





Following an INNER COMPASS

The lilting music wafts on a gentle breeze, drawing folks who are strolling Beaton Street to take in Raquel Lindemann's latest performance in a Pocket Park. She might strum an original tune on her guitar, sing a familiar oldie-but-goldie favorite with her keyboard or use her harmonica, mandolin or ukulele to put a new twist on a pop song. "I want my music to bring joy," Raquel said. "I use my instruments to speak and express what I want to say."

She grew up speaking English and her mother's tongue, Spanish. As a trained vocalist, Raquel sings in Spanish, French, Italian, German and English. "Words mean so much in music. I'm always wondering why the lyricist wrote this song and what he or she is trying to say."

As a teacher, she said, "I'm selling the joy and fun of music and singing. I love just putting music out in the air and the spontaneity of the moments spent with students. Working with them, my music becomes more fluid, and I learn more. The students are learning every day, and I want to be like them. I remember amazing moments spent in music when I was little. I want the younger me to be proud of me now.

"We moved around when I was a child," she said, "living in Indiana the longest. My mother is a beautiful pianist, and she taught me piano from age 4 to middle school." Because her family moved so often, Raquel didn't feel she had a hometown until she married Paul Nguyen, and they moved to his hometown of Corsicana in 2016. "I feel accepted here and can be my authentic self as both a performer and teacher," she remarked. A former teacher in Dallas, Raquel is completing her first year as Fannin Elementary's music and fine arts teacher. "I'm very excited to be a part of the community and kids' lives, and I love our home with its lake," she added. "I love nature. It stirs me, so I bring my guitar to the water to compose music. I listen to my inner compass and tell stories with the songs I compose."









With a bachelor's degree in music and vocal performance from the University of Kansas and having furthered her musical studies at Southern Methodist University, Raquel enjoys performing but admits to sometimes getting "butterflies" if she thinks about the upcoming event too much. "However, once I start, I'm OK," she explained. "I get nervous because I care. I am always pushing myself to grow. Once performing, I enjoy spontaneity with the audience. I feed off the crowd and relax knowing everything doesn't have to be perfect. I listen to the audience, and I have conversations with them. I ask for favorites, and I get very excited when someone is moved by one of my songs. I always hope someone in the audience finds a song they needed to hear during our shared moments."

Raquel performed in choir and through band tours while in school and played with bands around Dallas venues, but teaching and performing music during studies and in Dallas venues took a toll. She lost her voice for several years. Having been diagnosed with dysphonia, a disfunction of the vocal cords, she guit teaching to give her voice more rest and started homeschooling the couple's daughter, Kaya. She sought help from SMU voice teacher, Dale Dietert, who was experienced in working with "wounded birds." Her selections of songs reflect the needed changes such as singing in her lower register, lowering the needed volume and taking speech therapy.

As a wife, mom and self-proclaimed dreamer, Raquel shared, "I want to be prepared for moments when music transports me, so I can be the best version of myself in every role I play." One of her special times was when she recorded her original song. "Among the Trees," with then 8-year-old Kaya. "I'm so grateful to have had the experience of recording with my daughter." Raquel was a 35-year-old graduate student singing in a choir at SMU and was just starting to sing again when she tried out to sing "Fields of Gold" as a solo. She was selected, making this another favorite memory. "I have always felt connected to the song and believe it chose me," she recalled.

Her home music room is a place in which Raquel can compose and rehearse, sometimes with Kaya, now a



student at Collins Intermediate School. The room is full of natural light, bright colors, restful seating and a collection of instruments. Raquel has an album out, Sunrise, produced by Lloyd Maines of Dixie Chicks fame. "It was an amazing moment when he said he would produce the album with me," she said. "It was a challenge transitioning from songwriting to recording an album, but I am eager to share more stories with another album soon."

She advises upcoming musicians to be very still, listen to their heart and to not be afraid to experiment with different instruments. "Continue to learn and communicate, and above all, be thickskinned, resilient and don't fear making a mistake," Raquel added.

A former volunteer with CASA in Dallas, Raguel has been involved with settling into life in Corsicana. "People here allow others to be their full selves," she remarked. "There is such a sense of community in a smaller city." Paul's family are Corsicana residents, but Raquel's family is "scattered all over." "I've now lived in Texas longer than any other state," she said.

