In the summer of 1986, 17-year-old Jack Freeman took a family vacation that would change his life. "We were in Galveston, and a friend and I were watching girls on the boardwalk. I saw a four-person bike riding toward us, and when it passed, there was the most beautiful girl I'd ever seen," Jack recalled.

A wink and a smile from the blonde stopped Jack's heart, and he managed to say a quick hello. As fate would have it, the girl's sandal slipped off, causing her and her friends to stop. "I went and picked it up, walked over and knelt down and said, 'I wonder if this is going to fit?" Jack remembered. "I slid the sandal on her foot, smiled and said, 'Look, it fits just like Cinderella."

Introducing himself, Jack discovered his Cinderella was actually named *Cindy*. She told him she was 16 and from Mineola. "I asked, 'Where the heck is that?' and she said, 'North of Tyler,'" Jack reflected.

"Then I asked where he was from, and when he said, 'Midlothian,' I said, 'Where the heck is that?" Cindy laughed.


At that point, Cindy and her friends said they were late returning the rented bike. "They had missed the turn for the bike store before and went around the block. That is the only reason I saw Cindy that day," Jack noted. "Before she left, I asked where she was staying and if I could see her the next day." Jack told his parents he'd met a "one-of-a-kind girl," and, anxious to see her again, he arrived 30 minutes earlier than she expected him the next day. "I knocked on the hotel door and got no answer, so my friend said she'd stood me up," Jack explained.

Jack took a walk and returned to find Cindy leaving her hotel. "I was upset because I thought he'd stood *me* up. But we had missed him because we were at breakfast, and he came early," Cindy explained.

The enamored duo spent the day talking and getting to know each other. "We hung out that night by the pool and walked the beach holding hands. It was one of those special summer nights when two teenagers fell in love," Cindy admitted.







"I walked her to her hotel door and kissed her goodnight. The next day, we were leaving. We went by their hotel, so my parents could meet her, and her parents and everyone talked," Jack recounted. "We exchanged addresses and phones numbers, then we left and headed home."

Since this was before the existence of email and texting, Cindy hand wrote lack letters for the next 10 months. "I would write back some but would also call her every other week. I mean it was long distance," Jack joked of the time when it was more expensive to phone folks who were out of town.

Fast forward to April 1987, lack was a senior at Midlothian High School, and Cindy was a junior at Mineola High. "She called and invited me to her prom. I drove 115 miles!" Jack calculated.

"We had not seen each other since June the prior year. We danced and realized how much we'd missed each other," Cindy explained. "I think we knew that night how much we loved each other."

A month later, Jack drove back to Mineola to ask Cindy to "go" with him. "One year after we met, and the third time we'd seen each other, I gave her my class ring," he said.

"We spent the whole summer together between his family's home and mine. The greatest summer of our lives," Cindy recalled.

Cindy's senior year began September 1987, and Jack visited every other weekend. "She was a majorette, so I would go watch the Mineola football games to see her twirl," Jack noted.

Jack had already graduated, signed up for the Navy and was set to leave for boot camp in November. "After I left, I would call her when I could. She would





write me once a week," Jack said. "I came home April 1988, and she asked me to her senior prom. Of course, I went, and it was more magical than the year before."

The couple described dancing and singing to each other like it was yesterday. That August, they moved in together to attend college. "We loved that college life for two years — learned so much about each other and had our ups and downs," Cindy said.

In December 1990, Jack's military unit was activated for Desert Storm and sent to Germany. "We spoke on the phone a few times, but we couldn't stand being away from each other. She flew to Germany (the first time she had ever flown) on January 17, 1991," Jack said.

Cindy stayed in a hotel a few miles from the base. "After dinner on Valentine's Day 1991, we were walking back to the barracks. There was a light snow fall, and the moment was perfect," Jack remembered. "I knelt down in the snow and asked her to marry me. She began to cry and yelled, 'Yes!""

Jack returned from Desert Storm in April that year, and he and Cindy were married July 27, 1991. "We've been married 30 years and have been together for 34. We have three kids: Alyssa, Jaclyn and Jack IV," Cindy said.

A few years ago, the couple began anticipating joint retirement from the Dallas VA Hospital, with plans to buy an RV and travel. Plans changed when Cindy was diagnosed with Stage 4 Colorectal Cancer in 2019. "She is on chemotherapy every other week, so I drive her to appointments and have taken over cooking duties," Jack said.

