




EDITOR'S NOTE





Tommy Jones has been blessed with the ability to grow his own food all his life. He inherited the precious skill from his father who was an Ellis County farmer while Tommy was growing up.





Since then Tommy has utilized this priceless knowledge on the land he and his wife, Shirley, made their home and where they raised their children and now grandchildren. Having been high school sweethearts and now married almost 50 years, they make quite the farming team.

"He is the outside man, and I am the inside man," Shirley laughed. She can be found helping pick at harvest time, but her specialty is canning and jarring.

"We eat a lot of what we grow," Shirley acknowledged. "One of the best things in the summer is tomatoes. I make a delicious tomato jelly that's great on meatloaf or meatballs."

Each year, the friendly couple can be seen at the Waxahachie Farmers Market welcoming customers with a smile as they sell their freshly picked fruits and vegetables. At their booth you will see a rainbow of colors ready to be devoured.

From onions, beets, cabbages, garlic, kale, broccoli, a variety of squash, radishes, peaches, plums and more, there is plenty to satisfy any taste. One of the couple's specialties, patty pan squash, is an unusual, oh-so-delicious vegetable that serves as the perfect side or even a main dish. It can be stuffed with meat and cheeses or simply sautéed or roasted in olive oil with a little salt and pepper.

Not only can Tommy give advice on how to prepare the vegetables he grows, he knows first-hand the flavor of his fresh crop and often enjoys fruits and veggies right out in the field. "If I am hungry, I just start eatin'," Tommy laughed. This is also a tool he utilizes to see what's ripe for picking.

On the farm, 3.5 acres are used just for the vegetable crops, but the couple also manages two separate orchards which include 225 pecan trees and a spread of peach, pear, cherry, fig and plum trees. Maintaining this level of farming requires diligence, determination and hard work.

Tommy said these qualities are imperative for future generations and can be attained by learning what he calls "the lost art" of growing your own food. "Everywhere you look, farms are going away. A lot of farmers are getting taken over by corporations," he said. "It is very important to train the generation behind us."

Though farming and selling their crops at the Farmers Market is just a hobby for the Joneses, they are very passionate about passing on the knowledge to their kids and grandkids who often work on the farm or help at the Farmers Market. "It is a life skill everyone should know. You can take pride in what you grow," Shirley added.

The loneses are dedicated to the life lessons their art is providing despite the challenges farming sometimes presents. Hard work is not something the family shies away from. "A lot of people don't realize what all goes into it," Tommy recognized. "Number one, you have to have the right equipment."

Keeping the equipment operational is a significant part of the job that often goes unrecognized by those who haven't experienced life on a working farm. "Knowing when to plant, making sure your soil is conditional, when to harvest, weed control, pest control and plowing and tilling are all very important," Tommy explained.

Though many modern farmers have discontinued the practice, Tommy uses 48-inch beds for planting. "They hold water better," Tommy said. "That's why they used them back in the day. It is more work, but if you've got a hot, dry summer without rain, they are very beneficial."

Some days the Joneses start their day at 4:00 a.m., especially in the summer. If anyone knows the power of the Texas heat, it's Tommy who does most the

work outside. He does what he can to escape it, but somedays has to work through it. "The sun is going to catch ya. Any farmer will tell you that. You just put on a straw hat and keep truckin'," he smiled.

The Joneses work year-round preparing for the opening of the Waxahachie Farmers Market and have been showing up for nearly 20 years. "It started with just the two of us," Shirley remembered.

Since then, their business has grown, so now their children and grandchildren pitch in to help on the farm and at the market which has become an enjoyable experience for everyone. "We love the customers," Shirley said. "They're like family."

Shirley also appreciates the comforting atmosphere the market creates. "You don't rush when you come to the Farmers Market. It is a relaxing environment."



There are many booths to visit and the list of goodies is endless. You can buy gifts like goat milk soap and plants, or ingredients such as farmraised chicken, beef, pork, a variety of cheeses, homemade salsa, and of course, fruits and vegetables.

"The biggest thing I get from it is what it teaches the grandkids," Tommy said. "They learn so many things like how to work hard. I can see how my grandkids have grown since they started. Someday, they are going to run this." NOW



"In 2012, I was ready to retire as an RN. I took a trip to the Cayman Islands, and I got to thinking about how I had always loved art. So, I decided to study for a degree in fine arts. Not as an artist, you see. I couldn't draw a straight line! I just wanted to study the art. But it was a requirement of the degree to take a certain number of art classes. I took drawing and began to open up. Then I took a painting class and discovered my passion!"

