




Travel far, pay no fare ...






In life, everyone faces obstacles along their paths that can hold them back or make them stronger. The Zackery family decided to take their obstacles head-on, as Evan Zackery, their bright son, was diagnosed with autism at only 3 years of age.

Ernest and Effie, Evan's parents, devoted themselves to finding a way to connect with him when they first saw signs of autism. "Evan appeared to have some developmental delays when compared to peers his age," Effie explained. "At the age of 1 1/2, we noticed that he was very quiet and did not interact with other kids. He received services from ECI [Early Childhood Intervention] at 2 and was officially diagnosed with autism at the age of 3. He was enrolled in a preschool program for students who had special needs. Evan received in-home, ABA therapy, speech therapy and occupational therapy." Early intervention helped Evan to thrive socially and academically. To adjust to his needs, Evan's parents maintained a consistent schedule for him and outlined his day, so there were minimal surprises.

A journey involving autism isn't without struggle, but Evan takes the bull by the horns when facing his deepest challenges. Today, he is thriving as a sophomore at Red Oak High School and staying involved through band, student council and spending time with his friends. As an A/B student, he stays focused on his studies and puts forth great effort to succeed at everything he pursues. "I am currently learning to drive," Evan shared. "I will receive my driver's license this year!"

"We keep Evan active as much as we can to help him develop the needed skills to be independent," Ernest and Effie added. "He has shown so much growth since we received his diagnosis of autism." As the Zackery family continues to focus on his abilities, the more he grows and amazes them.









"Evan took piano lessons for three years when he was in elementary school," Effie said. "When he first enrolled in Red Oak Middle School, the band director gave him the opportunity to audition and try out for band and was amazed at his abilities. That was when he started his journey as a percussionist." While he learns a great deal from every aspect of music, Evan enjoys the marching season, playing at football games, the most. "I feel excited to be part of band. It's fun and enjoyable, and it is like I'm part of a family there," he admitted.

His activity in band has positively affected his life. "I was recognized as Percussionist of the Week two years in a row during a football game," he recalled. "I was awarded a letterman's jacket this year because of my accomplishments and participation in band." Participating in the Symphonic Band his freshman year, Evan has moved up to Wind Ensemble this year, having experience in the marimba, a deep-toned xylophone; the guiro, a hand instrument that makes a rasping-style sound when scraped across a stick; and the vibraphone, similar to a xylophone and a snare drum.

Evan has grown into a wonderful young man, but his parents still enjoy looking back at the amazing moments they've had with him. "Our favorite memory of Evan is when he would sing 'This Little Light of Mine," Ernest and Effie beamed. "Evan has been shining ever since. We remember his participation in a Christmas play, and he recited poetry at our church. Our faith in God has kept us going and remaining positive through his journey. Evan is truly a gift from God, and we are so blessed to have him as our son."

Evan is considered a devoted member


of the Red Oak student council. He has enjoyed various council activities, such as creating Christmas cards for nursing home residents, creating posters for Breast Cancer Awareness Month and helping to distribute food for foster children. "I also worked at the Red Oak Library as a library assistant during the summer of 2019," he said. "It was my first job."

He assisted in maintaining books on the shelves, collecting returned books, helping set up for the summer reading program and maintaining the summer reading database for the reading program. Evan got the opportunity to learn how to work with others, take responsibility and serve others — not to mention learning how to communicate with others, be punctual, dress appropriately for a job and follow policies and procedures. "One day, I mentioned to Evan to keep his phone on while at work, so we could reach him." Effie said with a laugh. "Evan's response was, 'No phones while working.""

Among all the ways Evan stays connected with others, his most valued way is through the church, as a faithful member of the youth department at Canaan Baptist Church in Dallas. He participates in the youth choir and usher ministry and attends outreaches. But that's not all that tickles his fancy. Evan enjoys helping with household chores and assisting with the family business from time to time. He also loves watching America's Funniest Home Videos, playing games, listening to music, playing drums and spending time with his family and friends, who all care for him deeply and accept him for who he is.

Upon Evan's graduation from high school, he hopes to attend Baylor University or The University of Texas at Arlington to study music. His goal in life is to give others the opportunity to be part of the band family he had, by becoming a music/percussion teacher.

"We continue to shower Evan with our love and support and treat him no differently," Ernest and Effie expressed. "We focus on his abilities and not his disability." As Evan's success shines through his challenges, he is a beaming example for countless others fighting the same battle to not let the challenges hold them back. NOW



Owning a pet is one of life's most valuable experiences, and those precious fur babies, which give us such joy, deserve the best care. We take the time to explain treatments and educate clients on pet care."




















