

I love Texas weather . . .



EVERYTHING'S COMING UP

"I'm just telling you ..." was the phrase
Sandy Anderson often used when she was
making a point about what was happening
at the moment or when she was predicting
what was going to be happening very soon.
Sandy passed away last November, and Pat
Warren is the current Garden Club president.
At the Bluebonnet Festival last year, Sandy
called Pat out from under the Garden Club's
tent and said, "I'm just telling you, can you
believe how much it has grown?"

"She was so excited with what it has become," Pat remembered. In the 1950s, the first bluebonnet trails went through what is known today as Kachina Prairie, and locals spread the word. It wasn't long before visitors were driving to Ennis, and the Ennis Garden Club began offering maps, home-crafted souvenirs and perhaps cookies or brownies from a small number of booths set up in front of the library on Ennis Avenue.

Both the trails and the festival have grown exponentially over the years. Gina Rokas has been Ennis' director of tourism for more than 19 years, and she has seen the effect social media has had. "A spring photo of the early bluebonnets can go viral, and people start calling," she said. "Sandy understood that."

"She had the vision many years ago of what the festival could be," Pat commented.

Sandy was chairman of the Bluebonnet Trails and Festival for 41 years. She and her family moved to Ennis in 1978, and





she immediately immersed herself in the community. Besides the Garden Club, Sandy loved and was actively a part of many local organizations, including the Ennis Public Theatre, the 20th Century Club, the Ennis Heritage Society, the First Presbyterian Church and several local charities. However, the Garden Club and the Bluebonnet Trails and Festival that she chaired for so many years may be her most noteworthy contribution to Ennis.

Pat said Sandy was amazing to work with. "She was a leader and a facilitator, and part of the way she led was by rolling up her sleeves and working hard. She did so much behind the scenes that few people know about."

Gina added, "She could also present the things she cared about publicly, such as the United Way. She went to the companies she was involved in and did the solicitation for contributions. She emphasized to their employees how important it was to their community."

The bluebonnets in Ennis are prolific, so much so that the state of Texas has designated Ennis as the Official Bluebonnet Trail and the Official Bluebonnet City of Texas.







Becky McCarty is downtown development director for the city. She recalled in 2015 when the city partnered with the Garden Club as the festival continued to grow. "It was a partnership, but everyone knew Sandy was in charge. We were happy to do what she recommended because she knew it so well."

"The Garden Club is still the sponsor/presenter of the festival and trails," Gina offered.

Becky recently gave the Garden Club two statewide People's Choice Award plaques from the Texas Downtown Association. The city nominated the festival, and the two awards for 2021 that the festival and trails won were Best Promotion Traditional, presented to the Bluebonnet Trails Festival, and Best Downtown Partner, presented to the Ennis Garden Club. According to the Texas Downtown Association's website, "The People's Choice Awards allow downtown supporters to show their appreciation for downtown projects, programs, businesses, buildings and groups."

The bluebonnets in Ennis are prolific, so much so that the state of Texas has designated Ennis as the Official Bluebonnet Trail and the Official Bluebonnet City of Texas. The Ennis Garden Club will drive the trails to check for the best areas for our visitors each week starting in April. Information is relayed to the Ennis Welcome Center, so guests will know where to find the most appealing fields. Sandy consistently drove the trails each year, often accompanied by her husband, Bryce.

Becky remarked that she thought Bryce loved it as much as Sandy did. Last year Sandy and Bryce drove to the southeast central Texas festivals in Brenham and Chappell Hill, and as you would expect, she declared that the Ennis bluebonnets were far better!

The festival downtown has grown from a few local vendors set up in front of the library to vendors with many varieties of food, artists including bluebonnet painters and photographers. crafts and souvenirs, children's activities and live music. Tourists have recently requested maps not only of the bluebonnet trails, but also of local merchants where they can experience the local flavor of our community. The welcome center is very busy during the entire month of April, and especially on festival weekend. Bus tours from the Metroplex and other areas regularly schedule excursions to the city, and the Garden Club has local expert "step-on" guides to assist the visitors, for a fee and by advance reservation.

In the past few years, Kachina Prairie has become a popular nature area, known for its walking trail and wildflowers. Guided wildflower walks are held on festival weekend.

Last year, the downtown festival was gated for the first time, and it was an overwhelming success. Sandy had been an advocate for gating the festival for some time, as she had seen the benefits at other festivals. Last year, a number of sponsors had pulled out because of the pandemic, and it was determined that the only way to have the festival was to gate it. The feedback was very positive, as it helped with social distancing. Parents said they felt more secure with their children, and the vendors liked it also.

