Watch any NFL football game, and you will probably see a commercial about how football schedules are developed using artificial intelligence. Delving further behind the scenes, there are YouTube videos describing how many variables and "rules" are being simultaneously considered by numerous computers to produce a schedule that is fair to the various teams and entertaining in prime-time television markets. The end result is ultimately played out this time each year at the Super Bowl, and it is broadcast into living rooms across the world.

Jenny Vidrine and Tia Hensley are two local residents who have considered some of the effects of artificial intelligence on business and education. Jenny has been an insurance agent for many years, but recently taught at Paul Quinn College and served for a while as vice president of academic affairs after completing her doctorate in business administration. Tia has been an advance placement English teacher for several years and recently entered school administration as GT/intervention coordinator. She also recently defended her thesis for her master's degree in English.

"In composition, we have to realize that the only thing Al can produce is what has been put into it. We are often looking for creativity or subjectivity, which includes opinion, emotion and feeling. Computers can generate facts and data but cannot express how a passenger train carries a person to their destination the way a great author can and make you feel like you are riding along on the train with them," Tia opined. "Great literature comes from authors who can manipulate language to make the inexpressible, expressible.


"So, while AI programs like ChatGPT might be used as a starting point for generating ideas or perhaps lesson plans, they cannot offer what we expect from students. I'm just not impressed by AI's best writing."

Jenny recently brought a presentation about the Al and ChatGPT to her local Lions Club meeting. As an example of the ability of Al to learn common tasks, she referred to a computer learning to play chess, understanding the moves and strategy involved. After challenging a number of chess masters, it was concluded that none of them could defeat the artificial intelligence of the computer.



Ethics may be at the heart of the argument for using AI in the education arena, but it carries over into many other venues as well. In September 2023, the U.S. Senate Committee on the Judiciary took up the issue of potentially regulating artificial intelligence. Sen. Richard Blumenthal, chairman, mentioned that Al would be used in producing everything from automobiles to drugs to children's toys. While there are regulatory bodies such as the FTC, FAA. FDA and the Consumer Product Safety Commission that oversee the safety of these products, the committee is looking at further regulation regarding their use of Al. Sen. Blumenthal mentioned that the state of Connecticut has an "Office of Al." One example in the hearing was of workers being replaced at a Wendy's drive-thru. The speaker pointed out the negative aspect of that, but also pointed out the potential positive aspect of the person who was replaced by Al then moving on to a position that would require creativity, and not just pushing buttons.







Jenny sees the prevalence of Al as the beginning of a societal shift. "I argue that the last time one this large occurred, it was with the emergence of the written word for the masses after Gutenberg invented the printing press." While admitting that she knows little about the science behind Al, she continued, "But it touches my life every day, has redefined commerce and industry and will shape our understanding of reality going forward."

Recently, a video ad appeared on social media with a popular celebrity endorsing a name-brand stand mixer with the promise to the consumer that they could obtain one "free." All they

had to do was pay the shipping and handling costs. What a deal, if only it were not a scam perpetrated with the use of an Al generated video that took clips of the celebrity speaking and manipulated her speech to create the fake endorsement. In the realm of music and art, Al can produce a "new recording" of songs by an artist by manipulating their voice from prior recordings. Can a new masterpiece by da Vinci or Michelangelo be far behind as Al "learns" to produce their unique brush strokes?

Last March, an open letter was signed by AI experts, scientists and entrepreneurs, including Elon Musk, calling for a pause on development of new AI technologies that would exceed the model GPT-4. The thought is that the technology is evolving too fast, and it is being released before potential risks can be evaluated. As prominent in the tech community as are the people who signed the letter, it is interesting to note that some of the major companies, such as Microsoft and Google, did not respond to requests for comment on the letter.