She concluded, "I'm so grateful for the opportunities to perform and teach here in Corsicana. Music is my life's purpose, and I'm motivated by service. It makes me a better wife, mother and friend. I love making people laugh and smile while I help soothe their souls, and I love being the soundtrack for shared beautiful moments and memories." NOW

















While Texans adore Friday night lights and other sports across the state, there is nothing guite like a rodeo. In the smallest counties across Texas, communities gather for both annual and regular events. That shouldn't surprise us, considering the Lone Star State took a leadership role at the beginning of this beloved sport.

Rodeos grew from the cattle industry, though no one knows for certain where or when the new sport began. Several towns inundated with cows claim the first rodeo. Santa Fe, New Mexico, claims they held the first one in 1847. Deer Trail, Colorado, boasts an event in 1869. But Pecos, Texas, declares an authentic rodeo in 1883 — the first that offered prizes.

Rebuilding from war, large ranches and cattle drives ushered in a golden era of cowboys, attracting young men seeking adventure. As young men do, they showed off skills through competitions, often inviting cowboys from other ranches to claim bragging rights or money.

As the industry flourished in the Southwest, West Texas and areas in the Panhandle of Texas established large ranches. John S. Chisum, Oliver Loving and Charles Goodnight became wellknown names, smaller ranches popping up beside them.

When fencing arrived in the late 1880s, however, the range cowboy experienced confinement. With communities building near ranches, holidays became social events and a perfect environment for cowboys to shine with abilities of roping, riding and wrangling. Some even honed their singing talents.

The railroad expanded, changing the way cowboys worked. During the off-season, many joined shows and rodeos, exhibiting ranch life skills. Rodeos became annual events in various places, enticing cowboys to follow. While some held only small contests, the first two rodeos on record consisted of the 1883 one in Pecos, Texas, and one held in 1888 in Prescott, Arizona, which was the first rodeo to charge admission. The first indoor rodeo took place in Fort Worth, Texas, during 1917.

According to World Atlas, more than in any other professional sport, residents of Texas played major roles in the development and leadership of rodeos. Texas boasts more hall of fame honorees than any other state, with more than 50 on record. And the Lone Star State guickly became the focal point of the professional sport native to the Southwest.

Then in 1997, the state legislature voted rodeo as the official state sport of Texas. Only two other states, Wyoming and South Dakota, share that designation for rodeo. In 1993, Mesquite, Texas, received a legislative declaration as Official Rodeo Capital of Texas because the city hosts more rodeo events than any other in the state.

Today, rodeo participation includes far more than the lonely range cowboy. The Women's Professional Rodeo Association will celebrate its 75th anniversary in 2023. Once thought of as a choice between glam or grit, most women who ride professionally maintain both. They work and ride as hard as any man, looking beautiful doing it. Once considered a shameful

display for women, professional female rodeo riders now command respect, admiration and wide publicity. Women compete, enjoying wonderful careers. Many use their fame for good causes.

Children, both boys and girls, also get involved at young ages. Many compete in mutton busting while between 35 and 55 pounds. Mini-bull riding events also bring in competitive kids, geared to their size and skill-levels. State requirements protect these junior rodeo lovers, especially their heads and faces. Like men and women of rodeo, the youngsters simply love the competitive aspect.

Throughout the years, Texas continued supporting the rise of rodeos. There are many organizations, like the Texas Senior Pro Rodeo Association, created in 1978, Texas Youth Rodeo Association, which caters to families. Texas Iunior and Texas Junior High Rodeo Associations, and more. Anyone interested can find support and information. Many colleges in Texas also offer rodeo teams.

Often coupled with stock shows in Texas, the love of rodeo continues growing. The events provide an opportunity for families to experience something they may never live. A long way from the initial days of cowboys competing on the open range, Texans — both native and transplanted have the chance to experience the thrill of animals and riders doing what they love.

