



HONORING LOCAL LEGENDS

A toddler snuggles up to the two children sitting on the bench with book in hand. Mom is kneeling not far away with her cell phone ready to catch the moment in a photograph. This beautiful scene is often repeated as families enjoy the Corsicana Public Library and stop to interact with the statue. The Corsicana Kiwanis Club gifted the city with the bronze statue of two children seated on a small bench to encourage young people to become lifetime readers. This is one of now 18 statues, with three more in the works, that grace Corsicana's landscape and street corners. "All the statues carry a legacy," Parks and Recreation Director Sharla Allen said.

"Visitors to our city love the bronze statue tour," Amy Tidwell, Main Street director, added. "The statues are an example of heritage tourism." The tour can be accessed through Main Street's website and played on one's cell phone. "The statues are located all over town from the airport to the college," Amy said. "It's

a great way to get visitors to explore Corsicana and not stay just downtown."

The process, from idea to a statue's unveiling and dedication ceremony, usually takes a number of years. "People come in wanting to honor a point in the city's history, a friend or family member," Sharla explained. "A committee meets once a year to consider ideas and proposed locations. "Each statue costs approximately \$40,000-\$60,000 and is totally funded by the family, friends or through fundraisers," Sharla added. "The expense is a commitment, since it takes usually about two years to raise the money. Just to make the bust and small mock-up statue costs about \$2,500."

The people proposing the statue usually select the artists and commission the work, but City Manager Connie Standridge found the first artist. Lisa Perry, known for her Bronze



Horses, has sculpted several of the statues. Cane Morrow and local artist. Nancy Rebal, have also contributed their talents, along with J. Payne Lara, Tim Harmon, Doug and Sandra McDonald, Buck Main and Spencer Evans. "The artist usually meets with the family and/or friends to get suggestions of the little things that were important to the person to be honored, such as the Masonic ring worn by Brent Thompson or Dr. Kent Rogers whose statue features his stethoscope around his neck," Sharla said. "The artists must get a feeling for the person or historical significance involved and does so through several meetings with the family and/or friends. They first create the bust and the small mock-up. Once that's approved, then the remainder of the statue is created and approved." The artists are usually the ones who

suggest the company that will do the bronze casting.

Each statue receives an unveiling and dedication ceremony, which is open to the public with special seating for the family and/or friends involved, some of whom add their remarks and memories to the eventful day. Memories and stories are shared during the event, such as those shared by Jackson High School alumni dressed in their school's letter jackets and colors at the unveiling and dedication of G.W. Jackson's statue.

To date, Dr. Rogers is the only honored person who personally participated in the planning stages of his statue prior to his untimely death due to contracting COVID-19 while treating patients. "Working with Dr. Rogers is a memory I cherish," Sharla said. "Another memory was the selection of what longtime baker to use to represent Collin Street Bakery." Jerry Grimmett, who was a baker at the famed bakery for over 60 years, was the chosen figure. Other statues honor Corsicana's history through generic representation. The Cadet Memorial, representative of the 90,000 cadets who trained at what is



now C. David Campbell Field during WWII; oil field workers; farmers; and the Navarro College Native American fit in this category.

Only one statue, so far, represents an animal — the wolf, Kaiser, for whom Wolf Brand Chili was named by its Corsicana creator, Lyman Davis. The statue occupies the corner on which Lyman sold his chili in 1895 from the back of a wagon parked by a saloon. Wesley Green's statue stands appropriately on the corner where he and his wife, Lucille, operated their western wear store for many years.

Sharla, whose department oversees and maintains the statues, is a Dawson, Texas, native. She attended Navarro

College and Texas A&M University and has been employed by the city of Corsicana for 29 years. "I love the people here," she said. "They're appreciative and proud of their community. We know our neighbors, and I love everything about my job. It's great to see kids playing outside in the parks, hosting all our summer events and helping with downtown events year-round." In addition to the 18 statues, the Parks and Recreation Department manages 20 parks, city owned buildings, two lakes, two downtown pocket parks and the Stuart J. Beebe Athletic Complex.

A Corsicana native, Amy left town to attend college but returned to raise her family. "Sharla and I are both passionate about seeing Corsicana grow. Our partnership and teamwork just help that growth."

"The city is honored to have the bronze statues and their legacy," Sharla concluded. "They're part of the Parks and Recreation Department's goal to provide this community with a diversified program to meet recreational, educational and leisure needs." NOW





Best Chocolate Cake

Butter, flour or nonstick cooking spray for pan preparation

- 1 box Duncan Hines Chocolate Fudge Cake Mix
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 1/2 cups cold coffee

- 1/4 cup vegetable oil
- 1/2 stick butter, melted
- 3 eggs
- 1 8-oz. pkg. cream cheese
- 1 Tbsp. vanilla
- **I.** Preheat the oven to 335 F; prepare 2 8-inch round cake pans with butter and flour or nonstick cooking spray.

- **2.** Into the bowl of a stand mixer with a paddle attachment, add all the dry ingredients. Add the remaining ingredients; mix on low for 1 minute. Stop; scrape the bowl. Mix on medium for an additional 2 minutes.
- **3.** Pour the batter into the prepared cake pans; bake for 30-35 minutes until a toothpick comes out of the center with just a few sticky crumbs clinging.
- **4.** Let the cakes cool a few minutes in the pan before putting them onto a cooling rack; let cool before frosting.

Simple Buttercream Frosting

- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, room temperature
- 1/2 cup vegetable shortening
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 5 cups confectioners' sugar, sifted
- 2-6 Tbsp. milk
- 3-10 drops food coloring (optional)
- **1.** In the bowl of a stand mixer with a paddle attachment, cream the butter until it's smooth and fluffy. Add the vegetable

shortening and vanilla; mix again.

- 2. Gradually beat in the confectioners' sugar until it's fully incorporated; add the milk slowly to gain the desired consistency. Add the food coloring; mix well.
- **3.** Frost the cake after it has cooled.

Cake Balls

- I baked cake, any flavor
- 1 20-oz. pkg. chocolate or vanilla almond bark

Popsicle or lollipop sticks Waxed paper and/or Styrofoam block

- 1. Prepare the cake according to the recipe or box instructions; cool fully.
- 2. In a large bowl, crumble the cake by hand; knead the crumbs together like dough.
- **3.** Scoop out about 2 Tbsp. of the dough; ball it up. Repeat to make all balls; place them on a cookie sheet. Refrigerate.
- **4.** While the balls are chilling; place the almond bark in a bowl. Microwave the bark for about 30 seconds at a time; stir in between until melted. Pour the melted bark into a Solo cup or water glass.
- 5. Dip about 1-inch of each stick into the melted almond bark; place that end into a cake ball. Note: 5-10 balls can be worked at a time. After the sticks have been inserted, dip each cake ball into the bark; tap to remove excess bark.
- 6. Balls may be placed on a piece of waxed paper to dry, or the sticks can be placed into a Styrofoam block to dry if a perfectly rounded ball is desired.









