



Mayor Rachel Proctor has invested deeply in DeSoto. "I've been a DeSoto resident for nearly 33 years," she said. "My family moved here when I was in third grade. I graduated from DeSoto High School. I went off to college, but I came back here to buy my first house, at the urging of my dad. I didn't grow up in a political family. My dad was a pastor and a businessman, so we were always involved in the community. He pushed us to work hard to help other folks. That became native to who I am."

With roots like that, it's no surprise that Rachel found ways to get involved. "When I moved back to DeSoto and got my first tax bill, I wanted to know where those taxes were going. I started getting involved in my HOA, committees at the high school and the library board. I was attending a gala hosted by the DeSoto Chamber of Commerce. Just the week before, I had decided to explore running for a place on the school board. However, in that

event, the seed was planted to explore a city council seat that was opening up because the council member was moving out of that district. Up to that point, I had never thought about serving on city council. At a crossroads, I prayed, 'God, if you want for me to do this instead of the school board, make it the obvious choice to make.' I checked the boundaries of the open district, and the boundary line literally made a loop around my house! The line had changed just the year before. I thought that couldn't be a more obvious sign."

Rachel won that special election, and then served on the council for six years. During that time, she served as mayor pro tem for three years under the late Mayor Curtistene S. McCowan. "Mayor McCowan was unique in the way she served the community. She was like family. That's one of the facets of her the community misses most. I learned from her that relationships count," she said. Rachel became Mayor

Proctor in a special election in 2021, following Mayor McCowan's passing. She was elected to her first full term this past May.

"One thing I'm very passionate about is discovering who DeSoto is and 'who we want to be when we grow up.' Creating lasting change requires us to be more intentional with defining our identity as a community and creating a stronger sense of place," she explained. "Intentional has been my word for this year. I feel like we're a little behind on this, but we can catch up. The Hampton Road Redevelopment Project will be a big part of attracting the quality developments we want to see. Within the plans for the Hampton Road Redevelopment Project, we've embedded three distinct nodes to serve as centers of attraction. We are gaining momentum around a clear vision of building a walkable, downtown corridor that includes active outdoor spaces and unique developments where people want to live, work and play.

"Progress moves at the speed of relationships. So, we're actively negotiating for the kinds of businesses we want here."

DeSoto is not just focused on business, but is continuing its commitment to bolster cultural arts in the region. "Our public art mural is the first of its kind for our city, and its creation ties in to DeSoto's commitment to the arts. Culture and community are important to DeSoto. We aim to be the Mecca of arts and entertainment of the Best Southwest region. Our Artists Lab program has found new and creative ways to take the arts into our community.

"As mayor, I want all our residents to feel seen and heard," she continued. "My family lives here, too. My mom and my siblings live here. I don't want residents to feel like they have to fight to be heard. I try to make sure the city government stays approachable and accessible. The decisions we make as local elected officials can impact people's lives immediately and for decades after. When I drive down the streets, I think about who lives behind those doors. They have real fears, and real hopes and dreams."

Most days in the life of a suburban mayor are reasonably calm, but disaster can strike out of the blue. "When Winter Storm Uri hit, my 'momma bear' mode kicked in. I hadn't been sworn in a week at that point, and that was hard, but it really showed how resilient our community is. There was no way I could rest knowing what conditions the people of DeSoto were facing. I put out a call for water, and over a thousand bottles were donated in less than 24 hours. People working together got us through."

Mayor Proctor continues to focus on some of the same issues that first got her involved in city government, like the library. "Literacy is important to me. I'm a two-time published author, so it was exciting for me to support literacy in our city by hosting the summer reading program again this year. We always kick it off with a block party. This year, we had water slides and carnival games. But I'm also aware that not every child has someone to bring them to the library for an event. We're partnering with local churches, community groups and the ISD to hold events at locations out in the community to get more kids signed up for library cards, share resources to increase access to broadband internet and bring meals and resources where they are needed most."

Another way Mayor Proctor is serving the youngest residents of DeSoto is by encouraging innovative parks. "Ernie Roberts Park has an all-inclusive play area that allows children of all abilities to play alongside each other.

"There will always be challenges. Maybe it just comes with age, but one of the things that has surprised me the most about this job is that it's not as stressful as I thought it would be. Most mornings, I'm just excited to wake up, that I get to do this. I get to help people and make a difference."