So, the jury is still out on what the long-reaching effects of this relatively new technology will be, but there is no doubt that it will affect all our lives in some way. Farmers recognize it may reduce waste and produce more food with self-driving tractors, robots harvesting crops and herbicide applicators that know the difference between the good crops and the weeds. All of this seems positive, unless it also results in fewer workers being employed.

Tia is also a youth worker at her church. Last year, ChatGPT was used to help set up a rhyming scavenger hunt for their young members attending summer camp, and the results were fun and enjoyed by the campers. Obviously, there are some lighthearted uses for this evolving challenge. Stay tuned and stay involved to see what the future holds! NOW







With New Year's resolutions still fresh on the minds of many, travel might top the list for 2024. The great state of Texas has an abundance of travel destinations across its nearly 269,000 square miles. From the Chisos Mountains of Big Bend National Park to the spring-fed Comal River in New Braunfels, The Lone Star State does not disappoint. Here are five great places to visit this year:

#### **#1 Big Bend National Park**

This national park has been fascinating visitors since 1944. The best time to visit Big Bend National Park is late fall through early spring, as the summer months are extremely hot. Guests can camp, hike the mountain trails, birdwatch, stargaze and simply enjoy time in nature.

#### **#2 Space Center Houston**

Space Center Houston offers more than 400 artifacts to explore. With rockets and a collection of spacesuits, hands-on experiences, historical films and live demonstrations, visitors can spend all day soaking up the fun. You can check out Mission Control and the Astronaut Training Facility by taking a NASA Tram Tour to NASA Johnson Space Center.

Don't forget to stop by the gift shop for some freeze-dried ice cream and other space-related merchandise. Check the Space Center Houston website to view a calendar of upcoming special events and ticket pricing.

#### **#3 San Antonio River Walk**

First envisioned by Robert H.H. Hugman in the early 1920s, the San Antonio River Walk provides visitors with ample opportunities to enjoy food and drink, shopping, nightlife and more. It was not until 1939 that construction crews broke ground on the river project with Hugman, otherwise known as the Father of the River Walk, serving as architect to develop the area for flood management and to increase tourism.

The 15-mile stretch of river now includes three main sections. The

Downtown area boasts restaurants, hotels, retail space and boat tours. Museum Reach just north of Downtown includes hotels, residences and a number of museums. The section south of Downtown, Mission Reach, is a woodland habitat that connects several UNESCO World Heritage-designated missions.

#### #4 Comal River in New Braunfels

The Comal River is considered the shortest river in Texas, at 2.5 miles, and stays a constant 70-72 degrees. When entering the river at Prince Solms Park, the first splash of cold water is a shock, but your body acclimates as you float on a tube toward the tube chute. If you choose to forgo the chute, you can walk around and return to floating down river through several small rapids.

Disposable items, such as sandwich baggies, cans and water bottles are no longer allowed on the river, so be sure to pack reusable containers for food and beverages. Wear a hat, sunglasses, sunscreen and, if necessary, grab a waterproof bag to store important belongings. Paid parking is available at the park, or you can catch a shuttle from one of the local tubing outfitters.



#### **#5 Fort Worth Stockyards**

The historic Fort Worth Stockvards has been a staple in North Texas since it was established in 1849 as an outpost for cattle drives along the Chisholm Trail. In recent years, more hotels were added to the area, and horse and mule barns underwent restorations to create Mule Alley.

New restaurant concepts and trendy shops add to some Stockyard staples Billy Bob's for all of your honkytonk needs and Cowtown Coliseum for an evening of rodeo. Visitors can ride a mechanical bull, take a ghost tour, taste some wines and catch one of the twice-daily cattle drives of the Fort Worth Herd. Paid parking is available if street spaces are occupied.

