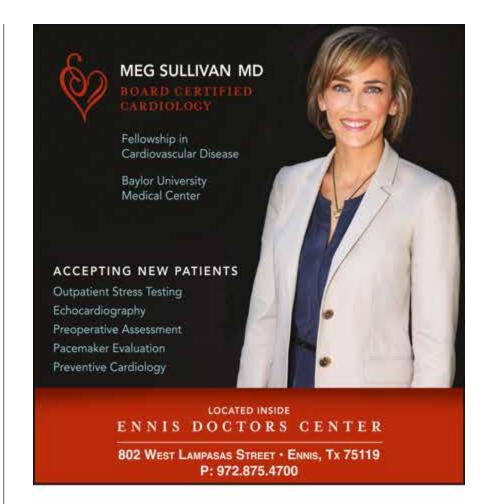

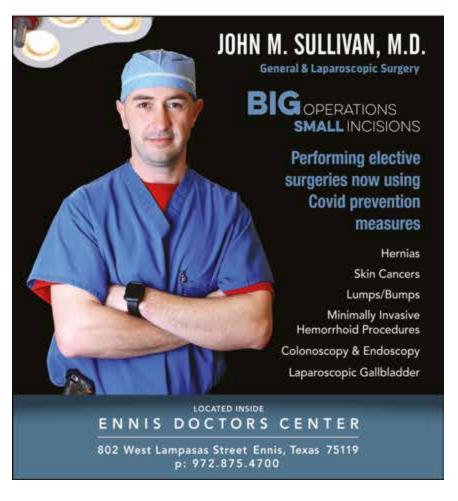

Happy April!

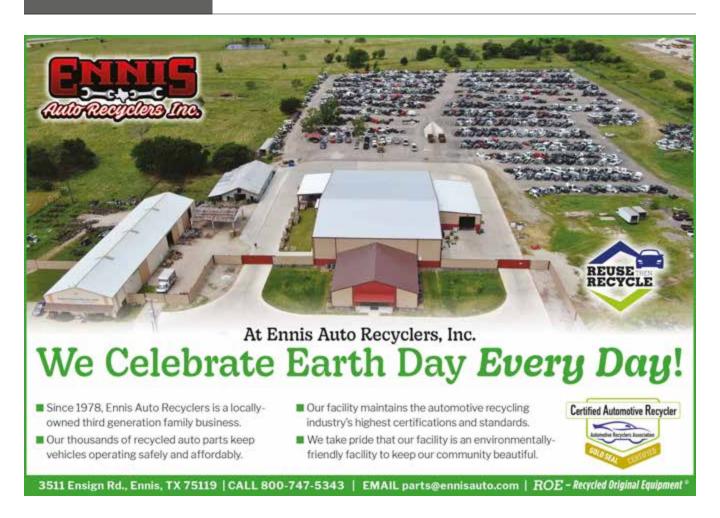

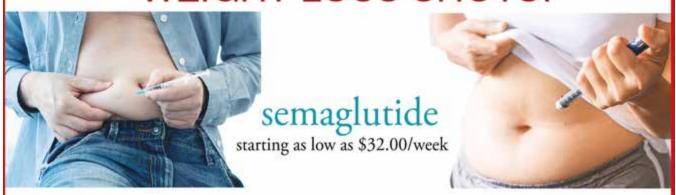

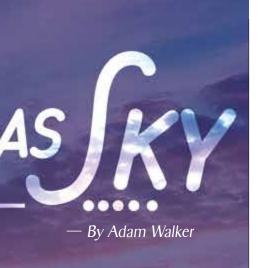


Garden Club who, together, have more than 115 years invested in Ennis and its bluebonnets. The trail became an official event in 1951, but as far back as 1939, there were unofficial trails marked out for drivers to enjoy the sights. In those early years, motorists and their families would make day trips from as far away as Dallas and Waco. Now, the bluebonnet trails draw visitors from China, India and Europe.

"When this started in 1951, the Garden Club just set up a tent in front of the library and passed out hand-drawn maps. We sold handcrafts," Nancy reported. Blue checked aprons and bonnets, painted rocks and T-shirts were featured alongside homemade sandwiches and cookies.

"The first year, 400 cars came, and the club passed out 1,000 maps," Pat informed.

"There were three main trails, but we didn't have painted metal signs," Penny added. "It was just cardboard that some lady nailed to a tree!" This



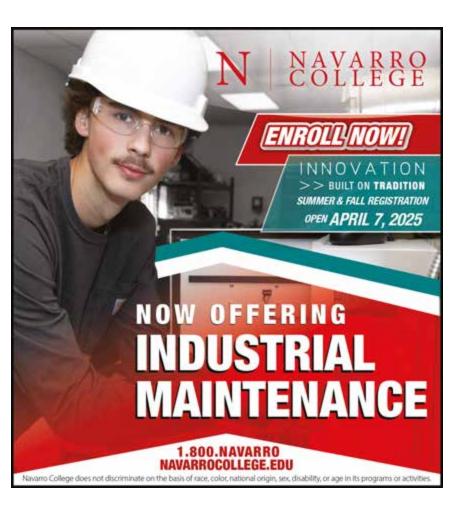
was the "primitive" state of affairs from which today's festival grew.

