

Mark Rios is a fan of old gangster movies, like The Godfather and Goodfellas, so it was a given that when he turned his hand to filmmaking, he'd don a fedora and head to old town Cedar Hill. Well, at least the first part makes sense. The second part might surprise you.


Mark started as a stage actor, something he's been enjoying for 19 years, professionally. He's acted on stages all over the Metroplex and on the East Coast. He's performed in all sorts of roles, but when it came time to write, he reached for his favorite genre. "I've been a big fan of mobster movies since I was in junior high. They have great acting and story lines. I was just a whippersnapper in the '80s when my grandmother on my mother's side, rest in peace, was a big fan of the TV show *Wiseguy*. I used to watch it, too, and we would discuss the episodes. I still remember a lot of those episodes. One day, she got this letter. It was addressed to her and had this long string of numbers in the upper left corner. I asked her, 'What are those numbers?' She replied, 'Oh, that's his prisoner number.' She told me that relative's father was rumored

to have mob connections. That kicked my interest to the next level. He's still in prison, but he's completely turned his life around and is a minister now."

Mark got the idea for writing a screenplay back in the early 2000s, when he was onstage in a live play. "A good friend, Brent, and I were in this play on the East Coast. In this scene, as the curtain came down, we were supposed to be chatting, but without the mics. So we were ad-libbing, chatting about movies we liked, and we both liked

mobster flicks. We decided that someday we should do a mobster-themed stage production. I decided that if I ever got the opportunity to do a mobster film, I should jump at the chance."

Years later, in 2018, he was helping a friend with a historical documentary. That friend agreed to come on board as the director of photography for Mark's project. "I talked to J.R. about filming my mobster story when we finished, and he agreed. The rest is history. He allowed my idea to come to life. It's a series of mini-episodes called A Family Thing. I'm based in the Duncanville/Cedar Hill area, so when I started thinking about locations, I looked here. I know one of the guys who own Sam's Pizza. I love to eat there, so I spoke to him and asked him what it would take to film some scenes in the restaurant. He thought it was a great idea because he loves the genre, too. I've also filmed exteriors at 1846 Coffee, and plan on shooting interiors there and at Wise Guys Old School Barbershop. They have all these mobster characters on the walls. There are some great alleys behind these old buildings, stuff that looks like what you find on the East Coast. I like filming here. When I'm scouting locations, I know a lot of these people. I have a little bit of a relationship with them. I shop there, eat there. And I know some of the local talent, because I've worked with them on stage over the years." Shortly after the project got off the ground, J.R. moved to Colorado, and Mark found a new DP in Rik, a friend from church.

When it comes to writing episodes for his series, Mark has a wealth of knowledge to draw on. "Some of my ideas are loosely based on true elements. I read a lot of true crime and

gangster history. Ideas pop into my head, and then I get feedback from my DPs, etc. Bouncing ideas off my co-workers is an important part of my writing process. I'll call Jay, from my film crew, or text him, 'You know that idea you had yesterday, I'm using that!' Mark isn't sure how long he'll keep filming his 15-minute episodes, but for now, it's a good thing. "We're on this new streaming service, BeeTV, on all the platforms. And there are a lot of people watching. As long as that's true, I'll keep writing and filming episodes. The streaming service has had over a million views so far! And we're getting a lot of good feedback, so we'll keep going! Oh, and the pilot episode is also available on Prime."

The success of A Family Thing hasn't kept Mark from developing other projects. "I'm working on a stage production about Dallas during the Prohibition era. The characters are real people from Dallas' past, but I and my fellow producer put our own spin on the story. I'm excited about this project. I'm in the process of shopping it to different local theaters around DFW right now. I feel really blessed to be doing what I'm doing. God is good. I love screen work. It's been a great ride!" NOW



Teens are all over the map. Every parent knows that. Sports and fashion, anime and gaming, careers and clowning, music and mayhem. No two of them have the same interests, and one of them may change favorite passions three times before breakfast, while their sibling has one interest that trumps everything for years on end. That's why, when Marg Runnels and the DeSoto Public Library decided to do something special for the teens in our communities, they named it the Best Southwest Everything Teen Expo. If your teen is into it, the expo has something for them.

"The expo got started because I had been working with teens here in the library for quite a while, but we can only serve so many here. We wanted an event that could serve a lot of teens in a lot of different areas of interest," Marg explained.

When Marq and her team started the event in 2016, it was fairly small. "We only had a few vendors. But about 500, mostly DeSoto teens, attended that year. Some of them showcased their talents, but we had two goals: to be a one-stop shop for everything teens are interested in and to present teens in a positive light. Every year, it has grown. COVID-19 canceled the expo for the last two years, but in 2019, we had about 2,500 teens show up."

As the event grew, so did the number and variety of vendors, many of whom are teen entrepreneurs. Teens present their products, showcase the clubs they enjoy, attend workshops by guest speakers, perform dances and music, show off their cooking skills. "We have teen writers and entertainers and teens who are doing outstanding things in their communities. We have groups from schools in Dallas and Frisco and beyond who come to present about the fun and important things happening at their schools, and, of course, all the Best Southwest cities are well represented. We even had a group of girls from Nigeria who presented by livestream about life in their country."

