

Hello. Christmas Season!







A Tree in EVERY WINDOW



The year 2015 was a rough one for David and Dena Burch. David was battling an aggressive form of prostate cancer and was diagnosed with a second kind of cancer, lymphoma. The couple had been looking for a house to purchase, but reluctantly put it on the back burner while "walking through" David's cancer treatment. They had made a list of everything they wanted in a house that would be the perfect fit for them and their family. The Burchs own their own business and work out of their home, so their house would require space for an office. It also needed space for their grandchildren and plenty of room to entertain. They wanted a pool and a big backyard. Everything was placed on the list, and as David battled through radiation treatments, he and Dena dreamed about their new home. Eventually, the list was put in a drawer and forgotten, while the cancer treatments continued.

In early 2018, things began to look up. The cancers had responded well to the treatments, and it was beginning to look like David was going to be OK. A friend mentioned that he wanted to sell his home. He asked if they would like to look at it, and the minute they saw it, David and Dena fell in love with it.

Just two months later, in July 2018, David and Dena moved into their new home. David's lymphoma had recently flared up, and they were struggling to keep an optimistic outlook and were constantly looking for positive experiences. A few weeks after they moved in, Dena was straightening out a nightstand drawer that the movers had turned upside down during the move, and she found the original list of all their needs and

wants for a new home. She immediately showed David the list. They had not looked at it for almost two years. As they sat down and read the list, they noticed that everything they had listed was in the home they now live in — everything! They sat there in amazement, realizing they were in the right place. In one of the hardest times of their 35-year marriage, finding that list gave the couple a muchneeded feeling of encouragement, and they celebrated that God had looked after their best interests during a time when they had been too preoccupied with critical health issues to concentrate on other important matters.

Today, David is officially in remission and now the couple, again, has the time and the house to celebrate Christmas as they always have. With 18 trees, every single room in the house is decorated. "We celebrate the birth of Christ at Christmas, and we celebrate it big in this house," Dena said. The 12-foot, rotating Christmas tree sparkles brightly as it rises tall over a living area filled wall-to-wall with beautiful Christmas treasures. "Each window, upstairs and downstairs, has a lighted Christmas tree," Dena said with a grin. Each room has its own theme and is decorated accordingly. She loves to make wreaths, and she created one to correlate with each room's theme.



The spectacular kitchen is filled with Mrs. Claus and all things peppermint. "I wanted the kitchen to showcase a Mrs. Claus wreath that I created in 2018, and peppermint just seemed to go with her really well. David gave me some fun ornaments to use in the kitchen. and I love reading them each year. The Decorator's Warehouse in Arlington had wonderful peppermint decor to help make my 'peppermint fantasy' come to life. I also used peppermint-scented plug-ins from Bed, Bath & Beyond,

so when you were in the room, you got the visual and sensory feel for it. I used peppermint-striped ribbon for the cabinets and some really fun tea towels to round it all out!"



The house is decorated with a mixture of old and new ornaments. Some have been in the family for generations. "We have lots of ornaments that bring back great memories to us and our children, but we also enjoy getting new ornaments each year. For David and me, it's so much fun to go, a few days after Christmas, and score great deals on super expensive glass, porcelain or hand-blown ornaments!" Dena said happily. She continued, "We have original ornaments from both of our childhoods and ones we got when we were first married. We have special ornaments from both of our parents and grandparents, as well." The glass, porcelain and hand-blown ones, my bell collection, the family heirlooms and the snowman ornaments. We've been collecting snowman ornaments for about 15 years. I'll see one I like along the way somewhere, and I'll pick it up to add to the collection. My favorite is an ornament of three snowmen in a group, which represent our three sons, Danny, Darren and Derek."

The nativity scene in the living room has been in the family since the children were little. It was given to them by David's mother. It is made of porcelain and has a wooden creche under which the porcelain figurines sit. "The nativity scene, as well as several stuffed Santas from both of our grandmothers, go out every year," Dena said. "I hope our grandkids all feel that way about things they will inherit from us. There's no 12-yearold tackling a 4-year-old, but Vice President Mike Langford admitted they do warm up and do the same exercises and drills.

"We do everything at one site, no matter the kid's age. They stretch together, for example. And we're teaching the same things top to bottom," Mike said. "Every kid who is a lineman will do the same drills, for example, paired with their age group, of course."

The WYAA Tomahawks, in its fourth vear, offers a variety of sports. There's basketball, track and cheerleading for ages 4 to 12, and a mixture of flag and tackle football, depending on the age. There's also flex football, which is nine-on-nine and offered for all ages.