No matter your interests, Texas has much to offer. So, have fun exploring The Lone Star State! NOW



Having grown up in Dallas, she learned to love Mexican and Southern cooking. "I have a lot of family recipes, but I also like to experiment in the kitchen. Sometimes, it works out nicely, like my Almond Pound Cake With Caramelized Mango Glaze. However, during COVID I tried making pear preserves like Aunt Dot, my grandmother's sister, used to make, but without her recipe. When they cooled, I had something akin to concrete! That experiment will never make the family cookbook I hope to write someday." Now

#### Green Chicken Enchilada Soup

- 2.5 lbs. chicken breast
- 1 28-oz. can green enchilada sauce
- 1 24-oz. can chicken broth
- 2 cups Monterrey Jack cheese
- 4 oz. cream cheese, cubed, room temperature
- I cup half-and-half or heavy cream
- 4 oz. salsa verde

- Salt, to taste
  Pepper, to taste
  Avocado slices, to taste (optional)
  Cilantro, to taste (optional)
  Sour cream, to taste (optional)
  Tortilla strips, to taste (optional)
- **1.** To a Crock-Pot, add the chicken, enchilada sauce and broth. Cook on low 6-8 hours.

- **2.** Thirty minutes before serving, shred the chicken, and return it to the pot. Add the cheese, cream cheese, half-and-half or cream, salsa verde, salt and pepper. Stir until the cheese melts. You can add additional salsa verde, to taste.
- **3.** Top individual bowls with sliced avocado, cilantro, green onions and sour cream, if desired. Add strips of crisp tortillas, if desired.

#### **Cranberry Orange Pork Roast**

- 1 2- to 3-lb. pork roast
- 4 slices thick-cut bacon
- 2 Tbsp. vegetable oil
- 1 14-oz. can whole berry cranberry sauce
- 1/2 cup Kraft Classic Catalina Dressing
- 1 Tbsp. soy sauce
- 5 Tbsp. orange marmalade
- 1-2 tsp. tapioca flour

#### Water

- I yellow onion, sliced
- 1 lb. baby carrots
- **1.** Wash the roast; pat dry. Wrap the roast with the bacon. In a skillet, brown the roast

in the oil on both sides. Carefully lift the roast out of the skillet and transfer it to a Crock-Pot.

- 2. In a bowl, mix the cranberry sauce, dressing, soy sauce and marmalade together. In a cup, mix the tapioca flour and a little water. Pour into the sauce; mix to combine.
- **3.** Surround the roast with the onions and carrots. Cover with the sauce.
- 4. Cook on high for 6 hours.

#### Almond Pound Cake With Caramelized Mango Glaze

#### Cake:

2 sticks butter, room temperature

I cup shortening

3 cups sugar

5 eggs

3 cups flour (divided use)

1/2 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. baking powder

1 cup whole milk

1 tsp. vanilla

1 tsp. almond extract

#### Glaze:

2 mangoes 1 cup sugar 1/2 cup water 1 Tbsp. unsalted butter, chilled 1/4 tsp. vanilla extract Almond slivers, to taste

- **I.** For cake: Preheat the oven to 325 F. Grease and flour a Bundt pan; set aside.
- 2. In a large bowl, use a hand mixer to cream together the butter, shortening and sugar.
- **3.** Add the eggs, one at a time, beating after each addition. Be sure to scrape down the sides of the bowl after mixing in each egg.
- 4. Alternately add the flour, salt and baking powder with the milk and extracts.
- **5.** Pour the batter into the prepared pan. Bake for  $1 \frac{1}{2}$  hours to 1 hour, 40 minutes. Let cool 10 minutes. Turn out onto a cake plate; let cool.
- 6. For glaze: Peel and coarsely chop the mangoes.
- **7.** Combine the sugar and water in a skillet. Cook until the sugar dissolves. Continue cooking for 3 minutes, or until golden; do
- **8.** Add the butter; stir. Add the mangoes; stir. Cook 10 minutes or until the mangoes are lightly browned and thickened, stirring frequently. About halfway through the cooking time, add the vanilla extract.
- **9.** When thickened and gooey, spoon over the cooled cake. Top with almond slivers.
