

Cindy and Deanna each typically use a 15-pound ball. Both may use multiple balls, however, depending on the condition of the oil on the lanes and whether the lanes are wood or synthetic.

The idea of using more than one bowling ball does not appeal to Deanna, however. "My daddy told me, 'If you can't do it with one ball, you can't do it with 10!" she recalled.

The ladies all agree that one of the attractions of bowling is that it is a lifelong activity. "My husband lost a leg recently and now bowls with a prosthetic leg. His average had been 182, and while he is not at that level yet, he is doing well and will eventually get back up there," Deanna shared.

Cheryl related how she once bowled with a fractured shoulder, but still scored well, and shows no signs of slowing down. This is just to show that no matter what your physical abilities are, bowling is a sport anyone can enjoy.

Cindy added that while they have a lot of fun, bowling gives back to the community also. "We have bowl-a-thons to raise money for community members in need. We also bowl to support veterans' groups and 'Bowl for the Cure.' which supports breast cancer research."

Three Lynns and a Lou is one of the top bowling teams in the state of Texas, and they consistently place high in tournament play. This year, the goal is to win it all, and anyone who knows them would say the odds are in their favor. Their mantra is "Support Your Local Bowling Center!" 



Nathan Hinson is one of Nyadia's choir students. In high school, Nathan not only participated in band and color guard, but also sang regularly in the Church of Christ in nearby Cleburne. "I sing tenor. The a cappella music in church helped me learn more about voice," Nathan noted. "My major is instrumental music. Of course, I'd love to have a career as a performer, but I can also see myself back in a small school as director of bands, choir and color guard. I came to Navarro to smooth the transition between a small school and the university. Navarro feels like home to me."

Another student of Nyadia's is Grace Tan from Malaysia. "I'm following the footsteps of a friend who also came from Malaysia, through Navarro College, and is now completing her music degree at a university. My major is voice, and Navarro has been good for a couple of reasons. It is affordable, and I like the small class size."

Navarro College's Director of Marketing and Public Relations, Stacie Sipes, explained more about the small class size, "Our student to teacher ratio is 18:1. Even in high school the ratio is often 25 or 30:1 or higher." The students nodded in agreement. They obviously thrive in the smaller environment, and Nyadia gives the students the individual attention that they crave.

At Navarro Nyadia leads three choirs, the College Chorale, the Chamber Singers and the Sound Company Show Choir. Her experience and love for teaching and conducting has expanded and continues to grow beyond the

classroom. She is also the music director at her church and led a project with nine to 10 other churches for a community choir that performed in Duncanville on Good Friday.

The students at Navarro realize they are fortunate to have such a versatile and talented leader. Waco ISD's University High School Choir recently performed with the Navarro choirs under Nyadia's direction. Such opportunities showcase her ability to lead larger groups and her desire to create safe spaces for student expression. "I went to college to study music. I really am living a dream. I get to teach and cheer on others as they perform. I enjoy helping others improve. It makes me want to sing more often."



Taylor's Smokehouse

With the wafting fragrance of Texas mesquite smoked barbecue in the air, diners are drawn to Taylor's Smokehouse for some down-home, old-fashioned, mouthwatering comfort food, accompanied by a refreshing longneck or iced tea. The food's great, but so is the friendly hospitality that owners, Matt and Diana Taylor, offer to every diner. "Real wood smoking is what we do," Matt, the primary pit man, said. "Smoke is the difference you can taste."

Together with Corsicana native and the restaurant's building owner, Jamie Wyatt, Matt and Diana remodeled the restaurant's interior, highlighting the historical building's high ceiling and brick walls with traditional Texas accents and an eclectic collection of vintage dining tables and chairs. Diners can feel right at home inside or on the building's adjacent dog-friendly patio, where diners can enjoy area musical talents and occasional karaoke and movie nights.

Plans are underway to add dart and shuffleboard games on the building's second story, where Jamie, Matt and Diana office. "We want people to enjoy their overall experience here and not feel rushed," Matt explained.

The couple opened the original Taylor's Smokehouse in Hillsboro, Texas, in an old tractor shop in 2014. Recruited by Scott Jones, Corsicana and Navarro County's former economic developer, Matt and Diana came, saw the potential and fell in love with Corsicana. They sold their Hillsboro location, moved to Corsicana with their daughter, Leslie (a Navarro College student this fall), and opened this location in May 2018.