Cal Mees grew up in North Dakota, so, of course, hockey was part of his life. "I was playing by at least age 6. In North Dakota, that's just what you do in the winter. We would flood the back garden — soak and freeze, soak and freeze — until it became an outdoor hockey rink. I never played indoors until I was 14. Playing outdoors, the fathers were our Zambonis. They'd use snow shovels and water hoses while we were in the warming house between periods. At least once a month, we'd go across the border to Canada, to play the border towns."

Cal played on bantam and midget intramural teams as a youth. In high school, he lettered in football and track, but

not hockey. "The coaches hated me because I laughed about everything. I never played one second of varsity hockey!"

In college, Cal focused on his studies, his job in an antique store and woodworking. He married, had a kid and joined the North Dakota National Guard. Hockey was just a side hobby. "I still played, but it was just a bunch of guys getting together for fun," he remembered. "While I was in the National Guard, I drove from Bismark to Fargo to take the ROTC classes I needed to get commissioned as an officer. Twelve of us from my graduating class became Army officers. One of them became a general." Cal went on to active duty in the Army, where he became a field artillery captain. During his Army years, hockey was confined to mall ice rinks with his daughter. After leaving active-duty Army service, Cal became a stock broker and moved to Dallas, sort of by accident. "I came here at a friend's invitation, intending to stay for six months and just stayed."

Hockey wasn't much of an option during his early days in Dallas. "When they opened the StarCenter in Duncanville, that's when I started back up with eight engines!" The Duncanville Dr Pepper StarCenter eventually closed and was replaced by the Duncanville Fieldhouse, but by that time there were other, less convenient hockey rinks around the Metroplex. Cal now plays for a number of local teams, including a couple of all-veteran teams, the Ft. Worth Patriots and the Dallas Warriors, a team of disabled veterans. "I play like 11 times a week," Cal revealed. "I'm the coordinator or captain for five different teams at the Parks Mall. It's a lot of work, but it's worth it. It's fun."

Cal has so much fun playing hockey, that he decided to go for a few world records. He currently holds certified world records for the most hockey leagues one individual has played for in a single year — that would be 33. The most hockey teams one individual has played for in a single year — that would be 90. The most hockey games played by an individual in one year - that would be 552. And the most consecutive games played - that would be 29 games in 31 hours at The Parks Mall in Arlington last year. "I had so many blisters! The last few games, I hurt so bad I could only watch the clock. I could barely stand!"

Achieving something like that has a cost. At the end of that crazy year, Cal required a few surgeries to put his body back together. "At that point, the pain of not finishing was greater than the pain of finishing, but I was wearing a shoulder brace, a wrist brace and both ankles were taped. I had four fractures and a torn rotator cuff. I had to have surgery on my wrist and my shoulder, but COVID-19 had put a stop to all elective surgeries, so I had to wait. I was so thankful when I could get my surgeries and get back to hockey!" The toll on his body wasn't the only cost. "I'm usually about 205 pounds, but at the end of that year I only weighted 175. I spent the equivalent cost of a small house achieving those four records and getting them certified. I don't think anyone will be surpassing my records, but if they do, I'll just recertify as the oldest person to do any of them. I'm 62."

You would think four world records would be enough, but Cal has plans for at least one more. "I'm going to try to be the first person to play an official hockey game in all 50 states in one year! I'm not quitting anytime soon. I have too much fun with this!" **NOW**

Dr. Kent Aftergut and the team at Dermatology Associates of Uptown have been serving the skin care needs of their patients in Cedar Hill and the surrounding area for 20 years. "We treat all ages and skin types here. We provide medical, surgical and cosmetic dermatology. We try to prevent skin cancer, but we have a Mohs surgeon on staff, Dr. Meredith Orseth, who can deal with removing complicated skin cancers in the facial area. We have three physicians on staff: myself; Meredith Orseth, MD; and Cynthia Robinson, MD; and a full-time physicians' assistant, Joe Capasso, PA-C, who has a lot of experience. Because of that, you can usually get in to see us quickly. If you have poison ivy, you can't wait three weeks for an appointment!"