"The trips will have to be planned differently, but my plan is to be with her no matter what or how we are doing things," Jack continued. "Our love for each other is larger than life itself, and I think we have shown it the last 35 years since the night that I met and fell in love with my Cinderella." NOW



Elementary school years lay the academic foundation for the years of study to come, but for Dannielle Remek, time as a student at Mt. Peak Elementary School in MISD meant so much more. She learned to love music, and she met her future fiancé, Tyler Caldwell, when they were in Ms. Miller's third grade class. Dannielle, a well-known local performer and music therapist, has combined her two loves by writing songs for an EP titled High School Sweethearts.

Dannielle moved to Midlothian just in time to attend third grade. "I consider myself a Midlothian native, and I graduated from Midlothian High School," she added. She performed in an elementary school talent show and in musicals at Waxahachie Community Theatre and MHS. "I was Wizard of Oz's Dorothy and Grease's Rizzo," Dannielle recalled.

"I will never forget what it felt like performing in front of the community. One of my favorite memories was performing as Dorothy. I was bombarded by tons of little girls wanting to get photos. That's as close as I've felt to being a 'superstar,' and I loved that it was as a character who I loved playing."

Those roles were only the start of things to come. She has performed in other musicals, showcases, coffee shop gigs and shows at Belmont University. "My main instrument has always been my voice. I have been singing since I can remember," Dannielle remarked.

"I picked up the guitar and piano in high school and received voice, piano, guitar and percussion formal training from Belmont. As a musician, I write most of my songs with my guitar in hand."

Tyler and Dannielle knew each other through middle school, and during their high school sophomore year, love bloomed when he started walking her to class even though it made him late to his own. "On Christmas Eve 2014, Tyler bought me a Frozen kid's watch as a joke, and the rest is history!" Dannielle shared. The couple carried on a five-year, long-distance romance during college, and in March 2021, Tyler proposed marriage through a scavenger hunt during

Dannielle's 22nd birthday party. "I was completely surprised and am absolutely elated to be marrying my high school sweetheart on August 6, 2022," she added.

It was during those five years of missing Tyler when Dannielle wrote the six EP songs. "Songwriting was a way for me to feel close to him when physical proximity was impossible." she explained.

The songs were a December 2019 anniversary present to Tyler, and the difficult part was keeping the project a secret for several months. When the time came, "Tyler was blown away."

During October 2020, Dannielle released three of the six songs and has performed them via social media due to COVID-19. "Year 1" is about falling in love at age 15, "Year 2" is about watching each other grow through high school times, and "Year 3" is about the long-anticipated goodbye as the couple began their long-distance journey.

"I decided to keep the song titles as the years, since High School Sweethearts is a concept EP that was birthed out of a project originally meant for just Tyler and myself," Dannielle explained. "I partnered with Luke and Shelby Johnson to produce the EP. They were extremely encouraging, and it was an exhilarating feeling to hear these songs come to life."

Tyler and Dannielle treasure each song for different reasons. "If I picked a favorite, it would be 'Year I," Dannielle admitted. "It reminds me of my 15-yearold self falling in love for the first time. Tyler's favorite is 'Year 2' because he loves the groove and how upbeat the song is."

In her spare time, Dannielle volunteers with CASA of Tarrant County, spends time with friends and family, works toward music therapy advocacy projects, invests her time into her students and clients at Destiny Studio, reads and watches Netflix. Her attention is focused on wedding planning, where, perhaps, her original music will be shared with the community that means so much to the couple. After all, as Danielle noted, "All of our friends and family who have watched Tyler and me grow in love over the years will be at our wedding." NOW



- I tsp. salt
- 2 large tomatoes, diced
- 1 cucumber, sliced
- 2 red bell pepper, diced
- 1/2 red onion, thinly sliced
- 20 basil leaves, chiffonade
- 1 tsp. garlic, minced
- 1/2 tsp. Dijon-style mustard
- 3 Tbsp. white wine vinegar or champagne vinegar
- 1/2 cup olive oil

- 1/2 tsp. salt1/4 tsp. black pepper
- **I.** Make the croutons by tossing the bread and olive oil with the salt. Bake at 425 F for 10 minutes.
- **2.** Combine all the vegetables and the basil with the croutons. Whisk together the remaining 6 ingredients. Pour over the salad and toss.

Rosemary Focaccia Bread

By Judith Fertig.