Gina said, "Sandy was my biggest mentor. She was always so positive. She had a great attitude, and she was always cheering people on and bringing out the best in them. At the end of the festival, we would be so tired it was hard to smile. Sandy was beaming."



Kourtney Curry and her firefighter husband, Clay, started Curry Clean just over a year ago, and the business has been successful enough that they are expanding from just cleaning to adding carpet, tile and grout cleaning as well. While beginning a new business during the pandemic may sound counterintuitive, Kourtney said the timing could not have been better. "People are concerned with having their homes and businesses clean and sanitized. That is what we do," she emphasized. "I wanted to add disinfectant if people wanted that, but we mostly just use the right cleaning products."

Kourtney's motivation for starting the business came from her own experience as a working mom. "I was a school teacher with a husband and two children. The last thing I wanted to do was come home in the evenings and clean house or think about how I would spend the weekend cleaning. Everyone wants to spend more family time on the weekends, and I knew our service could provide that.

"I know most people probably hate cleaning, but I thoroughly enjoy it. The problem was simply working outside the home and finding the time to clean my own home and having family and social time."

The logo the Curry's adopted for their business is a firehose circling the business name, including a mop where the "L" in "clean" would be. It represents that they are a local firefighter family in the business of serving the community. "Clay and I have been in Ennis a long time. We both graduated from Ennis High School and were high school sweethearts,"

Kourtney said with a smile. "Our families have been here for many years."

The majority of Curry Clean's business is residential, but when you review their Facebook page, you will find a number of testimonials from happy commercial clients as well. "We have about 80 homes that are committed monthly, and that includes those we clean once a month, or weekly or every two weeks," Clay explained. "We grew so quickly, and it has been awesome to witness all that has happened in just a year!"


Kourtney indicated that the most important thing for them is to appreciate their customers and their employees. "We constantly praise our employees and team because without them, we wouldn't be where we are today. We all work very hard to make our clients happy," Clay added. "We are also now offering carpet, tile and grout cleaning for commercial businesses and residential homes."







"I get my inspiration for cooking today by anticipating the joy people get from eating something I have created. New recipes just seem to float around inside my head. My style of cooking would be home-style like my grandma used to do. At our Bluebonnet City Grill, our customers have become like friends and family."

Rick has also had success in cooking competitions, including participation in the Kansas City Royal World BBQ Competition in 2016, and more recently winning the Best BBQ at the 2019 Texas Food Truck Showdown in Waco.

Texas Caviar

- 1 15-oz. can black-eyed peas, rinsed and drained
- 1 15-oz. can black beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 3/4 cups frozen whole-kernel corn
- I medium red bell pepper, diced
- I medium yellow bell pepper, diced
- I medium green bell pepper, diced
- I medium red onion, diced
- 2 10-oz. cans Ro-Tel tomatoes
- 2 fresh jalapeños, seeded and diced
- 1/3 cup fresh cilantro, chopped

- I tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. pepper
- 1 24-oz. bottle zesty Italian salad dressing
- 2 ripe avocados, diced
- **1.** Combine everything except the avocados. Mix well; refrigerate overnight.
- **2.** Add the avocados before serving with tortilla chips.

Homemade Chicken and Dumplings

Chicken Broth:

- 6 cups chicken broth
- I tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. pepper
- 1 Tbsp. garlic powder
- 2 cups chicken, chopped and cooked

Dumplings:

- I cup all-purpose flour
- 2 Tbsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. black pepper

- 1 tsp. salt
- 3/4 cup whole milk
- 5 Tbsp. butter, melted
- **1.** For broth: Combine all ingredients; bring to a boil.
- **2.** For dumplings: In a large bowl whisk together the dry ingredients.
- **3.** Add the milk and butter; stir until the dough forms a ball. If the dough seems a little too dry, add a little more milk.
- **4.** Roll out the dough to about 3/4-inch thick; cut it into 3/4-inch by 3/4-inch squares.
- **5.** Drop the dumplings into the pot of boiling chicken broth. Boil on high for 2 minutes.
- **6.** Reduce the heat to medium; cook for 35 minutes or until light and fluffy.

Pancakes

- 9 cups all-purpose flour
- 6 Tbsp. baking powder
- 9 Tbsp. sugar
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 9 eggs
- 1/2 gal. whole milk
- **1.** Whisk together the dry ingredients.
- **2.** Whisk together the wet ingredients.
- **3.** Combine the wet and dry ingredients; do not overmix. Add more milk if needed.
- **4.** Cook on 300 F griddle treated with nonstick cooking spray until golden brown on both sides.