Mary didn't think there was any connection between her first career and her new passion, but one of her professors told her that he could see something of the nurse in her desire to keep everything tight in her paintings, in the way she wanted to get the details right and go for realism. "I do landscapes and still lifes from time to time, but my passion is people and pets," she shared. "You can move a tree around, or arrange a still life however you want it, but you've got to get a face just right. The human face is so interesting. Understanding how all the muscles work — your face can go from scared to happy to surprised in 60 seconds. There are so many expressions. It's very challenging and fun!"

Mary has done many paintings since she discovered this passion and always seems to have a few canvases working. She has sold some of her work in galleries here and there and does work on commission, but she's also done many paintings as gifts. "I have a lot of grandchildren and great-grandchildren, and nieces and nephews, and I've painted a lot of friends' pets." As good as Mary is at capturing human faces and hands, she also has quite a knack



for dogs and cats that look like they could stand up and walk out of the canvas. "I work from photos, mostly, because pets and children don't cooperate with sittings, and adults don't have the time. I have jokingly said that painting is like oldfashioned Photoshop. You can change a background, remove a zit or move the goat closer to your niece."

When people ask her how long it takes to do a painting, Mary has an answer that tells



it all. "I work really fast, and then very slow. This painting of a dog, I finished the first 90 percent in two days. But the last 10 percent may take two months to get just right! Leonardo da Vinci once said. 'Art is never finished, only abandoned,' and that's true! My first painting — of a man in Venice, painting Venice — has been reworked five times!" Mary tends to start her paintings in acrylics, and then she finishes the fine details in oil. "It's nice that I can work at home, but there's also a social aspect to this. It can be both inside and outside. There's plenty of variety."

As Mary follows her passion, she keeps working to improve with each painting or class. "They say it takes 10.000 hours of practice to become an expert. I still have several thousand hours to go. Each new painting is about challenging myself to do something new. My next painting will be my first with four human figures in it — four kids at a wedding. It's never too late to find your passion. I wish I had discovered mine earlier. I might have been really good!" Some would say she already is. NOW

Dermatology & Skin Cancer Surgery Center is a medical, surgical and cosmetic dermatology center offering a multitude of services. The Waxahachie location, recently opened the second week of January, provides high-quality care and options that didn't previously exist for people in the area. "We are excited to be here," Holly Glover acknowledged. "We

are not just a business. I want to make sure everyone in the community is taken care of."

Holly is a physician assistant currently working in the new Waxahachie location caring for patients each day. Joining Holly is Medical Director Dr. Matthew Barrows, a Board-certified expert in the field of dermatology. He is also one of only a handful of surgeons who perform the Mohs Micrographic procedure for skin cancer removal in North Texas.

The Mohs procedure, which will be offered at the Waxahachie office, is a specialized technique used to treat skin cancer. Mohs involves removing skin cancer cells layer by layer. This process allows the doctor to examine each layer for cancer cells and continue removing additional layers until the cancer has been completely removed. By using this technique, doctors can remove the cancerous site while preserving surrounding tissue, which results in better cosmetic outcomes and happier patients.

The practice also has an in-house Board-certified plastic

surgeon, who performs wound closures for many of the more complex cases. In addition to many other services, they also provide skin cancer screening, BOTOX and fillers. "Anything to do with the skin, hair or nails — that's us," Holly explained.

Another cutting-edge service provided at the office is SkinPen® microneedling. This cosmetic technique is used to help with fine lines, wrinkles and even acne scars. "SkinPen® helps improve skin tone and texture," Holly explained. The procedure involves making tiny punctures in the skin to encourage more collagen production. The great thing about SkinPen® is that it does not require the use of chemicals.

Not only does the center provide cosmetic services to keep skin looking beautiful, they also provide skin exams and services to keep skin healthy. Many people may not be aware of the importance of yearly skin checks, but making an appointment may protect you from harmful diseases. "We have the ability to prevent a lot of these issues," Holly said. "A full skin exam is appropriate for every age, every single year. Everyone should be getting their skin checked." She also recommends monthly self-exams and wearing sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher on any part of the body that is exposed to the sun, especially the face. For those concerned with sunscreen decreasing the body's ability to absorb vitamin D, Holly said that the benefit outweighs the risk.