At only 8 years of age, Nicole Bonneau's passion for cooking was sparked by television programs. "I watched baking shows and thought it was so interesting to watch everything come together and how happy it made people," she shared.

As Nicole tried out new recipes, her mother oversaw the process, until she was ready to take on challenges by herself. But she learned from her early mistakes. "I was baking brownies to take to a friend's house," Nicole recalled. "I made them during the day, but I didn't think to check the middle with a toothpick. When we opened the trunk, there were brownies everywhere because the brownies were not cooked all the way through. I learned to always check their doneness before taking them anywhere!" NOW

Oatmeal Cookies

2 sticks butter softened

I cup granulated sugar

1 1/2 cups light brown sugar

2 eggs

I tsp. vanilla extract

2 cups all-purpose flour

I tsp. baking soda

1 tsp. salt

1 1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon

3 cups rolled oats

1. Mix together the butter, granulated sugar and brown sugar until creamy. Beat in the eggs, one at a time. Beat in the vanilla extract.

2. Combine the flour, baking soda, salt and cinnamon; slowly add the flour mixture to

the butter mixture. Fold in the oats. Let the mixture chill for at least 1 hour.

3. Preheat the oven to 375 F. Roll into tablespoon-size pieces; place on baking sheets.

4. Bake for 9 minutes; let cool before serving.

Double Chocolate Butterscotch Cookies

2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 cup baking cocoa

I tsp. baking soda

1/2 tsp. salt

2 sticks butter, softened

I cup light brown sugar

3/4 cup granulated sugar

I tsp. vanilla extract

2 eggs

2 cups butterscotch chips

1. Preheat the oven to 350 F. Combine the flour, cocoa, baking soda and salt in a small bowl.

2. Beat the butter, brown sugar, granulated

sugar and vanilla extract in a large bowl until creamy.

- **3.** Beat in the eggs until light and fluffy. Gradually beat in the flour mixture until well combined. Fold in the butterscotch chips.
- **4.** Place tablespoon-size pieces of the dough on a baking sheet.
- **5.** Bake for 9 minutes, or until fluffy.

Chocolate Chip Cookies

2 sticks butter

I cup dark brown sugar

1/2 cup granulated sugar

2 eggs

l egg yolk

1 tsp. vanilla extract

2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour

2 tsp. baking soda

1 tsp. espresso powder (optional)

1 tsp. salt

2 cups chocolate chips

- **I.** Melt the butter on medium heat until brown; let chill.
- **2.** To a bowl, add both sugars; mix. Gradually add in the eggs, egg yolk and vanilla extract. After mixing, add in the flour, baking soda, espresso powder and salt; mix until well combined. Fold in the chocolate chips.
- **3.** Put the dough in the freezer until solid. Preheat the oven to 375 F.
- **4.** Place tablespoon-size pieces of dough on the baking sheets.
- **5.** Bake in the oven for 9-15 minutes.

Chunky Monkey Breakfast Bars

2 bananas

2 cups oats

1/2 cup peanut butter

3 Tbsp. maple syrup

1 tsp. cinnamon

1/4 cup walnuts (optional)

1/3 cup chocolate chips

- **I.** Preheat the oven to 350 F. In a medium-sized bowl, mash the bananas.
- **2.** Add the oats, peanut butter, syrup, cinnamon, walnuts and chocolate chips; mix together.
- **3.** Add parchment paper to an 8x8-inch pan. Pour the mixture into the pan; spread evenly.
- 4. Bake for 25 minutes; enjoy!

Cinnamon Half Knots

2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour, or more as needed

1 pkt. instant yeast

1/4 tsp. kosher salt

1 cup warm milk

2 tsp. honey





- 7 Tbsp. softened salted butter (divided use)
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 3 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- **I.** Mix the flour, yeast, salt, milk, honey and I Tbsp. butter; knead away from the bowl. Cover; let rise for 30 minutes to 1 hour.
- **2.** Preheat the oven to 375 F; line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- **3.** On a floured surface, roll the dough out into a 1/4-inch rectangle.
- **4.** Spread the dough with 4 Tbsp. butter. Make cinnamon sugar by combining the cinnamon and brown sugar. Sprinkle some of the cinnamon sugar over the butter.
- **5.** Fold the dough in half; cut into 12 strips. Twist each strip, and then tie a couple into loose knots.
- **6.** Melt the remaining 2 Tbsp. butter; stir with about 3/4 of the cinnamon sugar. Brush on top of each knot. Bake for 9 minutes.
- **7.** Take out of the oven; place any sugar that has fallen off during baking back onto top of each knot; bake for another 9 minutes.

