It's National Children's Dental Health Month!



For National Children's Dental Health Month, I thought I'd share some information on a topic that many parents struggle with. Are thumb-sucking and pacifier habits harmful for a child's teeth? The short answer is yes. These habits may result in long-term problems.

As a parent and a pediatric dentist, I see various oral habits, but the most common of them all is thumb -sucking. Most kids suck their thumbs

because it's soothing and is most prevalent during times of hunger, fatigue, stress, sleep, teething, and shyness. In fact, some children are seen upon ultrasound sucking their thumbs.

The intensity and frequency of the thumb-sucking habit, as well as the pattern of jaw growth, determine whether dental problems will develop. The American Dental Association recommends breaking the thumb-sucking habit before your child's permanent teeth come in. If left uncorrected, thumb-sucking can result in reshaping of the jawbone (narrow upper jaw), flaring of the upper front teeth, poor tongue placement, speech issues, overbite and open bite, and airway issues.

It is important to know that a thumb-sucking habit will typically stop on its own, and that, ideally, it will stop before the permanent teeth erupt. Once the permanent first molars erupt, usually around age 6, there can be changes to the direction of the growth of the

Talk to your child. Explain what you're worried about. Kids respond better when they know why they are being told "no."

once isn't easy for a child. It is OK to suck his or her thumb in bed,

but not anywhere else. The goal is to have the habit taper off on its own.

Provide a replacement coping skill. Like adults, kids find it hard to break habits if they don't have an alternative way of coping, Consider letting your child have a "lovey" or "fidget" to squeeze when they're anxious.


Help your child recognize the habit. Remind your child when you see them doing it. Not all kids are conscious that they are sucking their thumbs, especially when they're bored or tired. Pointing it out can help them become more self-aware.

Keep in mind that change is not easy and may require lots of patience, which sometimes is easier said than done. If the thumb habit is still present at age 6, enlist your dentist's help. There may be some orthodontic issues developing, so I recommend a consultation to find the most appropriate method for addressing the problem and reversing the dental effects.

Reflecting back on many years of working with his hands, and looking to the future, Pastor Billy Joe Kelly remarked, "I want to wear out. I don't want to rust out. As long as I can keep this body moving, I want to be working." Billy Joe and his wife, Ruthie, have spent most of their lives in the Corsicana area, Ruthie being born in Corsicana, and Billy Joe in the Timothy community north of Corsicana.

Billy Joe has built a number of homes over the years and has taken many others that were in disrepair and added rooms to make them available for families to own. Never one to hire employees, his No. 1 helper for over 60 years has been Ruthie. "My father was a carpenter, so I learned the basics from him. I know how to help," she added. "I tried some other jobs. I worked at the hat factory for a while, but it was just because I felt like I had to try it."

Billy Joe continued, "My daddy had 100 acres of land in Timothy, Texas. There were 11 of us children in the family, and Momma did the best she could for us. Daddy died when I was 16, and I married Ruthie when I was 17.



"I'm happy to say I have always had a job. When one job would not work out, I was always able to find another one. One of my first jobs, other than working the farm, was for Uvalde Construction building Highway 22. After a short time in Sulphur Springs, we got homesick and moved back to Corsicana." That was in the early '60s, and soon after, Billy Joe took a job in Dallas with World Carpet Mill. "I drove a forklift for them, making about \$55 a week. That is hard to imagine today, but at the time, we could get a bill of groceries for \$12. Chicken was 19 cents a pound, and gasoline was 15 cents a gallon."

While in Dallas, he was nearby the day President John F. Kennedy was assassinated. "I went downtown to pay our water bill, which was \$5, and I was about a block away, sometime during the noon hour, when I heard this popping sound. I thought they must really be celebrating Kennedy because fireworks were being set off. The president was on his way to the World Trade Center to make a speech, and we had put a lot of carpet in that building. I had to work the rest of the day, thinking about that. I am glad to have the Kennedy story in my record book, though. Not many from Corsicana worked in Dallas at that time."

(17-96545) Always looking for a way to improve their lot, Billy Joe's brother-in-law said he was making about \$125 a week working for Oil City Iron Works. "The thing he failed to mention was the number of hours he was working to earn that," he related. "From there I went to work for Commodore Trailer Homes. I started out helping a welder, then he taught me how to weld. I never got laid off from a job, but I worked for Chattanooga Glass, and it went out of business when plastic got so popular. After that, we were 'on our own,' and have been since about 1989."

The first house Billy Joe and Ruthie built was a "shotgun house" on the land in Timothy. Later, they added three rooms on one side. Still later, they added three more rooms, making a nine-room house. "We also added a washroom across the back and an oldfashioned room with a cast-iron stove," they recalled.

They built two more houses on the property in Timothy, one almost as large as their current home. Then they built another house across the street. After their children were grown, they started looking for some lots in Corsicana to build on. "This lot where our home is now had been abandoned, and it was grown over like a forest. We had to wait a year-and-a-half to make sure the prior owner was not going to come back to claim it before we could build this house," Billy Joe added.