Dermatology Associaties

Dermatology Associates of Uptown sees a lot of patients, and about one-third of those are for the treatment or prevention of skin cancer. The other two-thirds are for a wide variety of skin issues including vitiligo, psoriasis, eczema, acne and warts. "There are many less common conditions which we treat, including autoimmune conditions like lichen planus and lupus. A lot of skin conditions are caused by abnormal interactions between the skin and the immune system. Many people don't realize that post-transplant immunosuppression greatly increases the risk of skin cancer," he added.

One issue that has been in the news recently is the under diagnosis of skin cancer in patients with skin of color. "Skin cancer is less common in skin of color, and can be harder to diagnose, unless you know what to look for," Dr. Aftergut explained. "We treat a lot of skin of color here, and we understand that a lot of skin conditions look different in skin of color than they do in very pale skin. We all trained at Parkland, where you gain experience in all skin types."

"We treat all ages and skin types here. We provide medical, surgical and cosmetic dermatology."

Dr. Robinson treats a wide variety of skin and scalp conditions including discoloration and hair loss. "We also offer cosmetic procedures like BOTOX, fillers, chemical peels, microneedling and platelet rich plasma therapy," she said. "I've been here for three years, and I love the diversity of this community. I'm able to build networks here. Sometimes, I treat three generations of the same family. We truly have experts here. We have great training and experience, and we work together as a team. If one of us is better at a particular issue, we step in, so the patient always gets the best care."

Dr. Aftergut agreed. "When we do cosmetic procedures, we stick to stuff that really works. We try to focus on procedures that are reasonably priced, since insurance does not cover cosmetic procedures — techniques that are effective and ones that are proven safe." Dermatology Associates of Uptown also offers a line of non-prescription products for sun protection, retinol treatments for wrinkles and lightening creams for dark spots.

"I may be biased," Dr. Aftergut confessed. "But I think we are the best at what we do. Our team has awesome skills within all areas of dermatology. We don't need to refer out for treatment." NOW

Enjoyable Pound Cake

3 sticks butter, room temperature
8 oz. cream cheese, room temperature
3 cups sugar
6 large eggs
1 tsp. vanilla extract
2 cups all-purpose flour
2 tsp. salt
Nonstick cooking spray

I. Preheat the oven to 350 F With a mixer, beat the butter and cream cheese until smooth. Add the sugar; beat until light and fluffy, about 5 minutes.

2. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Mix in the vanilla (or flavor of choice.)

3. Add the flour and salt in two additions, beating until just combined.

4. Generously coat a Bundt (or other) pan

with cooking spray; immediately pour in the batter. (The pan will seem full.) Tap the pan on a work surface to rid the batter of any large air bubbles.

5. Bake until golden and a toothpick inserted in the center comes out almost clean, 60 to 75 minutes.

6. Remove from oven; let cool. Enjoy with your favorite ice cream or fruit topping.

Something Carmel Brownies

1 12-oz. bag caramels, unwrapped

- 1/2 cup condensed milk
- I cup butter
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 4 eggs, slightly beaten
- 1 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 3/4 cup unsweetened baking cocoa
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1 12-oz. bag semisweet chocolate chunks
- 1/2 cup pecans, chopped
- I tsp. vegetable oil

I. Heat the oven to 350 F. Grease the bottom and sides of a 13x9-inch pan with cooking spray.

2. In a saucepan, heat the caramels and milk over low heat, stirring frequently, until the caramels are melted and smooth.

3. In a saucepan, melt the butter over low heat; remove from heat. Stir in the sugar, vanilla and eggs until well blended. Stir in the flour, cocoa and salt. Stir in the chocolate chunks and pecans. Spread batter evenly in the pan.

4. Gently and evenly drizzle the melted caramel over the batter, preventing large pockets of caramel and preventing the caramel from reaching the bottom of the brownie batter. Bake for 35-40 minutes or until set. Enjoy!

Chewy Sugar Cookies

cup butter
 1/2 cups sugar
 large egg

Sweeter Potato Chess Pie

2 medium (about 1 lb.) sweet potatoes 4 eggs

 $6\ Tbsp.$ unsalted butter, melted and cooled $1/2\ cup$ buttermilk

Zest and juice of 1 lemon 1 tsp. vanilla extract 1 1/4 cups granulated sugar 1/4 cup light brown sugar 2 Tbsp. cornmeal 1/2 tsp. nutmeg 1 piecrust (any kind)

I. Poke the potatoes all over with a good knife; microwave for 15 minutes until soft when pressed. When the potatoes have cooled, but are still warm, cut and scoop the flesh into the bowl of a food processor.

