Carroll Elementary School, once known as Lincoln Elementary School, has earned its place in both Corsicana's history and its future. In the school's hallowed halls and Mackenzie Irvin's first-grade classroom, generational history is repeating itself. "When I came here, I started talking about my meme having taught here," Ms. Irvin said. When Meme, otherwise known as Neva Johnson, walked down the hall to visit her granddaughter's classroom, she felt right at home. Years earlier, that very classroom was where she taught second grade herself.

But wait, there's more to this story. Back when Neva taught at Carroll Elementary, the principal there was longtime Corsicana ISD teacher and administrator Darlene Jackson. Mrs. Jackson grew up in a home with 10 siblings near the school, where her mother still lives. Mrs. Jackson's "baby

brother" is Tim Betts, the current principal of Carroll Elementary. "Carroll is a second family to so many generations. Neva is often here for Grandparents Day, Pancake Day and other times," Mr. Betts said. "And Darlene substitute teaches here."

Ms. Irvin was hired as a first-year teacher by Mr. Betts when both were at Navarro Elementary School. "The moment I met Mackenzie, I knew she was a natural. That first year at Navarro, she taught my daughter. I saw positive things happening in her classroom, and I was sad when she announced she was coming to Carroll, but then I came here, too, so I've been her principal her entire career," he remarked.

Darlene, otherwise known fondly as Mama J, spent 32 full-time years at Carroll. "I have so many memorable moments working with children and staff," she stated. "There's always been a family bond here. We want to be here where we learn to get along with all people. Little ones hug Tim and me, and I tell each of the kids, 'You're my grandchild.' I love still being here, seeing my brother getting his groove on as a principal, his love for education and being with all the people I know."

Some things don't change between generations and years. "I felt so welcomed by Darlene and the faculty committee, and Carroll quickly became my second family," Neva recalled. "Students loved

"And Neva was always actively involved with her students and was very concerned about her students and fellow teachers," Darlene recalled.

Ms. Irvin echoed her grandmother's comments. "The kids have welcomed me, and they are excited to learn. A little boy said he hand-selected me to be his teacher, but I tell my kids every day that I hand-selected them."


However, the longtime educators have seen changes, too. "COVID brought a lot of changes, and closing the educational gap since coming back two years ago has been challenging," Mr. Betts explained.

"Learning styles are so different now," Darlene observed. "The parents are younger, and students used to be more eager to learn and were good listeners. Both the classroom and neighborhood have changed over the years."

Ms. Irvin agreed, "I have to be creative and provide different handson experiences to reach the kids." She offers induction into a Hall of Fame as an incentive and Room Transformations. "I love the impact I make daily. I go to students' baseball games and see other students and families there and at the store." Additionally, Ms. Irvin coaches cheer at Corsicana Middle School. I became a teacher because I have always had a love for children, and I loved playing school with my sisters and seeing my grandma teach while I was growing up." She volunteers in the community through her church, Grace Community Church.

"I'm still teaching at Carroll and in Sunday school at Olive Grove Baptist Church in Blooming Grove," Darlene said. Her husband, a native of





Blooming Grove, is known as Deacon Jackson there. Darlene also volunteers for the Senior Day at the MLK Center where she serves on the board, and she's a member of Navarro County Retired Teachers Association. "No one's a stranger to me," she added. "I started in education as an aide, got my degree and became a teacher. Dr. Alexander, principals and family all believed in me and told me I could be a principal."

"As I student, I got to see Darlene as a teacher here at Carroll, known as Lincoln then. I saw and knew the impact she made, and that inspired me to go into education as a profession," Mr. Betts explained. "Darlene asked me about becoming an administrator, and I enjoy making a difference, not just in 22 lives in a classroom but in 600 students' lives." He serves on the Corsicana Salvation Army's board and at Olive Grove Baptist Church. Through Education in Action, Mr. Betts helps provide kids with experiences outside Corsicana.

"He offers before and after school activities for the parents' convenience, too," Ms. Irvin added. Also, through activities like the '50s Sock Hop, we spread the joy."

"Was this coming together of generations at Carroll destiny? Coincidence? Choice? Or a God thing?" asked Neva.

"I think it's a God thing," answered her granddaughter. "It shows the passion we all have for education."

"We have the saying here, 'We Can, We Will," said Mr. Betts. "I'm proud to follow in Darlene's footsteps at Carroll, and I'll always be the baby of our family. All these connections make us feel fuzzy inside. I want to leave a lasting legacy at Carroll."





