The sport of drag racing — two cars racing side by side to a designated stopping point — is thought to have originated in the dry lakebeds of Southern California in the 1930s. Today, two local teens are carrying on a family tradition in the sport.

Sister-brother duo, Maddy and Carter Poplawski, became interested in drag racing several years ago. "In 2016, when I was almost 8 years old, I attended a drag racing event in Memphis to watch my uncle race his Super Comp Dragster. At that time, I didn't know what junior dragsters were, but I knew I liked race cars," Carter, now 14, said.

Carter's parents invested in a used dragster for him in 2019, a McPhantom chassis with an 8.90 McGee engine, which he raced in the 2020 and 2021 seasons. "During 2021, we ordered my current car, a 2022 Half Scale Swing Arm Junior Dragster. The swing arm means my car has a shock built into it, which can help with reaction time."

Maddy, now 16, joined the sport in a used Half Scale Extreme Junior Dragster. "Our grandfather raced for many years, and that evolved into his son (my uncle), Carter, me and three of his other grandchildren getting into the sport," Maddy noted. "I'm proud all our cars carry our grandfather's signature, which was incorporated into our Freeman Racing logo."

Despite racing being in their blood, there was a learning curve. "When I first started, there were drivers I couldn't seem to beat. I had to overcome worrying about who was in the lane next to me and just focus on what I have learned and the tools that I have come to rely on while racing," Carter recalled.

With practice came confidence. "It's critical to know why I lost a race. Understanding this has helped me to improve. Watching videos of other racers also taught me a lot of good strategy," Carter continued.

A lighted system known as a Christmas tree — a column of seven lights for each driver or lane — is a common way drag races are started today. Carter and Maddy have a practice tree they use to improve reaction time. "We also have a handheld one we take with us to practice whenever we have time and in between rounds at the track," Maddy explained.

No matter how much they practice, every race is different. "During one particular race, I got on the brakes too hard and locked up the rear wheels. This made my tires slide and lose air, but I was able to keep the car from hitting any of the side walls or my competitor," Carter recalled.

Maddie had a close call, too. "I had a hard time stopping and was afraid of running off the end of the track. Very quickly, I decided to shut my car off to help slow it down, and I had to be cautious getting off the track, hoping I had slowed it down enough to make the turn. My dad determined the brake rotor bolts were coming loose, keeping the brakes from being effective."

With their crew chief dad, Francis, and hype squad mom, Melinda, behind them, Carter and Maddy continue to grow in and out of the sport. In 2021, just his second year of racing, Carter won the 10-12 Year Old Age Group category Championship of the SouthWest Junior Dragster Series (SWJDS) and was also the Junior Mod Track Champion for Xtreme Raceway Park. In 2022, he won three championships: The SouthWest Junior Dragster Series: 12-17 Year Old Age Group category, Bracket 330 category and the All Run Big Money category. He was also named the coveted Driver of The Year for the SWJDS 2022 season.

While Maddy, who will begin her senior year this fall, has proven to be a tough competitor on the track, she also concentrates on keeping her grades up and was a manager for the JV dance team at MHS this past school year. "I danced in middle school, and my freshman year of high school, I was selected to be one of five dance team officers my sophomore year. I made the tough decision to not try out my junior year, because a lot of the dance responsibilities and the racing schedule conflicted."

Maddy finds racing exciting and therapeutic. "I feel a rush of adrenaline and a great deal of competitiveness. Racing takes my mind off of everything else," she admitted. "Not to mention there's a lot of cute boys that I've met through the sport."





Carter, a freshman at Texas Connections Academy, said he no longer feels anxious while racing because he has a routine he trusts. He hopes to one day be an International Hot Rod Association World Champion and an Original Million Dollar Race winner, followed by a career in an automotive trade.

Maddy hopes to earn a degree in the medical field, then come back to racing. "By this time, I would go into what is considered a big car, rather than like the junior dragster I'm driving now," she noted.

The Poplawskis both credit racing with increasing their self-confidence on and off the track. "When I first started, there were older kids I looked up to and learned racing tactics from. Now I feel like there are younger kids who look up to me," Carter stated.

Aside from racing, Maddy likes to shop, watch scary movies and hang out with friends. Carter is the family cook, preparing most of their dinners, and has recently taken up CrossFit.