Specialties of the house include bacon-wrapped meatloaf, pork ribs, 2-inch-thick smoked pork chops and smoked tamales. "All sides, except desserts, are created in-house using our own recipes," Matt explained. "All menu items are available for takeout, too." Cash and all major credit cards are accepted.

The food's great, but so is the friendly hospitality that owners, Matt and Diana Taylor, offer to every diner.


While Matt and Diana are owners, managers and chefs, six employees are cross-trained to make sure diners receive the best service. Employees who can handle kitchen and pit duties free Matt to greet and meet diners. "We enjoy being a part of folks' conversations, hearing their laughter and being a part of their lives. I like smoking and cooking, but it's the people connections I enjoy the most in this business," Matt remarked.

Growth in all areas of the business has taken time, but Matt is looking forward to more community involvement. "We have great, supportive business neighbors," he said.

A native of Joshua, Texas, Matt attended Hill College in Hillsboro and is a self-described, self-taught chef. "I've always had a passion for all types of cooking — baking cookies, cakes and pies and creating candies," he admitted. "I just enjoy working with food. One of my best moments in the restaurant business happened when my dad attended our Hillsboro opening and told me he was proud of me."

When he can, even for a few minutes, Matt hops on his Harley-Davidson motorcycle and rides through the area's country roads. "My family enjoys traveling, and I love my Harley, but the restaurant is a priority always," he said.

With Corsicana's Beaton Street arch in sight, Matt and Diana are realizing their dream. He advised, "No matter what your dream is, keep going. Don't give up. Achieving dreams takes a lot of passion and sacrifice." NOW

"We're self-taught, trial-and-error chefs," Reva revealed. "And we're always on the lookout for recipes that feed a lot of people and keep them coming back for seconds." Friends and family members serve as taste testers before any new recipes are presented to the squadron members attending monthly meetings.

Famous Reuben Sandwich

Makes 8 sandwiches.

2 cups sauerkraut, drained 1/2 tsp. caraway or dill seeds 1/2 tsp. garlic powder 16 slices rye bread 1/2 cup Russian dressing 1 lb. corned beef, thinly sliced

1 lb. Swiss cheese, sliced Butter, melted

- **1.** Toss the sauerkraut with chosen seeds and garlic powder; set aside.
- **2.** Spread all bread slices with Russian dressing. On 8 of the bread slices, layer corned beef, sauerkraut and cheese; top each with remaining bread slices.

3. Brush butter on tops of all sandwiches; grill in a skillet or panini press until the cheese has melted.

Sweet and Sour Chicken

Makes 6 servings. Serve with rice or Chinese noodles.

- 3 lbs. chicken breasts, chopped into small pieces
- 1 8-oz. bottle Russian dressing
- 1 1-oz. envelope onion soup mix
- 1 10-oz. jar apricot preserves Green bell peppers, chopped (optional) Pineapple chunks (optional)
- **I.** Arrange the chicken in a greased baking dish. In a bowl, add the dressing, onion soup mix, preserves and bell peppers and pineapple chunks, if using. Blend well.
- **2.** Save about 1/4 cup of the preserve mix to baste the chicken as it cooks. Pour the remaining amount over the chicken.
- **3.** Bake for 1 1/2 hours at 350 F, basting occasionally with saved preserves mixture.

Charlie's Grilled Cheese Stuffed Jalapeño Chicken/ Bacon Wraps

You can't get enough of these "critters."

10 jalapeño peppers (wide and straight) 10 oz. shredded cheese of your choice 10 chicken breasts, thinly sliced 10 bacon strips, uncooked Toothpicks

- **I.** Wash the jalapeños. Slice stem tops off; set aside.
- **2.** Core the jalapeños, removing seeds and membrane carefully. Stuff insides with cheese.
- **3.** Place tops back on jalapeños; wrap each one with chicken breasts, completely covering each jalapeno, leaving the stem exposed.
- **4.** Cover the chicken wrap completely with bacon strips. Use toothpicks to hold the coverings in place if necessary.
- **5.** Place jalapeños in a pepper grilling holder or grilling pan with 2-inch sides. Grill over low heat, rotating as needed to cook the chicken and bacon until browned.