While the sport of rodeo changed over the years, the spirit of competition remained the same. Everyone involved wants to do their best, ride away with bragging rights and perhaps with a little money in their wallets. NOW





Ritz Crock-Pot Chicken

- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- 1 10.5-oz. can low-fat or fat-free chicken soup
- 1 8-oz. container low-fat or fat-free sour cream
- 1 cup cheddar cheese, shredded

- 1 stick butter, melted
- I sleeve reduced-fat Ritz crackers, crushed Brown or wild rice, to taste, cooked according to pkg. instructions

- **2.** In another bowl, mix the butter and crushed crackers; spread on top of the chicken mixture.
- **3.** Cook on low for 6 hours; serve with rice.

Pumpkin Pie

8 oz. cream cheese, softened

1 15-oz. can pumpkin

1/2 cup butter, melted

2 tsp. vanilla

3 eggs

3 1/4 cups powdered sugar

1 tsp. cinnamon

I tsp. pumpkin pie spice

1 tsp. nutmeg

1/4 tsp. salt

I deep dish piecrust Whipped cream, to taste

1. In a mixing bowl, beat the cream cheese for 5 minutes until it's light and fluffy, scraping down the sides with a spatula.

2. Add the pumpkin; mix for an additional 5

minutes. Add the butter and vanilla; mix for 1 minute.

- **3.** Add the eggs, one at a time, mixing after each addition. Add the powdered sugar, cinnamon, pumpkin pie spice, nutmeg and salt; mix well.
- **4.** Preheat the oven to 400 F; pour the filling into the piecrust. Bake for 15 minutes. Lower the temperature to 350 F; bake for an additional 45-48 minutes.
- **5.** Chill in the refrigerator at least 4 hours; top with the whipped cream.

Death by Chocolate

- Devil's food cake mix
 3.9-oz. pkg. instant chocolate pudding mix
 cups milk
 coz. Cool Whip
 HERSHEY'S syrup, to taste
 Mini-chocolate chips, to taste
- **1.** Bake the cake according to the package instructions; let it cool completely. In a big bowl, break half the cake into the bowl.
- **2.** In another bowl, mix the pudding and milk; fold in the Cool Whip.
- **3.** Drizzle chocolate syrup over the crumbled cake; pour half the pudding mixture over the syrup. Sprinkle with chocolate chips; repeat steps 1 and 3.
- **4.** Cover and chill for at least 2 hours.

Chicken Pot Pie

- 1 17.3-oz. pkg. frozen puff pastry, thawed 2 lbs. boneless, skinless chicken breasts, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 tsp. salt (divided use)
- 1 tsp. pepper (divided use)
- 4 Tbsp. butter (divided use)
- I large onion, chopped
- 1 tsp. garlic, minced
- I tsp. Italian seasoning
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 1/2 cups chicken broth
- 1 cup, plus 1 Tbsp. heavy whipping cream (divided use)
- 1 10-oz. pkg. frozen peas and carrots, thawed
- 1 14.5-oz. can diced potatoes, drained 1 large egg yolk
- **1.** Preheat the oven to 400 F. On a lightly floured surface, roll each pastry sheet into a rectangular shape. Cut 1 sheet crosswise into 6 2-inch strips. Cut the remaining sheet lengthwise into 5 2-inch strips. Weave the strips to make a lattice; freeze.
- **2.** In a bowl, toss the chicken with 1/2 tsp. salt and 1/2 tsp. pepper. In a large skillet, heat 1 Tbsp. butter over medium-high heat;







sauté the chicken for 5-7 minutes until browned. Remove the chicken.

- **3.** In the same skillet, heat the remaining butter on medium-high; sauté the onion until it's tender. Stir in the garlic and Italian seasoning; cook for 1 minute.
- **4.** Blend in the flour; cook and stir the mixture for another minute. Gradually stir in the broth and 1 cup cream; bring the mixture to a boil, stirring constantly, for 2 minutes, or until the mixture has thickened.
- **5.** Stir in the vegetables, chicken and remaining salt and pepper. Transfer the filling to a greased baking dish. Top with the latticed pastry; trim to fit.

- **6.** Whisk the egg yolk and remaining cream together; brush over the pastry.
- **7.** Bake, uncovered, for 45-55 minutes until the filling is bubbly and the pastry is golden brown. Let stand for 15 minutes before serving.

