Byron Anderson's earliest memory of playing basketball is as a 5-year-old child. "We played in a kid's league at Tabernacle Church," he recalled. "I was not focused solely on basketball then, and I also played football in junior high. When Head Basketball Coach [Jerry] Mason came, we decided to go full-time basketball and work toward a scholarship." This is Coach Mason's second stint as a coach in Ennis, as he was here about 20 years ago as an assistant basketball coach.

Byron's dedication and work ethic stand out. "BJ is a junior, and this will be his second season as a varsity starter," Coach Mason said. "He hasn't missed one summer, offseason or preseason practice the last two years and is working really hard to perfect his craft and become one of the best guards in the DFW area."

Byron explained that his nickname is "BJ" because his father has the same name. The "J" stands for "junior." He also mentioned that Coach Mason still "has game." "We played a three-point shot game, and he hit eight or 10 in a row," he recalled.

Early in the season, Byron said, "I think this year could be my break-out year in basketball. I started last year as a sophomore, and I learned a lot, especially about guys who were bigger, stronger and faster than me. I learned that lifting weights to get stronger is important, and I had not seen that as being an important part of basketball before. Strength makes a difference."

Byron plays point guard, and it is a good position for his height of 6 feet. "I'd say my best asset is being unselfish with the ball. I like to get my teammates involved, but I am also learning how to score more points. Coach Mason and Coach Hunter are really breaking the game down for me. As far as our team goes, the main thing we are looking forward to is making a playoff run. If the team comes together and bonds, we could get some of those gold trophies," he said.




A native of Ennis, Byron really likes



Aline Whatley is animated when she recalls learning to use a "calculator" before the days of calculators. "It was an adding machine back then — the kind you punched the numbers and then pulled a handle down. I started

doing office work in my dad's furniture store in Dallas. His bookkeeper, Lovelle, got me started, and I drew the ten-key numbers on a piece of paper to practice.

"I started doing taxes out of my home for neighbors and friends, and all of it was by hand with no computers. Most of it was done on a yellow legal pad. Then in 2001, Steavy Jakubik wanted to help me formalize my business. I had been doing her taxes for several years. She owned a building that had previously been a gasoline station on the corner of Kaufman and Lampasas. She was so kind to not even charge rent until I got the business running." The business was called APlus Bookkeeping & Tax Station, but we recently changed the name to APlus Bookkeeping & Tax Service.

"We had an error on our first business card. We have prided ourselves on keeping our fees as low as possible. One of the best parts of being in business for myself was being able to set my own prices, and I just could not charge exorbitant rates for simple forms that only took 10 minutes to complete. So, our first business cards were supposed to read, 'We do more for less,' but they actually read, 'We do less for

more.' I still have one of those cards in a frame with the first dollar we made!"

Aline added that her daughter, Michelle Mach, who recently purchased the firm, really joined the team in 2013. "She picked up the business very fast. She learned things that I did not teach her because she knew where to go to get the information. All of our employees have had that trait. If they thought I would be the only source of the answers to their questions, I would not hire them. They show initiative by finding the answers from other sources."


Most of the APlus employees have been part time over the years, working in the evenings after working another job during the day. "I might see 50-60 people a day, and Linda Dai was our only full-time employee. We like to say we grew the business like the old shampoo commercial that said something like 'one customer told two friends, then they told two friends, and so on ...' We are very proud of the reputation for fairness and honesty that we have."

The success of the business led to Michelle and her husband. David. buying the building at 1004 W. Lampasas, which opened in May 2024. "We have done some major renovations already, and we continue to expand it as we speak," she said.

Of course, the business uses computers now, which Aline says she never did, staying with the legal pad. "The old way was more time consuming, but you still need background knowledge with the computers," she opined.

Michelle says people often mistake her voice for Aline's when she answers the phone, and she wouldn't have it any other way. "Some clients have adamantly said they wanted only Mom to do their taxes, but now they realize that I'm just like Mom," she said proudly.