Holly is passionate about serving her patients and becoming involved in the community. She always provides patients with the information they need before they walk out the door. "Research has shown that patients only retain 40 percent of what is discussed in an office visit. I always try to write everything down, so they can reflect on it later," Holly acknowledged.

Holly is committed to providing excellent care to her patients from the moment they walk through the door. "We try to create a warm and welcoming experience," she said. "From the billing department to the front desk, we want to provide the best customer service possible." NOW

- **6.** Close bag tightly; shake until salad greens and orange segments are well coated. Add almonds and shake. Do-ahead tip: Before adding dressing, salad greens can be closed tightly and refrigerated no more than 24 hours. **7.** Variation: For a pineapple salad, substitute 1 13-oz. can pineapple chunks, drained, for the mandarin orange segments and snipped

- I pkg. (8-serving size) or 2 pkgs. (4-serving size) Jell-O gelatin, any red flavor
- I pkg. (8-serving size) or 2 pkgs. (4-serving size) Jell-O berry blue flavor gelatin

- 2 cups cold water
- 4 cups pound cake, cubed (I like Sara Lee in the frozen food section.)
- 2 cups strawberries, sliced
- 1 8-oz. tub Cool Whip, thawed
- 1. Stir 2 cups of the boiling water into each flavor of gelatin in separate bowls for at least 2 minutes until completely dissolved. Stir 1 cup cold water into each bowl. Pour into separate 13x9-inch pans. Refrigerate 3 hours until firm. Cut each pan into 1/2-inch cubes.
- **2.** Place red gelatin cubes in a 3-1/2-quart bowl or trifle bowl. Layer with cake cubes, strawberries and 1/2 of the whipped topping. Cover with blue gelatin cubes.
- **3.** Garnish with remaining whipped topping. Refrigerate at least 1 hour or until ready to serve. Store leftover dessert in refrigerator.

TRANSCENDING

THE ORDINARY

Welcome to vast desert vistas, snowcapped mountain peaks, the Rio Grande bosque and acequias (forest and irrigation system/hike and bike trails), and blue skies that become spectacular sunsets setting the Sandia Mountains aglow. Modern, yet mystical, Albuquerque, New Mexico, nestled along the Rio Grande River below the towering Sandia Mountains, is all that and more.


Home to about one-third of New Mexico's culturally diverse population, its cultural heritage, history and the arts are celebrated. The state flag's Zia Sun Symbol, representing the Zia Pueblo people's belief in the sacred number four, stands for the four directions in which visitors of all ages can have fun exploring this city, its outlying villages and pueblos during any of the year's four seasons.


The city sprawls and meanders, as does the Rio Grande, which flows through North Valley and South Valley. Interstate 25 and the Rail Runner Express commuter train (running from Belen, New Mexico's, Harvey House Museum, to Santa Fe) offer easy access to valley sites.

Founded in 1706 by Don Francisco Cuervo y Valdés in honor of the Duke of Alburquerque Viceroy of New Spain, the first "r" was dropped in later spellings, leaving the city nicknamed the "Duke City." Old Town Historic District's plaza, anchored by the stately walls and quiet spirituality of San Felipe de Neri Church, built in 1793, is surrounded by *placitas* (small plazas), home to residents, shops, galleries and historic sites. iExplora!, the Indian Pueblo Cultural Center, the New Mexico Museum of Natural History and Science and the Albuquerque Museum are sure stops.

In Spanish style, roads fan out from the plaza in all four directions. East to west, enjoy time travel back to the 1920s-1960s when much of downtown and the Nob Hill-Highland District grew up around the historic Route 66, which, in town, becomes Central Avenue. Iconic neon signs, vintage shops, period eateries and the beautiful architecture and gardens of the University of New Mexico campus, with its museums, bring back memories of when Route 66 was known nationwide as the Mother Road.

At the east junction with I-40, visitors can head north to catch the aerial tramway to the Sandias' peak. Moving farther east through the pass, visitors may exit to the Turquois Trail leading to Santa Fe after a side trip to Tinkertown Museum and Sandia Peak.