Nine-on-nine is two-handed touch football and will be offered in the spring for the first time. "It's for parents who aren't ready for tackle," Mike said. "The nine-on-nine will allow us to put linemen in to get some work."

Phelp Benjamin is president of the league. In 2015, he and Mike joined forces to start the organization with an emphasis on fun and fundamentals, playing safe and, of course, learning how to win and lose.

Good sportsmanship is strongly stressed. "It shows on game days. You see the teams cheering on each other, even teams that are in the same league," Phelp said.

"It's very family-oriented, and you can see it on the sidelines," said Phelp's wife, Nicole, the league's treasurer. "They hand out water when their team isn't playing. Also, as a board we're family-oriented. All of our boys and girls are really close. Even the kids who are in junior high come back and support the teams."

Those in the league play a good amount. Every player participates in at least 10 plays in a football game and at least two-and-a-half minutes each of basketball. That might explain why the league has grown to almost 500 youths participating after having only 30 at the start.

"Everything we do is based on what's best for the kid," Mike said. "It's created a community inside a community."

The organization's greatest successes so far have been in track. Competing in the Texas Amateur Athletic Federation, they qualified 16 athletes for the Games of Texas this past summer at College Station, more than five times the amount they sent in 2018, their first year to have a track program.

R'Mani Benjamin captured the team's first gold medal in the long jump for ages 8 and under, leaping 12 feet, 8

inches this past summer. He cleared 13 feet in regional competition to qualify. He also brought home a silver medal in the 100-meter dash.

Mariah Villareal brought home a pair of silver medals in the 50-meter dash in 2018 and 2019 in the 6-under division. Mariah had a short-lived state record in the preliminaries in 2018 before the gold medal winner broke it in the finals.

Tiffany Nava is the league's fundraising director and has two children currently involved, with another who recently aged out. She said the family feeling is what brought her and her children into the program.



"As Tomahawks we're different because we do things as a family unit. We stand for integrity and being a family that's first before the sport itself. We hold a high bar on the kids, as well as the parents and coaches and board members," she said.

"WYAA is about the kids. Every decision we make we consider the kids first. We want to make the youth sports of Waxahachie known for having a great Class A organization that every parent wants their kids to be a part of."

There's also a scholarship program for those who need financial help. "We understand some kids can't afford it, but we don't ever want to turn a kid away for financial reasons," Phelp said.

Players are expected to keep their grades up and behave appropriately. Parents also are held to a high standard of behavior, which is rarely a problem.

Mike is one of many coaches who are parents who no longer have children playing in the league but still want to be involved. "I just love the kids. That's why I stuck around," he said. NOW

"It's very important to me that we offer patients from Ellis County and surrounding greas the best of service in a peaceful, pleasant and friendly atmosphere."

"The field of dermatology covers a broad diversity of medical issues," Dr. Word explained. Medical changes occur often, and staying current is a top priority to Dr. Word. He has written many professional articles that have been published, and several of these articles can be found on the Word Dermatology website.

Word Dermatology handles a range of skin concerns, including medical, surgical and cosmetic issues. Medical issues range from problems with acne to warts. Skin cancer and cysts make up most of the surgical matters, and fillers, BOTOX and chemical peels are cosmetic services offered. They accept Medicaid, Medicare and most major medical insurance providers, along with credit cards and cash. Additionally, they have applications for CareCredit available for financing any services desired.

Many people wonder when they should visit a dermatologist. According to Dr. Word, "When something is growing, hurting or bleeding, that's when you need to see me. After a complete examination, we decide if we should investigate a little more by doing a biopsy or watchful waiting. That is also when we might put a person on a schedule for annual or semiannual checkups."

Dr. Word had advice for spending time in the sunshine. "Definitely use sunscreen. Anything over SPF 30 will protect efficiently, but a higher SPF will last longer. Wearing a hat, sunglasses and long sleeves are very beneficial when possible. Also, staying out of the noonday sun cuts down on the most damaging rays to our skin." NOW

Mexican Christmas Pork Leg

Approximately 16 servings.

