

Disc golf. "It's a sport that you can play relatively cheap, and it's for any age," said Barry Noggle, board member of Weatherford Disc Golf Club-The Parker County Projectile Pilots. "It's good exercise."

Disc golf can be played by individuals or as a group and is similar to golf in that players must throw a disc from a tee area into a "hole," which is a chain basket attached to a pole. Each hole has a par depending on distance and difficulty. "Most courses in Texas are going to be par 3, but with the kids nowadays, how far they can throw and the technology changing with discs, you need a par 4 and par 5 for it to be competitive," said Cheyne Wedgeworth, board member of Weatherford DGC-The Parker County Projectile Pilots.

The discs are similar to a Frisbee. Several types are available: a putt for use within 30 to 50 feet; a midrange with a beveled edge used for holes within 200 feet; and the more aerodynamic driver for use up to 500 feet. Disc costs vary, but most players can purchase one for \$15 or less. "You can go out and spend \$30 and go play and have a great time," Barry said. "You just get out there, and you don't think about your day, your job. Everything kind of leaves your mind, and it's just about that next shot."



Barry was introduced to the sport while playing Frisbee golf with a buddy in Austin four decades ago. "We didn't even know what disc golf was." They were attempting to hit specific trees in their neighborhood when a neighbor informed them about a disc golf course at Bartholomew District Park. Barry was hooked. "People, when they start, they either don't get it, or they're just completely all in," he said. "And those people within three months have 50 discs, and they're ready to play all the time."

Every Wednesday evening at 6:30 and Saturday morning at 9:00, players gather at the Weatherford Disc Golf Course on Lake Weatherford for mini disc golf tournaments hosted by The Parker County Projectile Pilots. Kevin Morgan, board member, runs the Wednesday minis, and Barry runs the Saturday tournaments. Todd Pool, who also serves on the board, assists as needed. The mini schedules are listed on a disc golf app called UDisc, and according to stats on the app, nearly 1,200 players from 31 states and several countries as distant as Sweden visited the course throughout 2023. The club's minis program is the second longest running mini disc golf tournament in the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex behind Fritz Park Disc Golf Course in Irving.

The popularity of the Weatherford course has grown over the years, just as its footprint has grown. The course on the southern edge of Lake Weatherford opened as a nine-hole course in the early 2000s. Brian Mace was instrumental in founding the Weatherford Disc Golf Club, and in the mid-2000s, Dave Emrick started once-a-week

mini disc golf tournaments. With the money raised from the minis, another nine holes were added to create an 18-hole disc golf course on the lake, which now includes two par 4 and one par 5 hole. Barry and Cheyne became members and developed the board in 2009. They have been avid supporters of the course and the sport ever since.

The free disc golf course on the lake has undergone renovations over the past several years as part of the city of Weatherford's master plan. City funding added a brick-and-mortar bathroom. a nearby pavilion and a paved parking lot. Funds from the minis updated the 20-year-old baskets. "We basically do everything down there," Barry said. "They give us free rein." The club's funding also provides new tee pads and other course upkeep, and volunteers pick up litter and build pedestrian bridges including several constructed by local Boy Scout troops and an Eagle Scout. Although the city does not provide funding, city employees fix any bathroom issues, mow the grass and remove downed trees. The city plans to add a kiosk with a course map and tee signage.

The city has offered the land across from the current course to add another 18-hole course. However, the club cannot gain access to the property due to a fence, and they do not have the equipment or the manpower to build an additional bridge or mow the second course.

Weatherford DGC-The Parker County Projectile Pilots has about 100 members, and non-members are encouraged to play in the mini disc golf tournaments. Disc golfers can compete



in three categories: Open Player, for more experienced disc golfers; Advanced; and Recreational, for players who are learning the sport. One dollar from the mini tournament fee goes into the Ace Pot, which is paid out to players who get a hole-in-one, while \$2 goes toward course upkeep. The remaining funds are paid out to the top players.

Disc golf is not just a recreational sport. Students can play at college, and the professional circuit offers highpaying tournaments. Mini tournaments typically last about two hours for 18 holes. At the disc golf course on Lake Weatherford, minis are primarily played according to Professional Disc Golf Association rules. However, they are not as strict as sanctioned tournaments, which require players to wear disc golf attire and close-toed shoes. "In our minis, it's just a bunch of guys and girls getting together to hang out and play," Chevne said.

The course at Lake Weatherford often changes as volunteers move baskets to one of four locations at each hole. Barry and Cheyne said they are always on the hunt for volunteers to serve on the board and to help take care of the course. "We're hanging on because we don't want to see our park go to waste," Cheyne said.

