

EDITOR'S NOTE


Fore!

A Heart for - By Bill Smith

Darryl Willis speaks from his heart when he recalls the beautiful country and beautiful people of Ukraine. Having made more than 25 visits to the war-torn country over the years, he has friends and colleagues who remain there, as well as some who are refugees for a second time, the first time being when Russia invaded the country from the east in 2014.

"I have a lot of dear friends in Ukraine," Darryl began. "We thank God for Facebook instant messaging. It is one of the few ways we can communicate. I have a friend who has served as my interpreter when I have been there. She is the same age as my eldest child, and she calls me her dad. She is in Zaporizhzhia, about 130 miles from Mariupol. Her parents are in Rozivka, about 35 miles away, and it has been taken over by the Russians. We try to talk or leave voice messages every night."

Since 2017, Darryl has been a regional director for Eastern European Mission. EEM is primarily an organization that publishes, prints and distributes Bibles and Bible-based materials in more than 30 countries and over 20 languages through a vast network of partner churches and organizations. Prior to assuming the role of regional director, Darryl was the youth camp program director. As program director, he had a host of responsibilities that were often done in Ukraine, including recruiting and training teams to build relationships, distribute Bibles and Bible literature and teach character traits and values to children in the Pioneer Youth Camps in Ukraine. During this time, he also developed curriculum and training material for the organization.









"We eventually came to realize that the youth camps were a 'mission drift' from our primary purpose and decided to turn the youth camps over to another organization. EEM provided grants to them for a couple of years, and we still provide Bibles and other camp literature." Darryl continued. "We also continue to provide Bibles in the public school system. In Ukraine, the Bible is used to teach the students character.

"The Bibles we distribute are translated from the original languages that are available by professional Bible scholars, and we pay them royalties for their work. In Ukraine, Bibles are very expensive, but our distribution program is very efficient. Only about 4 percent of gifts to EEM go to administration and 9 percent for development. All of the rest goes to production and distribution of the Bibles, making them free to everyone who receives one. In 2021, we gave away over 1.5 million Bibles."

Although Darryl claims to speak only a little Russian and Ukrainian, when he says in one of these languages that he only speaks a little, his eyes light up and he sounds like he might be speaking his native tongue. His wife, Terri, commented, "You can tell he loves Ukraine!" It is very clear.

While his responsibilities have changed significantly since he was director of the youth camps, Darryl still has colleagues in the youth camp program that is part of another organization. "Inna lives in Kharkiv, which is also one of the major cities being bombed. She continues to serve there. Our EEM staff had an office in Donetsk when the war broke out in 2014, and they fled to Kyiv. When the present conflict started, the employees in Ukraine had the freedom to make their own decisions, whether to stay or evacuate. My colleague, Dasha Novakova and all except one of our staff members moved to our office in Vienna, Austria. This is crucial to understand. Many of our staff members have been refugees twice now, because of the two separate wars Ukraine has experienced in a relatively few years."

Darryl affirms that EEM is not a humanitarian aid organization, and that they are not about to try to "reinvent that wheel." He said, "We are very good at raising funds, and we are a



very effective and efficient conduit to get the funds where they need to be to do the most good. When funds are received at EEM that are earmarked for Ukrainian aid, 100 percent of it goes to the relief efforts. We do not have any transfer or administrative fees taken from them," he continued. "There are a lot of organizations and individuals that are generous and want to assist by gathering supplies here and shipping them to Poland or some of the other countries that have been accepting Ukrainian refugees. They are much appreciated. However, it is a costly process to pack and ship the goods. We have found that the products the refugees need are already produced or available in Poland and the other countries in the area. Our staff in Vienna manages these funds, and they know the charities that have 'boots on the ground' that the money can be channeled through to obtain what the refugees need, and to get it in their hands. We do receive requests for funds from other organizations, and all of these requests are properly screened."

