



Eulanie's parents emphasized the transformative power of education, encouraging their children to pursue it as a way to improve their lives and give back to the community. Despite limited resources, they ensured Eulanie had the tools she needed to succeed by teaching her and her siblings to read at an early age. "I never desired to be the smartest kid in the class, but I



worked hard. That work ethic, passed down from my parents, has guided me throughout my life," she acknowledged.

After attending high school, she enrolled in a local college and eventually became a teacher, discovering a lot about herself. But her journey took a significant turn when a church elder recognized her potential and urged Eulanie to further her learning. Initially, she was hesitant about the idea due to financial constraints, but she was encouraged to apply for a scholarship. Ultimately, she competed for the scholarship — and won. That scholarship took her to Atlantic Union College in Massachusetts, where she began her academic journey in the United States as an international student. Since her parents had always encouraged her to pursue education, this was an excellent chance to continue moving forward.

Transitioning to a new country was both exciting and challenging. "Everything looked like what I'd seen on TV. I was determined to adapt, ensuring my voice was heard despite my thick accent," she admitted. Eulanie went on to complete her degree in accounting at Andrews University, where she also secured an internship with AdventHealth. This opportunity aligned perfectly with her values, as AdventHealth's mission of "Extending the Healing Ministry of Christ" resonated deeply within her.

That internship led to a full-time position as a financial analyst in 2008, just after she married her husband, Rossyl. "We've always been partners in ambition and beliefs. 

Handmade Valentine cards for a classroom giveaway not only save money, but they are a great way to tap into your child's creativity and occupy them for an afternoon. If getting started is a challenge, however, it can help to offer a few prompts for kids to copy or build upon.

Your first step, however, is to round up construction paper, markers, crayons and any other craft supplies that may come in handy. If your child wants to put their cards in an envelope, keep the size of the envelopes you have on hand in mind when cutting construction paper for cards. The less your child has to step away to find necessary supplies, the smoother the card crafting will go!

If kids have a hard time getting started on their own, it can help to create a few sample cards for them to follow. You might ask them to think of their favorite movie character, a game they enjoy playing or even popular slang among their classmates. These are great jumping off points for messages to include on valentines. If all else fails, here are a few simple themes to consider:

Tic-Tac-To My Heart. After cutting paper to the size that will fit your envelopes when folded in half, have children write the words "You Won ..." atop the front of the card. In the remaining space of the card, draw a tic-tac-toe board (also known by kids today as a hashtag symbol). Cut out three red hearts and glue those in boxes diagonally down the board. Fill in some of the remaining squares with X marks. On the bottom of the card front, the words "My Heart" complete the message. Children can write "Happy Valentine's Day!" inside, or just sign their name.


Puzzle Perfect. Have children draw two connected puzzle pieces. Draw one half



of a heart within one puzzle piece, completing the rest of the heart on the other piece, so that one full heart is seen across the two pieces. Draw the pieces large enough so that they will cover a good portion of the front of the card when cut in two. Color the heart, then thickly outline the puzzle pieces in black. Cut apart the two puzzle pieces, gluing one piece in the center of the card front, and the other on the inside of the card. Children can write a variety of messages related to puzzles on the card, such as (outside) "Our Friendship," (inside) "Is a Perfect Fit!" Or (outside) "Like a Puzzle Piece." (inside) "You Complete Our Class!"

Lucky in Love. Help children cut out four small hearts from green construction paper, then glue them atop the card front in the shape of a four-leaf clover, drawing a stem to the ground. Write something like, "I'm SO Lucky ..." atop the card. Inside, cut out a single red heart, also drawing a stem from it to the ground. The inside message can be any variation of why your child feels lucky: "You're My Friend," "You're My Classmate" or, even, "You're My Valentine."

Remember, you can always go with a smiley face heart on the front and "Happy Valentine's Day!" inside. Simple is heartfelt, too! NOW

Work on New Community Space, Geyer Commons, Breaks Ground

The initial phase for Geyer Commons, a new community-focused space, held its groundbreaking in early December 2024.

Phase 1A includes necessary infrastructure improvements, a splash pad featuring programmable LED lighting, civic lawn space, and a makers' market for local entrepreneurs.

The City of Mansfield and Mansfield Independent School District (MISD) partnered to exchange property to accommodate the growth of both organizations. The City received the school district's property along Walnut Creek Drive that includes Geyer Field, administration buildings, the original Mansfield High School, the historic Rock Gym and property across the street on East Broad

Street. MISD received the City Hall facility, 1200 E. Broad St., and property behind it.