Biscuits

- 9 cups all-purpose flour
- 8 Tbsp. sugar
- 6 Tbsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 lb. cold butter, grated into small pieces
- 3 eggs
- 4 cups whole milk
- **I.** Mix the dry ingredients together; work the butter into the dry ingredients.
- **2.** Add the eggs and milk until the dough comes together. *Do not overwork the dough!*
- **3.** Roll out to 1-inch thickness; cut out using 2 1/2-inch cutter.
- 4. Bake at 325 F for 25 minutes.

Potato Pancakes

- 4 cups dehydrated hashbrowns, re-hydrated
- 1/2 cup cheddar cheese, shredded
- 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese, shredded
- 1/2 cup green onion, chopped
- 1/2 tsp. granulated garlic
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour







1 tsp. salt 3 eggs

- **1.** Combine all the ingredients; mix together until it will form a patty. If too dry, add more eggs.
- **2.** Cook on a hot griddle on both sides until golden brown.

Honey Sticky Buns

2 cups sugar

2 Tbsp. cinnamon

1/2 cup pecans, chopped

1/2 cup brown sugar

1/4 cup honey

1/2 cup butter, room temperature

3 cans butter-flavored biscuits

- **1.** Mix together the sugar and cinnamon.
- **2.** In a separate bowl mix the pecans, brown sugar, honey and butter.
- **3.** Put a large spoonful of the pecan mixture into the bottom of each cup of a 12-count cupcake pan.
- **4.** Cut the biscuits in half; cover them with the cinnamon/sugar mixture. Put 5 biscuit pieces in each cupcake pan cup; press down.
- **5.** Bake at 350 F for 15 to 20 minutes.
- **6.** Immediately turn the pan upside down on aluminum foil after removing from the oven.



7. Let rest for a few minutes before removing from the pan; serve warm.

Baked Beans and Meat Sauce

I lb. ground beefI large onion, choppedI bell pepper, choppedI tsp. Worcestershire sauceI Tbsp. prepared mustard

10 oz. ketchup Salt, to taste Pepper, to taste

2 14-oz. cans pork and beans


1. Brown the meat, onions and bell peppers.


2. Add the Worcestershire sauce, mustard,


ketchup, salt and pepper; mix well.














The historic town of Hico, Texas, made its debut on Honey Creek in the late 19th century. With the coming of the railroad, the town's forefathers moved toward the new mode of transportation in 1880, a decision that proved prosperous for the community. New landmark buildings appeared, which have now withstood more than 100 years of the ebb and flow of commerce and populations. Hico prospered as the shipping center for cotton and other crops.

Many of the historic buildings remain along the main streets of the town, transformed into shops and restaurants, with fresh entities opening. Many, however, visit the small community for a more notorious reason. Locals adhere to the legend that Billy the Kid lived there as an old man. In the middle of the main street, a small museum tells the stories, providing scores of artifacts from the man they knew as Brushy Bill Roberts. For historians, a visit to the museum offers facts about Billy the Kid, whether or not you believe the local tales. Outside the room with Billy's life story, other historic artifacts exist for visitors to browse.

Near the museum, Blue Star Trading Company houses a fun shop ranging from clothing to furniture and a gallery featuring local artists. An antique riding horse and life-size stallion make it a fun place for all ages to visit.

Upstairs in the mezzanine you will find a post office front and other antiques, including a vault built around the safe inside. When a fire destroyed the entire mezzanine, the vault became a floating time capsule. No one had the combination to the safe, but when they finally opened it, they discovered letters, documents and ledgers from 1917 to 1940. With the mezzanine restored, the upper part now houses a pictorial history of Hico. Doubling as an event center, the pictorial experience takes a step back in time.

All buildings in the downtown area contain brick or rock walls, built in earlier centuries to stop raging fires from moving between shops. From the city watering station to a historic log cabin at Peppermint Square, the museums and buildings Hico contains offer enough history to keep any interested person busy all day. Throughout the city center, murals painted on walls also give visitors an opportunity to view art. Entering the area, you can't miss the iconic larger-than-life letters HCO. The space between H and C allows visitors to become the I in Hico.

For those who prefer the outdoors and adventure, the city park includes RV parking spaces. Situated beside the Bosque River, visitors can enjoy nature. Nearby, Pete's Path winds around a sports complex and contains a disc golf course. Designed in honor of fallen heroes, the trail provides a paved sidewalk for exercise and dog walks while strolling along the river. Picnic tables dot the area for those who want to enjoy a meal or snack.

A newer attraction to Hico, Siloville opened in 2015. Built from three silos, it offers harnessed climbing, both indoors and out, low ropes, ninja warrior courses and ziplining. The less adventurous can climb a ladder and watch the sunset from the top of the silos.

With ample places to stay and eat, visitors can plan a weekend in the small community to step back in history and enjoy a bit of adventure. Located 100 miles or less from the DFW Metroplex, it also makes a fantastic day trip.