With so much change taking place because of the war, it would probably be easy to lose focus. Darryl said, "We cannot abandon our core mission. Seventy-five percent of the public schools in Ukraine use the Bibles we provide to teach character. We also have over 600,000 Bibles in public schools in Croatia. We are seeing walls come down because of the Bibles. The requests are growing exponentially. We can never produce enough to meet the requests. If we had the funds, we could easily distribute 2.4 million Bibles in a year.

"Ukraine desperately needs our help and support. We don't need to forget them. They don't just need a moment in time. They need us long term. At the very least, but at the very most, pray. Don't underestimate the value of prayer and communication." NOW





Gabe Larez brought Twisted Metal Rod & Collision to Ennis in 2003, but it was not an easy decision to make. "We had a

lot of customers in the Carrollton/Farmers Branch area, and I was afraid we would lose them if we moved down here," Gabe recalled. "Our old clientele essentially sustained us for the first three years here. We transported their cars down here to work on them, then transported them back."

The move to Ennis was primarily because the business needed shop space, and they found the building on Avenue F was the size they were looking for, and it was more affordable than what was available in the Metroplex. "During those first few years, I did most of the work myself, with the assistance of some students that the high school referred to us from their vocational education program. At the time, we were primarily building hot rods, and the body work expanded from there," Gabe added.

Gabe has been doing something with cars since he was about 17 years old, when he started washing cars. "Larry Riggs is the one who brought me into the hot rod business, and he has been like a father to me over the years. He had a lot to do with convincing me that the business could grow in a smaller community," Gabe related. "I had always lived in the city, but now that I am here, I love the small town. The people are so friendly. I even met my wife here!" Gabe has a record of community service also, having served as local Lions Club president and also delivering Meals on Wheels.


Twisted Metal does everything related to auto body repairs, from complete restorations and insurance work to painting. They work on all makes and models, and the customer's satisfaction is their No. 1 goal. "The one thing we need right now is to hire some more employees," Gabe said. "Before COVID-19, we maintained a staff of 10-12 employees. Today, we have six. If someone is willing to work, they need to come see us.

"We still pride ourselves on getting repairs done in a timely manner. The only exception to getting the work out, when we expect to, is parts delays. Hopefully, the supply-chain issues will be behind us soon."

The hot rod business has mainly been for car shows, but Gabe, himself, had a passion for racing a few years back, mostly at Cedar Creek and Yellow Belly drag strips. Twisted Metal's website proudly cites that their work has been featured in Hot Rod Magazine, Car Craft Magazine and Super Chevy Magazine. They have also received awards for Best in Show and Best in Paint at local and national shows for many years.

Gabe acknowledged that the car repair business has changed over the years, and it has been important to keep up with the technology. "Everything is computerized now," he said. "Even the hot rods have computers. We have not had a lot of total electric vehicles yet, but we know they are coming, and it requires that our tech employees go back to school. We have already worked on a lot of hybrid vehicles.

"We believe the future of Ennis, and our business here is bright. We have some land behind the shop where we plan to expand. We are so happy to be in Ennis, and we really want to thank our friends and customers for their support." NOW











Peachjar:

In listening to our families and in an effort to be more environmentally friendly and fiscally responsible, Ennis ISD will no longer regularly distribute paper "take home" flyers on any of our campuses. Stuffed Manicotti

- 1 lb. ricotta cheese
- 8 oz. mozzarella or Italian blend shredded cheese
- 4 Tbsp. Parmesan cheese, grated
- 2 tsp. sugar
- 2 eggs

Nutmeg, to taste

Salt, to taste
Pepper, to taste
1 8-oz. pkg. manicotti noodles
Canola or olive oil
2 24-oz. jars your favorite marinara or
pasta sauce

