Corsicana Fire Department Chief Paul Henley's beaming smile and enthusiastic energy can ignite people. (Yes, the pun is intended!) He enjoys making presentations to groups on subjects about which he is passionate, such as public safety, and many folks still remember his performance during Navarro College's Dancing for Our Stars! However, Chief Henley is all business when it comes to the community's safety, no matter what the threat is — even when it's a pandemic.

As part of the Navarro County Emergency Management team, Chief Henley shared, "Eric Myers and his team are so professional and dedicated. Our COVID-19 numbers in Navarro County stayed low for many months due to those efforts. However, our biggest challenge, which we're still overcoming, is the loss of our friend, Dr. Kent Rogers."

The department and Chief Henley drew the assignment to organize and operate the county's COVID-19 vaccination hub efforts. Protocols and training were in place to handle the normal disasters that occur, but COVID threw out new challenges to emergency responders. "Normally, a disaster hits with a small part of the community affected. We mitigate and recover. However, the depth and reach of this pandemic is vast. It has affected everyone," Chief Henley said. "This pandemic has made us re-write our script."

The re-write has been a success. Chief Henley cites again the team effort made. "Volunteers contributed to the success of the vaccination efforts." Volunteers included CISD administration, police and nurses; the Navarro College nursing and EMS programs; Navarro County CERT; Texas A&M Agriculture Extension Agency; Hometown Pharmacy; Navarro County VFDs and CPD; the county health department; NCOEM; the city of Corsicana; volunteer nurses; and the I.O.O.F. Event Center. "Logistical support was given by Energy Transfer, Affordable Affairs Catering, call center volunteers and many local churches and businesses," Chief Henley added. "The vaccination effort was truly a communitywide success story. When we come together for a common cause, we're unstoppable."

While the vaccinations were ongoing, Chief Henley was still overseeing the usual operation of the fire department. He became Corsicana's chief three years ago and has 19 years in the fire service having served and risen to the rank of captain in the Garland FD and then to the rank of battalion chief in the Frisco FD. However, he got a later than usual start in fire service. "I was 34 years old when I found myself looking for a new career. I had a son on the way at that time and wanted to show him that one can have fulfillment in public service," he explained.

"You must have a servant's heart," Chief Henley added. He acknowledged that the work is rewarding, not from a getting rich point, but by becoming rich from an emotional and spiritual perspective. "I try to create an environment of autonomy and decentralized decision-making that empowers our employees to succeed, and I try to build a family atmosphere within our fire department," he explained. "We need people who want to make a difference in the lives of others and are committed to the mission of serving the needs of the public."

The CFD will take candidates who have a paramedic license only certification or candidates who are licensed as a structural firefighter by the Texas Commission on Fire Protection and hold a Department of State Health Services EMT license. Background checks are mandatory. Recruitment is constant since personnel are attracted to the Metroplex due to salary and location. "I would advise anyone interested in becoming a public servant to think about decisions and temptations they are faced with and try to make the right choices," Chief Henley suggested. "We're a civil service department that ensures equity in hiring, but bad decisions involving drugs, alcohol, poor work habits and unethical conduct eliminate many from the hiring process."

Appreciative Corsicana citizens nominated Chief Henley for a state award, which resulted in him being recognized as Fire Chief of the Year by the Texas Fire Chiefs Association, where he serves as second vice president on the executive board and works to





share information within the Texas Fire Service. He holds a master's in fire and emergency management administration from Oklahoma State University, a B.S. from The University of Texas at Arlington and an AAS degree as fire officer from Collin College. Chief Henley is certified/ licensed as a paramedic, life safety educator, fire officer, incident safety officer, master firefighter, master instructor, advanced fire investigator, advanced fire inspector and plans examiner.

Firefighting is a dangerous and challenging profession. "I'm excited to tackle those challenges every day," Chief Henley said. He also finds time to serve on the Boys & Girls Club of Navarro County's executive board and the county's United Way executive board.


