During a project in Abilene, Cindy traveled with Ron, and they drove through Weatherford. "I always wanted to live in a town with a main street," Ron divulged. "You don't get that in Houston." About two or three years after that, he attended a business convention and received a job offer, which he accepted. As they prepared to move, they decided to sell the cattle in order to live near downtown. When the house purchase fell through, they found a beautiful place in the country instead.

Originally, their new home didn't have much of a dining area and no laundry room or pantry. They added a second story to the house as well as the dining and laundry rooms alongside a massive pantry. Both agree, the dining room is their favorite in the entire home, but the living room places second because they have welcomed so many people to the two rooms over the years. A corner woodburning stove adds warmth to the room, figuratively and literally.

Eventually, Ron built a 6,000-square-foot office and storage building. Then in 2013, wanting to leave the ups and downs of construction, they planted a vineyard and began making wine as Sweet Springs Winery, mentored by Gene Estes. Although they closed their tasting room in 2017, they continue producing wines and plan to do so in the future.

Ron said, "Christmas has always been our thing. We love kids." Along with entertaining their three grandchildren, they strive to bring joy to other children. In the past, they dressed up as Santa and Mrs. Claus every year. "That was our way of helping a local organization."

To capture the season, they put up multiple Christmas trees and decorate outside. Keeping up a tradition, they





acquired a giant nativity set from their neighbors, Gerald and Bobbie Bates, when they moved. Gerald made the set from wood and painted it white.

"Neighbors drive by to see it," Cindy said. "Our flagpole had a cross, so from a distance, it looked like a floating cross." Of course, the couple has other lights on and around the house, which create a beautiful backdrop for the nativity.

Inside, one tree in the dining room holds nothing but Precious Moments ornaments. Cindy also displays the sweet figurines in curio cabinets. "Ron got me started on that," she stated. However, Cindy loves decorating — for Christmas or any time of the year. This is evident by the grapevine border she put in her kitchen and breakfast nook.

At Christmastime, throughout the house, she includes nutcrackers of various sizes, including two life-size ones. "We love Christmas and the joy and hope it brings in the celebration of Christ," Cindy said. "Ron's a musician, so the seasonal music also means a lot to us."

"Christmas is a time to give, and we get back without expecting it," Ron said. He sings and plays guitar, enjoying sharing his talents. After serving in the U.S. Army doing social work and psychology during Vietnam, Ron became a preacher. "Although I'm a pastor, we're not churchy. We're more pastors to the pastors," he said.

That's one thing the couple loves about their home. They share a place to relax and find restoration for those who sometimes need solitude from the life of ministering to people. For Ron and Cindy, it's a pleasure to do that any time of the year, but especially when holidays add stress.

"Christmas is your flag," Ron expressed. "The decorations you display show who you are. I hope that never changes." NOW

Bacon Jalapeño Corn Salad

6 slices bacon

3 cups whole kernel corn

I jalapeño, chopped

1 Tbsp. cilantro

1 tsp. garlic powder

luice from 2 limes

1/3 cup mayonnaise

1 tsp. chili powder

Salt, to taste

Pepper, to taste

I. In a skillet, cook the bacon. Remove the bacon from the grease. Chop it into small pieces; set aside.

2. In a pot, heat the corn to desired temperature; drain. In a large bowl, combine the bacon, corn and the remaining ingredients.

3. Mix well. Serve warm, or refrigerate and serve cold.

Grilled Cajun Lime Chicken

1 lb. boneless, skinless chicken breasts Juice from 1 lime

1/2 tsp. garlic powder

1/4 tsp. onion powder

1/4 tsp. oregano

1/8 tsp. black pepper

1/4 tsp. chili powder

1/2 tsp. smoked paprika

1/4 tsp. salt

2 Tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil

1/4 tsp. ground cumin

I. Heat a grill to 350 F. Rinse the chicken; pat dry.

- **2.** In a bowl, combine the lime juice and the remaining ingredients. Brush the seasoning onto the chicken.
- **3.** Grill the chicken until the internal temperature is 165 F. Remove from the grill; serve.

Taco Stuffed Shells

1 lb. ground beef

1 1-oz. pkt. taco seasoning

2/3 cup water

1 1/2 cups cheddar cheese (divided use)

 $1 \, 1/2$ cups salsa

12 oz. jumbo pasta shells

I. Preheat the oven to 350 F. In a skillet, brown the ground beef; drain the grease. Add the packet of taco seasoning and water; mix well. Add I cup of the cheese and the salsa; stir.