Bread:

3 1/4 cups bread flour

3/4 Tbsp. instant or bread machine yeast3/4 Tbsp. salt1 1/2 cups lukewarm water (100 F)

Focaccia:

I tsp. rosemary
Drizzle of olive oil
I/4 tsp. salt
Cornmeal, for dusting baking sheet

- **I.** For bread: Spoon the flour into a measuring cup; level with a knife or your finger, then dump the flour into a large mixing bowl.
- **2.** Add the yeast and salt to the flour. Stir together with a wooden spoon or Danish dough whisk. Pour in the water; stir together until just moistened. Beat 40 strokes, scraping the bottom and the sides of the bowl, until the dough forms a lumpy, sticky mass.
- **3.** Cover with plastic wrap; let rise at room temperature (72 F) for 2 hours or until the dough has risen near the top of the bowl and has a sponge-like appearance.
- **4.** Use right away or refrigerate. Use that day or place the dough, covered with plastic wrap, in the refrigerator for up to 9 days before baking.

- **5.** For focaccia: Using half the dough, make a 12-by-6-inch oval. Lightly push your knuckles into the dough. Sprinkle with fresh rosemary needles; drizzle with olive oil and salt.
- **6.** Transfer the dough to a baking sheet lined with parchment paper and sprinkled with commeal. Cover the dough with a tea towel; let rest.
- **7.** Prepare the oven for baking: Place a broiler pan on the bottom rack of the oven and a baking stone in the middle of the oven. Turn the oven on to 450 F. When the oven is hot, set the baking sheet with the bread on it onto the baking stone. Pour 2 cups of hot water into the broiler pan; close the door. Bake for about 15 minutes or until the temperature or bread registers 190 F.

Fresh Tomato Basil Sauce By Jenny Hobbick.


- 4 cloves garlic, minced
 Olive oil, enough for sautéing
 4 large tomatoes, diced
 I cup cherry tomatoes, quartered
 I0 fresh basil leaves, chiffonade
 I Tbsp. sugar
 I tsp. salt
- **1.** In a saucepan, sauté garlic in oil; add tomatoes and basil. Cook together for 5 minutes; add sugar and salt.
- **2.** Continue to cook for about 10 minutes. Serve over cooked pasta.


French Toast Souffles

2 tsp. ground cinnamon
Pinch of salt
Nutmeg (optional)
1 loaf day-old French bread, cubed into
1-inch pieces
1/2 cup butter
1/2 cup brown sugar
1/2 cup pure maple syrup
Powdered sugar

- **I.** Preheat the oven to 375 F. Spray a 12-cup muffin tin or individual ramekins with cooking spray. Combine eggs, milk, cinnamon, salt and nutmeg, if using. Fold in the cubed bread.
- **2.** Divide the mixture evenly into muffin tins or ramekins. Bake 25-30 minutes.
- **3.** Melt the butter, brown sugar and syrup in a saucepan until the sugar is dissolved; use to serve over the souffles. Sprinkle the tops with powdered sugar.





Frittata

7 large eggs
1/2 cup milk
1/4 cup cream
1/2 cup mascarpone cheese
6 oz. sliced ham, cut into ribbons
5 oz. mozzarella cheese, grated
1/2 cup Parmesan cheese, grated
1/2 cup finely chopped frozen leaf
spinach, thawed and drained
1 clove garlic, minced



Salt, to taste Pepper, to taste 1/2 lb. cooked linguini (I love lemon pepper.)

I. Preheat the oven to 375 F. Spray a 9x13-inch baking dish with nonstick spray. Whisk the eggs, milk, cream and mascarpone cheese. Mix in the ham, cheeses, spinach, garlic, salt and pepper. Add the pasta. Bake for 45-50 minutes; cover with foil halfway through the cooking time to prevent burning.





Hidden in the Hill Country, the town of Mason, Texas, might surprise you with more than you imagined from a population of under 2,500. Don't let its size fool you, though. Throughout the year, visit this hidden getaway for adventure or simply to relax and discover a host of gems within the county.

In abundant deer country, avid hunters may already know about some treasures found in Mason. Located on the Llano River, the community loves visitors, but residents have no desire to become a smaller version of neighboring Fredericksburg. Content with the serenity of their town square, locals and visitors alike find plenty of entertainment without driving far. With several bed-and-breakfasts on the square, you might choose one of them and walk to multiple interesting places.

The square itself has a variety of shops, restaurants and wineries. 


