

EDITOR'S NOTE

Oh, snap?

Nightly, my husband, son and I have been reading *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective Families*. While there are much more current works of related lessons, this was a thrift store find that, as many castoffs do, mysteriously found its way home with me. I figured it would offer valuable insight or family fodder and, either way, prove worth the half-dollar it cost. As writers, we Morrises have a habit of editing aloud the books we read. When the material is meant to teach you something, that tendency can cause you to miss the message. But the laughs are often plentiful.

7 Habits almost immediately tickled our collective funny bone with an anecdote of a father referencing his son as a difficult-to-deal-with "whippersnapper," and the book suddenly seemed older even than its 1989 publication date. We didn't think it meant we couldn't still find value in the book's suggestions. We couldn't even be sure that the author wasn't intentionally aging the character with the outdated term to make him seem absurd. Nevertheless, it derailed us into an investigation of the old-fashioned label.

We learned whippersnappers was a late 1600s term for people hanging around snapping whips to pass the time. While in some instances it referenced a "small but sprightly boy," it was more commonly a derogatory term for a know-it-all young man with little ambition and less regard for the law. In the spirit of equality, there was also a female version: whipperginnie.

While we haven't yet enacted any of *7 Habits'* suggestions, we learned two new words and gained another inside family joke. If for no other reason, I'd say 50 cents well spent.

Hoping to help folks escape from a complicated world, Greg T. Hall's passion for writing was re-ignited. "We're increasingly separated by social, political and lifestyle ideologies. I write stories that give readers a break from the negativism and remind them we share more in common than we can even imagine," Greg noted.

Through his motivational musings, Greg has gained a following. "I'm astounded at the number of people who encourage me to keep writing," Greg admitted, promising a book as a goal for 2022.

Sharing bi-weekly on Facebook's Midlothian Talk and Positively Midlothian, the Nextdoor app, his website Greghallwrites.com and also appearing on EllisDownHome. com, Greg focuses on shared experiences. "The love of our families, feelings of pain, happiness, heartbreak and even the joy that comes from a good laugh," Greg described. Although a voracious reader as a child and an honor roll student at North Mesquite High School in the city where he was born, Greg took an indirect path to writing. "It took me 10 years to graduate from The University of Texas at Arlington with a BBA in business management. Before that, I flunked out of The University of Houston-Downtown, and twice at UTA I was 'invited' to take a break. I believe they called it academic probation," Greg explained.

"However, after the birth of my first child, and with the example of an academically successful wife, I became a serious student and put together four straight 4.0 semesters to finish strong," Greg continued, noting he worked 60-plus hour weeks as a restaurant manager to pay for college.

Making others comfortable is Greg's strong suit. He speaks to students at events like Career Days. "I often find myself standing next to amazing doctors, attorneys and captains of industry. I use my scholastic story as a cautionary tale and to explain that my failures were ultimately gifts. If there is any value in accomplishment, it is found in the struggles that proceeded it."

Greg and his wife, Stephanie, bought their first home in rural Princeton, Texas, in which to raise their three children.

Stephanie, a degreed journalist, began reporting for the local paper, and through her, Greg submitted a humorous story about a stray English bulldog that had terrorized his family. "It was well received, and they offered me a weekly column," Greg recalled.

Inspired by Erma Bombeck and Patrick F. McManus, Greg wrote for a few years until a promotion at his job required a move to Arlington. "My career and raising a family absorbed my time, and I took a long break from writing," Greg remembered.

Today, Greg is chief operating officer for Spring Creek Restaurants, where he began bussing tables and washing dishes 36 years ago. "The business has kept me humble. I'm as comfortable sitting in a board room as I am sweeping a kitchen floor," he said.

His career exposed Greg to thousands of customers, vendors and employees. "I feel like I have a Ph.D. in connecting with people from all walks of life, beliefs, backgrounds and political affiliations."

In 2019, the Halls connected with new friends and neighbors after moving to Midlothian. They found "Hall (1.15) Acres" on the south side of town. As a backyard bird fanatic, seeing the property already had an established Purple Martin colony sold him. Greg enthused, "During the purchase negotiations, I think the words, 'I'll pay anything,' came out of my mouth."

After moving in, the Halls began meeting neighbors until COVID-19 limited those opportunities. "That being said, our house in Midlothian has quickly turned into a home," he noted.

Settled in, Greg was ready for a new start and knew it was time to write again. "My hope is that readers join

the journeys I take in my stories and get invested," Greg encouraged. "It's early, but as of this writing, I have yet to receive a single negative comment about anything I've posted. That's not a compliment to me, but a compliment to the people of Midlothian and greater Ellis County.