Both are happy to be able to share this sport with their family as they follow in their grandfather's footsteps. They appreciate the support of the SouthWest Junior Dragster Series, Xtreme Raceway Park, I-30 Dragway and other Jr. Drag Racing programs as well as DragChamp, a racing website. "We would also like to thank Lone Star Acre Painting, a local painting company that sponsors us," Maddy credited.

Carter also credits drag racing as a supportive community. "Racing is a highly competitive sport. But, after the competition is over, hanging out with race friends is like one big family," he said. "For the most part, everyone is willing to help you out with whatever you need." NOW



In 1999, citizens in Midlothian approved a ½-cent sales tax to create the Texas Type B corporation, known as Midlothian Community Development Corporation (MCDC). Since then, MCDC has funded grant requests for more than 100 projects, ranging from small to large. Appointed by City Council, MCDC's seven-member board administers this sales tax. Projects chosen must positively affect the quality of life for citizens and contribute to the local economy. Funds must be used exclusively for qualified development projects that have been authorized by state statute, including parks, roads, auditoriums, open space and other related improvements.

Creek Bend Disc Golf Course opens to the community

In 2022, MCDC funded construction of Creek Bend Disc Golf Course, which is located on the grounds of First Baptist Church at 1651 S. Midlothian Parkway. "The church's proposal fit MCDC's desire to create a disc golf course in the city, and we felt that First Baptist would be a good community partner," said Alyn Nix, MCDC president. The 18-hole course opened January 1 of this year and features nine disc baskets. Golfers have their choice of two tee boxes. Creek Bend Course is free and open to the public, except during church services on Sunday mornings and Wednesday afternoon and evenings. 

- 2. Bake at 350 F for 55-60 minutes.

Rice and Sausage Casserole

- 2 lbs. sausage, cooked (I recommend Owens or Jimmy Dean brands.)
- I cup celery, chopped
- 1 cup bell pepper, chopped
- I cup onion, chopped
- 1 10.5-oz. can cream of chicken or cream of mushroom soup

- 1 10.5-oz. can chicken and rice soup
- I cup raw rice
- 1 cup water
- 1 16-oz. box Velveeta cheese
- **1.** Cook the sausage, celery, bell pepper and onions in a skillet until the redness is gone from the sausage. Add the next 4 ingredients. Cover; cook in an oven at 350 F until done, about 1 hour.
- 2. Uncover; spread with the Velveeta cheese. Return to the oven until the cheese melts. Serve hot.

Brenda's Chess Cake

- I box yellow or white cake mix
- 4 eggs (divided use)
- 1 stick unsalted butter
- 2 8-oz. pkgs. cream cheese, softened
- 1 16-oz. box powdered sugar
- 1 Tbsp. vanilla flavor
- 1. Mix the cake mix, 1 egg and butter together well; press in a 9x13-inch pan. Set aside.
- 2. Mix the cream cheese, powdered sugar, remaining eggs and vanilla flavor together. Pour over the cake mixture. Cook for 45 minutes, or until the edges turn brown. If the top is too light, brown to your taste.


Strawberry Cold Cake

- I box strawberry cake mix (I use **Duncan Hines.**)
- 1 14.5-oz. can Eagle Brand Milk
- 1 16-oz. tub Cool Whip
- I small container frozen strawberries. thawed
- **1.** Bake the cake according to the box instructions; let cool.
- **2.** In a large bowl, mix the milk and Cool Whip with a hand mixer until creamy. Stir in the strawberries; set aside.

- 2. Stir well; pour the batter into a wellgreased and floured cake pan.
- **3.** Bake for 1 hour and 15 minutes or until well done.

Cow Chip Cookies

Makes about 12 dozen cookies.

- 2 cups sugar
- 2 cups butter/margarine
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 4 eggs
- 4 cups flour
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 2 tsp. baking powder

- 2 tsp. baking soda
- 1 cup pecans
- 2 cups bran flakes
- 1 cup coconut
- 2 cups oatmeal
- 1 cup raisins
- 1 12-oz. pkg. chocolate chips
- 1. In a large mixing bowl, mix the sugar, butter and vanilla until smooth. Add the eggs 1 at a time.
- 2. In another bowl, mix the flour, salt, baking powder and baking soda; add to the first mixture.
- **3.** By hand, stir in the remaining ingredients. Place 1/2 rounded spoons of dough on a cookie sheet that's been sprayed with PAM Cooking Spray. Cook about 10 minutes at 350 F.














might be the answer. Or travelers can stop and ask for directions. Preferably, plan the route before heading out on a road trip, so there aren't any directional surprises.