Over the next several years, the Kellys built or remodeled a number of houses in Corsicana. They have seen a lot of improvements over the years, such as the paving of the streets in





the neighborhood they live in now, as well as the area that Ruthie grew up in. "202 East 19th Street, my home as a child, was the only house in the neighborhood that had a water faucet in the front yard. The whole neighborhood would come to our house for water," Ruthie mentioned. "A few years ago, Billy Joe said it looked like my daddy, P.R. Renfro, had been forgotten, and he wanted to do something about it. We got the name of the street changed, so now Renfro Avenue is the street I grew up on."

Surely working together has played a part in this couple's successful marriage of more than 60 years, but they offered some other things that have been important, perhaps even more so. "Look to the Lord for everything, and ask Him for this day. We like going to church. The family that prays together stays together," Ruthie offered.

"We moved the building where our church is from Angus. We remodeled it, and the Spirit moved me to add 3,400 square feet on to it," Billy Joe recalled with a smile. "We used to drive to Memphis, Tennessee, every year to a church conference, and in all those years, I never got a single ticket."

He grinned as Ruthie, right on cue, added, "Well you shouldn't have bought me that new car!"

They both agreed that a happy marriage is about give and take. "She probably had to take more than I did," Billy Joe said.

"A lot has changed in Corsicana over the years. I think the next thing will be more retail out on the interstate," Billy Joe mused. Whatever direction Corsicana takes, the Kellys will be a part of it, continuing to build as they have for 60 years together.



Escape classrooms provided through Google with teams competing against the clock and multiple clues requiring advanced problem-solving skills sounds like every high school student's idea of an interesting English lesson. That's exactly what Mildred High School teacher, Kathy Herron, was able to provide, along with other Internet motivational tools, for her English students, thanks to an innovative teaching grant funded by the Mildred Education Foundation.

"WE LOOK FOR SOMETHING DIFFERENT THAT DIRECTLY BENEFITS STUDENTS." "I also have new tables through this grant that provide small group stations, so students can rotate from one assignment to another, adapting to multiple learning styles," Ms. Herron explained. The grant awards are announced at the end-of-school faculty meeting each year.

Having experienced firsthand the success of the Corsicana Education Foundation, Samantha Daviss and her husband, Kelly, knew a similar nonprofit educational arm was needed and stepped up to the plate as founders of the nonprofit Mildred Education Foundation when their children became Mildred ISD students. These days, a 15-member MEF board of directors is led by Samantha, president; Carie Judson, secretary; Beth Horner, vice president; and Ashley Hanna, treasurer.

"We raise funds to provide supplemental resources, such as teacher innovative grants and high school student scholarships based on merit and need," Samantha explained. "Our board is wonderfully diverse in every way. The members are amazing, and we've become good friends. They show up to the once-a-month meetings smiling."


Innovative teaching ideas in academics, the arts and extracurricular activities are the focus of funded grants. District educators are encouraged to fill out the four-page detailed application. Once granted, receipts for expenses are turned in.

"We look for something different that directly benefits students," Samantha said. Grants have funded art supplies that enable the art teacher to teach different art styles and the purchase of a camera and bag for the high school yearbook staff.

Brooklyn Robinson, yearbook editor and MHS senior, said, "With this camera, we can take quality photos from the stands at athletic events. It's made a big difference." Brooklyn, a Mildred native and daughter of Michael and Natalie Robinson, plans on applying for scholarship opportunities since she wants to attend Navarro College to pursue a degree in nursing.

"Having these opportunities to go on pushes me," Brooklyn added. With dual credit classes, she is a student council and church worship team member who also holds down several

part-time jobs, and already has a great head start in college.

Scholarships are awarded on the graduating students' academic standings, general merit and need. "Once awarded, we monitor the student's grades in college to make sure he or she is maintaining at least a 2.0 GPA," Samantha said.

Funds to support MEF projects and grants are raised through the organization's website and the two annual fundraisers, Stuff the Boot in the fall and Denim and Diamonds, which will be held this year on May 2. "We don't ask the students and their families to sell anything," Samantha explained. "Our teachers are encouraged to turn in 'wish lists' for the Denim and Diamonds tables.

"In 2018, supporters donated \$26,000 and almost doubled that amount in 2019 — monies dedicated to fulfilling each wish list. This year, we want to raise enough funds to host a senior banquet instead of the past senior breakfasts. MEF's purpose is to give back to MISD so learning opportunities outside of state funding can happen."

A veteran teacher of 21 years with four years' experience in MISD, Ms. Herron was chosen as MHS Teacher of the Year 2016-2017. A Houston native and graduate of Stephen F. Austin State University with a master's degree from Texas Southern University, she serves as






the UIL sponsor for the literary criticism and essay writing contests. "I love to read, travel, teach and garden," Ms. Herron said.

