



crafting the Story

The theater is dark and cool, just waiting to come alive with action, words and emotions brought to life by actors and crew members. Such is the world of Julie Mitchell, theater teacher, director, playwright and now

author, and, oh, let's not forget wife, mom and daughter! No matter her role each day, at Ennis Public Theatre or Mildred High School, Julie is creating a future for other aspiring actors and writers much as was done for her. "I'm honored to get to be a small part of this generation's growth and lives," Julie said.


Early in her school studies, Julie knew what she wanted to do in life. "I was in the third grade and had to fill out a book titled *What Do You Want to Be,*" she recalled. "I said writer and actor." Julie experienced rejection in the theater early, too, but learned a valuable lesson from it. "I didn't get an acting part in *Annie* at the Warehouse Living Arts Center as a child, while my two sisters did," she stated. "My mom encouraged me to work backstage or as an understudy. That changed everything for me. I learned that sometimes it's your part. Sometimes, it's not. But being part of the theater in any way is being part of something magical. Theater is like a watch. Every gear has to turn to make the watch come to life."

Texas Tech University was Julie's next stop after graduating from Corsicana High School. "I started as a creative writing major, and then switched majors to theater," she said. "I loved college because I got to be part of shows all the time." Upon graduation, California seemed to be the place to be, so she headed to Los Angeles and appeared in commercials, television and films. She found time to teach dance, theater and improv and teach at the WLAC drama camps. "I learned I enjoyed teaching," Julie said.



She met and married Markus Baldwin, a fellow thespian, and the two decided to move to Corsicana to raise their two children. Markus and Julie are co-artistic directors for EPT, and Julie serves on the Film Corsicana Committee. "I have my parents and one sister living nearby, and our two kids are being raised in the theater," Julie added. "It's great being near family, and I appreciated life in a smaller community when my cancer crisis and treatment happened. We feel we're able to serve our community and make a difference."

Her teaching and writing skills intertwined and grew during the last two years as Julie, already with two years of previous teaching experience, became the theater teacher at Mildred High School. She wrote and directed the one act plays for both contest years and guided her plays through the UIL approval process successfully. "It's challenging, and there's always a doubt whether you are doing the right thing or not, but I struggled to find plays that fit the exact demographics of our students, so I wrote them," Julie explained. "I like this generation of students at school and at EPT. They give me hope. They work hard. They are smart, creative and fun."

Two of her Mildred students, Parker Durham, a junior, and Lillie Burnett, a senior, shared their experiences. "I was very shy, even though I've been acting since I was IO. However, I want to be a theater teacher. I love getting on the stage and theater in every way. Every day is different in the theater," Lillie stated. She's known Julie since drama camp days and through her cousin, Jamey Pritchett, of WLAC and EPT fame. Her favorite role was that of Megan in the eighth grade. "Megan struggled with herself and had challenging problems and hardships," Lillie explained.

"It's all about getting out there. I want to be an actor," Parker added. "I like the OAP competitions. This is my sport." He's been in church productions and school talent shows and has been a ventriloquist "since I was young," he said. "My favorite role has been as the lead, Jack, in *Boxes*. It was my first time playing the lead. It gave me a ton of confidence."

Lillie enjoys Mildred HS because, "everybody knows everybody, and you get to do everything." She loves to write and sing, is an artist, and she competes in cross-country, volleyball, track, UIL prose and is in the Spanish and Drama clubs.

Parker participates in cross-country, track and is in the Spanish and Drama clubs. He and Lillie are officers in the Drama Club. Additionally, Parker writes plays.

Parker and Lillie see working with

Julie, the playwright, director and teacher as a benefit. "She can help create characters that fit our strengths, and she writes in more characters," Lillie said. Her most memorable moment on stage came during the second round of OAP competition when she lost her voice. "I still got best actress," Lillie recalled.

"It's hard to find a play that can be cut to the required OAP time, so it helps in competition to have a complete story told in the time limit," Parker added. His most memorable moment on the boards? "My best performance was in my eighth grade OAP, and it lit a flame in me."

In addition to writing OAP plays, Julie recently published her first novel, *A Very Okay Love Story.* She has other stories in the works and is a member of Cors-I-Can writing group. "If I try to define what I do," Julie said. "I think it's to help people find their voices. Everybody has something important to say, and if I can help them, that's a great honor. Life is short. 'Do what you love' isn't just a cliché. If it brings you joy, you can make a living."

The business name says a lot: A stands for accurate, R for reliable and C for confidential. Don and wife, Ann Lane, are local owners of ARCpoint Labs, one of Corsicana's newest businesses and a national franchise. "No matter what type of lab services are needed, we want our customers to have a pleasant experience in a friendly atmosphere and have

them out in about 20 minutes," Don said. "We can run and process over 4,000 lab tests here."