A native of Shreveport, Louisiana, Chief Henley married his high school sweetheart, Kathleen "Kathy," and moved to the DFW Metroplex. "Most of my family are still in Shreveport, and my wife's family is in the Metroplex. He works out frequently, and in his spare time, he likes to spend time with his 4-year-old grandson and "tinker" on a 1966 Mustang. "My escape is my family," he said.

With the move to a new main fire station completed, the Chief's vision now includes a Safety Village to be used by the city and county's school kids. "I want a central location to train kids on public issues, such as bicycle and pedestrian safety, fire dangers, medical first response, severe weather awareness, etc.," he stated. Using his experience gained over an awardwinning career, including this past year's challenges with a pandemic and Winter Storm Uri added to the mix, the Chief knows how to accomplish his goal. "This will take a communitywide effort to make it come to fruition. I'm excited to share this vision." NOW
















Family get-togethers, block parties and the small, hometown feeling are part of the memories Burke Zack formed while growing up in Corsicana. He returns to the area occasionally for more of the same, visits with family and friends and to preach and perform musically. "To this day, I can come to Corsicana and run into someone I know." Burke said.

The son of longtime Corsicana residents, Pete and Kathryn Zack, Burke now pastors at Church of His Presence in Daphne, Alabama, founded and led by Pastor John Kilpatrick, who is a mentor to Burke. "I love pastoring people of all ages, backgrounds and ethnicities," Burke explained. "I still write music and am always thinking up new ideas."

In preparation for a life in the ministry, Burke earned a bachelor's degree from Savannah College of Art and Design and a master's degree in pastoral and family ministry studies from Lee University. He pastored in Nashville, Tennessee; Red Bay, Alabama; and Golden, Mississippi, during the 10 years prior to coming to Daphne. Burke also served in prison ministries in both Savannah, Georgia, and Nashville, Tennessee.

Mentors who have brought him to this point in his life include family, leaders from all walks of life and pastors. "I have always put myself with men and women who are more experienced than me, looking to glean from them," Burke said. He has a network of mentors he knows he can call on for help in any situation he's facing. "You need people who will tell you the truth, even when it's not what you want to hear, and men and women who can comfort you when you are down and pick you up when you fall." School prepared him well, but Burke added, "I am continually reading and always looking for ways to educate myself and grow."

Burke has put music on a back burner while growing in the

ministry, but he is open to co-producing an album in the future. "As far as doing everything myself, I do not have the time and energy," he said. His music can be viewed on YouTube.


One other big, happy change occurred in his personal life recently. "On December 21, 2019, I married my lovely wife, Trinity Elizabeth Zack, in Point Clear, Alabama. We met a year earlier in Nashville, and her family and I connected immediately," he recalled. "I had a weekend off from preaching in Red Bay. We met through my pastor in Nashville, whom she and her family from Scottsdale, Arizona, were visiting." Since then, her family moved to Alabama and have become part of the church. "I'm not sure anyone anticipated that we would be married, but God still works in mysterious ways. We both enjoy the ministry, hiking, trying new foods and exploring new places." In his little spare time, Burke prefers physical activities, such as lifting weights and running.

Ministry opportunities for Burke include hospital visits, conducting weddings and funerals, ministering to the youth and time spent in prayer. "Life in Daphne, called 'The Jubilee City,' is fantastic!" Burke said. "The people are friendly. The atmosphere is peaceful, and the weather is warm year-round. I spend much of my time mentoring young people and planning what's next in the church." As with all folks during these COVID-19 days, life has become more challenging in the ministry and with performing music, but these challenges have also opened opportunities to deliver messages in different ways.







The drive is short and scenic. The destination is restful and rewarding. A vintage country cottage with its broad, welcoming porch set with bright turquoise chairs greets visitors. Stroll among the brightly colored metal art, whirly gigs, pottery, windchimes and wooden signs and birdhouses. Shop inside, and then sit a spell. "Come out to the country ... it's cheaper in the country" is Turquoise Armadillo's slogan. "First of all, the sales tax is lower," Cheryl Pratt, the shop's owner, explained.

"Our overhead is low out here, so we can keep our prices low as well. We are a hidden treasure."