"I'm so gratified when I hear from readers who say something I wrote touched them, conjured up fond memories or encouraged them toward a better outlook," he continued. "Some respond by sharing personal aspects of their own lives ... their trials and triumphs. I love that they feel comfortable in doing so."

Greg finds inspiration for a story anywhere. "Sometimes, I just gaze at whatever is in front of me and imagine all the narratives. It's about letting my surroundings speak to me, whether it be a fluttering butterfly, a person I meet on the street or an old lawnmower that refuses to start.

"Back in my newspaper days, I took an opportunity to challenge my ability to create a story. I was invited to speak to a class of third-graders about writing. I asked them to come up with a topic for my next column. After much debate, they settled on the title, 'The Cat That Flew to America'! It took a little imagination, but that unconventional yarn hit papers the following week!"

When not writing, Greg loves all things outdoors, except golf, a sport in which he claims to be so bad he is "banned from stepping foot on any golf course in Texas and its contiguous states." He also loves bragging about his wife, a teacher at Waxahachie Prep, and children: Katy, a fifth grade teacher in Frisco; Hannah, a singer/songwriter/ musician living in Nashville; and Sam, a senior at Texas Tech University.

"Lastly, maybe the most important thing to know about me is that I'm human like everyone else. I've experienced victory and defeat. I've made mistakes, said dumb things and let people down," Greg clarified. "Through writing, and my faith, I find redemption and an opportunity to slow down, laugh at myself and see the beauty and value in the people and places that intersect my path. Sharing that beauty with my readers in a way that resonates with them is one of my greatest joys." **NOW**

Jennifer Law has worked all around the U.S. in volunteer roles and often with children, but she says the best job she's ever had is her current position with Midlothian ISD. "Locally, I've worked with AAFES and as a job skills trainer with Bridges, LLC, she said. "I've had some great jobs, but being a resource aide at Walnut Grove Middle School is hands down my favorite!"

Jennifer's work with the district began in a volunteer capacity at Longbranch Elementary, where she helped develop a program for boys of exemplary character. "Lead Cats was for fourth- and fifth-grade boys to learn about things like respect, cleaning up after oneself and carrying on a conversation," Jennifer outlined. "The participants were expected to maintain required academic and behavioral standards to be in the club."

A desire to fill the gap between what boys were learning in school and home motivated Jennifer. She wanted to help them

grasp "the small things that will help them for life, that they likely weren't learning anywhere else." Jennifer arranged monthly speakers on things like kindness and leadership. The boys were required to shake the guest speaker's hand, thank them for coming and recollect one thing the speaker spoke on they found interesting. "Seeing the kids thrive and look forward to our time together was amazing. In those moments, I discovered exactly what I wanted to do in life," Jennifer admitted.

With an undergraduate degree in sociology from Dallas Baptist University, Jennifer had not always known which career path she hoped to follow. "It took me 14 years to re-focus and finish my Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences. I was seven months pregnant at the time, and it was a very proud moment," she recalled.

Married to her high school sweetheart, Matt, Jennifer was accustomed to her husband's military career taking priority. "We moved to Upstate New York after we were married, then spent three very enjoyable years in Hawaii," Jennifer noted. "We came to Midlothian in 2015 and have been here since."

Like many women, Jennifer put raising her family first. A former high school soccer player, she was excited when her children took up the sport. "Their second season, they ended up not having enough coaches for teams. I was very pregnant and very employed, but I knew that I wanted to share that experience with them. So, I volunteered to coach," she explained.

"I had no idea what to expect, but the parents were very kind, and the kids were hilarious. I fell in love with it and haven't stopped," Jennifer continued. "We have a great time, and they learn a little more every practice."

Just when it seemed Jennifer had found her footing as a volunteer and coach, her husband of 23 years passed away from COVID-19, November 28, 2020. "We had five kids together, and more memories than many people get in a lifetime," Jennifer shared. "Losing him left a huge gap, but our friends and family have given their all to make sure we are well-loved and taken care of."

And as she did when her children needed a coach, Jennifer took the reigns as best she could. "I keep putting one foot in front of the other. There's really no special secret to making it work," Jennifer admitted. "You roll with it and do the best you can. It's exhausting, and most days include some kind of struggle, but we make it."