This exchange enables both organizations to save resources while continuing to provide exceptional service to the community. The partnership is another example of local leaders working together as one for Mansfield. This exchange allows the city to develop an exciting community space known as Geyer Commons. It will provide gathering spaces and inspire memorable experiences.

"Mansfield residents have been asking for a third space like this, a location that's not work or home but allows friends and family to come together," City Council member Juan Fresquez said. "I look forward to seeing life flourish in this part of town as neighbors meet and children play."

The City expects Phase 1A construction to be complete in fall 2025.

"Geyer Commons will be a boon to the revitalization happening downtown to ensure the heart of our city continues to be a hub of community," Mayor Pro Tem Todd Tonore said.

Design for the next phase, Phase 1B, is currently underway with expected completion in fall 2025. Phase 1B features the relocation of the historic landmark Wallace-Hall house and the reconstruction of several key historic buildings including the Cumberland Church, Citizens Bank, Mansfield Co-Ed College and the Julian Feild House.

Alongside the continued preservation of the original Mansfield High School and Rock Gym, this project will pay thoughtful homage to our history while making way for requested shopping, dining and retail options.

Geyer Commons will be a vibrant gateway into Historic Downtown Mansfield and a community destination. This project offers a place where remarkable experiences and shared memories will carry Mansfield into the future.

Chocolate Chip Cookie Bars

2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour I tsp. baking soda

1 tsp. salt

1 cup (2 sticks) butter, softened

3/4 cup granulated sugar

3/4 cup brown sugar, packed

I tsp. vanilla extract

2 large eggs

2 cups (1 12-oz. pkg.) NESTLÉ TOLL **HOUSE Semi-Sweet Chocolate Morsels**

1. Preheat the oven to 375 F. Grease a 13x9-inch glass pan.

2. Combine the flour, baking soda and salt in a small bowl.

3. Beat the butter, granulated sugar, brown sugar and vanilla extract in a large mixing bowl. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Gradually beat in the flour mixture. Stir in the morsels. Spread the mixture into the prepared pan.

4. Bake for 20 minutes or until golden brown. Cool in the pan on a wire rack. Cut into bars.

One-Bowl Brownies

4 baker's unsweetened chocolate squares, chopped

3/4 cup butter

2 cups granulated sugar

3 eggs

1 tsp. vanilla

1 cup flour

I cup pecans, coarsely chopped (optional)

1. Preheat the oven to 350 F; lightly grease a 9x13-inch baking pan.

2. Microwave the chocolate and butter in a large bowl for 2 minutes, until melted.

3. Stir the sugar into the chocolate; blend well. Mix in the eggs and vanilla.

4. Stir in the flour and nuts; pour mixture into the prepared pan.

5. Bake 30-35 minutes. Do not overbake. Cool completely.

Fish Tacos

3 Tbsp. butter, melted Juice of 1 lime 1 tsp. chili powder 1/2 tsp. garlic powder Pinch of salt 10-15 oz. cod or other white fish, thawed 6-8 tortillas

Slaw:

1/4 cup oil

1/4 cup water

1/2 cup green onions, chopped

1/2 cup cilantro

1-2 cloves garlic

Juice of 2 limes 1/2 cup sour cream Pinch of salt 1 bag coleslaw

Toppings:

Avocado, mashed, to taste Red onion, to taste Mango salsa, to taste

- 1. Preheat the oven to 400 F.
- **2.** Mix the butter, lime juice, chili powder, garlic powder and salt in small bowl. Pour over the fish; bake 10-15 minutes.
- **3.** Flake apart the fish; coat with the extra sauce in the pan.
- **4.** For slaw: Add the first 8 ingredients to a bowl and combine. Pour the mixture over the bag of coleslaw.
- **5.** Serve fish in tortillas with the slaw and other desired toppings.


Crock-Pot Chicken & Dumplings

- 2 lbs. boneless, skinless chicken breasts or thighs
- I sweet onion, diced
- I clove garlic, minced
- 2 10-oz. cans cream of chicken soup
- 3 cups chicken broth
- 1 tsp. poultry seasoning
- I tsp. dried parsley
- 1 tsp. cracked black pepper
- 1 8-count pkg. refrigerated biscuit dough
- **1.** In a 6-qt. slow cooker, add all the ingredients, except the biscuit dough; stir to combine.
- **2.** Cover; cook on high for 3 hours or low for 6 hours.
- **3.** When the chicken is cooked and tender, shred the meat; stir to combine.
- **4.** Open the biscuits, press each biscuit flat, cut into narrow strips. Add the biscuit strips on top. Cover while cooking for 20-30 minutes.
- **5.** When finished, the biscuits should be light and fluffy.
- 6. Serve immediately.