"Sometimes, we just need to have things that make us feel good," Cheryl added. "If you don't find what you want, tell me. I'll go look for it. I enjoy shopping and having a reason to seek and find unique items. I tell people I feel if you come out to the middle of nowhere to shop, I need to give you choices. And there are choices." Many items are reflective of area fans' support of local, college and professional sports teams, as well as rodeo, western and holiday themes. Cheryl's excursions take her on travels far and wide as shown in the boutique's interior offerings of infant, children and ladies' boutique items; crosses; stuffed animals; planters; glassware and kitchenware; candles; signs of all sizes and entertaining sayings; teas; and Mexican vanilla. "I carry infant- to plus-size clothing along with hats, socks, jewelry and purses," Cheryl said.

A Frost native, Cheryl now enjoys getting to know the area people. She recently retired from Corsicana ISD, following a teaching career that began after she graduated from Stephen F. Austin State University. During her career, she also taught in Kilgore and Kerens ISDs. "I missed the social aspect of teaching — watching families grow and meeting local folks, former students and colleagues," she revealed. "I had toyed with the idea of having a gift shop for years. I loved being retired but not becoming a hermit. There was a cute little house that was going to be bulldozed down the road. My husband, Mark, and I arranged to have it moved to our property." The couple invested in remodeling the home into the shop it is today. A nearby barn holds more outdoor art items Cheryl has collected from her shopping travels.

Fulfilling her dream, Cheryl opened Turquoise Armadillo in November 2019. "Even with COVID-19, my business has thrived," she said. When not cooking for herself and her husband, Mike Dunavant, Judy Johnson Dunavant can often be found cooking while camping with friends. "I enjoy Dutch-oven cooking and using charcoal on the top and beneath the oven to maintain the correct temperature," she explained.

Self-taught to cook from elementary age, Judy first tried Dutch-oven cooking while kayak camping with friends at Caddo Lake. She entered a Dutch-oven sanctioned cooking contest. "I did some quick research, found a recipe on the Internet, bought a Dutch oven and off we went," she recalled. "I made baked apples and won third place! I find recipes from the Internet, friends and NOW Magazines." Retired from having been Mildred ISD's technology director, this Paris, Texas, native enjoys camping, hiking, birding and reading.

Dutch Oven Baked Apples

Cooking oil or spray 6 Granny Smith apples

2 cups brown sugar

3 tsp. cinnamon

2 tsp. nutmeg

1/4 cup sugar

3/4 cup butter

6 oz. orange juice

- **I.** Fire up a chimney of charcoal; prepare a 10-inch camp Dutch oven by spreading a light coat of cooking oil or spray around the bottom and sides of the oven.
- **2.** Core the apples and clean out all the

seeds; peel each apple about 1/2-inch down.

- **3.** In a bowl, mix the brown sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg and sugar.
- **4.** Place the apples in the Dutch oven, creating a circle on the oven's outer edge. Fill the center of each apple with the brown sugar mixture until full; top each apple with a butter pat.
- **5.** Pour the orange juice over the apples; cover with the lid.
- **6.** Place the Dutch oven on 8 hot coals; top the Dutch oven with 16 more hot coals placed in a checkerboard pattern. Bake for 35 minutes, or until the apples start to soften.

Dutch Oven Chili Taco Pie

2 lbs. ground beef

2 medium onions, chopped

1 Tbsp. butter

1 15-oz. can kidney or pinto beans

1 8-oz. can tomato sauce

2 1-oz. pkgs. taco seasoning mix

1/2 tsp. salt

2 6-oz. pkgs. cornbread mix

- **1.** Heat 18 coals; brown the beef and onions in the butter in an open 12-inch Dutch oven.
- **2.** Add the beans, tomato sauce, taco seasoning and salt; cover.
- **3.** Place the Dutch oven on 8 coals; top with 10 coals. Cook for 15-20 minutes.
- **4.** Mix the cornbread according to the package directions; add the batter to the meat mixture. Replace the oven's lid; cook for 20-30 additional minutes until the combread is done.

Mountain Man Breakfast

Makes 6-8 servings.