"When I first joined the Garden Club, 50 years ago, the club did this alone," Nancy explained. "We were on a very tight budget. We borrowed a tent from Keever's, tables from the churches. Gina Rokas, the previous tourism director, was an integral partner and was so passionate about the bluebonnets. In the last eight years, it's really gotten big. We brought in partners because it had outgrown the club. It's all been stepping stones. Every year, it gets a little better. We partnered with the city. Now, we have tours, vendors, live music, security and a huge tent for selling our official souvenirs. The money from selling souvenirs gives us funds to seed some of the parks and to start planning for next year. The extra money is given to local charities."

Though they have lots of help from the city and other partners these days, the Ennis Garden Club members still form the backbone of the festival. "All of the members volunteer at least one two-hour shift," Penny informed.

Bluebonnets grow naturally here. The only seeding that the Ennis Garden Club does is in some of the parks. where they partner with the city to add to the blooms. The trails are all nature's handiwork. Fall rains and cold weather in the winter make for the best blooms, so this year promises to be good. "They bloom along the highways first," Nancy explained, "because the ground is hotter there. Then two to three weeks later, the hills bloom. They like slopes with poor soil. They don't want their feet wet. They need to drain. People don't realize that they have a smell. Such an aroma! One place blooms,







while another goes to seed. When will the best time to see them be? Only God knows!"

"I love the beautiful color, with the other flowers mixed in," Pat added. "I grew up on a farm. This is home to me. God is so close. Many times, we don't take the time to stop to enjoy what's right here. And it's given to us, free, to enjoy. I enjoy getting to share this with other people."

Ashley Colunga, the community engagement director for the city of Ennis, has a unique perspective. "I've been with the city for eight-and-ahalf years and have enjoyed watching this event, so rich in history, adapt

and change. Our team handles the marketing, planning and logistics of the event. This is our largest event of the year and feeds into the brand and identity of our town, so we take great pride in ensuring this is a wonderful experience for both locals and visitors. Next year will be the 75th year, which is a huge milestone! Our team is already conceptualizing how to celebrate the history for next year's festival with ideas like recreating photos from the past."

Ashley grew up in Ennis. "The house I grew up in was on the trails, and the house I currently live in is on the trails. But I didn't really believe how big this was until I started working for the city



of Ennis. People come from all over the world. It makes me proud that people want to come experience the beautiful nature we have to offer. They want to see the bluebonnets, the Belgian horses, the donkeys and the tree-lined roads. Every year is different, which is what keeps people coming back.

"The Welcome Center offers one-onone conversations about where to find the best bluebonnet viewing and dining recommendations. We recently added a welcome video, but you need to talk to our volunteers to get the full, authentic experience. Instagram influencers are getting the word out to younger generations. Social media has certainly been a driving factor of growth over the years. Our first post of the season's blooms always goes viral!" NOW

# CookingNOW IN THE KITCHEN WITH MINNIE VAUGHN

"Growing up, I never got to be in the kitchen because back then, small children were not allowed to be in the kitchen while Mama was cooking. Around the age of 12 was the first time I was permitted to explore the kitchen. I learned how to make homemade biscuits. I truly enjoyed learning, and once I had it mastered, I made them all the time."

Cooking is her happy place. She loves eating and seeing others appreciate her meals. "I have a few favorite seasonings and spices. I often use sea salt mixed with black pepper, but for my sweet flavorings, I like vanilla and nutmeg," she added. "Mealtimes are important occasions that bring people together. In my house, we prefer downhome cooking — soul food."

During the holidays, Minnie looks forward to pulling out all the favorite holiday recipes to make lots of others smile while fellowshipping over a good home-cooked meal. "Everything that I have learned to cook over the years has been self-taught with the help of the Lord. Cooking is a gift. And I thank God for allowing me the ability to bless others in this way." #### Tea Cakes

4 cups flour

1 Tbsp. baking soda

1/2 Tbsp. nutmeg

2 sticks butter

1 cup sugar

3 eggs

1 cup buttermilk

1 Tbsp. vanilla

- **1.** Preheat the oven to 350 F.
- **2.** Put the flour, baking soda and nutmeg in a bowl; set aside. In another bowl, mix the butter, sugar, eggs, buttermilk and vanilla. Combine the ingredients.
- **3.** Roll out the dough on a flat surface; use a round cookie cutter to shape tea cakes.
- **4.** Place the tea cakes on a parchment paper-lined cookie sheet; bake in for 15 minutes. Remove from the oven; let set.
- **5.** Enjoy with a cup of your favorite drink.