Samantha, a Corsicana native, enjoyed growing up knowing everyone and making wonderful friends. "Friends and family provide great networking sources for MEF," she explained. She is a wife, busy mom chauffeuring kids, a full-time appraiser and a student working on her master's degree. "Having time to volunteer is my challenge," Samantha added. However, the time spent is worth it when students achieve through the MEF-provided opportunities. Samantha concluded, "We board members receive thank you cards in appreciation." NOW





A Little Piece of Heaven

Crust:

- 2 cups cookies, crushed (use vanilla wafers, ginger snaps, graham crackers, etc.)
- 1/2 cup butter, melted

Filling:

2 8-oz. pkgs. cream cheese, softened 1 1/2 cups powdered sugar

Tbsp. vanilla extract I6-oz. tub Cool Whip (divided use) 4 bananas, sliced

1 14-oz. jar caramel sauce

I. *For crust:* Preheat oven to 350 F. Mix the cookies and butter together; adding enough butter so cookies press well into a greased casserole dish.

 tsp. almond extract
 tsp. vanilla extract
 cups flour
 Preheat oven to 350 F Cream the cheese

and butter together. Add the sugar; add the eggs one at a time.

2. Add the extracts; add the flour, a little at a time until all is well mixed.

3. Pour the batter into a well-greased and floured Bundt pan. Bake for 15 minutes; reduce heat to 325 F. Bake for almost 1 hour, until soft and moist.





• TALES OF TEXAS • **FBARKEY** FERENCE

The American Heart Association reminds us that one in four deaths each year in the United States is a result of heart disease. In response, American Heart Health Month takes place each February to raise awareness of the disease and how to prevent it.

Longtime Texas resident, Dr. Michael DeBakey, was a pioneer in cardiology whose accomplishments centered around heart health. Namesake of the Houston Methodist DeBakey Heart and Vascular Center, Dr. DeBakey performed the first successful removal of a blockage in the carotid artery, establishing the field of surgical treatment of stroke, in 1953.

While today, Dr. DeBakey's name can also be found on other Texas research facilities and schools, it was not his birth name. After immigrating to Louisiana from Lebanon, the Dabaghis decided DeBakey was a more suitable, anglicized version of their name.

Born to Shaker Morris and Raheehja DeBakey in 1908, Michael is said to have shared his parents' thirst for knowledge and discipline. Shaker was not only a pharmacist, but also an investor. Michael's compassionate spirit no doubt came from his mother, who was an activist for nonprofit organizations.

In 1926, Michael graduated high school as valedictorian, then earned his bachelor's degree from Tulane University in 1930. While finishing his medical degree at Tulane's School of Medicine in 1932, DeBakey invented the roller pump — a tool helping blood flow continuously during operations. The device went on to be used in the first open heart surgery two decades later and was the first of more than 50 surgical heart and artery instruments credited to Dr. DeBakey.

Volunteering for military service at the start of World War II, DeBakey is credited with changing the way the Army handled casualties. Serving four years in the Office of the U.S. Surgeon General, he pursued movement of medical facilities nearer to the front lines, speeding the care of wounded soldiers and increasing their chances of surviving.

In 1945, he received the Legion of Merit Award for these efforts, which resulted in the Army's standardization of MASH units — Mobile Army Surgical Hospitals — which were first utilized in the Korean War a decade later, with helicopters and airplanes used to transport wounded soldiers from frontline care centers to surgical hospitals.

As a result of DeBakey's efforts, reports suggest soldiers who made it to MASH units had a 97 percent chance of surviving. With ongoing concern for servicemen, Dr. DeBakey also developed the Veterans' Administration (VA) Medical Center System and VA's Medical Research Program to try and ensure the treatment of soldiers returning from war and veterans with certain medical issues.

Moving to Houston in 1948, Dr. DeBakey became a staff member at Houston Methodist Hospital and joined the Baylor College of Medicine faculty. Houston Methodist's website credits the doctor as "essential to the Texas Medical Center's evolution into the largest medical complex in the world."

DeBakey recruited doctors and researchers who, with him, developed many innovative treatments. Other significant accomplishments by Dr. DeBakey include the invention of the awhile



Dacron graft — tubes which can replace or repair blood vessels — which he initially prototyped using his wife's sewing machine in 1954. This method would save DeBakey's own life decades later, when he suffered a dissecting aortic aneurysm at age 97, and doctors performed his own procedure on him.

In addition to his Dacron graft development, DeBakey performed the first aortocoronary artery bypass in 1964, and in 1968, the first multiple-organ transplant of a heart, one lung and both kidneys from one donor to four recipients. Working into his 80s, the medical statesman is credited with more than 60,000 surgeries.

Dr. DeBakey ensured Houston would continue to be synonymous with heart surgery treatment by teaching at Baylor College of Medicine, training thousands of surgeons, conducting ongoing research and co-authoring some 1,300 published articles. In 2001, Houston Methodist DeBakey Heart and Vascular Center officially opened. In 2008 at age 99, Dr. DeBakey died at Houston Methodist Hospital, where he had served a significant portion of his career and had greatly advanced cardiovascular medicine.