Tests include women's or men's basic wellness, with or without a physician consult; STD testing, paternity/ DNA testing, drug and alcohol testing, DOT and federal mandated judicial program testing, as well as background/ pre-employment screenings. "Our wellness panels include basic, comprehensive and even more detailed tests," Don explained. He realized the importance of medical tests and added them to his business bucket list after losing his first wife to cancer in 2010. "I learned an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure and wanted to give people the control to gauge their own health, while saving them money and time. We don't file any private insurance, Medicare or Medicaid, but our prices are more reasonable, and patients know up front what the cost will be," he added. Insurance claims can be filed by the customer, however. No doctor's referral is needed for services.

Tests are sent out to the three major labs across the country, and an ARCpoint medical review officer will contact the customer if the tests show critical results. A \$50 physician virtual consultation, good for 60 days, is available on several of their panels. "My mother was a single mom and lab technician who raised three kids while working three jobs," Don recalled. "Our lab services are wonderful for working parents. They can pick a sick child up at school, bring the child for strep or flu testing, and know what, if any, sickness the child has," he stated. Appointments and walk-ins are welcome.

The business has four employees — an RN lab director, a bilingual English/Spanish receptionist and two phlebotomists. Don and Ann's daughter, Miranda, is the RN lab director. Ann designed the office's relaxing interior. ARCpoint Labs accepts major credit and debit cards or Apple Pay as payment. The business is a member of the Corsicana & Navarro County Chamber of Commerce and received a U.S. Senate Commendation at its ribbon cutting.

ARCpoint Labs can also process an autologous serum for dry eyes, called Your Tears, in-house. A customer's blood is drawn, the serum is spun out in a sterile, closed system making eye drops that match the customer's DNA. The process is typically completed the same day. Customers can purchase their customized eye drops in either a three- or six-month supply.

"We have lots of family in the medical field," Ann said. Don and Ann also have two sons who are firemen/paramedics, and another daughter who isn't currently in the medical field. They enjoy their three grandchildren and boating together in their spare moments.

Don and Ann have Navarro and Freestone county roots. "My mother, Connie Hayes Lane, was from Richland, and my father, Jim Lane, was from Wortham," Don recalled. Ann's family were all from the Roane area. Don has been a businessman here in Navarro County for over 37 years.

Ann said, "Our business goal is to help people and businesses make informed decisions and be in control of their health, safety and well-being, making tomorrow better than today."

Mom cooked without recipes, using handfuls of flour and pinches of salt, and I still do the same." Kathy enjoys planning, cooking and entertaining friends and family. She raises a summer garden, as did her grandparents.

Kathy graduated from the University of Louisiana with a bachelor's in nursing and entered the U.S. Air Force, where she met and married Warnie Meisetschleager. "He was a C-9 pilot, and I was a flight nurse," Kathy recalled. She retired from the service as a colonel. The couple have two sons living in the Metroplex and a daughter stationed at Tinker AFB as an E-3 (AWAC) instructor pilot.

Banana Nut Bread

3 large bananas, very ripe 1/2 cup butter or margarine 1 cup sugar 2 eggs 2 cups flour Pinch of salt

1/2 tsp. baking soda2 tsp. baking powder1 cup nuts, chopped

I. In a bowl, mash the bananas to a pulp. In another bowl, cream the butter; add the sugar. Cream the mixture; add the eggs and mashed bananas. **2.** In a third bowl, mix the dry ingredients; add them to the banana mixture. Add the nuts; mix well.

3. Bake in a well-greased loaf pan at 325 F for 45 minutes to 1 hour, or until the bread shrinks from the pan's sides.

Vanilla Wafer Cake

This is a very rich cake, but oh, so delicious!

12-oz. box vanilla wafers
 cups sugar
 sticks butter
 eggs
 1/2 cup milk
 cup nuts, chopped
 cups flake coconut

I. In a gallon Ziploc bag, crush the vanilla wafers with a rolling pin or glass.

2. In a bowl, cream the sugar and butter; add the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition.

3. Add the milk and vanilla wafer crumbs;

fold in the nuts and coconut. Bake in a well-greased and floured tube pan for 1 hour and 15 minutes at 325 F.

Strawberry Pecan Layer Cake

Cake:

- I box white cake mix I 3-oz. box strawberry flavored JELL-O I cup oil I/2 cup milk
- 4 whole eggs
- I cup frozen strawberries, thawed and drained
- 1 cup coconut
- I cup pecans


Frosting: 1 stick butter 3 1/2 cups boxed confectioner's sugar 1/2 cup strawberries, drained 1/2 cup pecans, chopped 1/2 cup coconut


I. For the cake: In a bowl, blend the cake mix and JELL-O. Add the oil and milk; beat for 2 minutes. Add the eggs; beat until well blended.

2. Fold the strawberries, coconut and pecans into the batter; divide the batter equally into three 9-inch pans that are greased and floured. Bake at 350 F for approximately 40 minutes; cool before frosting.

3. For the frosting: In a bowl, cream the butter and sugar. Add the remaining ingredients; blend well. If the frosting is too thick, add a few drops of strawberry juice or milk.