The current course is full of mature trees, hills and shrubbery for challenging play. The Weatherford course also features covered picnic areas and grills for a fun afternoon with family and friends, "It drains fast and well. We have a lot of beautiful oak trees," Cheyne said. "My favorite part is it's shaded during the summer." NOW



Once considered an event only for the mom-to-be and her close female friends and relatives, these days, couples' baby showers are becoming more popular. The choice of whether to go with a more traditional shower or to open it up to everyone is strictly up to the expectant parents. But if you have older children, an inclusive shower might be an excellent way to help them get excited and feel involved as they await the arrival of their new sibling. So, how do you throw a baby shower that everyone in the family will enjoy?

Of course, the focus of any baby shower will be the gifts for the new little one. The baby bottle chugging game brings a lot of laughs and is another game that both adults and children can enjoy. Fill several baby bottles with juice, milk, Kool-Aid, etc. Whoever finishes drinking their bottle first is the winner!

Melodies from songbirds fill the air in the springtime. Locals can spot colorful birds flying through area neighborhoods as they begin to nest. These birds are often in search of food, water and shelter, and Wild Bird Outfitters in Weatherford offers area residents products to create the perfect wild bird habitat.

Debbie Newkirk, owner of Wild Bird Outfitters, has been helping locals with all their bird-related needs since April 2016. "The inspiration was my mom," Debbie shared. "She

just loved the birds." Debbie originally opened the store as Wild Bird Center, but the location separated from the franchise and rebranded in 2022 as Wild Bird Outfitters. "We focus on everything for wild bird feeding and wild bird watching — anything you need to set up your yard to bring in wild birds."

Bird houses, bat houses, owl houses and even shelters for squirrels are available. Debbie suggests installing the bird house on a pole with a baffle instead of in a tree to protect the birds from predators. Several pole systems are available.

Bird baths are also offered for purchase, as well as heaters to unfreeze the water in the winter. Even in colder months, birds need water for drinking and to bathe in to keep feathers clean for insulation.

Feeders to attract specific types of birds are available. "Some birds like to sit on feeders, and some like to feed on the ground, so you need a mixed habitat," Debbie explained. The habitat might include low-growing shrubs for ground feeders to use as cover, as well as mid-size bushes and trees. To protect the food from other animals, squirrel guards

and racoon baffles are available for installation on the feeders.

Not all wild birds eat seed. If they do, Wild Bird Outfitters staff members can inform customers about options based on the type of bird. Live and dried mealworms, as well as suet, a beef lard that includes protein for energy, are stocked. The food available at Wild Bird Outfitters is fresh and does not include fillers in the seed mixes. "Fillers are used in many of the bags sold by the bigbox stores to keep the cost of the bag down but add no value for the birds or the customer," she revealed. "All of the seeds that are in our bags are actually the seeds that the birds eat."

Hummingbird feeders are a popular option. "You want to make sure you do not use the red dye food because the red dye builds up in their system, and it will shorten their life span," Debbie explained. "Most importantly, you need to change your sugar water every three days over 90-degrees because it will grow bacteria on their tongue when it gets old, and that bacteria will kill them."

Some of the more common birds in the local area include cardinals, blue jays, bluebirds, titmice and chickadees. Oftentimes, customers will bring in photographs for identification and suggestions on feeders and food to provide. "We have the best customers." Debbie shared. "All of our customers are so happy when they come into the store. They're just wanting something for their little birds."

Debbie occasionally holds presentations for local organizations and at the store to discuss wild bird habitats. Due to declining habitats, she said it is important to subsidize wild birds' food. "By making your backyard a bird-welcoming sanctuary, each one of us contributes to replacing this lost habitat. Birds are just happy if they have some bushes, some trees, some food and some water." NOW







Frankie Manley Andrew enjoys entertaining small gatherings. "I do a poll to make sure my guests like what I plan to make." However, some of her cooking experiments have not gone as anticipated — garlic and raspberry dressing marinated catfish, for example. "We had a big laugh and cooked scrambled eggs."

All types of recipes are in Frankie's wheelhouse, including down-home and gourmet cooking, as well as baking. She concentrates on what tastes good and often adapts new recipes by adding a little more butter and less sugar. She is not concerned with low-fat dishes. "It's better to limit serving size," she said.

In her free time, she fosters German Shepherds for rescue groups and attends estate sales. "It's so interesting to see a family's history in the items sold. Also, there are many good bargains." NOW

- **1.** Cut each egg in half, lengthwise. Add the yolks to a mixing bowl; set aside the egg whites.
