garlic cloves with water until the mixture equals 1.5 gallons of fluid.
- **2.** Transfer the mixture to a pot; bring the mixture to a boil. Add the salt, chicken base and white pepper.

- 3. In another pot, add enough salad oil to coat the bottom; toast the rice until it becomes golden in color.
- **4.** Transfer the toasted rice to the spinach mixture. Cover the pot; cook on low heat for 10 minutes. Stir; recover. Cook for an additional 10 minutes.

#### Black Beans

1/2 gal. black beans I gal. water

1/4 tsp. salt

4 cups hot potato salad, made from a favorite recipe or store bought

2 Tbsp. granulated garlic

I tsp. finely ground black pepper

- **1.** In a large pot, add the black beans, water and salt; cook over medium heat for approximately 60-90 minutes or until the beans are soft.
- 2. Add the hot potato salad, garlic and pepper; stir well. Drain the mixture; grind it in a blender or mixer before serving.

#### Mas Queso's Chili Con Carne

5 lbs. ground beef

1 gal. water

1 cup paprika

1 cup chili powder

1/4 Tbsp. salt

1/4 Tbsp. granulated garlic

1 Tbsp. granulated cumin

1 tsp. oregano

1/4 gal. vegetable oil

1/2 gal. flour

- 1. In a large pot, add the ground beef and water, stirring the meat into the water. Cook at a high temperature for 5 minutes. After reaching a boiling stage, add the spices; cook for an additional 15 minutes.
- 2. In a bowl, mix the vegetable oil and flour. While the meat mixture is still boiling. add the flour mixture to the pot. Stir well; more flour may be added to reach the desired thickness.