Wrapped Green Beans

Cooking spray

- 1 16-oz. pkg. bacon
- 2 14.5-oz. cans French-style green beans, drained
- 6 Tbsp. butter or margarine
- 2 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 cup brown sugar, packed

- **I.** Prepare a casserole dish with cooking spray. Cut the bacon package in half. Using half the bacon, take a handful of green beans; place them in the middle of the bacon. Roll it up tightly; place it in the casserole dish. Repeat the first step until all the green beans are used and in the dish.
- **2.** On the stove top in a pan, melt the butter; add the Worcestershire sauce and brown sugar; stir until the mixture bubbles.
- **3.** Pour the brown sugar mixture over the top of the green bean bundles. Bake at 350 F for 45 minutes. *Hint: To crisp the bacon, turn on the broiler for a few minutes while cooking.*

Soda Crock-Pot Ribs

I-2.5 lbs. boneless pork ribs
I 12-oz. can Coca-Cola, root beer or Dr Pepper
Salt, to taste
Pepper, to taste
Barbecue sauce, to taste

- **I.** Place the ribs in the Crock-Pot; pour the soda over the ribs.
- **2.** Add the salt and pepper; cook on low for 6-8 hours.
- **3.** Pour the soda out; add the barbecue sauce. Cook for an additional 30 minutes.


















Small Town, Big Advent

If you are looking for a weekend getaway that's packed with adventure and full of small-town charm, look no further than Denison, Texas. Just 75 miles north from the heart of Dallas, you'll be in town and checked in before you know it with plenty of time left to explore!

Known as the gateway city, Denison was founded in 1872 in conjunction with the Missouri-Kansas-Texas Railroad and was the entry point of the first non-Texas-based railroad. The historic Katy Depot still stands today and can be reserved for private events and weddings. You can also visit the Red River Railroad Museum one block away at 124 W. Main Street.

Denison is the birthplace of President Dwight D. Eisenhower. He was the only one of David and Ida Eisenhower's seven children born in Texas. David brought his wife and their two young sons, Arthur and Edgar, from Hope, Kansas, in 1889 to pursue a new life in Texas, working on the railroad. His home has been restored and is open to the public for tours.

The home of T.V. Munson, who saved the French Wine Industry from devastation in the 1800s, Denison is rich with

craft beverages that you cannot get at home. Take a stroll through the vineyards at Hidden Hangar Vineyards and Winery. From 1928 until the 1950s, the land the vineyard sits on served as a training airport for "wanna-be" pilots and a fuel stop for those traveling between Oklahoma City and Dallas. The tasting room is open Thursday-Sunday from 12:00-6:00 p.m., where you can sip on varietals such as Riesling, Cabernet Franc, Malbec and Syrah.

For whiskey lovers, Ironroot Republic Distillery is a must. The name "Ironroot" pays tribute to T.V. Munson and the "iron" roots that helped save the French wine industry. The distillery is family-owned and -operated by the Likarish brothers (Robert and Jonathan) along with their mother Marcia, and everything is mashed, fermented, distilled, barrel-aged and bottled on-site in Denison. The spirits are made using high-quality heirloom and non-GMO corn from local farms to capture the authentic flavor of North Texas. The distillery is open for tours every Saturday at noon and 2:00 p.m.

If you like farm-fresh ingredients, check out the Downtown Denison Farmers Market. From farm-fresh eggs, meat, produce and even canned goods, purchase something locally grown and get to know our farmers! You can catch the market Saturdays on the 700 block of Main Street from the beginning

of May through October.

After you've hit up the Farmers Market, take a stroll down Main Street, where you will find antique shops, boutiques, breweries, wineries and restaurants. Peruse the public art displays, galleries and studios and even create a masterpiece of your own to take with you. And in the summer, you can enjoy Music On Main, the 10-week free summer concert series on Friday nights.

For the outdoor lovers, Denison is surrounded by picturesque parks, trails and natural beauty. From biking around Waterloo Lake, to camping at Eisenhower State Park or striper fishing on Lake Texoma, you're sure to relax, unplug and unwind.






