

This year marks a fifth anniversary of a traumatic event in my life. Friends and faithful readers may remember August 19, 2017, or at least reading about it. That day, after a frightening night and morning, I ended up on a CareFlite, rushed to Providence Hospital in Waco. There, they told me I had a stroke. A stroke? At 56? No way. Yes way. Strokes can hit at any age.

Miraculously, I not only survived, but during the past five years, no additional strokes, no heart health issues, only one lingering physical effect. The information processing center of my brain had to reroute cells, so my processing ability functions daily. Occasionally, I search for words or slur speech if I allow myself to get overtired. Most of the time, people don't know I suffered a stroke. Most people have lingering, sometimes debilitating issues left in the aftermath. If I didn't believe in miracles before that, I would now. I'm in a very rare percentage of stroke survivors, and I don't take that blessing lightly.

Worth celebrating? You bet. The precarious preciousness of life lingers forever in my mind. How different I could look today. After five years, the stats don't apply as much. It becomes a non-event medically. But I know it happened, and I will cherish the date when miracles abounded for me. Know the signs of a stroke, and don't believe they apply only to old people. I pray you never experience what I did, but if you do, minutes can count.

# DOZENS of DAUGHTERS



During his childhood at St. Luke Catholic School in Irving, J.R. Martinez learned to play volleyball. "It was that or playing on monkey bars, the only playground equipment we had," he shared. Growing up with the sport, his pastor once told him, "God will use your skills." Eventually, he coached at Bishop Dunne Catholic High School in Dallas, Texas, although he declared, "I'm not a very good coach. I'm an instructor. My older girls are better than me."

Coach Martinez enjoys working with younger girls, starting when they reach third or fourth grade. They quickly become like daughters to him. He realized, however, the young girls needed role models as coaches, so he engaged what he terms "disciple coaches." While these high school students help hone volleyball skills, J.R. strives to meet the deeper needs of all the girls and leads his instructors to do the same.

"They are always under pressure at school from teachers and peers. Some have challenges at home," he divulged. "The girls love volleyball, but if they get belittled, many give up playing. The instructors and I listen, encourage and praise them. Nothing makes me happier than seeing a new girl smile after she's heard, 'You can't,' and then realizes she can."

With a family environment, the players and coaches show mutual respect that sometimes comes out in a joking manner but never belittling. With the disciple coaches, J.R. encourages individual styles for instruction instead of insisting the teens do things the same way he teaches. He expects them to love, care and listen. "That's what these girls need. This is a safe place, a special place where the Holy Spirit fills the room," he said.







Before the transition to a gym, the building served as a prayer room for the Living Water Church. The pastors, Peggy and Phil Gibson, allowed J.R. to use the space for his volleyball clubs. "Peggy insisted no kid would be denied instruction in this gym, regardless of finances," he explained. Although families who can afford fees pay them, the ministry runs off donations, parents and volunteers. When the floor needed replacing, it happened because of volunteer efforts. When Living Water became The Heights Church, the new staff let J.R. continue using the building. He supports the church, giving back because they give to his ministry.

Beyond instruction and providing competition under the umbrella of Johnson County Junior Volleyball Club, J.R. desires to prepare the girls for life. His disciple coaches mostly come from past club players. Many of these teens didn't make the high school volleyball teams, but that didn't hold them back. After getting cut from a high school team, one girl became a certified coach at 16. Another girl went to college, and during her junior year, she coached both track and volleyball. In her senior year, the college hired her as a head coach. These successes give J.R. a reason for pride in his daughters.

Another proud moment occurred when a student stated, "If at first you don't succeed, try doing what the coach told you to do the first time." His proudest time came when a girl called him rabbi. Although admitting he isn't a youth pastor, J.R. acknowledges teaching the girls, players and instructors biblical values to carry with them through life.





"My kids teach me lessons, and I feed them every day," he stated. "It's all about the kids. I'm not doing this. God's doing it through the girls."

In teaching volleyball, J.R. prefers to instruct through experience rather than tell the girls how to play. He also likes to use video analysis. Once the girls see where they make mistakes, they feel it. Then they can correct themselves.

Believing God gives him what he needs for success, J.R. desires more community support to keep the program strong. He welcomes volunteers who want to experience serving the Father like he has. Although volleyball gives him a means to the end, he wants the girls to have fun and receive repeated affirmation. Spending six or seven days each week with his girls, he finds ways to encourage them, regardless of their skills or abilities. He simply loves his players and his disciple coaches, who love the younger girls as much as he does.

Besides heading up the JCJV Club, J.R. also works with Johnson County Sports Association Lions. He admitted to hopes of one day becoming an official instructor for JSCA Lions. Currently a trainer for those kids, the downside to coaching them means losing touch during the summer.

Year-round, J.R.'s life revolves around his volleyball daughters. Every day, he looks forward to the hours spent with each girl in the "Little Gym That Could," preparing them for a sport and life. At the end of the day, he joins their smiles over improvement, fun and pure joy of spending time together as a family and can't imagine living any other way. NOW

While every corner of the world may claim its own dialect, Texas goes big toward its own communication style. People from other parts of the country have probably heard many typical Texan phrases, while some slang is purely local. Here's a beginner's guide for any recent transplants trying to acclimate to the language of the Lone Star State.

**Howdy** — A less fancy way of saying, "How do you do?" the greeting, *Howdy!* is even the official greeting of Texas A&M University, the state's largest university with about 70,000 students. *Howdy* is often followed by the word, *y'all*, which leads us to ...

**Y'all** — A contraction that means just what it clearly says: You all. *Y'all* can address two or more people, but a very large group (or multiple groups) requires a pluralized plural. That's where *all y'all* comes in. (Yes, Texans know that means "all you all," but groups can be really, *really* big here, so we don't consider it redundant.)