"Geologist Richard Burleson forms the opinion that they are 'igneous occurrences.' Archeologist Vount Byron de Prorok ... concludes they were constructed by a prehistoric race. Dr. R.S. Hyer, former professor of physics at SMU, concludes the formation is natural. Dr. Kenneth Schaar of The University of Texas at Arlington concluded that both sections he examined were natural formations but does not rule out the possibility that another portion could be manmade." These are just a few of the conclusions of men, quoted on the Rockwall County Museum website, who have examined the curious wall that meanders through a portion of North Texas. Even with all of this evidence, the jury is still out. Is the wall that gave Rockwall County its name a natural formation or manmade?

Texas has 254 counties. There is a simple answer to the question, "Why?" It is because Texas is just so big! In the early days of the state, Texas followed a simple guideline that no one should be more than a day's travel from their courthouse. Travel was mostly on horseback, so the counties had to be relatively small. Rockwall County leads the way as the smallest county. The Constitution of 1876 said new counties had to be at least 900 square miles. Rockwall County was in an area that was part of Nacogdoches County in 1836, and by the time Texas joined the United States in 1845, it was part of Henderson County. Kaufman County was formed in 1847, and the Rockwall area was included therein until 1873, when the residents felt the county seat of Kaufman was just too far away. And in 1873, Rockwall County was formed. Since it was formed before the 1876 Constitution, the diminutive county was able to organize with just 147 square miles.

Today's Rockwall County Courthouse is a magnificent edifice, constructed in 2011, and features terrazzo floors, granite wall paneling and mahogany ceiling paneling. It is a far cry from the original structure built in 1875 and the subsequent structures completed in 1892 and 1940. While the first two structures no longer exist due to fire and safety issues, the 1940 courthouse is still in use today by the county commissioners and tax office.

One Republic of Texas action that helped with the establishment of the city of Rockwall and of Rockwall County was the construction of the Central National Road. According to the Texas State Historical Association, in 1844, the Texas Congress "established a five-man commission to select a right-of-way, see that it was cleared and supervise the building of necessary

bridges." The road would run from the Trinity River in the Dallas area crossing Rockwall County near Rockwall, then farther north and east to the extreme northwest corner of Red River County. The foresight of Congress was great and was, in fact, an "international" vision. "At its southern terminus, it connected with the road opened in 1840 between Austin and Preston Bend on the Red River, in effect making an international highway between St. Louis and San Antonio." Population shifts kept the highway from meeting its full international potential, and the later development of new towns decreased the importance of the Central National Road.

It was sometime in the early 1850s that farmers digging a well discovered a rock wall that crossed the future county and, at some places, appeared at ground level. When the town of Rockwall was formed. it was named after the rock formation, and subsequently, of course, the county took the name also. As recently as 1976, part of the wall was excavated near present-day FM 549 and Cornelius Road. The excavation was open to the public, and hundreds of school children visited the wall. In 1996, Architect John Lindsey concluded that "evidence of a prehistoric structure is mounting." Then in 2012, the America Unearthed program, "The Great Wall of Texas," concluded it was a natural formation.

Today, the walls in situ are buried and closed to the public on private property. However, pieces of the walls have been moved and reconstructed at Rockwall County Museum Park, and a small segment of the wall is visible at the old Rockwall County Courthouse. Texashillcountry.com titles its blog about the wall, "The Rock 'Wall' in Rockwall, Texas: Prehistoric Man, Extra-Terrestrial, or Natural Phenomenon?" Regardless of its origin, the wall makes a nice foundation for the city of Rockwall and Rockwall County.



Rena Sutphin learned at an early age to cook. "Momma could make anything taste great!" Rena recalled. She collects cookbooks, reading them for entertainment. "I usually read several recipes and then make the dish the way I think it will taste best. I love to cook because I love to eat," Rena stated.

Since becoming a Certified Texas Master Naturalist, Rena has begun learning about foraging and cooking with native plants. "I started using native plants by picking well-known greens, such as dandelions, to use in salads," she said. "Fellow members of Indian Trail Master Naturalist Chapter of Ellis/ Navarro counties provided me with the following recipes they've tried using native plants. However, always be sure of a plant's identity to avoid eating poisonous plants or plant parts!"