I. Combine the cheeses, sugar, eggs, nutmeg, salt and pepper.

- **2.** Stuff the manicotti noodles with this mixture. I use a beef jerky gun to stuff the manicotti noodles.
- **3.** Spray a 13x9-inch baking pan with canola or olive oil.
- 4. Bring the marinara or pasta sauce to a boil.
- **5.** Cover the bottom of the baking pan with half of the pasta sauce. Arrange the stuffed manicotti noodles in a single layer in the baking pan (the 8-oz. container has 12 noodles). Top with the rest of the sauce.
- **6.** Cover with foil; bake at 400 F for 40 minutes.
- **7.** Remove from the oven. Remove the foil; top with more grated Parmesan cheese (or Italian blend shredded cheese). Bake for about 5 more minutes (or until the cheese is melted).

Bacon-wrapped Pork Loin

I pork loin

4 cloves garlic, minced

6-8 Tbsp. mustard

Salt, to taste
Fresh cracked pepper, to taste
Minced onion flakes, to taste
Softened butter (enough to coat inside
of butterflied pork loin)
I lb. bacon

I lb. bacon Butcher twine Foil wrap

- **I.** Butterfly the pork loin.
- **2.** Add the garlic cloves to the mustard. Rub the inside and outside of the pork loin with the mixture.
- **3.** Sprinkle and rub the salt, fresh cracked black pepper and minced onion flakes on both sides of the pork loin.
- **4.** Pat the inside of the pork loin with softened butter; fold the pork loin back together.
- **5.** Wrap with bacon; tie with butcher twine to close it up.
- **6.** Put on a rotisserie. (I have an Emeril Lagasse Power AirFryer 360.) Cook at 400 F about 25-30 minutes until the internal temperature hits 145 F.
- **7.** Wrap in foil for 5 minutes, then serve.

Sauerkraut

- 1/2 lb. bacon, diced, or more to taste
- 1/2 medium onion, diced (divided use)
- 4 cloves garlic, minced, or to taste (divided use)
- 3 32-oz. jars Libby's sauerkraut Cornstarch, for thickener
- **I.** Bring the bacon to a simmer; add half of the diced onions and the garlic. Drain at least half of the bacon grease.
- **2.** Pour in the sauerkraut; boil for about 10 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- **3.** Stir in the cornstarch; simmer for about 5 more minutes.

Cheese Enchiladas

Cooking oil, enough to coat tortillas

- 1 small pkg. (20) corn tortillas
- 1 20-slice pkg. H-E-B Easy Melt Cheese, or your choice of cheese
- 1 15-oz. can chili
- 1 8-oz. pkg. shredded Mexican-style cheese
- **1.** Heat some oil in a skillet; quickly give each side of a corn tortilla a dip in the oil to soften them up enough to roll easily.
- **2.** Stuff with cheese (or whatever you want). I put a slice of H-E-B Easy Melt Cheese in each corn tortilla, and then roll them up. Place in a 13x9-inch glass baking dish.
- **3.** Top with chili; bake for about 30 minutes on 375 F.
- **4.** Top with shredded cheese; broil until the cheese is melted.

Smoked Pork Ribs

I rack St. Louis-style or baby back ribs Mustard, enough to coat ribs Dry rub of your choice

- **1.** Remove the silver skin/membrane from the back of the ribs.
- **2.** Generously coat the ribs with mustard and a dry rub.
- **3.** Smoke for about 2-3 hours between 225-250 F. (Each smoker is different, so you may need to adjust the temperature and

time.) Once the ribs have a nice smoke color, remove and wrap them in foil.

4. Either finish cooking in the oven or put them back on the smoker until the bones easily pull out.

Beer Bread

- 3 cups self-rising flour, plus a small amount to dust the pan 1/4 cup sugar 1 12-oz. can or bottle of beer 1/2 stick butter
- **I.** Mix the flour, sugar and beer to form a dough.
- 2. Dust a greased loaf pan with flour.
- **3.** Scrape the batter into the loaf pan. Spread into the corners.
- **4.** Either dot the top with softened butter or top with melted butter.
- 5. Bake for about 1 hour at 350 F.
- **6.** Remove from the loaf pan; let cool on a wire rack.