- **2.** In a pot, boil the shells according to the package directions; drain and cool. Stuff the shells with the meat mixture; place the shells in a greased pan.
- **3.** Once the pan is full of filled shells, sprinkle the remaining 1/2 cup cheese on top. Bake, uncovered, at 350 F for 15 minutes.

BBQ Chicken Pineapple Kabobs

- 1 lb. boneless, skinless chicken breasts, cubed
- 1 pineapple, peeled, cored and cubed 10-12 slices of bacon, each cut into four equal pieces
- 1 cup barbecue sauce Skewers
- 1. Heat a grill to 350 F.
- **2.** Beginning with chicken, alternate chicken, pineapple and bacon onto the skewers. Place on the grill; cook until the internal temperature of the chicken is 165 F.
- **3.** When the skewers are done cooking, brush on the barbecue sauce, or serve it on the side.

Roasted Red Potatoes

14 small red potatoes

3 Tbsp. olive oil

1 tsp. garlic powder

1/2 tsp. onion powder

1/2 tsp. paprika

1/2 tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. pepper

I tsp. Italian seasoning

1/4 cup Parmesan, grated

- 1. Preheat an oven to 375 F.
- **2.** In a large bowl, add the potatoes and the remaining ingredients; toss until coated. Spread the potatoes on a foil-lined baking sheet; bake, uncovered, for 45-50 minutes.

Cheesy Ranch or Cheesy Garlic Potato Foil Packs

- 1 1/2 lbs. red skin potatoes, cubed
- 2 Tbsp. olive oil
- 3 Tbsp. ranch seasoning mix or garlic powder
- 1/4 tsp. freshly cracked pepper
- I cup sharp cheddar cheese, shredded
- **I.** Heat a grill to medium. Lightly spray four rectangles of foil with cooking spray; set aside.
- **2.** Put the potatoes in a large bowl; drizzle with olive oil. Sprinkle in either the ranch seasoning or the garlic powder and the pepper; toss to coat the potatoes. Divide





equal portions of the potatoes onto each piece of foil. Fold the foil; seal the ends. Place on the grill, seam side down, for 10 minutes.

3. Turn over the packages of potatoes; cook for an additional 10 minutes. Remove the packages from the grill; carefully open the foil. Sprinkle cheese on top of the potatoes. Put the open packs back on the grill for another 3-4 minutes, or until the cheese is melted.

Cheesy Bacon Ranch Chicken Bake

4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts

- 1 8-oz. pkg. cream cheese
- 1 1-oz. pkg. ranch seasoning
- 1 tsp. garlic powder
- I tsp. onion powder

2 cups shredded cheese2 1/2-oz. real bacon pieces

- **1.** Preheat the oven to 350 F. Halve each chicken breast; spread even amounts of the cream cheese onto each piece of chicken.
- **2.** Sprinkle the ranch seasoning, garlic powder and onion powder evenly over the cream cheese. Top with shredded cheese and bacon pieces.
- 3. Bake at 350 F for 30 minutes.

Dry Rub for Ribs

- 1/3 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup paprika
- 3 Tbsp. kosher salt
- 1 Tbsp. cracked pepper
- 2 Tbsp. garlic powder
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ Tbsp. onion powder
- 1 1/2 Tbsp. ground mustard

2 tsp. white pepper 1 1/2 tsp. ground coriander 1 tsp. ground fennel seeds 1/3 tsp. cayenne pepper

- **I.** Mix all the ingredients in a bowl until completely combined.
- **2.** As an alternate method, you can place all of the ingredients in a jar and shake them together, making sure to break up any clumps with a fork.
- **3.** To store the dry rub, choose one of two methods: Place it in a Ziploc freezer bag, press out as much air as possible and seal. Store in the freezer. Or, you can place the rub in an air-tight jar. Store it for up to 6 months in a cool, dark place or in the refrigerator.
- **4.** Use the dry rub on ribs or other meat before smoking.

-VOCAL-GYNNASTICS

Most every great music genre incorporates harmony. With barbershop style, the harmonies take a different shape, resulting in a sound built on vocal gymnastics where baritones and leads constantly switch places. Lee Tayon first learned about Lone Star Chorus when she went to see a friend's show. "I leaned over and whispered to my husband, 'I have to do that," she said. She joined in 1998.

