

Calling all free spirits ...




Soccer is more than a sport to this family. It is a cohesive activity that brings them closer together with each kick of the ball. Lately, they've been able to stay in shape with family practices in local parks, like Julian Feild Park on West Broad St. and Katherine Rose Memorial Park on North Walnut Creek Dr. Soon, they'll all be back to competitive playing.

Of course, the Reginas and the Lenoirs were already as close as any family could be. They live in the same house, share investments in the same business and, yes, love the same sports — especially soccer. "Even my mom has filled in for a game when she comes to town from Austin, and she's 56," Craig Regina, 36, said. "It's just something else that we, as a family, can all enjoy doing together."

Living together into adulthood is nothing new for the family. Jay Lenoir, Misti's husband and Craig's brother-in-law, is in the Marines and travels a lot (though home base is their home in Mansfield). They believe it makes sense to share one roof with their children, Misti and Jay's daughter, 16-yearold Trystan, and Craig's son, 8-year-old Craig "CJ" Regina Jr. "It's what you do. You come together as a family," Misti said. "With Jay being in the military, it helps having Craig there. They say it takes a village to raise children, and we're proof that it does."

They also entered into business together a couple years ago, a business that is appropriately named Family Mattress and HomeStore. "We trust each other's ethics, so we said, 'Let's do it quality, and right," Misti said. "If I'm going to invest my money, I'm going to do it with my family."

Jay, 44, is in town frequently, however, enough to be on the same over-30 co-ed soccer team with Craig and Misti, 38, at the Apex Indoor Sports Center in Mansfield. Though they are not currently playing soccer competitively, as all their leagues were shut down during COVID-19, they are hoping to pick back up where they left off. A year ago, they were in their fourth season together on the team, while Misti also played on an outdoor co-ed team in Mansfield and Jay was on a men's outdoor team in Arlington. "We are definitely planning on starting an adult team again in the fall," Craig said.

The family members who never quit playing on a team were the kids. Trystan was on the Mansfield High freshman girls' team in 2019, and then she played again as a sophomore at MHS. "She's definitely progressed and become a quicker, better shot playing good offense and defense. It was good to see her team back out and getting to play in spite of COVID," Craig said. CJ, who recently turned 8, has played in leagues for 8-and-under and 7-and-under, and will be in the 9-and-under league next year. He's also been coached by Craig and Misti. "I learned to always pass to my teammates. My dad's a good coach," CI said.

The family's interest in soccer began with Trystan, who started playing at age 5 in 2010. Jay picked up the sport in 2013 at the urging of some of his Marine buddies who started a team when he was stationed in New Orleans. "The guys were like, 'You're fast. Let's go.' So, I joined them," Jay said. "It's challenging, a lot of running, and I'm in the Marine Corps, so it goes along with that."

Misti followed in 2016, also with the encouragement of friends. "I'd been asked a few times to be in an adult league," she said. "They said, 'You're pretty athletic. It'll be easy.' It's not," she added with a laugh.



It was also around that time that Craig joined in, after seeing how much fun the rest of his family was having. He and the rest of his family were already athletes, him with a baseball background and Misti having played softball. Also, the family had played together on a softball team as adults. "I just saw them having fun and thought I'd give it a try, and it's been a blast," Craig said. "I went back to softball one summer, but then I went back to soccer. You don't run as much in softball."

The running is a big part of why they all play. Craig called it the ultimate workout after a hard day. "It helps us blow off steam, and it's a way to have fun and get some exercise," he said. "You blink, and you've run five miles."

Craig and Misti have two younger brothers who also love soccer and play. Aaron, 30, lives nearby and has a 4-year-old son, Hunter, whom Craig said will almost certainly play when he's old enough. "He's a good little dribbler now," Craig said.

Also, 29-year-old Nathan lives in Colorado and joins the team when he's home for a visit. In fact, since they play year-round, the family often plans holidays and vacations around soccer seasons. "He keeps cleats in a room at our house," Misti said. "When he comes home and wants to play, there's a spot for him."

The premiere episode will center around their September 2021, outdoor, horsey wedding.

What a difference from last year at this time, when the couple were newcomers at the neighborhood Fourth of July party. Hospitable neighbors asked the normal questions: Are you married? When are you getting married? What if he leaves?

How will you run your ranch without him? Eliana's response was always: "I'm pretty sure we'd be able to run it without him. But also, he's not going to leave."

Her confidence came from six years with Matthew and 26 years' experience with horses. Still, she and Matt are learning as they go. For instance, they'd never had chickens or sheep. He had never really dealt with horses before Eliana introduced him to her horse of 12 years, Tyson. She did not know how to weld, and he didn't know how to install a ballast on a fluorescent light. Together, they've renovated and improved the fencing and barns that allow them to care for approximately 10 equines at any given time.

"Anything you need to know, you can look up with this phone," Matthew said. And although he uses his device for little things, like learning to build a solid chicken coop, he treats it as purely functional. "I'm telling you, the pleasure of waking up every morning to this — 13 acres, where I don't have time to be on Facebook and digging my phone — has made me a better person. That and learning from Eliana. She knows everything there is to know!"

"Owning your own business with the person about to be your husband is weird," Eliana said, explaining the importance of handling the work/love dynamic. "He slowly started to realize, *This isn't just my girlfriend telling me to clean the stalls this certain way.* He realized I wasn't nagging him, but teaching him."

They've learned to overcome the trust issues each carried.

Originally from California, Eliana moved to Flower Mound to remove herself from a toxic relationship and live near her parents. Originally from South Dakota, Matthew had moved to Texas at the invitation of his aunt when he was 18. Thanks to a mutual interest in skateboarding, the two met in the Dallas skating scene.