Mix until you have a smooth puree, scraping down the sides of the bowl as needed. Let the mashed potatoes cool.

2. When the mash is cool, add the eggs, melted butter, buttermilk, lemon zest and juice and vanilla to the sweet potato in the food processor. Blend until smooth, scraping down the sides as needed.

3. Whisk the granulated sugar, brown sugar, cornmeal and nutmeg together in a small bowl; pour it all into the bowl with the sweet potato mixture. Process until smooth, scraping down the sides of the bowl to make sure everything is completely combined. Pour the filling into the crust.

4. Bake the pie for 30 minutes; then sprinkle a little nutmeg over the top and return to the oven. Cook another 10 minutes. Let cool; enjoy!



The most interesting road to White Sands National Park winds through Cloudcroft, New Mexico, high in the Sacramento Mountains. From two overlooks, travelers can view snow-covered mountain tops above and white gypsum sands spread across the foot of the Andres Mountain Range. The two ranges form the Tularosa Basin, which encases the sands. After a 30-minute drive from mountain cool to desert hot, more surprises await.

The best time to experience the park is in late fall to early spring due to desert temperatures. However, the park opens at 7:00 a.m., so an early morning visit before the daily temperatures rise is possible. Glowing sunrise and sunset colors enhance the group walk/talks with park rangers. The White Sands Missile Range surrounds the park, which closes each week when nearby Holloman Air Force Base schedules tests, so call ahead.

Preparation is key to enjoying this park. Bring plenty of water, snacks, sunscreen, hats, sunglasses and sleds for everyone. Not the beach, digging in the sand isn't allowed, but sledding the dunes is a treasured pastime. Many Alamogordo area lodgings check out sleds, boards and wax for free.

At the park's entrance, stop at the adobe visitors' center. Built in the 1930s in the Pueblo Revival style, it's part of a national historic district within the park. Literature, interactive museum exhibits and a short video are offered along with the only potable water source in the park. Rangers offer tips, guidelines and information, or download the free NPS app.

While neighboring mountain roads need snowplowing. Dunes Drive in White Sands NP is plowed because the sand drifts constantly. Cleared parking areas accompany three trailheads, the Interdune Boardwalk (handicapped accessible), Backcountry Camping Trail, Lake Lucero (a playa) and the amphitheater. Roadside exhibits, shaded picnic areas and restrooms are available. When hiking the trails, always carry water and keep landmarks in sight. It's easy to get lost among blindingly white dunes. Footprints disappear within minutes.

Covering 275 square miles, this is the largest gypsum field in the world, with gypsum left behind when the Permian Sea retreated and melting glaciers dissolved the mineral eons ago. Rain and snow continue dissolving the gypsum, while wind and sun separate and break down the crystals into sand. Water, lying just inches below the sandy surface, supports plant and animal life.

Animals, such as the bleached earless lizard and the Apache pocket mouse, scurry among the plants and visitors during early mornings, evenings and overnight. Adapted to life in the sands, they grew lighter than cousins living elsewhere. They are camouflaged and stay cooler. Early morning visitors might notice, on wind-stilled mornings, mouse tracks followed by fox tracks, two of many nocturnal animals.

Dune pedestals, created by shrubs such as the skunkbush sumac, shelter many animals. The soaptree yucca grows taller in the dunes, so new leaves stay above the sand. Desert flowers add beautiful color to the trails.

As Dunes Drive reaches its cul-desac turn, the surrounding dunes are clear of plants and ready to sled. After a challenging climb to a dune peak and waxing of the sled or board so it goes faster, visitors, young and old, thrill at sledding the dunes in tandem or solo.

People have been coming to this area since the Jornada Mogollon started farming in the basin during the Archaic Period. American Indians came in the 1600s, joined by Europeans and Americans in the 1800s as railways were built. White Sands NP was created in 1933, so visitors from around the world can continue visiting and enjoying this phenomenal natural treasure.