Aline concluded, "Everyone I put in place to take over, I trained. They are knowledgeable and will continue the tradition of fairness, honesty and accuracy." NOW

Watch Out for Investment Scams

When you invest, you'll find that knowledge is power. The more you know about your investment choices, and who is offering them, the better prepared you'll be to make good decisions. And this diligence can also help protect you against investment scams.

How widespread is this activity? Consider this: Investment fraud losses totaled more than \$4.5 billion in 2023, according to the FBI's Internet Crime Report.

Here are some common types of scams:

- **Cryptocurrency** Not all cryptocurrency offers are scams, but many are. The scammers will contact you via social media, claiming they've made a lot of money in crypto and are willing to help you do the same. They may direct you to a website or app to invest, but the "company" taking your money may not even exist, and, after taking your money, may disappear.
- **Investment programs** These programs claim to have "proven" strategies that can enable you to get rich by investing in financial products. But these strategies are dubious at best and can cost you thousands of dollars that could otherwise go into an investment plan based on your goals, risk tolerance and time horizon.
- **Real estate** Typically, a real estate scam tries to get you to invest in a "world-class" or "luxury" property development, but these properties may take years to build, if they're built at all. Also, various real estate "seminars" claim they can teach you how to get wealthy by buying and selling real estate, but these programs are expensive and usually worthless.
 - Gold and other precious metals Scammers who call themselves "rare coins"

merchants may try to sell you gold coins, bullion or other types of precious metals, claiming that these assets will always go up in value (which isn't true) and that "now is the best time to act." You can find legitimate ways to invest in precious metals, possibly through mutual funds, but you'll need to determine whether these assets can be an appropriate part of your investment portfolio.

So, how can you avoid these scams? Here ae some suggestions from the Federal Trade Commission:

- Don't be pushed into snap decisions. Scammers will pressure you to act quickly because "space is limited" in an investment offering or a "special deal" won't last long. If someone won't give you time to consider an offer, it's not worth considering.
- Be suspicious of "risk-free" claims. All investments carry risk, and no variable investments can claim to provide "guaranteed returns." If an individual or organization downplays the risk of an investment and doesn't want to provide risk disclosures, just walk away.
- · Ask about licensing or registration. Legitimate investment professionals must be registered with the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (FINRA) and be licensed by your state's securities regulator before they can sell you any investment product. You can check the status of an individual or firm by using FINRA's BrokerCheck tool at brokercheck.finra.org.
- Do some research. You can search online for the name of the company or individual offering you an investment opportunity. By entering terms such as "review," "scam," "fraud" or "complaint," you may well find that other people have experienced problems or been victimized.

To achieve your financial goals, you'll likely need to invest for decades. So, be wary of scammers who claim to offer a shortcut to success.





CookingNOW IN THE KITCHEN WITH KAYLA HILL

"While growing up, I learned some of what I know about cooking from my mom, but now I'm teaching myself new techniques and recipes," Kayla mentioned. "I scroll on Pinterest to find new recipes. I usually make them once based on the recipe, then the next time, I make changes that sound good to me."

She primarily cooks for her fiancé and her two beautiful daughters. Occasionally she has the opportunity to cook for other family members and friends when they drop by.

"I've got stories galore of failures," she said. "I recently tried to make chile rellenos. I spent about three hours preparing the peppers, and then my egg mixture wasn't what it needed to be. It didn't stick to the peppers and melted off while frying. It was one of the worst heartbreaks I've ever had!" Now

Hamburger Steak With Country Gravy

Steak Patties:

1 lb. ground beef

1/2 cup breadcrumbs

1 egg

2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

I tsp. soy sauce (optional)

Pepper, to taste

Salt, to taste

Onion powder, to taste

Garlic powder, to taste

Kinder's Buttery Steakhouse Seasoning, to taste

Kinder's Woodfire Garlic Seasoning, to taste

1 Tbsp. vegetable oil

For gravy:

4 Tbsp. butter

1/4 cup flour

Cayenne pepper, to taste

Garlic powder, to taste Onion powder, to taste

3 cups milk

Salt, to taste

Pepper taste

1. For steak patties: Preheat the oven to 300 F.

2. In a large bowl mix the meat; breadcrumbs; egg; Worcestershire sauce; soy sauce, if using; and seasonings. Shape into decent-sized patties, roughly 5.