Stormy Ritchmond became a member in 2020. "A friend and I decided we wanted to join a choir," Stormy said. "I'd never been in a choir, but with the learning media, I can sing," Ironically, her friend didn't continue with the group, but she loves it. As she approaches empty-nest years, it makes the perfect hobby for her.

Although she sang karaoke before, Stormy enjoys the challenge of the chorus. "I hoped to gain new skills, and I do," she shared. "They're good about warm-ups and drills." She loves singing with Lone Star, listening to the harmonies and blend of voices. The camaraderie within the group also appeals to her. "They're all so sweet," Stormy said. "Most are grandmotherly and try to welcome new people. Everyone is so supportive."

Lee agreed. "We all joined for the music, but we stay for the friendships. I can call any of the 35 and have more than enough help," she shared. Over the years, the group helped move people, picked up each other and provided support beyond singing. Although she grew up singing in school and church choirs, the a cappella and unique style provide enough challenge for both the most advanced singers and newcomers alike.

Lone Star Chorus co-directors Becky Loveday and Charlotte Hoffman lead the local group in preparation for competitions and performances. As part of the national group, Sweet Adelines, local choruses must compete at least every three years with a minimum of 17 members. In 1993, the chorus, then named Fort Worth Metro, merged with another small chorus. After their first contest, the group adopted the new name of Lone Star Chorus.

Founded in 1945 by Edna Mae Anderson in Tulsa, Oklahoma, Sweet Adelines came together as a small group of women who loved singing. Over 70 years later, the sisterhood spans the globe and contains almost 21,000 singers around the world. Committed to preserving the unique sound of a cappella barbershop harmony, they continue sharing a passion for music and empowering communities. The organization provides opportunities for barbershop music education, multiple competitions throughout the year, special performance events and an international convention.

The women meet weekly and come from all over, although they want to see more members from the Weatherford area. Normally, they compete annually in March or April. In past international competitions, they appeared using themes such as biker babes, ducks and birdwatchers among others. Half the fun comes from the costumes they choose.

Disappointed at not having the







regional and international competitions for two years during the pandemic, they faced challenges by meeting temporarily via Zoom. Their perseverance paid off when they received an invitation to perform in Hawaii this month during a memorial for the 80th anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor. Excited, the group of women plan on showing up wearing their Texas vests. As official representatives of Texas, they have a proclamation from Governor Abbott they will present to Hawaii during the six-day, five-night trip.

As the daughter of a veteran, Lee looks forward to the Pearl Harbor trip. Many in the group are children and grandchildren of those who fell during the attack, so the trip holds deep meaning for all the members.

Practices throughout the last year provided many challenges. Although they used Zoom, and continue doing so for those who aren't comfortable meeting in person, they miss being together. With many vaccinated now, most of the members have returned in person.

As always, Lone Star Chorus

welcomes new members and those who want to visit and see what the group does. Members can join for long or short term. Some come long enough for competitions or Christmas events. The co-directors have no problem with short-term attendance as long as each woman gives 100 percent while there.

With few requirements, they hope to see their small group continue growing. "You have to be able to carry a tune — not in a bucket," Becky said with a laugh. "Seriously, you need a love of music, but don't have to read music. I look for not the perfect voice, but one I can work with." During auditions, she asks herself if that voice is teachable.

The group has dues, and each woman must pay for her costume and contests. Like most hobbies, it requires spending money. They work with members when necessary. "Because I drop money into this, I'm gonna give it my best," Becky admitted. "Lone Star is coming back strong."

As they meet in person again, they will take precautions and check temperatures each week. Made up of all ages, dues and fees cost less for

those under 25. Although allowed to join, children must have a sponsor. Their youngest ever member started at 10. Now 30 years old, the woman no longer lives in the area, but participates in competitions through a sister Sweet Adeline group. "She came in fifth at Internationals, top five in the country," the ladies boasted.

While most choral music follows a spherical shape, barbershop has a cone shape with bass at the foundation. With extremely tight harmonies, the notes lock and ring, producing a sound that, in actuality, no one sings. Performed a cappella, the audience hears only words and sweet melodies.

The practices require work, but Lee and Stormy enjoy the weekly times with other singers. Whether women come for only the meetings, to perform, compete or take part seasonally, the two find rejuvenation in the practices and look forward to many years of singing. NOW




