





And that's just for starters. Gracie participated in CMS Ag Mechanics, Student Council and was on the Honor Roll. She competes in public speaking through FFA and UIL oral reading. As she looks forward to being a freshman at Corsicana High School this coming school year, she will also take time this summer to hone her leadership skills further by attending her second Texas Brigades camp.

Gracie is a member and officer of the Kerens 4-H Chapter, where her mom, Carrie Teetz, DVM, is co-manager. Gracie raises, trains and shows hogs and steers and competes in the food, creative arts, livestock judging, livestock quiz bowl, swine skillathon, public speaking, photography, record books and consumer decision making areas. She performs community service with her fellow chapter members by participating in food drives for area food pantries. Gracie also serves as an officer on the 4-H Shotgun Team, which her dad, Todd Teetz, coaches, and she's a Navarro County 4-H Ambassador. 4-H has been a "family thing" with Gracie's younger brother, Corbin, also participating. "My brother does everything I do," Gracie explained.

Gracie competes in 4-H locally and has traveled to major shows in San Antonio, Houston, Denver and Ft. Worth. She enjoys traveling, and, in addition to traveling to shows and other competitions, she's been to Yellowstone and the Grand Canyon national parks. "I like swimming in hotel pools and being together with friends and/or family," Gracie said.

A strength that helps Gracie in nearly all she does is her love of reading and writing. "My favorite subject in school is





reading. I love scary stuff and poetry and have always been good at reading," she shared. "I like to write, too. I have a notepad in my room, and I write my thoughts and prayers down." She admits to being very dramatic in her UIL oral reading competitions. "I use my dramatic oral reading skills in my public speaking," Gracie added.

A highlight last summer for Gracie was being accepted to attend one of the nine Texas Brigade summer camps. "My camp, the North Texas Buckskin Brigade in Santa Anna, Texas, last summer, focused on animal habitats and leadership activities," Gracie recalled. "I made new friends, and on the first day of camp, I learned how deer use their digestive systems. I'm returning to camp this summer after being selected for an assistant leadership position in the North Texas Buckskin Brigade." Working toward







that goal, Gracie has been earning points this past year by sharing her camp experiences through her public speaking abilities. Gracie will attend an additional camp, the Rolling Plains Bobwhite Brigade in Rising Star, Texas, this summer.

"Texas Brigades educates and empowers youth with leadership skills and knowledge in wildlife, fisheries and land stewardship, so they can become conservation ambassadors for a sustained natural resource legacy,"

Carrie explained. Texas Brigades is a nonprofit organization.

Being selected to represent Corsicana Middle School on its Amazing Shake team was a highlight of Gracie's time at the school. CMS has competed in Amazing Shake, a live competition teaching professional skills to students through role models in the school's community, for several years. "Over 100 seventh and eighth grade students worked toward being on the team," Carrie said. "After four rounds of competition. Gracie was in the top five and made the team." The top 10 finalists from CMS traveled to Atlanta for the national competition. They stood out in their matching T-shirts, jackets, black cowboy hats and smiles.

"I enjoy working with Gracie and going and watching her in all she does," Carrie, a veterinarian who works for the USDA in public health as a safety inspector, said. "She's learning responsibility through her shoots and shows and learning that everything's not always a win. I spent 10 years in 4-H and academic competitions, so I like to give back to the program. My

dad always said if a kid is at the barn, he/she is out of trouble. Hopefully, too, Gracie will earn college scholarships."

Born in College Station, but a resident of Navarro County since she was 5 months old, Gracie has prepared well for high school and beyond. "I made the eighth grade A team in volleyball, and I'm hoping to play in high school. I was the hitter," she said. "I know most of the kids, and I like having had friends here since I was little, but I'm looking forward to making some new friends in high school, too. She's undecided as to what she would like to become in life but is leaning toward attending college at Texas A&M University or at Texas Tech University. "My major interest may be something in agriculture," Gracie added.

Looking for a summer getaway for an overnight, week or monthly stay? Sunset Cove Marina, Campground and RV Resort offers Richland Chambers lakeside RV full hookup sites; a three-lane cemented boat launch; a swim area; a grill serving breakfast and lunch; an event center; and a convenience store with live bait, supplies, tackle and laundromat. Owners John and Susan McMullen explained, "We offer a friendly, honest, safe and clean place to RV camp, fish, swim and launch your watercraft."

