BLENDED & BLESSED

At Home With Richard and Jeniffer Peña

For the Peña family, holidays mean making memories and giving thanks for the gifts with which their blended family has been blessed ... starting with their unique love story. "Jen and I knew each other because our boys played soccer together when they were 4. Later, when the boys were in 7th grade, they were partners for a class project," Richard remembered. "It was Super Bowl Sunday, and I heard a knock at my door. My son didn't tell me he invited anyone over to work on a project, but I was pleasantly surprised because I had always admired Jen and thought she was beautiful.

"I invited them in, and the boys went to work on the project. Jen left, and all of the sudden, I received a text asking me what was for dinner. I invited her over. That was February 3, 2015. Our lives were beginning unbeknownst to us." They began dating and were married a year later, becoming a family of seven, including sons Chad, now age 23; Nickey, 21; Corbin, 20; Landen, 18; and Presley, 14.

In 2016, the couple planned their wedding and built their six-bedroom home in The Grove. "We wanted this plan, and they weren't building it anywhere else. It worked for our family for a short time — then the boys left," Richard noted.

"Now our daughter basically has an entire apartment to herself upstairs," Jeniffer said. "When she graduates, we'd like to look at a house on the lake."

In the meantime, the Peñas enjoy their home, particularly at the holidays. "I love to decorate for Thanksgiving and Christmas. My husband and the kids enjoy all the holiday vibes and smells," Jeniffer noted. "I'm a little obsessed with Christmas decor. I even change our bedding to match the holiday."

The family starts watching Christmas movies as soon as they begin airing, including favorites: *Coat of Many Colors, Elf* and anything on the Hallmark channel. "And Christmas music will be playing — especially Elvis — as we decorate the tree," Richard described.

The Christmas decor goes up earlier and earlier with bonus items every season. Clusters of trees of all sizes and materials, holiday-messaged signs and buffalo plaid and ticking stripe stockings are some decorative staples. "The smell of cinnamon spice candles fills our home all December, and I add something new to our decor each year. Presley now has a love-hate relationship with it all," Jeniffer joked.

The six larger Christmas trees scattered around their two-story home showcase Jeniffer's love of "fancy, vintage and glass

















bulbs," plus ornaments with special meaning to the family. "I love our Marine and Army bulbs and the police car ornament," Jeniffer noted.

Richard is a Marine Veteran and retired police officer. "He headed the MISD safety program for eight years," Jeniffer explained, "So he was known as Officer Peña everywhere he went for a long time."

Jeniffer is also known locally, having been a hairstylist for 12 years at Swink Color Bar, while Richard has become a Realtor. "We were reminded how supportive the community is when Richard got COVID-19 last year," Jeniffer recalled.

Throughout Richard's 98-day hospitalization, the community supported the Peñas. "There were something like 1,200 people following our Facebook page of updates on Richard," Jeniffer stated. "Six officers escorted us home from the hospital. with people along the roads from the high school and into our neighborhood cheering him on."

While he still used a walker, Richard was off oxygen, recovering well, and soon ready to return to the school board trustee role to which he'd been elected in May 2021. The Peñas were excited to get back to pre-pandemic mode as soon as his health allowed.

"Richard had just started real estate when the world shut down. I didn't work for seven weeks. We actually enjoyed that time, traveling together to places where no one else was around," Jeniffer admitted.

Traveling is a big part of the holidays for the Peñas, too. Before hitting the road, there are some special family traditions. "We normally celebrate Christmas Eve at my parents' in Ovilla. Christmas morning, we open gifts with





the kids who are able to be here," Jeniffer outlined. "I usually cook a breakfast casserole with a recipe from my bonus mom. All the kids love it. Now that they are older, we get a kick out of playing games. We have a money-shooting gun that we fill with a mix of fake and real money and make it rain. It's exciting to see who gets the most real money. Then we're usually ready to hit the road," Jeniffer outlined.

Some of the Peñas' favorite holiday destinations are Branson, Missouri, and Pigeon Forge, Tennessee. "The Sight and Sound Jesus show in Branson is amazing. It is the best visual reminder of the true meaning of Christmas," Richard offered.

"We like to make memories. We exchange gifts but activities are better than having stuff to open," Jeniffer said.


One of their best gifts, they say, is the family they have made. "If I had a message to other blended families, it would be that every day is a challenge, but things smooth out," Richard noted. "Anything you want to be successful at takes work. Marriage is the fight of your life, and blending families ups that challenge."

And when the kids fought like other siblings, "I told them to work it out on their own," Richard said. "The louder they got, the higher I turned up the volume on the TV."



- **1.** Lightly spray a 9x 12-inch baking pan with the cooking oil. Drain the green beans; place them in 1/3 of the pan area.
- **2.** Add the chicken next to the green beans; then add the potatoes. The chicken, green beans and potatoes should each cover about 1/3 of the pan.
- **3.** Sprinkle the dressing mix over everything. Add black pepper to taste.
- **4.** Drizzle the butter over the top. Cover with foil; bake at 350 F for 1 hour and 10 minutes.