#### **Sweet Potato Pie**

4 large sweet potatoes

2 sticks pure butter

2 1/2 cups sugar

1 Tbsp. nutmeg

1/2 cup flour

1 Tbsp. vanilla

2 unbaked deep-dish piecrusts

- **1.** Peel and boil the sweet potatoes until soft; drain the water.
- **2.** Place the sweet potatoes in a large mixing bowl. Add the butter and sugar while mixing well.
- **3.** Once the mixture is blended, add the remaining ingredients; mix until smooth.
- **4.** Transfer the mixture into the unbaked piecrusts. Bake for 45 minutes to 1 hour until golden brown.

#### **Old Fashioned Beef Stew**

5 lbs. beef stew meat

Salt, to taste

Pepper, to taste

Sugar, a pinch

3 lg. potatoes, peeled and cut into chunks

1 lg. onion, diced

4 stalks celery, diced

I bag frozen carrots

2 cans stewed tomatoes

1 jar original Ragu sauce

I bag frozen mixed vegetables

**1.** Season the stew meat with salt, pepper and sugar. Brown the meat in a large skillet.

**2.** Place the meat, and remaining ingredients in a large pot; stir to combine. Boil for I hour.

**3.** Serve with corn bread.

#### Greens

- 4 bunches mustard greens
- 3 bunches turnip greens
- 4-5 bite-size pieces salted bacon
- 1 Tbsp. salt
- 1/3 cup sugar
- **1.** Thoroughly rinse the greens in lukewarm water; rub them with your hands to remove dirt before cooking.
- **2.** Put the salted bacon, salt, sugar and the greens into a pot; bring to a boil over mediumhigh heat for  $1 \ 1/2$  hours until tender.
- 3. Serve with corn bread.

#### Homemade Biscuits

2 cups self-rising flour 1/4 cup Crisco 1 cup buttermilk PAM cooking spray

- **1.** Preheat the oven at 350 F for 12 minutes.
- **2.** In a large bowl, mix the flour and Crisco. Add the buttermilk; mix with your hands. Do not overmix. After mixing the ingredients, add a sprinkle of flour to roll out the biscuit dough.
- **3.** Use your biscuit cutter or a cookie cutter to form the biscuits.
- **4.** Spray PAM cooking spray on a cookie sheet; place the biscuits on the pan.
- 5. Bake for 10-15 minutes.

#### Potato Salad

I lg. potato

1/2 cup mayonnaise

2 Tbsp. mustard

2 Tbsp. sugar

1/2 cup sweet relish

4 boiled eggs

- **1.** Peel and dice the potato. Place the potatoes in a pot of boiling water; cook until soft. Remove the potatoes to cool.
- **2.** In a large bowl, add all ingredients; stir together. Cover; put in the refrigerator to chill before serving.

# Are You Afraid of Outliving Your Money?

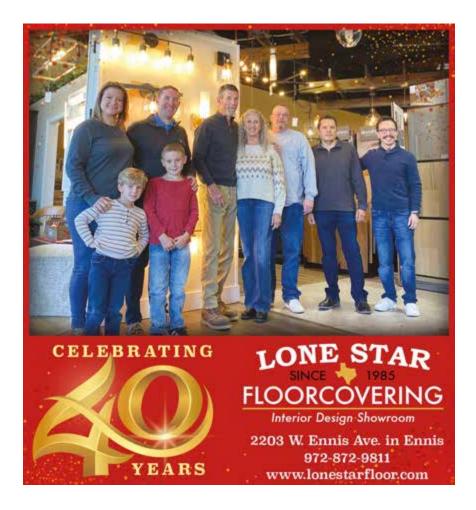

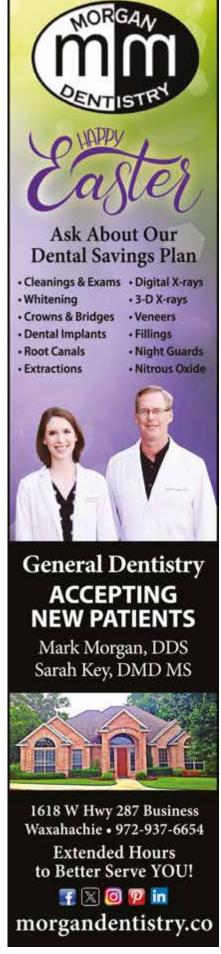

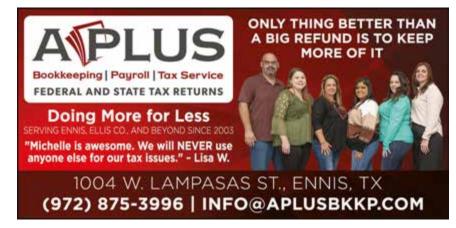