3. Heat the oil, preferably in a cast-iron skillet (any will do though) at medium heat. Brown the patties on both sides.

4. Place the browned patties on an ovensafe cooking sheet; place them in oven for approximately 15 minutes until fully cooked.

5. For gravy: In the same skillet over medium-low heat, melt the butter; whisk in the flour, cayenne, garlic powder and onion powder. Whisk until golden brown and fragrant.

6. Slowly add in the milk, whisking continuously until thickened. Add the salt and pepper and other seasonings to taste.

Sheet Pan Chicken and Potatoes With Honey Garlic Sauce

Honey Garlic Sauce:

3 Tbsp. butter

1/2 cup honey

2 garlic cloves, minced (I use a forkful of "jarlic.")

Salt, to taste Pepper, to taste

Chicken and Potatoes:

I lb. yellow potatoes (You really can use any kind, but yellow potatoes are my favorite.) Olive oil, enough to coat the potatoes and chicken Garlic powder, to taste Onion powder, to taste Pepper, to taste Paprika, to taste Kinder's Buttery Steakhouse Seasoning,

Kinder's Woodfired Garlic and Herb Seasoning, to taste

- 2 chicken breasts, cut each one in half
- 1. For sauce: In a medium pan, melt the butter; stir in the honey, garlic, salt and pepper.
- 2. Bring to a boil; reduce the heat; let simmer for 5 minutes. Remove from the heat: set aside.
- 3. For potatoes: Preheat the oven to 400 F.
- 4. Start by cutting the potatoes into sixths, making sure they are all roughly the same size.
- **5.** Add the potatoes to a medium-large mixing bowl, and add some oil to coat, as well as all seasonings listed in the ingredient list to taste.
- **6.** Evenly spread the potatoes on a sheet pan; place in the oven while preparing the chicken **7.** For chicken: In the same mixing bowl you used for the potatoes, add the chicken breast halves. Add oil to coat, and the same seasonings, to taste.
- **8.** Remove the sheet pan with the potatoes from the oven; slide the potatoes to one side.
- **9.** Place the chicken down, and fork tenderize the chicken breasts.
- **10.** Drizzle the honey garlic sauce over the chicken breasts: place in the oven.
- 11. Bake for 25-30 minutes, or until the chicken is cooked through and the potatoes are tender.











enjoy playing or even popular slang among their classmates. These are great jumping off points for messages to include on valentines. If all else fails, here are a few simple themes to consider:

Puzzle Perfect. Have children draw two connected puzzle pieces. Draw one half of a heart within one puzzle piece, completing the rest of the heart on the other piece, so that one full heart is seen across the two pieces. Draw the pieces

large enough so that they will cover a good portion of the front of the card when cut in two. Color the heart, then thickly outline the puzzle pieces in black. Cut apart the two puzzle pieces, gluing one piece in the center of the card front, and the other on the inside of the card. Children can write a variety of messages related to puzzles on the card, such as (outside) "Our Friendship," (inside) "Is a Perfect Fit!" Or (outside) "Like a Puzzle Piece," (inside) "You Complete Our Class!"

Lucky in Love. Help children cut out four small hearts from green construction paper, then glue them atop the card front in the shape of a four-leaf clover, drawing a stem to the ground. Write something like, "I'm SO Lucky …" atop the card. Inside, cut out a single red heart, also drawing a stem from it to the ground. The inside message can be any variation of why your child feels lucky: "You're My Friend," "You're My Classmate" or, even, "You're My Valentine."

Remember, you can always go with a smiley face heart on the front and "Happy Valentine's Day!" inside. Simple is heartfelt, too!