Creamy Shrimp and Pasta

Serve with garlic bread and a green salad of your choice.

- **2.** In a large pot, add the chicken and sausage; add dressing to completely cover all ingredients. Marinate for 4-6 hours.
- **3.** Add carrots, potatoes, onion and corn.

Bring mixture to a low boil, cooking for 30-45 minutes, or until the potatoes are tender; drain.





TravelNOW Transcending the Ordinary

Welcome to vast desert vistas, snowcapped mountain peaks, the Rio Grande bosque and acequias (forest and irrigation system/hike and bike trails), and blue skies that become spectacular sunsets setting the Sandia Mountains aglow. Modern, yet mystical, Albuquerque, New Mexico, nestled along the Rio Grande River below the towering Sandia Mountains, is all that and more.

Home to about one-third of New Mexico's culturally diverse population, its cultural heritage, history and the arts are celebrated. The state flag's Zia Sun Symbol, representing the Zia Pueblo people's belief in the sacred number four, stands for the four

directions in which visitors of all ages can have fun exploring this city, its outlying villages and pueblos during any of the year's four seasons.

The city sprawls and meanders, as does the Rio Grande, which flows through North Valley and South Valley. Interstate 25 and the Rail Runner Express commuter train (running from Belen, New Mexico's, Harvey House Museum, to Santa Fe) offer easy access to valley sites.

Founded in 1706 by Don Francisco Cuervo y Valdés in honor of the Duke of Alburguerque Viceroy of New Spain, the first "r" was dropped in later spellings, leaving the city nicknamed the "Duke City." Old Town Historic District's plaza, anchored by the stately walls and quiet spirituality of San Felipe de Neri Church, built in 1793, is surrounded by placitas (small plazas), home to residents, shops, galleries and historic sites. iExplora!, the Indian Pueblo Cultural Center, the New Mexico Museum of Natural History and Science and the Albuquerque Museum are sure stops.

In Spanish style, roads fan out from the plaza in all four directions. East to west, enjoy time travel back to the 1920s-1960s when much of downtown and the Nob Hill-Highland District grew up around the historic Route 66, which, in town, becomes Central Avenue. Iconic neon signs, vintage

shops, period eateries and the beautiful architecture and gardens of the University of New Mexico campus, with its museums, bring back memories of when Route 66 was known nationwide as the Mother Road.

At the east junction with I-40, visitors can head north to catch the aerial tramway to the Sandias' peak. Moving farther east through the pass, visitors may exit to the Turquois Trail leading to Santa Fe after a side trip to Tinkertown Museum and Sandia Peak.

Traveling westward from the plaza, the Albuquerque BioPark hosts an aquarium and botanical garden. Take the Rio Line narrow-gauge railroad to the zoo and Tingley Beach and hike or walk the 16mile Paseo del Bosque Trail. Climb in the ancients' footsteps on extinct volcanos to view the petroglyphs carved between 1000 B.C. and 1600 A.D. at the Petroglyph National Monument.

Southward from the plaza, the Barales community hosts the National Hispanic Cultural Center of New Mexico with its art galleries, performing arts venues, library and archives. Historic Barales grew up around a Rio Grande River ford near the Camino Real, the Spanish road connecting Mexico City and Santa Fe.

Travel northward from the plaza on Rio Grande Boulevard a few miles to the North Valley where fertile, irrigated farms, ranches and vineyards thrive. Hike along the river at the Rio Grande Nature Center State Park and visit the Unser Racing Museum.

Enjoy driving to the historic Village of Corrales, the state's self-proclaimed horse capital. Return to Albuquerque by way of 4th Street, which bisects the Village of Los Ranchos de Albuquerque as a continuation of Route 66.

Then perhaps catch a hot air balloon ride at the Anderson-Abruzzo International Balloon Museum, or delight in viewing skies dotted with colorful hot air balloons during dawns and sunsets while breakfasting or supping New Mexico-style Mexican food, featuring the state's largest crop, green chili peppers, on a restaurant's patio. With mariachis performing, it's the perfect way to relax. **NOW**