Manager and Camp Hosts Demian Nelson and Monica Steadman supervise and run most of the daily operations, while Maintenance Manager Ricky Toungate keeps everything "ship shape" and, with his knowledge and extensive experience, offers RV and fishing tips to guests. "Ricky has been with us for several years, and Demian and Monica have been a tremendous blessing to the marina," Susan said. During the summer months, part-time staff members assist in the convenience store and grill.

Families enjoy the amenities and often rent the event center

for celebrations, meetings and year-round special occasions. The 1,200-squarefoot enclosed Lake Front Pavilion has a kitchenette, tables, chairs and ample parking. It's also used for Sunday morning nondenominational church services. Wi-Fi is available at the convenience store and select RV sites. "Our grill is known for having one of the best burgers in the area," Susan added, "and we have kayak and paddle boat rentals. "We enjoy seeing young ones catching their first fish, while families fish together from the shoreline. We provide a service to the area of the lake and have enjoyed growing the business over the years." Sunset Cove is a member of the Corsicana & Navarro County Chamber of Commerce and the Kerens Area Chamber of Commerce.

John and Susan moved to the area from Arizona in 2008. "We enjoy the small-town feel and love relaxing and living at the lake," Susan said. "We bought the marina as a 'fixer-upper' in May 2013, so people could enjoy the north side of Richland Chambers Reservoir like we have." The convenience store has been remodeled. and the restaurant grill and event center are recently added amenities.

Susan learned the recreational business while putting herself through college and working at Golf N' Stuff before becoming a family practice doctor with her practice located in Gun Barrel City. The couple has a son, daughter-in-law and grandchildren who live in Corsicana. They own a tool and die shop. "Our hobbies include swimming, fishing, traveling and hiking in our national and state parks," Susan stated.

Evenings take on a special glow as the sun gently sets over the cove and water. Whether kayaking or fishing along the shore or off the pier, it's a special time to enjoy moments while making memories. NOW

Creamy White Wine Chicken

- 1/4 cup butter
- 2 .7-oz. pkgs. Good Seasons Italian Salad Dressing and Recipe Mix
- 3/4 cup white wine
- 1 10.5-oz. can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 8-oz. pkg. cream cheese

- 2 Tbsp. chives, minced
- 2 Tbsp. garlic, minced
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 2-3 lbs. chicken thighs or breasts, deboned and skin removed
- I lb. angel hair pasta, cooked according to pkg. directions

- **1.** In a saucepan, melt the butter. Add the dressing mix; stir. Add the wine and soup; stir.
- **2.** Add the cream cheese, chives, garlic, onions and heavy cream; stir until the sauce is smooth. Heat thoroughly, but don't let it boil.
- **3.** Arrange the chicken in a 9x l3-inch baking dish; pour the sauce over the chicken.
- **4.** Bake at 325 F for 50-60 minutes, or until bubbly. Serve the chicken over the pasta.

Deacon's Favorite Tomato Cream Sauce

This sauce is good over roasted or pan-seared chicken with pearl couscous, pork chops, rice or pasta.

Splash of olive oil or 3 pats of butter 1 small onion, diced

4 garlic cloves, minced or 1 Tbsp. prepared garlic

3 Roma tomatoes, diced Salt, to taste Pepper, to taste 1 Tbsp. chicken-flavored Better than **Bouillon** 1/2 cup water 4-oz. cream cheese

1/4 cup heavy cream

- 1. In a pan, add the olive oil or butter or use both. Add the onions and garlic; sauté for 2-3 minutes on medium heat. Add the tomatoes. Season with salt and pepper; sauté for 2-3 more minutes.
- 2. Add the bouillon and water: simmer for another 3-4 minutes. Turn the heat to low; add the cream cheese and cream. Stir until the mixture is smooth.


Mamaw's Banana Pudding

2 cups sugar 10 Tbsp. flour 1/2 tsp. salt 4 cups milk (divided use) 6 egg yolks 3 tsp. vanilla Nilla Wafers, to taste Bananas, sliced, to taste

- 1. In a large pan, mix the sugar, flour and salt over medium heat; pour just enough milk into the sugar mixture to make a smooth, thick paste.
- 2. Add the egg yolks, one at a time, stirring until the mixture is smooth.
- **3.** Add the remaining milk, stirring constantly; add the vanilla. Turn the heat up a little until the mixture thickens. Then reduce the heat to low. Stir constantly until the mixture is a thick, smooth pudding.
- **4.** Remove the pan from the heat; let the pudding cool for 5 minutes.
- 5. In a large serving bowl, layer the pudding, Nilla wafers and sliced bananas as desired.