Traveling westward from the plaza, the Albuquerque BioPark hosts an aquarium and botanical garden. Take the Rio Line narrow-gauge railroad to the zoo and Tingley Beach and hike or walk the 16-mile *Paseo del Bosque Trail*. Climb in the ancients' footsteps on extinct volcanos to view the petroglyphs carved between 1000 B.C. and 1600 A.D. at the Petroglyph National Monument.

Southward from the plaza, the Barales community hosts the National Hispanic Cultural Center of New Mexico with its art galleries, performing arts venues, library and archives. Historic Barales grew up around a Rio Grande River ford near the Camino Real, the Spanish road connecting Mexico City and Santa Fe.

Travel northward from the plaza on Rio Grande Boulevard a few miles to the North Valley where fertile, irrigated farms, ranches and vineyards thrive. Hike along the river at the Rio Grande Nature Center State Park and visit the Unser Racing Museum.

Enjoy driving to the historic Village of Corrales, the state's self-proclaimed horse capital. Return to Albuquerque by way of 4th Street, which bisects the Village of Los Ranchos de Albuquerque as a continuation of Route 66.

Then perhaps catch a hot air balloon ride at the Anderson-Abruzzo International Balloon Museum, or delight in viewing skies dotted with colorful hot air balloons during dawns and sunsets while breakfasting or supping New Mexico-style Mexican food, featuring the state's largest crop, green chili peppers, on a restaurant's patio. With mariachis performing, it's the perfect way to relax.

Why do people store stuff in their garage and leave the car out in the driveway? Many simple solutions can use available space and leave room for vehicles. Although you can invest in inexpensive organizing systems, you don't have to spend a fortune in the process. Get creative.

Use the walls.

If you have open studs with space between, you have ready-made "closets" for storing garden tools, fishing rods, cleaning tools, etc. Simply cut two 16-inch x 16-inch pieces from scraps of 1/2-inch plywood. Screw them into

the back and front of the studs at a slight upward angle. Then slip in objects from the top down.

For a fishing rod organizer, all you need is a 3-inch diameter PVC pipe and a foam swimming pool noodle. Drill 1-inch holes spaced every 4 inches in the PVC pipe. With a sharp knife, cut slits in the noodle 4 inches apart. Line up the pool noodle on the wall so at least two slits sit over studs.

Pulling those slits apart, slide in a fender washer and screw the noodle to the wall using 2-inch screws. Finally, screw the PVC pipe to the wall beneath it at a comfortable height and insert fishing rods. This system prevents line tangles, as well.

Add hooks.

One of the best storage solutions comes in the form of various sizes of coated hooks. Attaching oversized







hooks to studs becomes instant storage for garden hoses, extension cords and even bicycles or lawn chairs. Even more efficient, hang J-style hooks to the existing garage door track for a ladder, yard tools and spare lumber. Using canvas storage bags with the hooks can also be a great way to protect and store holiday decorations for all seasons.

Ceiling-mounted shelves.

Many ready-to-install versions exist that drop down from the ceiling to hold most anything. You can also build your own ceiling system using 2-inch PVC pipes and fittings. Glue them together and bolt the straight pipe to ceiling joists, which works to support heavy loads. Screwing angled pieces from the wye connectors to the cross brace helps stabilize the entire rack.

Ceiling track storage.

Another way to extend storage space from the ceiling incorporates big plastic storage bins with a few pieces of wood attached to the framing. While this system isn't great for heavy items, it is a good way to store light and medium weights.

Use 2x2s, cut to the appropriate length, and screw into the framing with 3 1/2 screws spaced every two feet. Then, center and screw 1x4 boards flat against the bottom of the 2x2s using 2-inch screws. When finished, slip the bins into place. The lip of the bin should just touch the center 2X2.

Take advantage of corners.

Some of the most unused space falls between the garage door and sides of the structure. Yet small corner shelves fit well in this area. With exposed studs, this area provides even more room. Either way, cut scrap wood to the appropriate size and shape, rounding or squaring the front corners. Use 1x1-inch cleats to support the shelves on both

sides. These small spots are perfect for holding smaller containers that get lost on larger shelves or in cabinets.



Simple ball storage idea.