Bacon-cheese Smoked Chicken Thighs

1 pkg. (about 10) chicken thighs Canola or olive oil for coating

- Dry seasoning of your choice, with a little added cornstarch
- I lb. bacon (You won't need the whole pkg. just enough to cover the thighs.)
- 1 8-oz pkg. shredded cheese
- **I.** Coat the chicken thighs with oil and the dry seasoning/cornstarch mixture.
- **2.** Put the thighs close together on the smoker; drape them with bacon.
- **3.** Smoke at 225 F for about $1 \frac{1}{2}$ to 2 hours, or until the chicken reaches 165 F.
- **4.** Remove the bacon strips. Dice the bacon; mix it with shredded cheese.
- **5.** Top the chicken thighs with the diced bacon and cheese.
- 6. Cook until the cheese has melted.



The most interesting road to White Sands National Park winds through Cloudcroft, New Mexico, high in the Sacramento Mountains. From two overlooks, travelers can view snow-covered mountain tops above and white gypsum sands spread across the foot of the Andres Mountain Range. The two ranges form the Tularosa Basin, which encases the sands. After a 30-minute drive from mountain cool to desert hot, more surprises await.

The best time to experience the park is in late fall to early spring due to desert temperatures. However, the park opens at 7:00 a.m., so an early morning visit before the daily temperatures rise is possible. Glowing sunrise and sunset colors enhance the group walk/talks with park rangers. The White Sands Missile Range surrounds the park, which closes each week when nearby Holloman Air Force Base schedules tests, so call ahead.

park. Bring plenty of water, snacks, sunscreen, hats, sunglasses and sleds for everyone. Not the beach, digging in the sand isn't allowed, but sledding the dunes is a treasured pastime. Many Alamogordo area lodgings check out sleds, boards and wax for free.

At the park's entrance, stop at the adobe visitors' center. Built in the 1930s in the Pueblo Revival style, it's part of a national historic district within the park. Literature, interactive museum exhibits and a short video are offered along with the only potable water source in the park. Rangers offer tips, guidelines and information, or download the free NPS app.

While neighboring mountain roads need snowplowing, Dunes Drive in White Sands NP is plowed because the sand drifts constantly. Cleared parking areas accompany three trailheads, the Interdune Boardwalk (handicapped accessible), Backcountry Camping Trail, Lake Lucero (a playa) and the amphitheater. Roadside exhibits, shaded picnic areas and restrooms are available. When hiking the trails, always carry water and keep landmarks in sight. It's easy to get lost among blindingly white dunes. Footprints disappear within minutes.

Covering 275 square miles, this is the largest gypsum field in the world, with gypsum left behind when the Permian Sea retreated and melting glaciers dissolved the mineral eons ago. Rain and snow continue dissolving the gypsum, while wind and sun separate and break down the crystals into sand. Water, lying just inches below the sandy surface, supports plant and animal life.

Animals, such as the bleached earless

stay cooler. Early morning visitors might notice, on wind-stilled mornings, mouse tracks followed by fox tracks, two of many nocturnal animals.

Dune pedestals, created by shrubs such as the skunkbush sumac, shelter many animals. The soaptree yucca grows taller in the dunes, so new leaves stay above the sand. Desert flowers add beautiful color to the trails.

As Dunes Drive reaches its cul-desac turn, the surrounding dunes are clear of plants and ready to sled. After a challenging climb to a dune peak and waxing of the sled or board so it goes faster, visitors, young and old, thrill at sledding the dunes in tandem or solo.