Wild Plum Jelly

5 lbs. wild plums

- 4 cups water
- Cheese cloth
- 7 1/2 cups sugar
- 2 6-oz. pkgs. liquid pectin or 6 Tbsp. Ball Classic Pectin or 1 3/4-oz. pkg. powdered pectin

I. In a large stockpot, simmer the plums in

the water for about 30 minutes until they are tender and broken down. Strain the plums through the cheese cloth to get 5 1/2 cups of liquid.

2. Return the liquid to the pan; bring to a boil. Add the sugar; bring to a rolling boil, stirring constantly for 1 minute.

3. Add the pectin; boil for an additional minute. Remove from heat; skim off the foam with a metal spoon.

4. Ladle the jelly into clean, hot canning

jars, leaving 1/4-inch headspace. Apply the lids; process the jars in a boiling water bath canner for 10 minutes.

Yaupon Tea

This tea will contain quite a bit of caffeine.

3/4 Tbsp. dried yaupon leaves 16-oz. water

I. In a cast-iron pan, toast the yaupon leaves until they're dry and crunchy but not burned.

2. Crush the leaves. Add the leaves to a tea infuser or cloth tea bag; submerge in the water.

3. Let the tea leaves cold steep in the refrigerator until the tea reaches the desired strength, typically 5-10 hours.

Beautyberry Salad Dressing

This dressing can "dress" any green salad.

1/4 cup fresh beautyberries2 Tbsp. olive oil

1 Tbsp. water Pinch of salt

I. In a blender or food processor, blend all the ingredients until the mixture is smooth.

Henbit Pesto

This is not a native plant, but it is plentiful here.

3 cups fresh henbit (available in the springtime)
1/2 cup pecans
3 garlic cloves
1 Tbsp. lemon juice
1/2 cup olive oil
1/2 tsp. salt
1/4 tsp. black pepper
1/2 cup Parmesan cheese, grated

I. In a blender or food processor, blend all the ingredients until the pesto is smooth. If the consistency is too runny, add more henbit and pecans; if too thick, add more olive oil.

Lori Crider's Common Evening Primrose Burgers

The burgers are great served with ketchup or lemon sauce.

- 4 1/2 cups tender evening primrose leaves, chopped
- 4 1/2 cups whole wheat or barley flour
 4 cups carrots, chopped, cooked and mashed
- 4 cups onions, chopped
- 3 cups brown rice, cooked
- 3 cups water
- 2 cups fruit juice
- 2 cups sesame seeds, roasted
- 3 Tbsp. paprika
- 3 Tbsp. miso
- 2 Tbsp. fresh dill
- 1 Tbsp. oregano
- 1/2 cup sesame oil

 In a large bowl, mix the first 12 ingredients together; shape the mixture into individual patties. More flour can be added to hold the burgers together, if needed.
 In a pan, heat the sesame oil; cook the burgers in the hot oil.

2 Tbsp. unsalted butter
3 large eggs
1 cup whole milk
1 tsp. lemon zest
1/3 cup white sugar
1/2 cup flour
1 1/2 cups dewberries, or other berries
2 Tbsp. raw sugar





I. Preheat the oven to 350 F. In a skillet, melt the butter.

2. In a blender, mix the eggs, milk, zest and white sugar until the mixture foams; slowly add the flour.

3. Pour the mixture into the hot skillet. Top with the berries and raw sugar.

4. Bake for 25 minutes; remove. Let the clafoutis rest for 5-10 minutes before serving.







If you have ever been a smoker and answer "yes" to any of these questions, you may be considered high risk for lung cancer.

Other risk factors include:

- Radon or occupational carcinogen exposure (asbestos, arsenic, diesel fumes, etc.)
- · Family history of lung cancer
- · COPD or pulmonary fibrosis
- · Personal history of cancer or lymphoma

How Do I Decide If I Should Be Screened?

Low-dose CT screenings provide earlier detection, when lung cancer is most treatable.

Discuss your medical history, the risks of screening and benefits with your doctor. In order to be covered by Medicare, you must visit your doctor and have an order.

Is This Screening Covered By My Insurance?

Your insurance may or may not cover the cost of a low-dose CT screening for detection of early-stage lung cancer. This screening is covered by Medicare when ordered by your doctor after a lung cancer screening counseling appointment.

What You Can Do

- · If you are a smoker, start a plan to quit. We can help!
- · Make your home and work environment smoke-free.
- · Be aware of occupational exposures.

If you are still smoking, talk to your physician about ways to help you quit.