Chocolate Espresso Bread

1 1/2 cups flour 1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa powder



1 Tbsp. espresso powder
2 tsp. baking powder
1/2 tsp. salt
2 eggs
1 cup granulated sugar
1/2 cup olive oil
1 cup sour cream

- 1 tsp. vanilla extract 3/4 cup pistachios
- **1.** Preheat the oven to 350 F. Grease a 9x5-inch bread pan.
- **2.** In a medium bowl, mix the flour, cocoa powder, espresso powder, baking powder and salt.
- **3.** In a mixer, whisk together the eggs

and sugar until light and smooth. Add in the oil, sour cream and vanilla; mix until well combined.

4. Add the flour mixture into the butter mixture; fold in the pistachios. Pour the mixture into the prepared pan. Bake for 50-60 minutes, or until a toothpick comes out clean.



From florals to faux eggs, decorating an Easter wreath is a simple way to usher springtime into your home. While tulips and speckled eggs are traditional Easter wreath add-ons, you can count on DIYers to get more creative and craftier. Whether emphasizing the religious significance or using all things bunny-themed, an Easter wreath lets you put your stamp on the holiday, which falls on Sunday, April 4, this year.



If you don't want to invest in a pre-made wreath but you're a first-time DIYer, starting with a simple grapevine wreath may be for you. These can be pricey at craft stores, but they can often be found for half the price, or cheaper, at yard sales and thrift stores.

Very few supplies are

needed to transform a grapevine wreath into a holiday- or season-specific piece of decor. Dollar stores have really upped their floral game, and are a great place to find everything you need to create your springtime door decor.

Supplies:

- · Grapevine or willow wreath in the size of your choice
- · Florist wire (Pipe cleaners or bread ties work, too.)
- · Wire cutters
- \cdot 2-3 faux flower stems (Tulips are used here, but any spring flower will do.)
- · 2-3 stems of smaller flowers or greenery (optional)
- · Item to cover where stems meet (A wicker butterfly is shown, but you could use a bird's nest, a crafted bunny, a wooden monogram letter, a bow made of ribbon, etc.)



Easy Approach -

Step 1: Separate each flower from your flower stem, so that they are individuals. Starting at the right (where our image shows a butterfly), space your stems one by one curving around the wreath toward the opposite side.

Step 2: Use your floral wire to secure each flower to the point

where you want it to sit on the wreath. (Some crafters prefer hot glue to floral wire. It's your choice, but using wire allows you to swap out florals from season to season with the same grapevine wreath as your base!)

Step 3: Fill in vacant spots with your second set of stems, using leafy greenery to help hide floral wire.

Step 4: Place your focal item (wicker butterfly, bow, monogram letter, etc.) at the point where your floral stems first meet on the right side. Secure it with floral wire or hot glue.

Step 5: Wrap a wire or pipe cleaner into a circle atop the back of your grapevine wreath, twisting the ends together through a good portion of the wreath's stems for security. This is how you will hang your wreath, either to a nail, hook or wreath hanger made for doors.



Easier Approach —

A twist on this first approach to an Easter wreath is to simply encircle the top of your grapevine wreath with your tulips, leaving no portion of your wreath uncovered. In this case, you follow the same steps, but completely cover the wreath's surface.

While there is no need for a ribbon or decorative item to cover where the floral stems started, anything could still be added directly atop the flowers, if desired. Speckled craft eggs could easily be tucked around this type of wreath, either by gluing them to floral sticks, or gluing them directly to the wreath itself.







Easiest Approach — Perhaps the simplest take on a springtime Easter wreath is to take your two stems of flowers, without cutting each flower off, and place them end to end, so that the stems overlap and one set of buds is on the right, the other on the left.

Secure the stems atop one another with one wire, then secure the entire bundle to your grapevine wreath with a second wire. Bend the stems so the flowers are angling around the wreath, and cover the stems with a large bow. You can even just secure a single set of stems to your wreath for the simplest approach of all.

There are, of course, countless options when it comes to ringing in spring with an Easter wreath that depicts your style. Whimsical or modern, religious or secular, have fun creating a minimalist or over-the-top crafty piece that says, "Happy Easter, Happy Spring" to you!