People have been coming to this area since the Jornada Mogollon started farming in the basin during the Archaic Period. American Indians came in the 1600s, joined by Europeans and Americans in the 1800s as railways were built. White Sands NP was created in 1933, so visitors from around the world can continue visiting and enjoying this phenomenal natural treasure. NOW

While every corner of the world may claim its own dialect, Texas goes big toward its own communication style. People from other parts of the country have probably heard many typical Texan phrases, while some slang is purely local. Here's a beginner's guide for any recent transplants trying to acclimate to the language of the Lone Star State.

Howdy — A less fancy way of saying, "How do you do?" the greeting, *Howdy!* is even the official greeting of Texas A&M University, the state's largest university with about 70,000 students. *Howdy* is often followed by the word, *y'all*, which leads us to ...

Y'all — A contraction that means just what it clearly says: You all. *Y'all* can address two or more people, but a very large group (or multiple groups) requires a pluralized plural. That's where *all y'all* comes in. (Yes, Texans know that means "all you all," but groups can be really, *really* big here, so we don't consider it redundant.)

Fixin'ta — Although foreigners might think you're about to repair something when hearing this phrase, it actually just means you are about to *do* something. Whatever you're about to do, however, never *ever* say it with a g. *Fixing* still means repairing something, even in Texas.

Ain't — A contraction meaning: I am not, I have not, he/she has not, we are not and that is not. Certainly not exclusive to Texas, but common for natives who ain't fixin'ta use more syllables than absolutely necessary. Used in a Texas sentence: "This ain't my first rodeo!" (meaning I've actually done this before/I'm not new to this). Further abbreviations include *y'aint* (y'all are not) and *aintcha* (aren't y'all?).

Git — Because get is just plain uppity, Texans slip *git* into all kinds of phrases: *Git-r-done* (meaning to accomplish something); *all git-out* (meaning very or extremely); or *git-to-gittin*' (meaning to get started). For example, a warning between siblings about chores: "You bes' git-r-done before Pa gits-to-gittin' home or he'll be mad as all git-out."

As those examples suggest, individual words are often partnered with other phrases for emphasis in Texas. Here are some common phrases one might use to show they are Texan through and through.

Bless your heart — While this one can be sincerely stated in regard to something bad happening to someone else: "Your horse got loose? Bless your heart!" it can just as easily be meant sarcastically: "You think you know what you're doin? Bless your heart."

Dadgumit! — A Texan's way to curse around children, suitable for use wherever a swear word is intended. Derived from *darn it* or *dang it*, *dadgumit* works well in conjunction with *shoot fire* and *son of a gun!*

Don't have a cow! — While lots of Texas-centric language actually has roots in other places, this phrase is

originally attributed to a Denton, Texas, newspaper, where a writer quoted a subject saying someone would "have a cow" if they knew about something unacceptable he had done. When telling someone, "Don't have a cow!" you're telling them not to overreact. Similar cattle-themed sayings include: *Till the cows come home* (meaning for a long, long time); and *Take the bull by the horns*, encouraging someone to tackle something head on. And, let's not forget ...

All hat, no cattle — Every state probably has its own version of Texas' slang for someone who considers themself important without reason. Perhaps a derogatory reference to city-folk imitating the fashion of actual cowboys, it can also describe a person who is all talk but little action. "That politician never keeps his promises. He's all hat, no cattle."

While many other words and phrases are commonly associated with Texas, the state's unofficial motto may be the most famous of all ...

Don't mess with Texas. Launched in 1986 as an anti-littering slogan, it is widely accepted as a reminder of a Texan's toughness and a warning for anyone who might forget.

Portraying former President George W. Bush on TV's Saturday Night Live, actor Will Ferrell reminded 9-11 terrorists they should not have messed with Texas. Further proving how iconic the reference had become, it is also listed in the Advertising Hall of Fame.

Ironically, the official motto of Texas is just one word: *Friendship. Tejas* was the Spanish pronunciation of *teyshas* or *thecas*, the Caddoan word for ally. So, while Texan talk may be full of swagger, it tries to keep that motto in mind ... as long as you don't make a mess while you're here. NOW