In among the fun, a lot of serious stuff happens, too. There are workshops on human trafficking, cyberbullying, running a business, getting into colleges and mental health. The resource tables provide help for both teens and their parents in dealing with difficult issues that teens face, like dating violence, nutrition and fitness, addiction treatment and prevention. "We have the workshops because we didn't want it to just be entertainment. We want the teens to learn something about the things they care about. It's not just laser tag and food, even though those are important, too," Marq explained.

"We have had classes on everything from sewing to dance and art. There are cosmetology tables and a prom fashion show — and the cupcake wars. We've had radio stations and DJs. We're restarting this year and put a lot of effort into planning the event scheduled for April 30. We don't want teens who attended in previous years to be disappointed. We're making sure we have enough going on to make it fun. This is important because teens are our future. We want to make sure they have access to the resources and services to build their lives and stay connected to the community they'll be leading one day. We have to make time for them and their interests. These are smart, inquisitive, creative people. They just need someone to invest time in them. We have the police and fire departments here to present. Big machines like squad cars, SWAT vans, drones and firetrucks are popular. Some of our teens have considered careers in public service for the first time after meeting these first responders. Doctors set up for health screenings and blood pressure checks. Lawyers, artists and others present about their careers. The teens hear from colleges, trade schools, the military and job corps. There are a lot of options they may not have considered, so we highlight a lot of different careers and educational opportunities." Teens can even earn community service hours for participating.

When this first started, Marq and her team were taking a risk that it would all work out and meet a need they saw. Now it's a nonstop festival of options for teens from all over. NOW

A self-taught cook, Brooke Reynolds enjoys cooking with her husband, Todd, and their four children. "We decided to incorporate a monthly cooking night into our family routine," she stated. 3. In a medium pan, sauté the carrots, red peppers and jalapeños in the oil. Remove; drain.
4. Over a low heat, add the evaporated milk to the noodles; stir.

5. Add the three cheeses slowly; mix until the cheeses melt. Add the chimichurri sauce; stir in the vegetables.

7 Add the cilantro to the warm rice; season with salt. Mound the rice, covered by the steak onto each plate.



The historic town of Hico, Texas, made its debut on Honey Creek in the late 19th century. With the coming of the railroad, the town's forefathers moved toward the new mode of transportation in 1880, a decision that proved prosperous for the community. New landmark buildings appeared, which have now withstood more than 100 years of the ebb and flow of commerce and populations. Hico prospered as the shipping center for cotton and other crops.

Many of the historic buildings remain along the main streets of the town, transformed into shops and restaurants, with fresh entities opening. Many, however, visit the small community for a more notorious reason. Locals adhere to the legend that Billy the Kid lived there as an old man. In the middle of the main street, a small museum tells the stories, providing scores of artifacts from the man they knew as Brushy Bill Roberts. For historians, a visit to the museum offers facts about Billy the Kid, whether or not you believe the local tales. Outside the room with Billy's life story, other historic artifacts exist for visitors to browse.

Near the museum, Blue Star Trading Company houses a fun shop ranging from clothing to furniture and a gallery featuring local artists. An antique riding horse and life-size stallion make it a fun place for all ages to visit.

Upstairs in the mezzanine you will find a post office front and other antiques, including a vault built around the safe inside. When a fire destroyed the entire mezzanine, the vault became a floating time capsule. No one had the combination to the safe, but when they finally opened it, they discovered letters, documents and ledgers from 1917 to 1940. With the mezzanine restored, the upper part now houses a pictorial history of Hico. Doubling as an event center, the pictorial experience takes a step back in time.

All buildings in the downtown area contain brick or rock walls, built in earlier centuries to stop raging fires from moving between shops. From the city watering station to a historic log cabin at Peppermint Square, the museums and buildings Hico contains offer enough history to keep any interested person busy all day. Throughout the city center, murals painted on walls also give visitors an opportunity to view art. Entering the area, you can't miss the iconic larger-than-life letters HCO. The space between H and C allows visitors to become the I in Hico.

For those who prefer the outdoors and adventure, the city park includes RV parking spaces. Situated beside the Bosque River, visitors can enjoy nature. Nearby, Pete's Path winds around a sports complex and contains a disc golf course. Designed in honor of fallen heroes, the trail provides a paved sidewalk for exercise and dog walks while strolling along the river. Picnic tables dot the area for those who want to enjoy a meal or snack.

A newer attraction to Hico, Siloville opened in 2015. Built from three silos, it offers harnessed climbing, both indoors and out, low ropes, ninja warrior courses and ziplining. The less adventurous can climb a ladder and watch the sunset from the top of the silos.

With ample places to stay and eat, visitors can plan a weekend in the small community to step back in history and enjoy a bit of adventure. Located 100 miles or less from the DFW Metroplex, it also makes a fantastic day trip.







If you are diabetic, and especially if you are also age 60 or older, odds are that your nerve damage has been caused directly by your diabetes — although many younger diabetics also have nerve damage from this potentially deadly disease.

But many OTHER people with these symptoms — pain, burning, and tingling — are NOT diabetic, yet also suffer from nerve damage.