Build two u-shapes from scrap wood. Drill one or two holes in each side and at least two in the front. Insert one u-shape at the bottom of the wall (preferably between two exposed studs) and one about 4 feet up. Attach 3-foot bungee cords to each hole. The balls slip between the cords easily but then stay in place.

Simple holder for gloves and hats.

Use a scrap of wood and decorate it any way you desire. Attach wooden clothespins on the front, and using small eyehooks, attach a wire for hanging. Position the holder on a nail anywhere in the garage and clip up gardening or work gloves, caps, bandanas or any other accessory. This one might even be good for inside the house.

Creating new storage zones can be as easy or difficult as you want. But perhaps some of these ideas will spur you on to even more creative ways to get your car back in the garage. After all, isn't that what a garage is meant to protect?








TALES OF TEXAS

MAGNIFICENTLY MAJESTIC



The theatrical amenities of the Majestic Theatre make it obvious that it was built for the exciting live performances of vaudeville rather than as a movie theater. One of the things one might notice as "missing" from the theater is a marquee. Vaudeville preferred the poster that presented much more detail about the scheduled entertainment, and the original poster is in the Majestic offices, announcing the opening night of April 11, 1921. Plans are already in the works for the Majestic's centennial celebration.

Gazing out at the theater seats from center stage, one must wonder if Bob Hope, Houdini or perhaps Mae West from the vaudeville era felt the same nervous excitement as recent performers, such as the talented Elvis Costello or British comedian Eddie Izzard. Performers and patrons alike appreciate the intimate experience of the Majestic. The beautiful golden balcony extends over the floor seats toward the stage and brings the artist closer to his audience. The acoustics are so near perfect that it is like performing in a smaller space with fewer patrons, yet today a "packed house" would include more than 1,500 guests.




Though the original marble floors and stairways have given way to plush carpet that complements the rest of the lobby, the original design continues to bring to mind the opulence of the stars and dignitaries who have visited this magnificent structure. The lobby, with its beautiful, gold leaf paint and dramatic crystal chandeliers, is like walking into a gold-filled room. The mirrored walls expand the room to remind us of the reflections in their history.

The Majestic was originally part of Karl Hoblitzelle's Interstate Amusement Company, which included theaters across the South. Dallas was the flagship theater, so imagine Hoblitzelle's horror when, in the 1930s, he returned from Europe after an extended stay only to find that his manager had painted over the gold leaf we admire today with colors of red and pink! He *immediately* ordered the original paint restored.

In 1973, the last movie was shown at the theater, and in 1976, the Hoblitzelle Foundation gave the Majestic to the city of Dallas. The building was the first in Dallas to be placed on the National Register of Historic Places, and today is overseen by General Manager Mike Schwedler. Mike's first view of the theater was looking out over the performance hall. He recalls saying, "OK, what do you want me to do? I'll take the job!" The Majestic makes its own impression when you see it for the first time.

The area out of public view is just as important in ensuring "the show must go on" as is the grandeur of the public areas. Backstage, the lights and the curtains are managed by an elaborate system of counterweights and pulleys for raising and lowering the modern theatrical equipment.















Mike explained, "If we have a performance of *Peter Pan*, we have all the equipment we need to make sure he can fly."

Deeper into the theater, a passageway follows a stairwell under the stage to allow a performer to exit stage right and then magically reappear to the delight of the audience from stage left. There are 16 dressing rooms for the performers' preparation, including two choral dressing rooms for large troops. Imagine passing by one of these rather simple, somewhat austere rooms and getting a glimpse of an upcoming act like the cast of Man of La Mancha preparing to go onstage. Use your imagination even further and maybe you can see Bob Hope in his dressing robe and the makeup artist taking the sheen from that famous nose that Bing Crosby likened to a ski-slope!

The revered history of this magical place continues to draw famous performers and great movies. It was certainly a piece of relatively recent nostalgia to see the original *Mary Poppins* screened in the Majestic just after the remake, *Mary Poppins Returns*.

Mike offered this additional insight, "I am proud to have contemporary acts like Hall and Oates play here as they tour, but I am even more proud when a local school of dance books the theater for their recital. The parents and grandparents beam with pride, and the children have the time of their lives."

Visit the Majestic website soon and see who is playing there. It might be a performer that you saw in concert 20 years ago, or perhaps a world-famous contemporary artist. Attending the Majestic is to experience a different era of theater, one we do not want to forget.