Red Chile Sauce:

12 dry, whole red Mexican chile pods

2 cups chicken broth

2 Tbsp. olive oil

I medium onion, chopped

5 cloves fresh garlic, chopped

I Tbsp. all-purpose flour

1 tsp. dried or 2 tsp. fresh oregano

1/2 tsp. cumin

2 tsp. salt

Pork Leg:

1 12-lb. boneless pork leg

1/2 cup blanched almonds

I lb. diced ham

15 cloves garlic, peeled

1. For red chile sauce: Wash chile pods; let dry.

2. In a cast-iron skillet, toast the pods for 1 to 2 minutes per side: do not burn.

3. When the pods are cool, put on gloves. Remove and discard the seeds and stems.

4. Combine the chiles and chicken broth. Simmer on medium heat for about 10

minutes, or until the chiles look cooked.

5. Heat oil in a cast-iron skillet on medium heat. Sauté onion and garlic for 4 minutes. Add flour and spices. Cook until flour is golden brown.

6. Combine the chili and chicken broth mixture with the onion mixture; blend until smooth.

7. After all sauce is blended, simmer on medium-low heat for 30 minutes.

8. Taste sauce and adjust seasonings as desired

9. For pork leg: Preheat oven to 350 F. Place pork leg in a roasting pan.

10. Make slits with a sharp knife all over the pork leg, concentrating on the top and sides of the leg.

11. Fill the slits with almonds, ham and garlic. Pour Red Chile Sauce over the pork leg. Let the leg marinate in the sauce for at least 6 hours, if possible.

12. Cover the leg with a lid or aluminum foil. Roast for about 4 hours, until you get a center temperature reading of 145 F.

13. Uncover; bake until browned, about 30 more minutes. Remove from oven; recover. Let rest for at least 15 minutes before serving.

Green Tomatillo Sauce

3 fresh jalapeños, less or more to taste 10 tomatillos

1/2 onion, chopped

1/2 cup fresh cilantro, chopped

I tsp. salt, to taste

- 1. Boil jalapeños, tomatillos and onions in just enough water to cover the vegetables.
- 2. When vegetables are tender, blend in a blender or with a stick blender.
- 3. Add cilantro and salt.

Charro Beans

2 lbs. pinto beans

1 Tbsp. salt

I lb. bacon, chopped

I cup chorizo

3 fresh tomatoes, diced

I large onion, diced small

7 cloves fresh garlic

I cup cilantro, finely chopped

1/2 cup jalapeño, or more to taste

- **1.** Soak pinto beans in water overnight.
- 2. Strain soaking water; rinse beans. Boil pinto beans with salt until tender.
- 3. Fry bacon and chorizo until they are about halfway cooked; add tomatoes, onion, garlic, cilantro and jalapeño.
- 4. Once the mixture is cooked, add it to the boiled beans; let simmer for about 20 minutes.

I cup all-purpose flour

1/2 tsp. salt

1 1/2 tsp. baking powder

5 whole eggs, separated

I cup sugar (divided use)

1/3 cup milk

1 tsp. vanilla

I can sweetened condensed milk

I can evaporated milk

1/4 cup heavy cream

Whipped Cream:

1 pt. heavy cream

3 Tbsp. sugar

Maraschino cherries, to taste

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 F.
- 2. Whisk flour, salt and baking powder in a large mixing bowl.
- 3. Beat the egg yolks and 3/4 cup sugar with a hand mixer on high for 2 minutes. Stir in milk and vanilla.
- 4. Gently stir the egg yolk mixture into the flour mixture.

- **5.** Beat egg whites on high speed until soft peaks form. With the mixer on, pour in the remaining 1/4 cup sugar; beat until the egg whites are stiff but not dry.
- **6.** Fold egg white mixture into the batter very gently until just combined.
- **7.** Pour batter into a 9x13-inch prepared pan; spread to even out the surface.
- **8.** Bake 35 to 45 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the middle comes out clean.
- **9.** Place the cake on a large platter; let cool.
- **10.** Mix together condensed milk, evaporated milk and heavy cream.
- 11. Punch holes all over the surface of the cool cake with a fork.
- **12.** Slowly poor the cream mixture over the cake, allowing it to soak into the holes and absorb into the cake as you go. Make sure you get the sides good and soaked.
- **13.** For whipped cream: Whip together the heavy cream and sugar until peaks form.
- **14.** Let the soaked cake rest for 30 minutes; frost with whipped cream. Decorate with maraschino cherries.







In December, Santa makes the converted gazebo his second home. From the night after Thanksgiving until December 23, lines form with young and old waiting to visit the benevolent character and his adorable wife. Check out the hand-painted walls on the exterior and interior of the house. Several photo-op backdrops are also available for families to capture memories.