- 2 lbs. mild pork sausage, crumbled 1 onion, chopped (optional)
- 2 lbs. frozen, shredded hash brown potatoes

8 eggs
Salt, to taste
Pepper, to taste
1 4-oz. can green chilies (optional)
2 cups cheddar cheese, grated

- **1.** Preheat a 12-inch Dutch oven over a full bed of hot coals. Fry the sausage and onions together; remove. Drain on paper towels.
- **2.** Using the remaining sausage drippings, brown the potatoes; spread the potatoes evenly over the Dutch oven's bottom.
- **3.** Place the cooked sausage mixture over the potatoes. In a bowl, beat the eggs, adding the salt and pepper; add the chilies.
- **4.** Pour the egg mixture over the sausage layer; top with the cheese.
- **5.** Place 8 coals underneath the Dutch oven and 16 hot coals over the lid; cook for 20-25 minutes, rotating the lid 1/4 turn every 5 minutes, until the eggs are cooked.

French Toast Casserole


Makes 6-8 servings.

- 1 large loaf of French bread, torn into 1/2-inch chunks
- 8 eggs, beaten
- 3 cups milk
- 4 Tbsp. sugar
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 3/4 tsp. salt
- I tsp. vanilla
- 4 Tbsp. butter, cut into small pieces
- **I.** Preheat a 12-inch Dutch oven over hot coals. Put bread chunks into the Dutch oven; beat together all the remaining ingredients, except the butter.
- **2.** Pour the mixture over the bread; dot with butter.
- **3.** Place 9 coals on the oven's bottom and 15 coals on the lid's top. Bake (approximately at 350 F), rotating the lid 1/4-inch every 15 minutes, for 30-45 minutes, or until the eggs are set.

Easy Dutch Oven Cobbler

- 2 21-oz. cans fruit pie filling I box white or yellow cake mix Cinnamon, to taste
- 1/2 cup butter or margarine, cut into equally sized pieces
- 25 or more charcoal briquettes
- **1.** Preheat a 12-inch Dutch oven over approximately 8 charcoal briquettes or coals. Add the pie filling; evenly spread the dry cake mix over the pie filling.
- **2.** Sprinkle the mixture with cinnamon; top with the butter.
- **3.** Cover; arrange 16 hot charcoal briquettes





or coals in a checkerboard pattern on the lid's top.

4. Bake, rotating the oven 1/4 turn every 15 minutes, for approximately 45 minutes.

Herbed Skillet Chicken

- l lb. white mushrooms, halved
- I small red onion, cut into 8 wedges
- 2 Tbsp. olive oil
- 1 tsp. fresh thyme leaves
- 4 chicken leg quarters

1 tsp. salt 1/2 tsp. pepper

- **I.** In a 12-inch Dutch oven, stir together the first 4 ingredients. Top with the chicken; sprinkle with salt and pepper.
- **2.** Cover with the lid; place the Dutch oven over 12 hot charcoal briquettes. Cover the lid with 22 hot briquettes (450 F). Bake, rotating the oven 1/4 turn clockwise and the lid 1/4 turn counterclockwise every 15 minutes, for 35-40 minutes.

Dutch Oven Potatoes

Use a 12-inch Dutch oven and 36 hot coals.

6 slices of bacon
1 onion, diced
10-12 large potatoes, sliced
1 4-oz. can diced green chilies or green bell peppers
1/2 cup water
Salt, to taste
Pepper, to taste
2 cups cheddar cheese, shredded or grated

- **I.** In a preheated Dutch oven over 18 coals, cook the bacon; remove from the heat. Crumble the bacon.
- **2.** Add the onion to the bacon grease; cook over coals until the onion is translucent.
- **3.** Add the bacon crumbles, potatoes, chilies or bell peppers and water; season with salt and pepper. Cover; bake with the coals underneath and 18 coals on the lid for 25 minutes.
- **4.** Remove the lid; turn the potatoes over; recover; cook for 20-25 minutes more.
- **5.** Remove the oven from the heat and the coals from the lid. Put cheese over the potatoes; replace the lid for 5 minutes while the cheese melts.