Very much Matthew's "polar opposite," Eliana describes her marriedforever parents as "amazing." Matthew's past, with its own complexities, translated into a very long wait for Eliana. "If you're going to ask somebody to marry you, you have to mean it," Matthew said.

Shortly after asking for her father's blessing, Matthew proposed with a note in her chocolate cake at a dinner with her parents. Deciding first to conduct the whole wedding in front of the barn, they then agreed to turn their lifestyle into a reality TV show. With filming and editing help from producers Brey Brown and Rachel Napolitano, plus a local production company, the proto-episode pitched to television networks focuses on the couple helping their first broodmare, Coeura, give birth to Ditalini AR (named after a type of pasta and intended for a high-level hunter-jumper career).

Matthew's sweetheart was Miss Patsy Cline. "We got her as a 1-year-old still weaning on mom. We found her a good home, and the lady is going to turn her into an eventer horse," Eliana said, explaining that Angelheaded Ranch does not take horses and turn them for profit. When they find off-track rescue horses in bad situations, they try with all their heart to give them new love, a new purpose, a new talent and a better chance at a perfect forever home.

"We limit ourselves to what we can take on. But help is help," Matthew said, remembering Miss Molly, who came as skin and bones and had to have a catheter in her neck to take medicine. "Now she's at a new home, spoiled rotten."

"The kid who owns her is a 17-yearold, who oils her braided mane with argan oil," Eliana said, smiling with satisfaction. She and Matthew understand they can't save every horse. But the more they try, the happier they become. Now



Italian Pasta Salad

Dressing: 1 1/2 cups olive oil 1/4 cup white or red wine vinegar 1/4 cup water 2 Tbsp. coarse sea salt 2 cloves garlic, minced

1 Tbsp. sugar

2 tsp. each dried oregano and dried basil Black pepper, to taste

I Tbsp. each fresh parsley, basil or chives, minced (optional)

Salad: I Ib. uncooked rotini pasta

- 4 cups water
- 1 Tbsp. salt
- 3 cups cherry tomatoes, halved
- 8 oz. fresh mozzarella cheese balls, halved
- I lb. salami or summer sausage, cut into cubes
- 3/4 cup kalamata olives, sliced
- 3/4 cup pepperoncini (optional)
- 1/2 cup sliced red onion
- 1/2 cup fresh parsley, chopped

I. *For dressing:* Shake all the ingredients together in a jar.

2. For salad: Cook the pasta according to the package directions (in salted water for more flavor). Allow to cool slightly; toss with a little oil to prevent sticking.

3. Re-shake the closed jar. Toss about three-fourths of the dressing together with all the salad ingredients. Save the remaining dressing to add to the leftovers.

4. Keep the salad in the refrigerator for 2-3 days.

Pecan Chicken and Wild Rice Salad

Serves 6-8 people.

Dressing:

1/2 cup rice vinegar
1/3 cup vegetable oil
2 large garlic cloves, minced
1 Tbsp. Dijon mustard
1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 tsp. pepper
1/4 tsp. sugar

Salad:

cup wild rice
 cups chicken stock
 lemon, juiced
 whole chicken breasts, cooked
 bunch green onions, minced
 6-8 oz. snow peas, trimmed
 ripe avocados, chopped
 cup pecan pieces, toasted

 For dressing: Combine all the ingredients in a jar with a tight-fitting lid. Shake to mix.
 For salad: Combine the rice, stock and lemon juice in a saucepan. Bring to a boil. Reduce the heat. Simmer, covered, for 1 hour, or until tender; drain.
 Chop the chicken into bite-size pieces, discarding the skin and bones.
 Combine the dressing, rice and chicken, green onions and snow peas in a bowl 2 hours prior to serving; mix well. Chill, covered, in the refrigerator.
 Add the avocados and pecans just before serving; mix gently.

Frosted Coconut Protein Cupcakes

lcing: 4 oz. fat-free cream cheese 1/4 cup coconut oil, melted 2 cups Xylitol confectioners' sugar

2. For cupcakes: Preheat the oven to 375 F.

Spray a muffin tin with nonstick spray; set aside. **3.** In a large bowl, combine the flour, protein powder, baking soda and salt. Whisk until well combined; set aside.

4. In a second bowl, combine the next 6 ingredients.

5. Add the wet ingredients to the dry ingredients; mix well.

6. Scoop 1/4 cup of the cupcake mixture into each muffin cup. Place in the oven on the middle rack for 20 minutes.

7 Remove to a cooling rack; let the cupcakes cool completely before frosting.

8. Garnish with flaked coconut.

Nana Cindy's Italian Chicken

1 cup butter

- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 6-8 large chicken breasts, boneless and skinless
- 2 cups fresh Parmesan cheese, grated
- 2 cups Progresso Italian Style
- Bread Crumbs
- l tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. pepper
- I tsp. basil (or any Italian herbs)
- 3 slices sharp cheddar cheese

 Melt the butter with the olive oil; spread over the inside of a 9-x 13-inch casserole dish.
 Cut up all the chicken breasts into 1-inchthick squares; add the pieces to the casserole dish. Coat well with the butter and oil.
 Combine the Parmesan cheese, breadcrumbs and seasonings. Sprinkle half the mixture all over the buttery chicken; mix

until coated. **4.** Mix the remaining Parmesan cheese mixture all through the chicken.

5. Place the cheddar cheese slices on top of the casserole.

6. Cover with foil; bake on the middle rack for $1 \frac{1}{2}$ hours.

7 Remove from the oven. Uncover the casserole; test a piece of chicken from the middle, checking for doneness. Do not cover, but return to the oven for up to 1/2 hour longer before serving.