One way Jennifer gets through the hard times is blogging about her feelings. "The blog was born out of frustration and angst. After Matt passed, I needed an outlet to express what I was going through ... having five kids, working full time, volunteering and dealing with the everyday stuff was getting to me.

"It didn't hurt that my life is always comical. The kids provide plenty of material. When I'm able to write it out and share it, and I can see that it resonates with others, it's an amazing feeling," Jennifer noted of her Facebook blog, "Sincerely, The Exhausted."

Somehow, Jennifer also makes time for the simple things with her children, like seeing movies and taking trips. "Getting to experience new places and things is something we all look forward to," she said.

Despite everything on her plate, Jennifer anticipates completing her teaching certification in the coming months, then hopes to teach in MISD. To anyone facing adversity, Jennifer promises if she can do it, so can they. "When the odds are stacked against you …" she said, "… it might seem easier to give up, but it is so worth pushing on." NOW




 For spiced pecans: Beat the egg white until frothy, but not stiff. Add the remaining ingredients, excluding the pecans.



Born in Germany on April 5, 1801, Nicholas Adolphus Sterne was the oldest son of Emmanuel Sterne, who was an Orthodox Jew, and his wife, Helen, who was a Lutheran. At age 16, Adolphus was working in a passport office when he learned he was going to be conscripted into German military service. He forged his own passport and emigrated to America through New Orleans, Louisiana, in 1817. He found employment in a mercantile and studied law.

Having become a businessman with interests from New Orleans to Nashville, Tennessee, Adolphus made Nacogdoches, Texas, his home around 1824, and upon joining the New Orleans Masonic Lodge in 1826, he became one of the first Masons in Texas. He became friends with Sam Houston through business interests. Despite having taken the required Mexican government's loyalty pledges, Sterne assisted in Nacogdoches' 1826 Fredonian Rebellion by smuggling weapons for the War Dog rebels, a local militia group that was attempting to establish their own republic due to the political and cultural differences between the Anglo-Americans and the Mexicans. Adolphus was tried for treason by the Mexicans and ordered shot. While his case was reviewed, he was incarcerated in the Stone House, now the Old Stone Fort in Nacogdoches. The New Orleans Masonic Lodge interceded, arranging his parole. He was released, agreeing to never take up arms again against the Mexican government.

He helped in the Battle of Nacogdoches in 1832 but did not take up arms. In violation of the Texas Constitution of 1824, Mexican Colonel José de las Piedras ordered townspeople to surrender all firearms to his 300-plus troops. Instead, residents of Nacogdoches and surrounding towns formed a National Militia. The militia marched to the square where the Mexican army opened fire and hand-to-hand combat began. Sterne instructed the San Augustine Red-Landers how to outflank the Mexicans trying to flee. A peace treaty was signed, and Mexican troops were never again garrisoned in East Texas.

Attempting to raise funds and recruit fighters for the New Orleans Greys, who fought in several battles, including the Alamo, during the Texas Revolution, Adolphus spoke at their first rally. Volunteers filled the Grey's first two companies, and thousands of dollars were donated to support the cause for religious freedom and the establishment of the Republic.

Adolphus supported most of Houston's policies during the Republic's early days, except his Indian policy. Sterne commanded a militia company at the Battle of the Neches in 1839, expelling the Cherokees from East Texas.

Between 1840 and 1847, Adolphus became the Nacogdoches postmaster and a land agent. He served Nacogdoches County as court deputy clerk, associate justice, justice of the peace, the board of land commissioners' clerk and the commissioner of roads and revenues clerk. In 1847, he was elected to the Texas House of Representatives and served a second term. In 1851, he served in the Texas Senate.

He and his wife, Eva Catherine Rosine Ruff, had seven children. Adolphus enjoyed dancing, occasional drinking and playing games of that era. His published diary, with entries from 1840-1851, chronicles early life in Texas. He owned 16,000-plus acres of land worked by slaves. Self-educated, Adolphus was an interpreter in English, French, Spanish, German, Yiddish, Portuguese and Latin.

After passing away on March 27, 1852, in New Orleans while on a business trip, Adolphus was buried there but was later interred in Nacogdoches' Oak Grove Cemetery. His home, built in 1830 at 211 S. Lanana Street in Nacogdoches, is now the Sterne-Hoya House Museum. Sterne, an early colonist, businessman and politician, hosted prominent guests, including Davy Crockett and Sam Houston. Sold to the Hoya family in 1866, the home was donated to the city of Nacogdoches in 1958. The museum and library hold the history of the early days of Texas, including Sam Houston's sword and Adolphus' published diary.