**Fixin'ta** — Although foreigners might think you're about to repair something when hearing this phrase, it actually just means you are about to *do* something. Whatever you're about to do, however, never *ever* say it with a g. *Fixing* still means repairing something, even in Texas.

**Ain't** — A contraction meaning: I am not, I have not, he/she has not, we are not and that is not. Certainly not exclusive to Texas, but common for natives who ain't fixin'ta use more syllables than absolutely necessary. Used in a Texas sentence: "This ain't my first rodeo!" (meaning I've actually done this before/I'm not new to this). Further abbreviations include *y'aint* (y'all are not) and *aintcha* (aren't y'all?).

**Git** — Because get is just plain uppity, Texans slip *git* into all kinds of phrases: *Git-r-done* (meaning to accomplish something); *all git-out* (meaning very or extremely); or *git-to-gittin*' (meaning to get started). For example, a warning between siblings about chores: "You bes' git-r-done before Pa gits-to-gittin' home or he'll be mad as all git-out."

As those examples suggest, individual words are often partnered with other phrases for emphasis in Texas. Here are some common phrases one might use to show they are Texan through and through.

**Bless your heart** — While this one can be sincerely stated in regard to something bad happening to someone else: "Your horse got loose? Bless your heart!" it can just as easily be meant sarcastically: "You think you know what you're doin'? Bless your heart."

**Dadgumit!** — A Texan's way to curse around children, suitable for use wherever a swear word is intended. Derived from *darn it* or *dang it*, *dadgumit* works well in conjunction with *shoot fire* and *son of a gun!* 

**Don't have a cow!** — While lots of Texas-centric language actually has roots in other places, this phrase is

originally attributed to a Denton, Texas, newspaper, where a writer quoted a subject saying someone would "have a cow" if they knew about something unacceptable he had done. When telling someone, "Don't have a cow!" you're telling them not to overreact. Similar cattle-themed sayings include: *Till the cows come home* (meaning for a long, long time); and *Take the bull by the horns*, encouraging someone to tackle something head on. And, let's not forget ...

All hat, no cattle — Every state probably has its own version of Texas' slang for someone who considers themself important without reason. Perhaps a derogatory reference to city-folk imitating the fashion of actual cowboys, it can also describe a person who is all talk but little action. "That politician never keeps his promises. He's all hat, no cattle."

While many other words and phrases are commonly associated with Texas, the state's unofficial motto may be the most famous of all ...

**Don't mess with Texas.** Launched in 1986 as an anti-littering slogan, it is widely accepted as a reminder of a Texan's toughness and a warning for anyone who might forget.

Portraying former President George W. Bush on TV's Saturday Night Live, actor Will Ferrell reminded 9-11 terrorists they should not have messed with Texas. Further proving how iconic the reference had become, it is also listed in the Advertising Hall of Fame.

Ironically, the official motto of Texas is just one word: *Friendship. Tejas* was the Spanish pronunciation of *teyshas* or *thecas*, the Caddoan word for ally. So, while Texan talk may be full of swagger, it tries to keep that motto in mind ... as long as you don't make a mess while you're here. NOW

Although Mountain Valley Studios didn't open until 2010. Rebecca Brown taught lessons from home beginning in 1991. While in college, she originally wanted to be a concert pianist, until she taught her first student. "At the end of the first lesson, I knew this is what I wanted to do forever," she shared. "I changed my degree."

Rebecca dreamed of opening a full-fledged music school featuring teachers for all instruments. In 2010, she opened Mountain Valley Studios with 22 students, one guitar teacher and a second piano teacher. Within a year, they had 200 students and teachers for a variety of instruments.

At the peak of her business, COVID-19 hit, so she moved to online teaching and took the opportunity to step back and reflect on her professional priorities. One of the first teachers in the area to return to in-person classes, her business boomed after the pandemic. Rebecca returned to private instruction alongside group lessons. While the studio no longer has multiple teachers, she finds she reaches more students by focusing on her true passions — teaching piano and preschool music.

"I love kids. I'm the one who has a conversation with a 5-year-old at the grocery store, and I have an ability to connect with a variety of personalities and learning styles, keeping every student engaged," she said.

Mountain Valley Studios offers private piano for ages 3 to

adult. Rebecca also provides group piano lessons and preschool music classes. An extra room allows her to rent space to local instructors who need a studio environment for their students.

"There's not a child who can't benefit from music lessons," Rebecca claimed. "Let them try piano. Make music education a priority for your children." Rebecca emphasizes the importance of music education for all ages. "Adults often hesitate only from fear of failure. You're never too old to learn. Try it, and be willing to laugh at yourself when you mess up."

According to Rebecca, music lessons do far more than teach a skill. Those other benefits keep her passionate about her work. And Rebecca adores watching the lights go on when a student finally "gets it."

When Rebecca first came to Fort Worth, she fell in love with the area. She liked the fine arts availability in Fort Worth but wanted out of the city, so the family moved to the Burleson area for the best of both worlds. She enjoys the friendliness and gives back to the community by periodically taking students to retirement centers to play for residents.

#### Sweet and Spicy Turkey, Apple and Cheese Sandwiches

- 4 large croissants
- 1 5-oz. pkg. Alouette Crème de Brie
- 1 4-oz. pkg. Montchevre Herb Goat Cheese
- 1 10-oz. jar Tabasco Spicy Pepper Jelly
- 1 12-oz. jar Smucker's Red Raspberry Preserves
- 8 slices deli turkey meat
- 2 Granny Smith apples, thinly sliced

- **I.** Slice open croissants, evenly down the middle.
- **2.** Add a thick layer of brie and goat cheese to half of a croissant.
- **3.** To the other croissant half, add a thick layer of the jalapeño and raspberry jams.