Nebber's Rolls With Modern Twist

- 1 cup shortening
- 2 1/4 cups water (divided use)
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1 1/2 tsp. salt
- 3 pkgs. instant dry yeast
- 3 eggs
- 8 cups flour
- 2 sticks butter, melted
- **I.** Place the shortening, 1 1/4 cups water, sugar and salt in a bowl; heat the ingredients in the microwave for about 30 seconds. Stir until the shortening is melted; cool to lukewarm.
- **2.** In a large bowl, dissolve the instant dry yeast in 1 cup lukewarm water.
- **3.** Add the shortening mixture and eggs; gradually add the flour, beating well with a spoon.
- **4.** Once combined, knead until soft, circular and elastic. Place the dough in a greased bowl, turning once to grease the top of the dough.
- **5.** Cover with a cloth; let rise in a warm place for 10-15 minutes.
- **6.** Roll out flat; cut using a small, circular cup on a flat surface. Dip the cut out dough into the melted butter. Fold in half; place the dough close together in greased baking pans.
- **7.** Bake at 350 F for 15-20 minutes. Brush with butter and serve.

Chocolate Ribbon Pie

4 oz. cream cheese 2 Tbsp. sugar





- 2 Tbsp. condensed milk (divided use)
- 1 8-oz. tub Cool Whip, thawed (divided use)
- 1 9-inch Oreo Crumb Crust
- 2 cups cold milk
- 2 4-oz. pkgs. chocolate fudge instant pudding

Cocoa powder or chocolate shavings

- **1.** In a bowl, beat together the cream cheese, sugar and 1 Tbsp. of the condensed milk until smooth. Gently fold in half of the Cool Whip. Spread on the bottom of the crust.
- **2.** In another bowl, combine the milk and remaining condensed milk. Add pudding; whisk for 2 minutes. Pour over the cream cheese layer.
- **3.** Refrigerate for 4 hours, until well set and chilled. Top with the remaining Cool Whip; spread evenly. Garnish with cocoa powder or chocolate shavings.

- **I.** In a large skillet, sauté the onions in the olive oil until softened. Add the hamburger; brown, stirring in the seasonings. (I usually add other favorite spices.) When the meat finishes cooking, stir in the cornstarch.
- **2.** Transfer the meat to a 6- or 8-qt. Crock-Pot. Add the frozen vegetables and V-8 Juice. Stir everything well; cook on low for at least 4 hours. Add water or broth if extra liquid is needed.
- **3.** Serve in individual bowls with sour cream and cheese, if desired.

 1 1/2 cups sugar

Midlothian Postal Service employee Amy Barrientos is proof that Santa Claus exists, as long as you believe. Amy has a direct line to St. Nick, as organizer of the MPS Letters to Santa program. "My first Christmas at the post office, no one was specifically assigned to organize the letters or make sure Santa sent a response because everyone was so busy with normal operations," Amy, who started at MPS in 2015, recalled.

So, with Santa's permission, Amy began responding to letters during her lunch break. "I got about 10 to 15 letters for the first two years, but I guess word started to spread," Amy surmised.

As interest increased, Amy emphasized to carriers that they had to make sure a return address was on every Santa

letter in order for a response to be sent. Children were also reminded via social media to include their address for Santa. "Letters started coming in earlier, which made me happy, so I had time to respond to everyone. Each year, it has grown more and more," Amy said.

Participation grew so much, Amy had to employ the assistance of her family to make sure every child received a response. "I started to bring the letters to my family's Thanksgiving and had everyone help," Amy explained.

With the enthusiastic assistance of her mom, Patricia Garza; her older sister, Natalie; and her own daughters, Elena (6) and Alyana (3), Amy now has a system for handling Santa letters, starting with ordering special supplies in early fall. "As soon as the first letter comes in, I like to start responding to stay ahead of the game, so it won't be too much to handle," Amy stated. "With my girls, we love to turn on Christmas music, sit by the fire that my husband, Ruben, makes, and just start. The girls help with the arts and crafts part, like adding fun stickers. Once they get tired, we pick out a cartoon Christmas movie, and while they watch, my husband will make me some coffee or hot chocolate, and I work on responses.

"Then, when the rest of my family gets involved, it's basically an assembly line," Amy described. "I write a Santaapproved response, and my family helps stuff and decorate envelopes."

Amy usually knows just what Santa would want her to say. "There are a few letters that stand out from the rest. Some are sweet like requests for a new sibling. Or those that say, 'All I want for Christmas is for my family to get some sleep because my baby brother or sister is up all night crying," Amy said.

"Some older children write and say their parents are making them do this for their little siblings, and they just want a million dollars. Those are the ones Santa likes to remind they are never too old to believe and that he is always watching, but better luck next year on the million dollars," Amy joked. "But Santa has me tell them he'll get them something else they like instead."

Other times, Santa's replies are a little harder to give. "The ones that get me are those saying that all they want for Christmas is enough food for their families, or they just lost a family member and wish that they can see them for one more day," Amy reflected. "Or a little one just lost a sibling and wants their mom to be happy again."

Amy's family taught her that small acts of kindness, like a reply from Santa, matter. "Growing up, while all of my siblings were in school — there are five of us — my mom would help out all of our teachers. She would put packets together, help make the centers, make little games the teachers wanted her to make. Once we all got older, she started substituting at our schools. Everyone loved her!" Amy recalled. "My older sister always loved doing stuff like that, too, and now she's an elementary teacher with a classroom of her own."

When not helping St. Nick, Amy enjoys decorating, arts and crafts and co-ed softball with her husband. An MHS graduate who attended Navarro College, Amy sees the Letters to Santa program as her way to spread kindness. "I hold on to the responses until closer to Christmas, because that's when Santa knows kids are most excited to hear from him," Amy explained. "I feel like this is something kids can look forward to no matter what's going on in their lives." NOW






